

1. PREAMBLE:

Source's personal history is given in the report on the first interrogation carried out by this HQ (No 1403/48 of 24 May 46).

As before, Source was extremely co-operative and gave the impression of being truthful in all his statements.

2. NEGOTIATIONS PRECEDING SOURCE'S APPOINTMENT AS AMBASSADOR TO PGAH:

Source has NO first-hand knowledge of the negotiations which preceded his appointment as Ambassador to the Provisional Government of AZAD HIND. He heard from others, however, that when SUBHAS CHANDRA BOSE came to JAPAN, he asked the JAPANESE Foreign Office to appoint an Ambassador to the PGAH in RANGOON.

When Source returned to JAPAN from FORMOSA in Nov 44, the question of such an appointment was still under discussion. Despite his vigorous protestations that he knew nothing about INDIA or the INDIAN Independence Movement, Source was chosen to fill the post.

3. CREDENTIALS:

Source arrived in RANGOON in Mar 45 without any credentials, greatly to the astonishment of Mr CHATTERJI, Foreign Minister in the PGAH. Source wired to TOKYO asking for his credentials to be sent on; but they still had NOT arrived when Source had to leave RANGOON on 24/25 Apr 45. Later, in BANGKOK, Source received a telegram from TOKYO stating that his credentials had been despatched; but owing to the difficulty of communications, they had still NOT arrived at the time of the surrender.

Feeling that lack of credentials might cause embarrassing situations to arise, BOSE stated that there would be NO official business between the two Governments until Source's credentials arrived.

Source states that the JAPANESE Government did NOT appear to be in the habit of issuing credentials to its ambassadors to provisional governments; an ambassador by the name of KATO Kochu was sent without credentials to the Provisional Government of OMSK in SIBERIA.

4. ESTABLISHMENT OF EMBASSY IN RANGOON:

Source thinks that it was BOSE, and NOT the JAPANESE Government, who suggested the establishment of a JAPANESE Embassy in RANGOON.

So far as Source knows, there was NO written treaty or agreement between the two Governments, but merely a verbal understanding.

5. SOURCE'S WORK AS AMBASSADOR:

Because of his lack of credentials, Source was unable to do any official work whatsoever while Ambassador to the PGAH.

6. SOURCE'S CONTACTS WITH CHATTERJI:

Source met CHATTERJI only twice on official business; both meetings were to discuss the question of Source's credentials.

STATES OF YOSHIMI TANEYOSHI, CAPTAIN (MEDICAL) OF THE IMPERIAL JAPANESE ARMY, WITH REGARD TO THE DEATH OF ONE CHANDRA BOSE, WHO DIED AT TAIMOND, FORMOSA, ON 18th DAY OF AUGUST, 1945.

I, TANEYOSHI YOSHIMI, Captain (Medical) of the Imperial Japanese Army, at present at Stanley Gaol, Hong Kong, having observed a statement in a Japanese newspaper, requesting information regarding the death of Chandra Bose, wish of my own free will to place any knowledge I have of this matter at the disposal of the Authorities requiring it. To the best of my ability and memory I hear state the events surrounding the death of Chandra Bose.

In August, 1945, I was the Senior Officer at the NANMON Military Hospital, Taihoku, Formosa. At about 1700 hrs on the 18th day of August, 1945 a truck driven up before the hospital contained several men who had been injured in an aeroplane crash. Two of the men were Indians, and the remainder, about five or six in number were Japanese. One of the Japanese, a Staff Officer with the rank of Lt-Colonel whose name I cannot properly recall, but believe was Ishii -something, informed me that one of the Indians, pointing him out, was Chandra Bose and that I was not to spare myself and must give him the very best of treatment. I immediately gave instructions for some medical orderlies to go a prepare a bed, and for others to carry in the injured man.

When he was laid on the bed, I personally cleaned his injuries with oils and dressed them. He was suffering from extensive burns over the whole of his body, though the most serious were those on his head, chest and thighs. There was very little left on his head in the way of hair or other identification marks. the first four hours he was semi-concious, and practically normal, speaking quite a good deal. The first words I remember him speaking were in Japanese, when he made a request for water, which had to be fed to him through a hospital cup with As most of his speaking was in English, a request for an interpreter was made, and one was sent from the Civil Government Offices named NAKAMURA. informed me that he had very often interpreted for Chandra Bose and had had many conversations with him. He appeared to have no doubt that the man he was speaking with was Chandra Bose. During the treating of his injuries, I twice inquired of Chandra Bose if he was in any pain, and neither time did he make any answer. about four hours, I inquired whether there was any statement, will, or such matter he wished to make. He answered "Nothing". After the fourth hour he appeared to be sinking into unconciousness. He murmered, and muttered in his state of coma, but never regained conciousness. At about 2300 hrs. he died. There was apart from the injuries mentioned above, abrasions on his elbows and knees. There were no fractures.

The other Indian was a Chandra Bose's Adjutant, a Colonel of the Indian National Army, who was suffering from burns to the sides of his head, arms, hands and knees. I do not remember this mans name, but recall that it was a very long one. He was a very tall man, about six feet or over, medium build, and clean shaven.

It was the wish of this Colonel, and also that of the authorities that the remains of Chandra Bose should be transported to Tokyo, and to facilitate this I injected Formalin into the body, and also had the coffin partly filled with lime. The whole was put in a box, and on the 20th August, was taken to Taihoku airport for transporting to Japan, in charge of Warrant Officer NISHI. W.O. Nishi returned later and informed me that the body could for some unknown reason, not be taken to Japan, and was to be sent to the crematorium for cremation. I therefore made out a Death Certificate, stating the causes of death to be extensive burning and shock. The orders for this change of plans came from the Adjutant's Department, Taiwan Army.

On the morning of the 19th August, Colonel Miyata, Staff Officer of General Ando came to the hospital to express mourning on behalf of General Ando and his staff, and as is our custom brought gifts of flowers, fruits and cakes for the deceased. The news of the death of Chandra Bose was kept a secret, and I and my staff were warned not to divulge that we knew who it was that had died. The news was as far as I can remember published in the public press early in the month of September, 1945.

which was told to me. As far as I could make out, the aircraft, carrying Chandra Bose, his Adjutant and about ten or twelve others (Japanese), took off from the Taihoku Air Port, and after rising to a height of about thirty feet, suddenly burst into flames and crashed to the ground. A Major-General SHIDEI and two others were killed, or unable to escape and were burned with the plane. The others escaped or were rescued, and were brought to Nanmon Hospital. The two pilots, Warrant Officer (later 2/Lt.) AOYAGI and a Sergeant Major., were both burned, but after remaining in my care for about two or three weeks had practically recovered and were transferred to the Hokuto Military Hospital were I later heard they had died, about three weeks after admittance.

The Indian Colonel, Adjutant to Chandra Bose, remained in my care for about 10 days, and was then sent to the Hokuto Military Hospital. The interpreter Nakamura went up there with him, and I have no knowledge of what became of either of them. I do know however that the ashes of Chandra Bose were handed over to the Indian Colonel.

There is nothing more I can remember of this matter, at the present, but will give thought to it, and anything of importance I later remember I will disclose.

S.C.Bose and his party leaving Rangoon on 24 Apr 45 reached Bangkok on 14 May. The party, at the time of leaving Rangoon, had in its possession gold, gold ornaments and diamonds contained in 4 boxes of varying .sizes ranging between "x9"x4" and 6"x4"x2". An additional quantity of gold was purchased on the way at Moulmein to the extent of Rs 700,000 drawn by 3.C. Bose from Yokohama Specie Bank, Moulmein Branch.

While at Bangkok several meetings of the Cabinet Ministers of the FGI were held between 18 May to 14 Jun, the object of which was to decide as to the future course of action so far as the existence of the PGI was concerned. No decision could be arrived at as S.C. Bose had to leave for Singapore in order to carry out his propaganda over the radio against the acceptance of "Wavell Proposal". In course of these meetings Lt Col (Maj Gen) Chatterjee suggested that a nucleus of the PGI should be shifted to Yunnan Province in order to contact the Communists who had more influence in that part of China, and through their help to contact the Soviet authorities in Siberia. At the same time it was thought desirable to leave behind certain Cabinet Ministers and high ranking I.N.A. Officers to carry on the fight with HQ at Bangkok and Singapore. After the 2nd meeting (exact dates not remembered) Kiani left for Singapore to arrange accommodation for the Rani of Jhansi girls numbering about 120 who were at that time at Bangkok. At about the same time Chatterjee, Iyer and A. I. Sahai left for Saigon - Chatterjee to establish the site for the PGI, Tyer for broadcasting work and Sahai on a special mission at Hanol not known to B1189.

On 16 Aug 45 S.C. Bose came to Bangkok by a special Jap bomber chartered for him, accompanied by Iyer, Capt (Col) Habib ur Rahman and Capt (Lt Col) Pritam Singh. On 17 Aug 0700 hrs (Tokyo Time) Bose left Bangkok for Saigon accompanied by the following additional personnel

Lt Gen ISODA and two other H. Kikan personnel accompanied Bose and the party in a separate aircraft.

According to B1189's information received from H. Kikan and other sources, Bose and the parties reached Saigon on the same day (17 Aug). On the following day (18 Aug) S.C.Bose accompanied by Capt (Col) Habib ur Rahman left for Tokyo in a plane originally meant for the conveyance of some high ranking officials of Mori Butai as placing of the special bomber at 'his disposal was no longer possible. The rest of Bose's party remained behind at Saigon where at that time Chatterjee and Sahai were also staying. ISODA who happened to be present at the Saigon aerodrome to see the party off, said that Bose took his seat in the passage of aircraft between the pilot and the tail and as such could not be seen to wave goodby; when the plane took off. According to the estimation of B1189, the remainder of the party at Saigon named above might have moved into any of the following places, as these were the names of the places; suggested by various members in the Cabinet meetings mentioned before: -THE DEED TO STEEL STORE AND THE

- (1) Yunan Province
- (2) Hanoi (3) Shanghai
- (4) Harbin (Pinkiang)

In course of talk with ISODA on 21 Aug 45 Bl189 heard that the plane carrying Bose and the party landed at Taihoku (Formosa) at 1300 hrs (Tokyo Time) on 18th, and after about an hour's halt was taking off at 1400 hrs when the right engine failed resulting in the crash of the plane. The crew and the Chief of Staff Mori Butai were killed instantaneously, and Bose with Habib ur Rahman and 4 other Japanese officials were seriously injured. Bose and the other injured persons were removed to an eye hospital at Taihoku where he died at 2400 hrs on the night of 18/19 Aug 45 without regaining consciousness. No information about Habib ur Rahman could be obtained owing to restrictions put by the Allies on Japanese communication. B1189 requested ISODA to keep photographs of Bosa's funeral and other rites as well as his remains. No photographs or further information was received by B1189.

B1189 does not know whether Chatterjee ever met any of the nationalist Annamite leaders in course of his movements in French Indo-China. About Annamite leaders Bl189 only knows that S.C.Bose on his way to Tokyo in Dec 43 was prevented by the Japanese from meeting some of then who were sager to meet him (S.C.Bose) at Salgon.

B1189 has no direct information regarding the gold mentioned above. His own impression is, that a major portion of the gold was taken by S.C. Bose while the remainder was left with the rest of his party.

Born in CUTTACK, 1897. Educated Presidency College, CALCUTTA (from which expelled) and Scottish Church College. B. A. examination with honours in philosophy. Left for ENGLAND 1919 where he stood fourth in competetive I.C.S. examination. Took mental and moral science tripos at CALBRIDGE. Resigned service to take part in agitation over "AMRITSAR atrocities". Arrested for taking part in hertal in connection visit of Prince of Wales to INDIA. Appointed Chief Executive Officer of CALCUTTA Corporation 1924. Was parrested same year and deported to MANDALAY jail. Released on medical grounds after two years. Became leader of extremists in BENGAL Congress Party. Sentenced one year's imprisonment January 1930, elected Mayor of CALCUTTA August 1930, while still in prison. several times in next two years. Underwent treatment for tuberculosis in VIENNA 1933. Warned against re-entering INDIA 1936. Arrested on landing BOMBAY, released March 1937. year elected President Indian National Jongress, re-elected for second term 1939. Resigned office over disagreement with Gandhi over formation of Working Committee. Founded Forward Bloc of which elected President, 434. Arrested July 1940 in connection with agitation for removal of HOLVELL monument in JALCUTTA released same year. Reported missing from his home in CALCUTTA January, 1941. Arrived in KABUL February 1941 disguised as Pathan. Applied to Soviet Legation for help in proceeding to MOSCOW, was refused help. Applied German Legation and promised help. Eventually, with the assistance of Italian Minister who gave him Sicilian passport in name of MAZZOTTI, left KABUL 2nd Had told followers he was proceeding MOSCOV but March. 1941. two weeks later was reported to be in BERLIN. Falsely reported killed in air crash on way to TOKYO Conference, 1942. Elected leader of I.I.L. at SINGAPORE April 1942, though not present, and appointed RASH BEHARI BUSE as his deputy. Formed Indian National Society in HAMBURG, September, 1942. Broadcasts pro-Axis and anti-British propaganda from GERMANY and has visited P.W. camps with object of perverting Indian P.W.'s. for JAPAN in German submarine 9th February, 1942.



A spokesman of Bose's "government" at Singapore was quoted as saying: "The new government is not a refugee government exiled from its country by the exigencies of war. It is a war government of Free India, with no other task but to carry the war into the enemy's camp and free India for all time.

"Behind it stands an army, India's army of liberation, which has the backing of the Japanese forces. Japan has repeatedly affirmed that she has no political, economic, military, or territorial ambitions in India."—Reuter





MOST SECRET.

RECENT ACTIVITIES OF SUBHAS CHANDRA BOSE.

- 1. Subhas Chandra Bose, who arrived in East Asia from Germany in May, appears to have gone to Tokio in mid-June. His arrival in Asia, at first kept secret, is now being widely publicised.
- 2. On his arrival in Tokio, Bose granted a number of interviews to Axis journalists at his headquarters at the Imperial Hotel. The gist of these interviews was reiteration of his belief in an Axis victory, in the imminent liberation of India with Axis help, and in the need for an armed revolt in India to coincide with invasion from the East. He also answered questions on such subjects as the character of Chiangkai-Shek and the appointment of the new Viceroy.
- Bose has also spoken on the wireless --- to India in English, Hindi and Bengali, and to Germany and Indians in Germany in German. In these broadcasts he again paid tribute to Axis benevolence, and urged all Indians outside India to get into touch with him and help him to organise a "gigantic force to sweep the British from India". This first veiled reference to the "Indian National Army" was later amplified by an official announcement from I.I.L. Headquarters in Singapore declaring that this "new Indian Army" is now under training. On July 8 a formation of the I.N.A. paraded before Bose and the Japanese Prime Minister, Tojo, during the latter's visit to Singapore.
- 4. On July 4, at a meeting of the Indian Independence League at Singapore ("Shonan") the interim Fresident of the League, Rash Behari Bose, presented Subhas Bose to the League as its new President. S.C. Bose, who has adopted the title of "Mehtarji" or Leader, made a lengthy presidential address, chief points of which were:-
 - (a) Immediate formation under his aegis of a Provisional Government for India. When the revolution has succeeded this will be replaced by a permanent, popularly elected government.
 - (b) The hour of India's fight for Freedom has now struck.
 - (c) His sincere belief in Japan's good intentions.
 - (d) India's hope of freedom lies only in an Axis victory.
 - (e) Wavell's appointment means increased ruthlessness.
 - (f) Existence of many agents inside India with whom, in spite of the British Secret Service, he has kept in close touch.
 - (g) Great difficulties ahead.
- increased the tempo of subversive propaganda, and appears to have galvanised the I.I.L. into greater political activity. It is also noticeable (and to be expected) that while praising and thanking Japan, Bose never forgets to refer to Germany and to Axis sympathy for India. Before his coming the I.I.L. was only publicised in connection with Japan: S.C. Bose clearly intends to raise the movement into a national campaign for freedom supported by all three Axis powers.
- 6. Bose's great drive and political acumen, his prestige in Indian revolutionary circles, his understanding of both Indian and English character, will be of real value to the Japanese whose propaganda against India has hitherto lacked imagination. Although we have good reason to believe that his statement at 4(f) is exaggerated there is no doubt that under Bose's direction subversive activities and espionage in India will be greatly intensified.
- 7. Bose has now finally burned his boats with us by virtue of his association with Germany and Japan, his political future being entirely

/dependent

dependent upon the continued military success of the Japanese and the paralysis of British rule in India by internal revolt. Fortunately public morals and internal security in India are now fairly steady and the Japanese widely feared. Bose will undoubtedly be able to make some capital out of the economic distress and the political deadlock but unless he can win over Congress en bloc his chances of stirring up a major revolt would appear to be small. Had he arrived in East Asia last August or even during Gandhi's fast his prospects would have been much better.

SUBHAS CHANDRA BOSE.

Born 1897, the son of a leading citizen of Cuttach, Orissa. Expelled from the Presidency College, Calcutta, in 1915 and came to England 1919, where he took the Mental and Moral Science Tripos at Cambridge, and entered the I.C.S. Resigned from I.C.S. 1921 to join the non-cooperation movement, and was arrested for taking a leading part in the Calcutta hartal during the Prince of Wales' wisit to India. When Calcutta Corporation came under Congress control in 1924, Bose was appointed Chief Executive Officer (Mayor) of Calcutta and was again arrested and deported to Mandalay jail where he spent two years as a state prisoner. Elected member of The Bengal Legislative Council while in prison, he was finally released in 1926 to go to Europe for medical treatment as his Soon gained control of the Bengal Provincial health had broken down. Congress Committee, From 1929 to 1936 he was in constant conflict with the Government of India and was frequently arrested and released, making two visits to Europe in the intervals of these arrests. While in Vienna in 1934 wrote his book The Indian Struggle 1920-34 in which he bitterly criticised the tactics of Gandhi, Nehru and the Congress High Command. Elected President of the All-India Congress in 1938, re-elected in 1939 but resigned. He put himself at the head of the Congress extremists , founding the Forward Bloc in Bengal in 1939. Arrested in July 1940, released in December, but kept under police supervision, from which he escaped to Berlin in January 1941. His activities in Germany chiefly consisted in breadcasting; and in haranguing Indian P/W and attempting to suborn In May 1943 he arrived in East Asia and is now in Singapore, where the H.Q. of the Independence League has lately been established. A man of great ability, political experience and initiative, Bose has already shown in his broadcasts and in interviews granted to Axis journalists that he means business. His influence in India is at present hard to assess, but since he has little chance of being recognised by Gandhi and the Congress High Command it seems unlikely that he will be able to win over the whole of Congress to his plans for national revolution.





Axis Attempts to Suborn Indian P.O.M. Three pointers have recently been obtained to the possibility of the Japanese/Rash Behari Bhose efforts to suborn Indian P.O.M. and form an I.N.A. being paralleled by a German/Subhas Chandra Bose organisation. These pointers are:-

- (a) That the Germans permit Sikh POW to receive minature Kirpans.
- (b) A letter written by a P.O.W. named Sepoy Jahan Singh in Stalag IV D (ZW), which states:"Formerly we were in Italian hands, but now we have been transferred to Germany. We are comfortably placed here and there is no trouble whatsoever. I hope to be back in India in 1943. Here the management is in the hands of Subhas Chandra Bose, the leader of the Endian National Jongress."

Comment It is improbable that the type of propaganda administered by Subhas Chandra Bose to Indian B.C. J. would convey the impression that they will return to India in 1943 other than under German/I.N.A. auspices.

(c) A letter from an Indian civilian, smuggled in with Indian P.O.W. mail, which states:-

"In the beginning of War I had come back to Germany from England. Few days ago I have been sent to manage for the camp of Indian P.O. in Annaburg." MEZCol -

ADDRESS BY SUBHAS CHANDRA BOSE? SPEAKING FROM TOKIO TO GERMAN LISTENERS. CEXTRACTS).

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN ON THE INDIAN FREEDOM DAY WHICH WE CELEBRATED IN BERLIN ON 26TH JANUARY, I TOOK THE OCCASION TO ADDRESS YOU IN YOUR MOTHER TONGUE. TODAY, I SPEAK TO YOU FROM AN ENTIRELY CORNER OF THE WORLD, IN OTHER WORDS, FROM TOKIO. IN THE FIRST PLACE, I SHOULD LIKE TO EXPREESS MY DEEPEST GRATITUDE TO THE GERMAN GOVERNMENT FOR THEIR KIND HOSPITALITY WHICH THEY SHOWED ME THROUGHOUT MY GREAT FATHERMAND NOT AS A STRANGER, IT WAS NEVERTHELESS A NEW EXPERIENCE FOR ME TO VISIT GERMANY AT WAR.

GERMANS NOT ROBBING OCCUPIED EUROPE

WHEN I TRAVELLED THROUGH EUROPE, I REALISED HOW COMPLETELY FALSE ENEMY PROPAGANDA WAS, ALLEGING THAT GERMANY ROBBED OTHER EUROPEAN NATIONS OF THEIR FOOD. QUITE TO THE CONTRARY, I FOUND THAT ONE COULD GET MUCH BETTER SISHED IN A RESTAURANT IN RESTAURANT THE BRUSSELS THE HAGUÉ OB BAGUETH THAN IN BEST ON THAT THE ECONOMIC SITUATION IN GENERAL, AND THE FOOD IN PARTICULAR, ARE AS SATISFACTORY AS IT IS POSSIBLE IN WARTIME.

GERMANY'S INTEREST IN INDIA'S STRUGGLE

SUPPORT WITH THE GERMAN PROPEEDOM CAN ASSURE YOU THAT THE ND INDIANM PEOPLE HAVE ALWAYS SHOWN GREAT INCLINATION TOWARDS THE GERMAN PEOPLE DURING THIS WAR. AS GERMANY FIGHTS OUR ETERNAL ENEMY, THIS IS NOT ASTONISHING. THE SECOND WORLD WAR AGAINST OUR INVETERATE EVENY HAS NATURALLY INCREASED OUR INCLINATION TOWARDS GERMANY.

AXIS BLOWS AGAINST ENGLAND HELP INDLA



The interest of Subhas Chandra BOSE+in the possibilities of a connection with Japan, particularly from the financial standpoint, is well-known. Recent secret information is to the effect that an Indian ship's doctor on the eastern run keeps him posted with news regarding Japanese activities in the Pacific, with special reference to Indo-China and Thailand. Frequent, though unconfirmed, reports of this nature, and of Subhas BOSE's close alliance with the Japanese in India, when considered in conjunction with the strong suspicion that he was responsible for Shankar Lal BASAL's journey on a forged passport to Japan in 1940, lend considerable interest to the report that BOSE's recent complete disappearance from the ken of the pdice in this country is accounted for by his having sailed for the Far East some time in the middle of January bearded and bearing a forged passport. This information is, however, subject to confirmation.

MR. SUBHAS BOSE IN LONDON

Defence of the Congress Ministers: "We Have Improved Communal Situation"

From our London Staff

FLEET STREET, MONDAY.

When Mr. Subhas Bose, the prohibition on his entry into England lifted, arrived at Victoria Station tonight he was greeted by hundreds of Indians, and by many English friends. This youngish man, who is likely to be the next president of Congress, had come to Europe for medical treatment, but he now looks in excellent health and fit for the burdens of office.

English people who met him for the first time were impressed alike by his pleasant, quiet manner and the decisiveness with which he discussed Indian affairs. That was at a reception held an hour later at the Dorchester Hotel, which was attended by a large number of Indian, as well as English, journalists.

When asked about the situation in the provinces under Congress Ministers, Mr. Bose said that the Ministers had to function under various drawbacks. They had no control over the Central Government, which possessed special responsibilities and discretionary powers, while even in their own domain they could not have everything their own way, as, for instance, in regard to their wish that all political prisoners should be released. People who had been interned in villages or in their own homes in Bengal had been released, but there were still 500 men in Bengal prisons on political charges.

Problem of Finance

The biggest question the Provincial Governments had to face was finance. It was difficult for them to do much till they had control over the Central Government. Next to that was the difficulty that the permanent civil servants who had to carry out the Ministers' instructions were financially independent of them. "In spite of

their handicaps," Mr. Bose said, "I believe that in the short time they have been in office the Congress Ministers have done much to justify their existence."

In answer to a suggestion that conditions had worsened since these Ministers came into power, and that the communal difficulty had been by no means alleviated, Mr. Bose said: "It is absolutely false. We have improved the communal situation. With the exception of, I think, one province which is too small to have more than three Ministers, and which could not find a suitable Moslem to appoint, practically all the provinces have appointed a Moslem Minister. They have gone out of their way to do it. We are hopeful of better relations with the Moslem League.

"In every Congress-governed province we have done something tangible

"In every Congress-governed province we have done something tangible for the peasantry. Ameliorative measures have been adopted such as preventing the raising of rents, and stopping the collection of arrears of rent. We have a sort of moratorium, and we are examining the whole question how far permanent relief can be given.

Hostility to Federation

"We are opposed to federation; we will fight it tooth and nail." Mr. Bose declared. "We are going to use every legislative means to oppose its introduction. Federation as it is now drawn up would be a setback. We think the Princes of the native States would be a definitely reactionary force. In the last resort we would rather have the status quo than federation."

Mr. Bose said he was not here on a political mission; he had come to meet his old friends, many of whom he had not seen for years. When asked whether he was going to the India Office, he said that if his friends wished him to meet anyone he was willing to do so. "From the Congress point of view we do not approach anyone."

MR. SUBHAS BOSE'S CAREER

WHILE there has been no further news about the circumstances in where Subhas Bose met his death, as the ed from Tokyo on Sunday, a Bangkok dispatch to the German news agency says that two leaders of the Indian community in Siam were killed in an aeroplane grace of length ed in an aeroplane crash off Japan and that they were en route to Tokyo to attend a conference of all Indians in the Far East.

Mr. Subhas Chandra Bose was born in Cuttack on January 23, 1897. His father, Mr. Janaki Nath Bose, was a prominent figure in the town, being the Government pleader and leader of the Bar, he was also for a long time Chairman of the Municipality and the District Board.

Subhas Bose proved a keen scholar, passed his Matriculation at the age of 16, and joined the Presidency College in Calcutta.

Following trouble in the college, Subhas Bose was expelled; two years later he entered the Scottish Church College and passed the B.A. examination with honours in philosophy. He left for England in 1919 where he stood fourth in the competitive I.C.S. examination. Before returning to India he took the mental and moral science tripos at Cambridge.

On his way out to India Subhas Bose read Mr. Gandhi's appeal for passive resistance in connexion with the "Amritsar atrocities" and resign-ed the service to take part in the agitation. A few months later he took a leading part in the hartal in connexion with the visit of the Prince of Wales. He was arrested and spent eight months in prison.

When the Calcutta Corporation came under the control of the Congress in 1924 Subhas Bose was appointed Chief Executive Officer.

In 1924 Subhas Bose was arrested under Regulation III of 1818 and deported to Burma. He spent two years in the Mandalay jail before he was released on grounds of ill-health.

After his release, Subhas Bose got control of the Bengal Congress Party's funds and political machine. His "dictatorship" was challenged by a section of the party led by the late Mr. J. M. Sen Gupta but he won in the struggle for supremacy. The Benthe struggle for supremacy. The Ben-gal Congress Party was split, Subhas Bose becoming leader of the extremists.

extremists.

The years between 1929 and 1933, saw Subhas Bose in constant conflict with the authorities. In January 1930 he was sentenced to twelve months' imprisonment for organizing a procession which passed through Calcutta carrying banners inscribed with revolutionary slogans.

In August, while still in prison, Subhas Bose was elected Mayor of Calcutta, securing an overwhelming majority over the only other candidate. He was released from prison soon after.

Subhas Bose could not stay out of prison long. In January next he was sentenced to seven days' imprisonment for defying an order not to enter the district of Malda. He was re-arrested and released on several occasions. In November he was arrested when about to enter the district of Dacca in connexion with a non-official committee to inquire into alleged police excesses. On his release he was again arrested near Bombay and interned.

SOJOURN IN VIENNA

About the middle of January, 1933, the Government of India informed Mr. Satish Chandra Bose, his brother, that they were prepared to withdraw the order under Regulation III of 1818, which had been imposed on Subhas Bose, from January 2, of the previous year and grant him a passport for Switzerland and France if he wished to go to Europe for treatment of tuberculosis.

From the time of his arrival in Vienna From the time of his arrival in Subhas Bose's health began to improve. He quickly gathered round him Indian students who had come to Europe to the toured Europe and while in study. He toured Europe and while in Rome was elected President of the Federation of Indian Students Abroad. The headquarters of the organization was mov-ed to Vienna and the next annual Congress of the Federation was also held there.

In November, 1934, Subhas Bose, was urgently summoned to the bedside of his dying father. He flew to India only to hear on his arrival in Karachi that his father had died 36 hours earlier.

Subhas Bose decided to defy order and sailed for Bombay. was arrested as he landed and was taken to the Yervada jail. Being in indifferent health he was removed to Kurseong and then to Calcutta where he was released by order of Sir John Anderson, Governor of Bengal, on March 17, 1937.

CONFLICT WITH CONGRESS

In December, 1937, he was elected President of the Indian National Congress. Perhaps his greatest achievement was his re-election for a second term as President of the Congress early in 1939. His defeat of Dr. Pattabhi Sitaramayya who was the official candidate of the Working Committee and who also received the blessings of Mr. who also received the blessings of Mr. Gandhi, astounded the country.

Success at this presidential election widened the breach between him and the Congress Working Committee, and culminated in his resignation from the Presidentship of the Congress. It soon became evident that the majority of members of the All-India Congress Committee were adherents of the policy of the Working Committee, who, in common parlance, were called the "Rightists." This was proved at the Tripuri Congress, where Pandit Govind Ballabh Pant's resolution, practically censuring Subhas Bose for casting aspersions on the members of the Working Committee in his presidential election manifesto, was carried by an overwhelming majority. By that resolution, he was directed to form the new Working Committee in consultation with Mr. Gandhi. This was followed by the A-I.C.C. meeting in Calcutta, in April 1939, where the point at issue was the principle on which the Working Committee should be formed. Subhas Bose was for a "composite cabinet" consisting of both "rightists" and "leftists," while Mr. Gandhi was in favour of a homogeneous Committee. Prolonged discussions took place between Mr. Gandhi and Subhas Bose at Sodepur, but no compromise was arrived at. Thereupon, he resigned the Presidentship of the Congress, and Dr. Rajendra Prasad was elected President.

Thenceforward Subhas Bose's attitude towards the Congress "High Com-Success at this presidential election widened the breach between him and the

Thenceforward Subhas Bose's atti-tude towards the Congress "High Com-mand" became bitterly hostile. He founded the Forward Bloc, of which he was elected President.

he was elected President.

Then came the All-India Congress Committee meeting at Bombay in June, 1939, when two resolutions, sponsored by the Right Wing, were adopted. These resolutions in effect prohibited the inauguration of civil disobedience campaigns by Congressmen, unless they first secured the consent of their respective provincial organizations. They also discouraged irresponsible attacks on the Congress ministries. Subhas Bose called for protest meetings on the ground that the resolutions infringed the right of Congressmen to resort to direct action. He was warned by the President of the Congress that the action contemplated amounted to a revolt against president of the Congress that the action contemplated amounted to a revolt against the Congress. He disregarded the warning and organized an All-India Protest Day against the resolutions in July. He persisted in defying the President, with the result that in August, 1939, disciplinary action was taken against him, he being debarred from holding any elective office of the Congress for a period of three years.

BENGAL AFFAIRS

Meanwhile, Subhas Bose had managed to consolidate his position in the Bengal Provincial Congress Committee where the majority of the memtee where the majority of the members continued to disregard and defy the party's central executive. This went on for months, Eventually, he resigned the presidency of the Bengal Provincial Congress Committee, but a nominee of his was elected President in his place, and it was resolved that he would get in an was resolved that he would act in accordance with the instructions of Subhas Bose. In the meantime, elections to a new B.P.C.C. became due, but, under instructions from Subhas Bose, the BP.C.C. refused to hold any elections. Thereupon, the Working Committee suspended the defiant B.P. C.C. and appointed an ad hoc committee for holding elections to the B.P.C.C. The elections were held in due course, and a new B.P.C.C. came into being and received official recognition. The suspended B.P.C.C. however, refused to dissolve itself and continued to function.

Subhas Bose kept up his attack on Mr. Gandhi and the Right Wing leadership. The frequent conversations, which Mr. Gandhi carried on with the Viceroy, following the outbreak of the war, provided him with an opportunity of further criticizing Mr. Gandhi. He ascribed these negotiations to a desire on the part of Mr. Gandhi to "compromise with British Im-perialism." He even held an anti-compro-

Committee contested the elections at the instance of Subhas Bose in the name of the Congress. The elections did not go all in favour of the candidates set up by him, some of whom were defeated by those set up by the Hindu Mahasabha. After his release, Subhas Bose got control of the Bengal Congress Party's funds and political machine. His "dictatorship" was challenged by a section of the party led by the late Mr. J. M. Sen Gupta but he won in the struggle for supremacy. The Bengal Congress Party was split, Subhas Bose becoming leader of the extremists.

The years between 1929 and 1933, saw Subhas Bose in constant conflict with the authorities. In January 1930 he was sentenced to twelve months' imprisonment for organizing a procession which passed through Calcutta carrying banners inscribed with revolutionary slogans.

scribed with revolutionary slogans. In August, while still in prison, Subhas Bose was elected Mayor of Calcutta, securing an overwhelming majority over the only other candidate. He was released from prison soon after.

Subhas Bose could not stay out of prison long. In January next he was sentenced to seven days' imprisonment for defying an order not to enter the district of Malda. He was re-arrested and released on several occasions. In November or Maida. He was re-arrested and released on several occasions. In November he was arrested when about to enter the district of Dacca in connexion with a non-official committee to inquire into alleged police excesses. On his release he was again arrested near Bombay and interned.

SOJOURN IN VIENNA

About the middle of January, 1933, the Government of India informed Mr. Satish Chandra Bose, his brother, that they were prepared to withdraw the order under Regulation III of 1818, which had been imposed on Subhas Bose, from January 2, of the previous year and grant him a passport for Switzerland and France if he wished to go to Europe for treat-

ment of tuberculosis.

From the time of his arrival in Vienna Subhas Bose's health began to improve. He quickly gathered round him Indian students who had come to Europe to study. He toured Europe and while in Rome was elected President of the Federation of Indian Students Abroad. The headquarters of the organization was moved to Vienna and the next annual Coned to Vienna and the next annual Con-gress of the Federation was also held

there.

In November, 1934, Subhas Bose, was urgently summoned to the bedside of his dying father. He flew to India only to hear on his arrival in Karachi that his father had died 36 hours earlier.

A month later Subhas Bose returned to Vienna to continue his treatment. Vienna to continue his treatment.

In March, 1936, the report that Subhas Bose had been warned against entering India caused a stir in the country. In the Central Assembly a vote of censure against the Government was carried by 62 votes to 59. The Home Secretary made a state-ment at the time to the effect that the Government apprehended incitement to terrorism on the part of Subhas

John Anderson, Governor of Bengal, on March 17, 1937.

CONFLICT WITH CONGRESS

In December, 1937, he was elected President of the Indian National Congress. Perhaps his greatest achievement was his re-election for a second term as President of the Congress early in 1939. His defeat of Dr. Pattabhi Sitaramayya who was the official can-didate of the Working Committee and who also received the blessings of Mr. Gandhi, astounded the country.

Gandhi, astounded the country.

Success at this presidential election widened the breach between him and the Congress Working Committee, and culminated in his resignation from the Presidentship of the Congress. It soon became evident that the majority of members of the All-India Congress Committee were adherents of the policy of the Working Committee, who, in common parlance, were called the "Rightists." This was proved at the Tripuri Congress, where Pandit Govind Ballabh Pant's resolution. practically censuring Subhas Bose for cesting aspersions on the members of the Working Committee in his presidential election manifesto, was carried by an overwhelming majority. By that resolution, he was directed to form the new Workoverwheiming majority. By that resolution, he was directed to form the new Working Committee in consultation with Mr. Gandhi. This was followed by the A.-I.C.C. meeting in Calcutta, in April 1939, where, the point at issue was the principle on which the Working Committee should be formed. Subhas Bose was for a "composition cabinett" consisting mittee should be formed. Subhas Bose was for a "composite cabinet" consisting of both "rightists" and "leftists," while Mr. Gandhi was in favour of a homogene-Mr. Gandhi was in ravour of a homogeneous Committee. Prolonged discussions took place between Mr. Gandhi and Subhas Bose at Sodepur, but no compromise was arrived at. Thereupon, he resigned the Presidentship of the Congress, and Dr. Rajendra Prasad was elected President.

Thenceforward Subhas Bose's attitude towards the Congress "High Command" became bitterly hostile. founded the Forward Bloc, of which he was elected President.

he was elected President.

Then came the All-India Congress Committee meeting at Bombay in June, 1939, when two resolutions, sponsored by the Right Wing, were adopted. These resolutions in effect prohibited the inauguration of civil disobedience campaigns by Congressmen, unless they first secured the consent of their respective provincial organizations. They also discouraged Irresponsible attacks on the Congress ministries. Subhas Bose called for protest meetings on the ground that the resolutions infringed the right of Congressmen to resort to direct action. He was warned by the President of the Congress that the action contemplated amounted to a revolt against the Congress. He disregarded the warning and organized an All-India Protest Day against the resolutions in July. He persisted in defying the President, with the result that in August, 1939, disciplinary action was taken against him, he being debarred from holding any elective office of the Congress for a period of three years.

BENGAL AFFAIRS

Meanwhile, Subhas Bose had managed to consolidate his position in the Bengal Provincial Congress Commit-tee where the majority of the mem-bers continued to disregard and defy the party's central executive. This went on for months, Eventually, he resigned the presidency of the Bengal Provincial Congress Committee, but a nominee of his was elected President in his place, and it was resolved that he would act in accordance with the instructions Subhas Bose. In the meantime, elections to a new B.P.C.C. became due, but, under instructions from Subhas Bose, the B.P.C.C. refused to hold any elections, Thereupon, the Working Committee suspended the defiant B.P. C.C. and appointed an ad hoc committee for holding elections to the B.P.C.C. The elections were held in due course, and a new B.P.C.C. came into being and received official recognition. The suspended B.P.C.C. however, refused to dissolve itself and continued to function.

Subhas Bose kept up his attack on Mr. Gandhi and the Right Wing leadership. The frequent conversations, which Mr. Gandhi carried on with the Viceroy, fol-Gandhi carried on with the Viceroy, following the outbreak of the war, provided him with an opportunity of further criticizing Mr. Gandhi. He ascribed these negotiations to a desire on the part of Mr. Gandhi to "compromise with British Imperialism." He even held an anti-compromise conference simultaneously with the annual session of the Indian National Contracts of Paragraph in March 1940. annual session of the Indian National Con-gress at Ramgarh, in March 1940 At his instance the Bengal Provincial Conference at Rajshahi adopted a resolution giving an "ultimatum" to the British Government— that, unless India's demand for Independ-ence was conceded within six months, an intensive struggle would be launched.

In 1940 although the Congress officially abstained from taking part in the general elections of the Calcutta Corporation, the suspended Bengal Provincial Congress

Committee contested the elections at the instance of Subhas Bose in the name of the Congress. The elections did not go all in favour of the candidates set up by him, some of whom were defeated by those set up by the Hindu Mahasabha. Thereupon, he entered into a pact with the Moslem League, in order to have a working majority in the Corporation. The pact worked well for some time.

Subhas Bose was arrested in July 1940, in connexion with the agitation for the removal of the Holwell Monument in Calcutta and released in December of the same year.

In October he had been returned uncontested to the Central Legislative Assembly in the vacancy caused by the death of Mr. Surya Kumar Some, who represented the Dacca Division Non-Mohammedan constituency. His decision to stand for election came as a surprise to the public, especially in view of his declared policy of "fighting British Imperialism."

On January 26, 1941, Subhas Bose was reported missing from his home.

was reported missing from his home in Calcutta. On November 10, an official statement was made in the Council of State that he had gone over to the enemy and was with the Axis Powers.

On November 12, an Italian broadcast in Hindustani reported the presence of Subhas Bose in Germany.

THE TWO AEROPLANE FLIGHTS ON THE ATH OF MAY AND ON THE 8TH OF MAY HAVE ENABLED OUR COMPADES TO GAIN VALUABLE EXPERIENCE WHICH WILL BE OF GREAT USE ON SUBSECUENT OCCASIONS. WEY HOPE . IN VIEW OF THIS EXPERIENCE, IT WILL NOT BE NECESSARY IN FUTURE TO PUBLICLY ANNOUNCE ANY AEROPLANE PLIGHT TO INDIA. SINCE SUCH ANNOUNCEMENTS GIVE INFORMATION TO OUR ENEMIES AS WELL.
