## Student Government Association

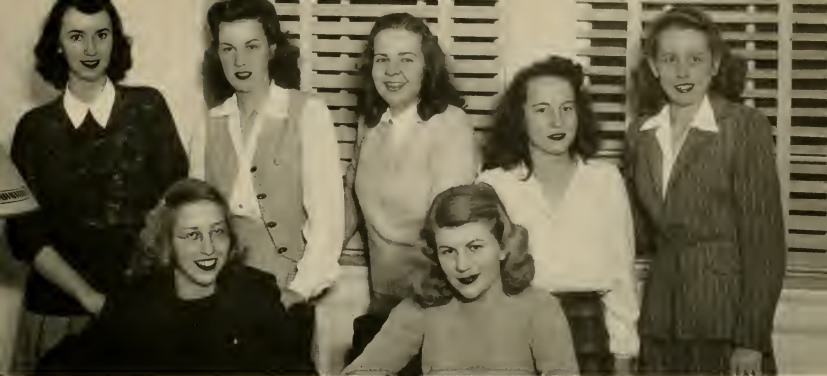

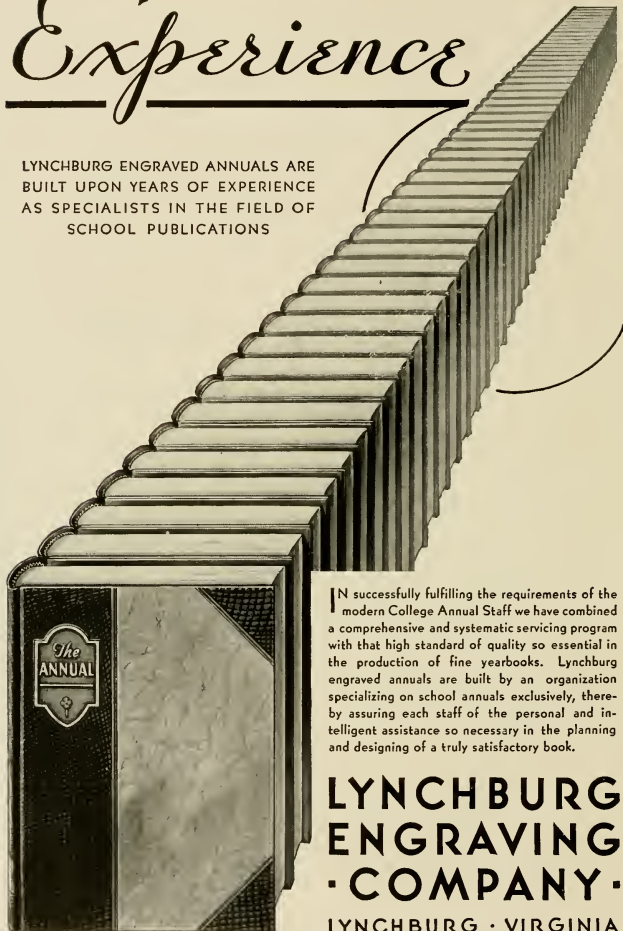
