## NIEREMBERGIA HIPPOMANICA — DWARF CUP FLOWER

## (Bodger's Introducer's Description)

Of all the hundreds of new flower introductions which have come under our observation during the course of the past few years, none has caused so much comment from visitors to our farms as this little Dwarf Cup Flower, Nierembergia Hippomanica. With the possible exception of Zinnia Linearis, it will outbloom any flower we have growing. It starts flowering when the plants are only about two inches tall, that is about 15 weeks after the seed is sown, and keeps on right up until the heavy frosts of late fall. It is at all times neat and tidy looking, the young flowers coming and covering the older flowers and seed pods. The lovely lavender blue shade, heightened by a touch of yellow in the center, is most charming. Plants are definitely dwarf, com-pact-streamlined, if you will-and not over 5 or 6 inches tall, and with a spread of only 8 to 10 inches. Foliage is light gray green, very inconspicuous, and there are literally dozens of flowers in bloom at a time throughout the summer. As an edging plant, for the border along a walk, or to outline beds of larger flowers, it has no equal, while for use in the rockery it is unexcelled and is extremely lovely in a window box or in flower pots. It is a half hardy perennial which will winter over if given some protection. In the southern warmer sections, no protection will be necessary. The plants should be cut back at the end of the season and will send out fresh growth in the spring.

## HOW TO IMPROVE GERMINATION OF FINE SEEDS ESPECIALLY DURING HOT WEATHER SEASON

Mix "Sorbex". (The Finest Peat Organic) with soil in seed flats and pots. Soil for Seed Flats. A perfect mixture for the tender germinated seedlings is one part "Sorbex" to two parts screened garden loam-by volume. What Causes Damping-Off? Few growers realize that such diseases as "Damping-Off" and rots of seedlings are caused by living germs. Disease producing germs live normally in the soil and on seeds. The only successful way of preventing these diseases is to sterilize the soil and disinfect the seed.
(Excerpt from Florists' Review, issue of January 24, 1935)
Formaldehyde for Damping.Off. Dr. C. E. F. Guterman of the department
of plant pathology (Cornell University) told of recent developments in the control of damping-off of seedlings. The use of formaldehyde for treating soils for seed planting was recommended where it is not possible to use steam as a means of sterilization. It was shown that two scant teaspoons of commercial (forty per cent) formaldehyde mixed with about ten teaspoons of water make sufficient solution to treat one average-size flat of soil. The soil is spread out on the bench and sprinkled with the formaldehyde solution. It is then thoroughly mixed and placed in the flat. After the soil has stood twenty-four hours, the seeds may be planted. One pint of formaldehyde is ample to treat fifty flats of soil.

## Asters Like "Running Start"

Florists should have greater success with asters if they give them a "running start" on the season. In other words, asters need a longer season than the majority of the popular flowers of this area, and it has been found beneficial to plant them inside sometime after mid-March.
The young plants should be transplanted when they have grown large enough to be easily handled and when the ground and climate have become warm. Treated in this manner they should bloom comparatively early.

In soil that is clean and rot is not to be considered our "Regular" Strains of California Asters, listed below, will be found generally satisfactory. However, if in doubt, plant "Bodger's Wilt-Resistant" Strains. The small difference in cost of seed is of little moment compared to crop results.

## CANDYTUFT (Annual)

If you have grown annual candytuft before and found it a poor seller, it is more likely that you had too much of the white variety. Try in its place a few of the colored varieties, such as Pink, Rose, Carmine, Lavender and Crimson and be convinced that this annual is of much use in the florist's establishment in the spring. It will take about five months to bring them into flower indoors. Plans may be made accordingly, taking into consideration the period cut flowers will be of most use to the individual florist. A good time for one planting is soon after the winter holidays as space becomes available. Some growers sow the seed singly, planting out later at the distance of a foot apart.

## CHRYSANTHEMUM

Annual chrysanthemums are important florist＇s plants，being useful in many ways in the flower shop and，at the same time，they are inexact－ ing in their cultural needs．A number of annual species or plants which are treated as annuals are mentioned in the literature，but two kinds， C．carinatum，and C．segetum，cover most of the material now in general commerce．These are all easily grown，coming into flower quickly，and the modern kinds are mostly pleasing colors，making good cutting material outdoors in summer or under glass in winter． Perhaps the most popular species at present is C．segetum，especially the Star varieties，such as Evening Star（golden yellow），Eastern Star（light yellow with a dark disc and yellow ring），and Morning Star （immense flowers of an attractive primrose）．

## BODGER'S FAMOUS "GOLD MEDAL" ZINNIAS FOR CUT FLOWERS AND GARDEN SHOW

Few flowers have exhibited greater improvement at the hands of hybridizers than the Zinnias, and their improvement has been matched with a corresponding increase in public favor. For those geting started with Zinnias, it should be emphasized that the nature of the plants demands plenty of warmth. This is explained by the fact they are native to Mexico. This temperature requirement also, of course, applies to their seed germination, which will be a certain failure in a cold, wet soil. The warm end of a Carnation house or, say, a temperature of around 55 to 60 degrees nights will germinate it. In warm climates Zinnias have high florist value. By sowing around March 1st, Zinnias can be flowered to perfection during May in a Carnation house temperature. By sowing outdoors as late as August lst, in well-enriched soil and protected with water, they can be had in fine shape right up to frost. To bring out their wonderful colors calls for long sunny days. For this reason they are not profitable as a mid-winter greenhouse crop.
Don't overlook the margin in growing Zinnia seedlings for home gardeners. They are liable to become drawn and hardened in pots-better and more easily grown by broadcasting in an open bed.

An early-flowered batch of the showy Tuberous-Rooted Begonias will always be appreciated. The tubers when received may either be potted at once in a mixture of loam, extremely old manure and sand or placed in peat moss on a bench and lightly sprayed until the top growth and roots start. Usually 4 -inch pots will answer well for the tubers, although if larger plants are desired, they can later be given a shift.
These Begonias will grow better if kept fairly warm at this season, 55 degrees at night not being too much. Avoid wetting the foliage as much as possible, and later in the season, as the sun grows in power, some shading during the hottest part of the day will prove beneficial. Not only are the large-flowered Begonias useful as potted plants, but later they are excellent to plant in window or porch boxes where there is considerable shade, as well as for bedding out in positions that are so shady other bedding plants will flower little if at all.

Florists on the West Coast recently found a profitable outlet for Double Tuberous Begonia blooms by utilizing them for corsages and table decoration (the stems being wired). This new fashion is now sweeping the country, the flowers commanding a price on a par with that of Orchids and Gardenias.

## FORCING GLADIOLUS

The care of the Gladiolus after they are started is very simple. Clean culture and careful attention to watering, and caution in not trying to hurry with additional heat is about all that need be mentioned. Exact timing of gladiolus is not practical, but they have a special merit as a cash crop for planting any time between January 15th and March 30th.

Gladiolus planted in March will come into bloom in a less number of days than those planted in January. Late January planted bulbs, on an average, will require about 115 to 120 days to come into bloom. Late February plantings will require about 90 to 100 days. Often the same variety of bulbs planted January 15 th to February 15th will come into bloom about the same time. The percentage of blindness is greatly increased in the early plantings. For this reason, it is unwise to plant before January 15th. The use of electric light mornings and evenings will not cost more than additional heat and will hasten flowers and help prevent blindness.

Do not rely on any one variety as it has been proven that with the Gladiolus the very one that does the best one year may prove disappointing another, so it is best to have several varieties. It is also wise to treat the bulbs before planting with corrosive sublimate. The standard formula is 1 ounce to 8 gallons of water. Wooden or earthenware containers only can be used. Bulbs should be left in solution 2 to 3 hours and dried off somewhat before planting.
