There were so many present at that meeting that they could not be counted; the entire hall of the Jamat Khana was full. The hall would hold about 1,000 or 1,200. Many of the relators' party came, but I cannot say who. I explained shortly the object for which the neeting was assembled, and caused Ebrahim Meghjee to read out the newspaper article, which he did standing. No discussion took place, but it was decided that a formal notice should be given to As the B. I. S. N. I can't say whether any of the relators' party were present, but the meeting was duly summoned in the usual manner. The answer that had been received was laid before the Jamat, and the entire meeting declared that the party of the relators should be excommunicated—which was accordingly done by the meeting. Aga Khan was not present. It is in accordance with the usages of the caste to excommunicate persons in that manner. No notice was sent, informing those who were excommunicated of the decision of the meeting, but the whole Jamat, being assembled, knew of it. I, Khakee Pudumsey, and sixteen others, were afterwards prosecuted for conspiracy at the Police C art, at the instance of Mooladeena Soomar, but the case was dismissed. After that, the case was brought into the High Coart—in April 1863—and tried before Sir Joseph Arnould and a jury. We were acquitted. I produce the account books of the Bombay Jamat; they contain accounts of the funds I mentioned yesterday.
