(2) (Enlisted Men) (Changes No. 2 to RRL-1)

"Regardless of any eligibility which I may have now or in the future for discharge under Readjustment Regulations, or the length of my term of service, or on account of my age, I elect to remain in the Army as a Class \_\_\_\_\_ Volunteer."

(Class 1 and 2 as defined in Changes No. 2 to RR 1-1)

g. Special exceptions not otherwise provided above:

(1) Temporary Duty:

(a) Personnel assigned to a Zone of Interior installation or activity, the normal functions and operations of which require exit from and entry to the Zone of Interior within short periods of time under temporary duty orders. (An individual who is eligible for separation or who will become eligible for separation, prior to his scheduled date of return will not be ordered overseas under this provision).

(b) Any officer or enlisted man who volunteers in writing for duty outside the continental limits of the United States for a period of time sufficient to complete the mission to which he is assigned under temporary duty orders, even though he is eligible or may become eligible for separation prior to his scheduled date of return.

(2) Overseas Returnees:

(a). Officers returned from a theater to the United States to accomplish a specific mission and report back in person to the theater command.

(b) Any male officer or enlisted man who has been returned to the United States on temporary duty for rest, rehabilitation and recuperation and who volunteers in writing to return to the theater for a period of service of 6 months or more.

(3) Transfer to Accept Civilian Employment:

(a) Any officer or enlisted personnel who desires to be transferred to a theater in a military status for relief from active duty or discharge to accept civilian employment, provided that documentary evidence is presented to establish the fact that the individual has a civilian job with the United States Government in the theater to which he has requested transfer.

4. The certificate or volunteer statement signed by the individual to qualify for exception from the provision of paragraph 2 will be included in or attached to and transmitted with the individual's WDAGO Form No. 66-1 or service record.

5. Movement orders for personnel excepted from the provisions of paragraph 2 of this letter will include a citation to the subparagraph under which the exception is made in the following statement:

"Personnel included herein are excepted from screening procedures under subparagraph ( ) of letter, AG 370.01 (11 Dec 45) OB-S-A-M, 12 December 1945, subject: Screening of Personnel for Overseas Movement.

6. Personnel removed from overseas shipments under the provisions of this directive will be reassigned by the Major Force concerned.

7. The EDCMR of personnel in the United States on temporary duty, leave or furlough from a theater and relieved from overseas assignment will be 14 days after date of order reassigning such personnel to the Zone of Interior. Copies of such orders will be forwarded to the interested agencies by air mail.

8. Orders prepared in accordance with subparagraphs 3 b and 3 c of letter AG 370.01 (31 Oct 45)OB-S-A-M, 7 November 1945, subject: Screening of Personnel for Overseas Movement, will be considered sufficient to authorize exception to paragraph 2 hereof. The revocation of all outstanding statements whereby an officer has volunteered to continue on extended active duty set forth in Paragraph 4 of Section IV of WD Circular 366, 7 December 1945, does not revoke any volunteer statement signed by an individual for the purpose of complying with the provisions of subparagraphs 3 b and 3 c of letter AG 370.01 (31 Oct 45)OB-S-A-M, 7 November 1945, subject: Screening of Personnel for Overseas Movement.

MEMORANDUM TO ALL AGENCIES OF THE WAR DEPARTMENT GROUPS:

1. The report form attached as an enclosure to War Department Memorandum to all agencies of the War Department Groups, dated 20 October 1945, has been further revised to include "Length of Service" as an additional category under item 4, "Specifically Exempted from Oversea Duty". The categories under item 4 should be rearranged as follows:

- b. Age
- c. Length of Service
- d. Exempted group and activities
- e. Physically Disqualified for Oversea Service

2. The initial revised report will be submitted as of 31 December 1945 and should be forwarded in order to reach this office no later than 10 January 1946.

3. In the future, the reports should reflect new criteria, if any, for discharge and/or exemption from oversea duty which will become effective during the month immediately following the effective date of the report.

MEMORANDUM TO ALL AGENCIES; War Department Groups

SUBJECT: Separation Criteria, Medical Department Officers.

1. The following is supplemental to Office of the Chief of Staff Memorandum to War Department Groups, Subject: New Separation Criteria, dated 16 January 1946 and establishes demobilization criteria for Medical Department officers:
2. Effective 1 February 1946 the following criteria will govern the separation of Medical Department officers, except volunteers and Regular Army officers to include 30 June 1946.
  - a. Medical and Dental Corps officers except those listed in paragraph 3 below: Adjusted service rating score 60, or 39 months active service, or 45 years of age to nearest birthday.
  - b. Veterinary, Sanitary, Medical Administrative Corps: Adjusted Service rating score 60, or 39 months active service, or 42 years of age to nearest birthday.
  - c. Medical Department dietitians and physical therapists: Adjusted service rating score 25, or 24 months service, or 30 years of age to nearest birthday, or married, or have dependent children under 14 years of age, or physical status limited service United States.
  - d. Army Nurse Corps: Adjusted service rating score 25, or 18 months service, or 30 years of age to nearest birthday, or married, or have dependent children under 14 years of age, or physical status is limited service United States.
3. Exception to 2 a are Medical Corps officers with primary or secondary classifications a, b, or c in following military occupational specialties who are assigned to duties utilizing their specialty: 3101, 3105, 3106, 3107, 3102, 3125, 3126, 3130, 3139, 3150, 3153, 3180, 5306, 3325, 3152. Officers in this category will be separated under following criteria: Adjusted service rating score 70, or 45 months active service, or 45 years of age to nearest birthday.
4. Effective April 1, 1946, officers listed in paragraph 3 supra will be separated under the following criteria: Adjusted service rating score 60, or 45 months active service, or 45 years of age to nearest birthday.
5. Computation of length of service will include total active Commissioned and enlisted honorable service, continuous or interrupted since 16 September 1940. Time lost under Articles of War Number 107 will not be included.
6. Adjusted service rating score as used herein is the score computed for each individual as of 2 September 1945.

7. The date the officer becomes eligible for relief from active duty under this directive is the date his point score, age, length of service, or other condition is equal to or greater than the above criteria which is in effect at that particular time. In the case of a MC, DC, OR VC officer who is a graduate of ASTP, his eligibility for separation is suspended until he has completed three years active commissioned service.

8. Officers listed in paragraph 2 a and paragraph 2 d upon becoming eligible for relief from active duty under this policy will be separated or aboard fastest possible transportation for return to United States within 30 days of date of eligibility.

9. Officers listed in paragraph 3 and 4 supra upon becoming eligible for relief from active duty under policy promulgated herein will be separated or aboard the fastest possible transportation for return to the United States within 60 days of date of eligibility.

10. All other personnel will be separated or aboard ship returning to the United States within 30 days of date of eligibility.

11. All officers surplus to requirements of major commands or returned to Zone of Interior from overseas who are within four months of eligibility for release will be separated under provisions of Section 2, Circular 290, War Department, 1945.

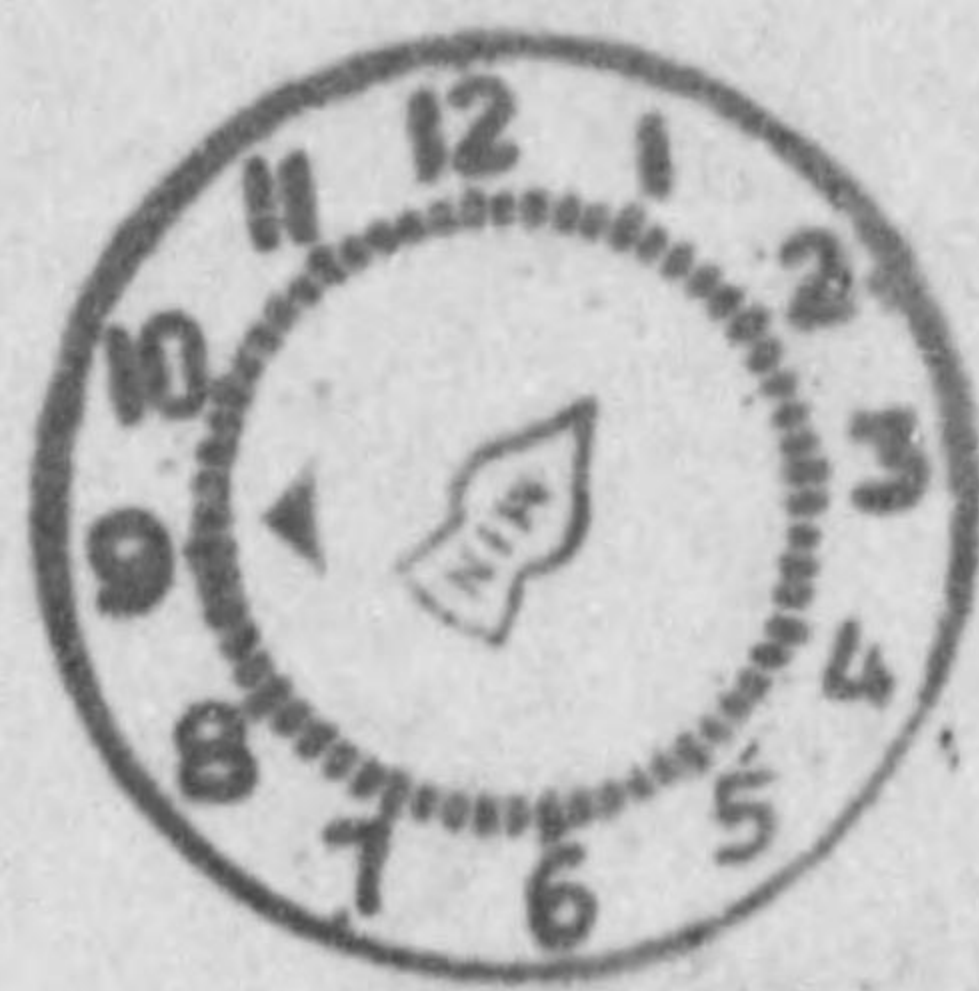

5. Attention is directed to Surplus Property Regulation 14 which may permit the purchase of Government surplus property from disposal agencies by most educational institutions at a reduced cost.

3. Assignment of personnel at reception stations. a. Hereafter, recovered American military personnel (RAMP) arriving at Reception stations from oversea theaters will be given the authorized period of temporary duty at their homes or other points selected by them, in accordance with the provisions of WD letter (AG 383.6 (17 Aug 45) OB-S-A-SFGAM-M), 17 August 1945, subject, Procedure for Processing, Return and Reassignment of Recovered Personnel" (short title: POW), and WD letter (AG 383.6 (29 Oct 45)OB-S)SFGAM-M), 5 November 1945, subject, "Rehabilitation, Recuperation and Recovery Processing of Army Ground and Service Forces Recovered Personnel," with orders to return upon completion thereof to the reception station, where they will be processed for separation or reassignment in accordance with current procedures.

b. Personnel who have returned as patients from oversea commands, and who are ordered to reception stations from U. S. regional, general, or convalescent hospitals will be processed for separation or reassignment in accordance with current instructions for processing oversea returnees.

MEMORANDUM TO: Office Transportation Officers.

Subject: Waiting time, War Department Motor Center Staff Cars.

1. Current regulations concerning passenger transportation service provided by the War Department Motor Center are publicized in memorandum, this headquarters, dated 24 April 1944, File AHC 537(Regs), subject: War Department Motor Center Transportation, copy of which has been furnished each Office Transportation Officer.
2. These regulations stated (Par. 4b(3)) that "Drivers are not permitted to wait more than 30 minutes from time of arrival at destination". In practice this has meant that without special arrangement drivers are permitted to wait 30 minutes from the designated time at which they are to pick up passengers, as well as to wait 30 minutes after delivering passengers at their destination. Abuse of these waiting privileges has resulted in a marked increase in waste of driver and car time. In addition, there has been a sharp increase in the number of cars which have been requested but which were not used after reporting. These abuses, coupled with a shortage of driver personnel, have resulted in an excessive workload for the Motor Center.
3. By direction of the Deputy Chief of Staff, drivers of War Department Motor Center vehicles will not wait for passengers more than 15 minutes after the appointed time at which they are instructed to report, nor will they wait more than 30 minutes from time of arrival at destination without special arrangement having been made in advance through Transportation Branch, AHC, that vehicles are to "remain with" passengers. No exceptions will be made in the first instance. In the second case drivers will be permitted without special approval to wait at destination point for general officers when specifically requested to do so by the general officer involved.
4. This amendment to current instructions will be effective 17 January 1946.

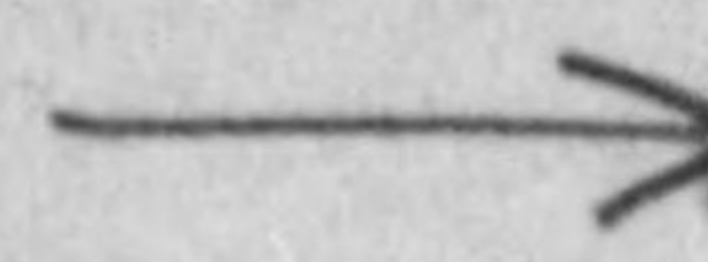



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

MEMORANDUM TO WAR DEPARTMENT GROUPS:

SUBJECT: New Separation Criteria

1. Separation criteria effective 31 Dec 45 will be as follows:
  - a. All officer and enlisted personnel except Medical Department officers. Male officers: ASR 70 or four years service; WAC officers: ASR 37 or three years three months service; male enlisted: ASR 50 or three years six months service; and female enlisted: ASR 32 or two years six months service.
  - b. Effective immediately, WAC (officer and enlisted) who are married to a discharged veteran of World War II become eligible for separation upon their own application, irrespective of the date upon which they enlisted.
2. Separation criteria for Medical Department officers, except ASTP graduates, effective 31 Dec 45 will be as follows:
  - a. Medical Corps officers, (except Group I, Group II and Group III, below), ASR 65 or three years six months service or age 45; Group I officers having primary or secondary classifications A, B or C in the following MOS: 3105, 3107, 3111, 3112, 3115, 3130, 3150, 3180, 3306 and 3325-ASR 70 or three years nine months service or age 45; Group II officers having primary or secondary classifications A, B or C in the following MOS: 3106, 3125, 3126, 3139 and 3153-ASR 80 or continuous active service since prior to 7 December 1941 or age 45; and Group III officers having primary or secondary classifications A, B or C in the following MOS: 3152 only-ASR 80 or continuous active service since prior to 7 December 1941 or age 48.
  - b. Dental Corps and Veterinary Corps officers-ASR 65 or three years six months service or age 45 for Dental Corps and age 42 for Veterinary Corps.
  - c. Separation criteria for Sanitary Corps officers, Army Nurse Corps, Medical Administrative Corps officers, Physical Therapists and Medical Department Dieticians remain unchanged and will continue to be in effect through and after 31 Dec 45.
3. Medical, Dental and Veterinary Corps officers now on active duty who are graduates of the ASTP will not be relieved from active duty under War Department Readjustment Regulations even though they are or may become eligible for relief from active duty by reason of their ASR score, age,

or length of service until they have completed three years active service as a commissioned officer. This action does not prejudice the officers eligibility for relief from active duty for convenience of the government under Section II Circular 290 WD 1945 or upon application of the individual under the provisions of Section III, IV or V, Circular 290 WD 1945.

4. Officers who are or become eligible for relief from active duty under this policy will be released according to the following schedules:

a. All Medical Department officers including Medical Corps officers included in Group I, Group II, and Group III, except Regular Army or volunteers, who became eligible for separation prior to 1 Dec 45 will be reported available for separation prior to 1 Jan 46.

b. All Medical Department officers, except Regular Army or volunteers, who become eligible for separation from 1 Dec 45 to 30 Dec 45, inclusive, will be reported available for separation on or before 28 Feb 46.

c. All Medical Department officers other than Medical Corps officers included in Group I, Group II and Group III, except Regular Army and Volunteers, who become eligible for separation on or after 31 Dec 45 will be reported available for separation within 60 days of the date upon which they individually become eligible under any one of the separation criteria herein announced.

d. All Medical Corps officers included in Group I, Group II and Group III, except Regular Army and volunteers, who become eligible on or after 31 Dec 45 will be reported available for separation within 90 days of the date upon which they individually become eligible under any one of the separation criteria herein announced.

e. All officers other than Medical Department officers, except Regular Army, volunteers and officers listed in Circular 321 WD 45, will be reported available for separation within 60 days of the date upon which they individually become or have become eligible under any one of the approved separation criteria herein or heretofore announced.

f. All volunteers, except Medical Department officers in b and d, above, who sign a Category IV statement under the provisions of Section IV, Circular 366 WD 45, will be reported available for separation within 60 days of the date upon which they individually become or have become eligible under any one of the approved separation criteria herein or heretofore announced, or upon the date of expiration of the agreed term contained in the statement, whichever date is the later.

g. All Medical Department officers included in b, above, who volunteer by signing a Category IV statement under the provisions of Section IV, Circular 366 WD 45, will be reported available for separation on the date of the expiration of the agreed term contained in the statement or 28 February 1946, whichever date is the later.

h. All Medical Department officers included in d, above, who volunteer by signing a Category IV statement under the provisions of Section IV, Circular 366 WD 45 will be reported available for separation within 90 days of the date upon which they individually become or have become eligible under any one of the approved separation criteria herein

and heretofore announced, or upon the date of expiration of the agreed term contained in the statement, whichever date is the later.

5. Enlisted personnel, except personnel listed in WD Memorandum 615-45, must be declared available for separation immediately upon their attainment of eligibility unless they have volunteered under provisions of Change 2 of RR 1-1 or have enlisted in the Regular Army.

6. It is desired that maximum care be exercised to avoid retention of any personnel whose services are not absolutely essential to the assigned mission. Individuals listed in WD Memorandum 615-45 and Section VII, Circular 321 WD 45, may be retained in service for a maximum of six months after the date the individual becomes or has become eligible for separation under any one of the approved separation criteria herein or heretofore announced.

7. Authority for separations will be RR 1-5 for officers and RR 1-1 for enlisted personnel.

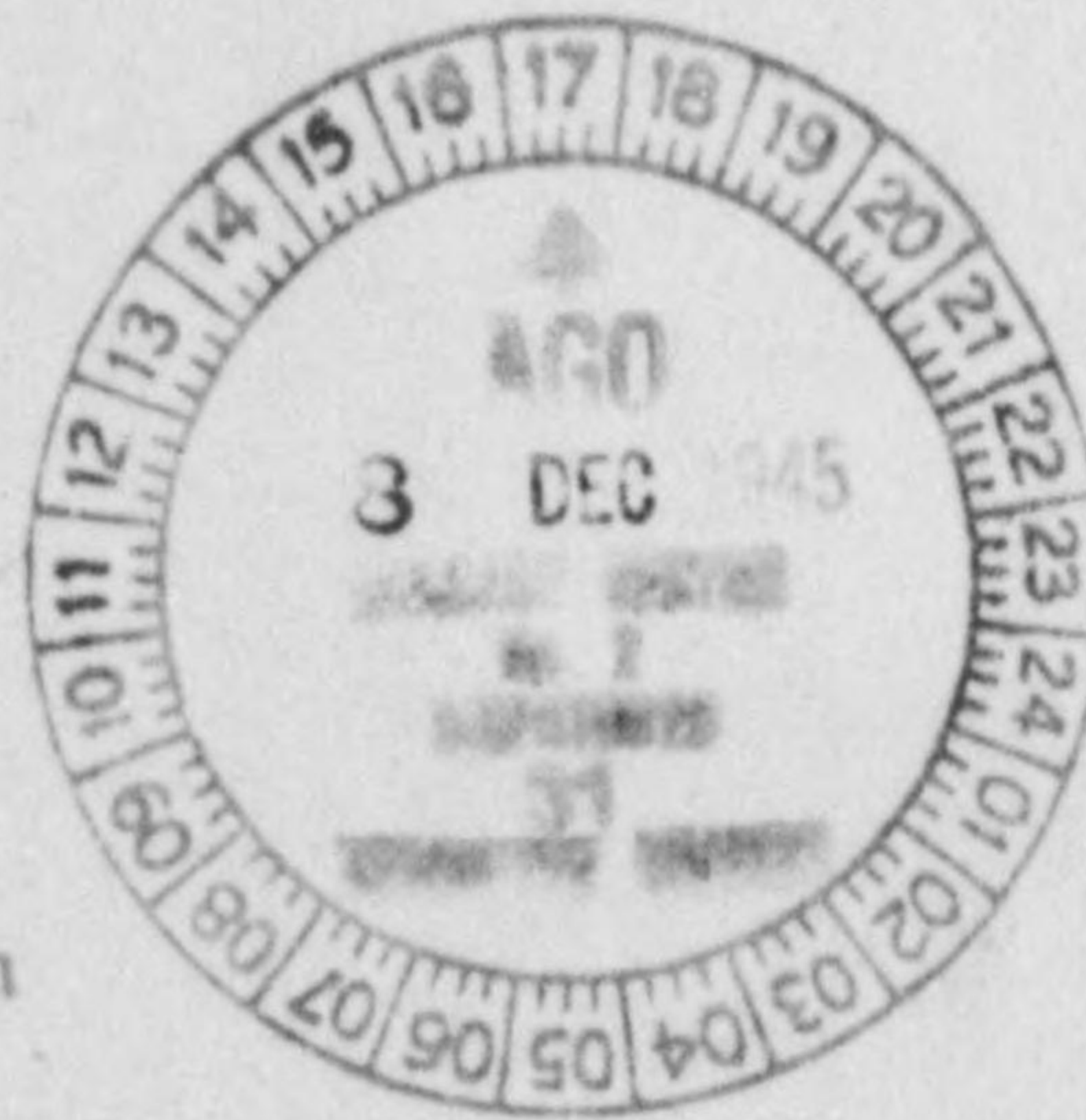
