Summary of the Latest Despatches
Foreign Intelligence
London, Feb. 19.—A night demonstration took place in London on the 18th inst., in connection with the proposed extension of the franchise to the working classes. The demonstrators were met by the police, and a riotous scene ensued. Several persons were injured, and a large quantity of property was damaged. The demonstrators were dispersed by the use of force, and the police were praised for their conduct.

THE HOUSE
The House then took up the bill for the incorporation of the State of Texas into the Union. The bill was passed by a vote of 101 yeas to 58 nays. The bill provides that the State of Texas shall be admitted into the Union as a full and equal member of the same, on and after the 1st day of December next. CITY INTELLIGENCE
