Since writing you we have rec'd \$500
Flour making in all 127 Hds now on hand
which since stony we have not offered
for sale but will dispose of it whenever
we may think it most to your advan
tage. owing to the unusually mild weather
we still have which leaves every
navigable communication with the City
open. Flour is very dull though western
maintains about the same price as when
