Esteemed Friend

The net yesterday for gent
Trotter 162 bbls Flour 69 of which we have sold
to a customer of ours (a Baker) at 45¢ and one bbl
very wet, had no doubt been in the barrel - sold for
\$4 1/2 - The remaining 92 bbls we have stored think-
ing it more to your interest than to sell at the
present market price - we could not obtain
from Flour Merchants over \$5 1/2 - See sold
100 bbls at 5 1/2 the balance at 5.40/100 -

Your last parcel of 50 bbls arrived during a
very depressed state of the market and would
have been stored had we anticipated the
small quantity we were to receive this
fall - They were sold as per statement below
The lot would not bring over 42¢ - 500 bbls
of Ely's brand were sold on the 3rd Nov^r @ 42¢ -

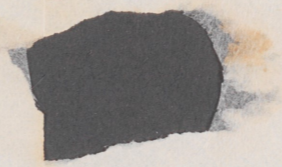
