ABSTRACT OF FUR LAWS, 1940-41

The trapping, possession, and sale of fur animals and their pelts or other parts are controlled entirely by State laws, but interstate shipments thereof are subject to the scrutiny of Federal officers charged with the enforcement of the Lacey Act (35 Stat. 1137), as amended June 15, 1935, and June 19, 1939.

The accompanying tabulation of the open seasons for 1940-41, in which the opening and closing dates are given, together with a summary of the provisions of State and Provincial laws regarding possession, sale, shipment and export, and licenses, has been prepared primarily as an aid to Federal officials in conducting investigations under the Lacey Act and enforcing its provisions, and to answer inquiries of State game officials, individual trappers, and others.

Every effort has been made to have the summaries substantially correct, but since the trapping seasons in many States and Provinces are subject to change by orders or regulations of the respective game authorities, it is well for trappers and others concerned to familiarize themselves with the provisions of State and Provincial laws, orders, and regulations before engaging in trapping or other activities involving fur animals or parts thereof.

THE FEDERAL LACEY ACT

An Act of Congress of May 25, 1900 (31 Stat. 187) as amended, known as the Lacey Act, provides, among other things, that it shall be unlawful for any person, firm, corporation, or association to deliver or knowingly receive for shipment, transportation, or carriage, or to ship, transport, or carry by any means whatever, from any State, Territory, or the District of Columbia, to, into, or through any other State, Territory, or the District of Columbia, or to a foreign country, any wild animal * * * or the dead body or part thereof imported from a foreign country contrary to any law of the United States, or captured, killed, taken, purchased, sold, or possessed contrary to any such law, or captured, killed, taken, shipped, transported, carried, purchased, sold, or possessed contrary to the law of any State, Territory, or the District of Columbia, or foreign country or State, Province, or other subdivision thereof in which it was captured, killed, taken, purchased, sold, or possessed, or in which it was delivered or knowingly received for shipment, transportation, or carriage, or from which it was shipped, transported, or carried; or to transport, bring, or convey, by any means, from any foreign country into the United States, any wild animal, or the dead body or part thereof, captured, killed, taken, shipped, transported, or carried contrary to the law of the foreign country, or State, Province, or other subdivision thereof, in which it was captured, killed, or taken, or from which it was shipped, transported, or carried. The Act further provides that no person, firm, corporation, or association purchasing or receiving any wild animal, or the dead body or part thereof, imported from any foreign country, or shipped, transported, or carried in interstate commerce, shall make any false record or render any account that is false in reference thereto.

An amendment of June 15, 1935 (49 Stat. 380) confers upon employees of the Department of Agriculture (see note) authorized to enforce the Act, power to arrest any person committing a violation of the Act in his presence or view, and also, under warrant, to search for and seize any wild animals or the dead bodies or parts thereof shipped, transported, or carried in violation of the Act.

An amendment of June 19, 1939 (53 Stat. 840) provides that all packages or containers, except those from foreign countries, in which the furs, hides, or skins of wild animals are shipped, transported, or carried shall be plainly and clearly marked or labeled on the outside thereof with the names and addresses of the shipper and the consignee.

NOTE: Under the Reorganization Act of April 3, 1939 (53 Stat. 561) and Reorganization Plan No. 2 (53 Stat. 1433) the functions of the Secretary of Agriculture relating to wildlife, game, and migratory birds were, effective July 1, 1939, transferred to the Secretary of the Interior. Under Reorganization Plan No. 3, of April 2, 1940, the Bureau of Biological Survey and the Bureau of Fisheries were consolidated into one agency, to be known as Fish and Wildlife Service, effective June 30, 1940.

SHIPMENT AND EXPORT: No restrictions on skins legally taken and on which State tax has been paid.

LICENSES: Resident, \$2.50. Nonresident not permitted to trap. Fur buyer or trader must procure license based on amount of gross sales of preceding year, minimum, \$25.

TRAPPING METHODS: Land fur bearing animals may not be taken by means or aid of any set gun, shot gun, fire, jacklight, pit lamp, searchlight or other artificial light; trap or device known as "klips"; steel bear trap or trap having a greater spread of jaws than 9 inches; strychnine or other poison. Beaver traps must not be set within 25 feet of beaver house or dam, and beaver or muskrat houses or dens, dams, or runways must not be injured or destroyed. Foxes must not be trapped within 100 feet of den.

POSSESSION AND SALE: No restrictions on prime skins legally taken except that beaver skins must be presented to a wildlife agent or other officer of the Commission, with affidavit showing lawful taking, for sealing within 90 days. Skins of blue foxes taken from the wild must be tagged by U. S. Commissioner before being sold.

SHIPMENT AND EXPORT: No restrictions on skins legally taken, but no person engaged in fur farming, or in the fur trade as a dealer or agent, shall possess or transport furs without a license. Packages containing furs must be marked to show contents and names and addresses of consignors and consignees, and shipper must deliver to freight or express agent, or postmaster, at shipping point, a statement showing contents of packages and that no illegal or unsealed skins are contained therein. Blue fox skins (other than those raised on farms having a registered brand and branded with such brand) whether acquired in Territory or imported, must be tagged (fee \$1.50) by U.S. Commissioner. Shipment of unsealed skins of beavers prohibited.

LICENSES: Resident, \$2. Nonresident, general hunting and trapping, \$50. Fur farm, \$2. Alien, special, \$100. Fur dealers: (a) Resident, or association or copartnership of residents, \$10 for each individual; (b) Nonresident, citizen of U.S., or corporation, association, or copartnership formed of citizens of U.S., any member of which is a nonresident of Territory, \$100; (c) Alien individual, corporation, association, or copartnership, any member of which is an alien, \$500. Resident agent of (a), (b), or (c), \$10; nonresident citizen, agent of (a), (b), or (c), \$100; alien agent of (a), (b) or (c), \$500. No license issued to an agent whose principal has not procured appropriate license. TRAPPING LICENSE NOT REQUIRED OF NATIVE INDIANS OR ESKIMOS.

SHIPMENT AND EXPORT: No restrictions on skins legally taken, but packages must be marked with name and address of consignor and consignee, and statement of contents. Parcel post shipments prohibited.

LICENSES: Resident, license required, but no charge. Nonresident, \$25. Aliens not permitted to trap.

ARKANSAS

SHIPMENT AND EXPORT: No restrictions, except fur dealers must report shipments within or out of State.

LICENSES: Resident, 12 or less traps, \$1.50; more than 12 traps, \$20; nonresident, \$50. Fur dealer: Resident, \$5; nonresident, \$50.

CALIFORNIA

LICENSES: Citizens, \$1; aliens, \$2. Licensees must, before July 1, submit report of their catch, with names and addresses of persons to whom sold or shipped. Hunting license required for taking bear.

COLORADO

POSSESSION AND SALE: Skins legally taken may be possessed during open season and for thirty days thereafter. Permit required for possession of skins by trapper and dealer after 30 days from close of season. These permits expire on September 1 of the year of issue, but may be renewed upon application before that date. The permit must accompany pelts sold by trapper, whether sold within or outside of State. If trapper disposes of only part of pelts covered by the permit, the original permit must accompany the pelts disposed of and application made for new permit to cover the remainder.

SHIPMENT AND EXPORT: See Possession and Sale. Licensed dealers are not required to obtain shipping permits for raw furs, but shipping tags provided by the Commission (fee 2¢ each) must be attached to each bundle shipped, and each bundle must show name, address, and license number of shipper. Licensed trappers must obtain shipping permits from the Commission for each shipment of furs out of the State. The permit must be attached to each bundle shipped, and must show number and kind of each pelt in shipment, names of shipper and consignee, and license number of trapper. Licensed dealers must furnish the Commission, on or before June 30, a written report showing number and kind of skins purchased from trappers and the amount paid.

LICENSES: Resident, \$2; nonresident, \$25. Fur dealer: Resident, \$25; nonresident, \$50. Commission may require licensees to submit such reports as it may deem necessary.

LICENSES: Residents 16 years of age or over, trapping, \$3.35; trapping and hunting, \$5.35; trapping, hunting and fishing, \$7.35; residents under 16, \$1.35. Nonresidents not permitted to trap. Fur dealer: Residents, \$5; agent of licensed resident, \$2; nonresidents, \$75.

DELAWARE

Unlawful to take muskrats in time of flood or freshet, or when they are driven from their dens or homes by flood or freshet; and unlawful to take them by the method known as "nailing" or by the use of diving or box traps.

POSSESSION AND SALE, SHIPMENT AND EXPORT: No restrictions on skins lawfully taken, except that it is unlawful to sell or export red fox or red fox hide.

LICENSES: Resident, hunting and trapping, \$1.25; nonresident, hunting and trapping, \$15.50; special 5-day license, \$5.50. Fur dealer, \$5, required for purchasing all pelts except muskrat.

FLORIDA

POSSESSION AND SALE: Skins legally taken may be possessed, bought and sold during the open season and 30 days thereafter, except fur dealers may handle manufactured furs at any time.

SHIPMENT AND EXPORT: Skins legally taken may be shipped and exported during open season and 30 days thereafter. Packages must show name and address of trapper.

LICENSES: Resident (Statewide), \$25.50; county, \$3.25; county other than county of residence, \$10.50. License not required of resident Confederate veterans or other residents 65 years of age or over. Nonresident (Statewide), \$100.50; county, \$25.50. Applicants for licenses must report previous year's catch. Fur dealer: Resident, \$100 for each agent; nonresident, \$500, and \$100 for each resident or travelling agent. Dealers and buyers must report each two weeks the name of trapper from whom pelts are purchased, his license number, and number and kind of pelts purchased.

GEORGIA

POSSESSION AND SALE: Prohibited during close season. Dealers must make such reports as may be required by Division of Wildlife, Department of Natural Resources.

SHIPMENT AND EXPORT: No restrictions on skins legally taken, except that trapper must exhibit his license to transportation agent when making shipments. Express companies must submit report of fur shipments.

LICENSES: Resident, \$5; nonresident, \$25. Fur dealer: Resident, \$10 and \$5 for each agent; nonresident, \$200 and \$5 for each resident or travelling agent.

IDAHO

NOTE: Director of Fish and Game may permit taking of beavers and muskrats in close season when they are damaging irrigation ditches, canals, crops, etc., but pelts must be turned over to Director for sale.

POSSESSION AND SALE: Skins legally taken may be possessed and sold at any time. Unlawful to possess without permit fur animals or hides on which there is no open season.

SHIPMENT AND EXPORT: No restrictions on skins legally taken.

LICENSES: Resident, \$5; nonresident, \$25; alien, \$50. Fur buyer, \$3.

POSSESSION AND SALE: Possession of green hides permitted during open season and 10 days thereafter. Every person taking fur animals must make sworn report to Department of Conservation of all hides of fur animals taken, sold, shipped, or dealt in during November to February, inclusive, not later than the 5th day of the month succeeding the month for which report is made. Fur buyers or tanners of green hides of fur animals are required to keep a record showing name, address and license number of each person, within or outside of State, from which such hides are received, date of receipt, and price paid, which record shall be open to inspection of officers of the Conservation Department, sheriffs, constables or other police officers.

SHIPMENT AND EXPORT: No restrictions on skins legally taken.

LICENSES: For each 25 traps or fraction thereof - Resident, \$2; nonresident \$10. Fur buyers: Resident wholesaler, \$50; retailer, \$10; travelling, \$50; nonresident, \$50.

INDIANA

POSSESSION AND SALE: Fresh skins legally taken may be possessed and disposed of for 5 days after close of season. Licensed fur buyers may possess un-tanned hides taken in open season for 60 days after close of season, and for a longer period if report showing number and kinds of skins, and place of storage, is made to Director of Conservation. No other restrictions on skins legally taken.

SHIPMENT AND EXPORT: No restrictions on skins legally taken, except that shipments must be labeled to show contents and license must be exhibited to carrier.

LICENSES: Resident, \$1.50; nonresident, \$15.50. Fur buyer: Resident, \$10; nonresident, \$25; nonresident jobber to purchase from licensed buyers, \$10.

IOWA

Mink, muskrat, raccoon, opossum, skunk, civet cat, badger . . . Nov. 10-Jan. 10.
Fox, weasel, wolf, wildcat No close season.

POSSESSION AND SALE: Skins lawfully taken may be possessed and sold during open season and for 10 days thereafter, or for a longer period under permit of the Conservation Commission. Licensed dealer may possess at any time hides lawfully acquired. Special permit required for sale of pelts to dealers outside of State. Green hides in process of manufacture may be possessed at any time. Dealers or buyers must, within 10 days after close of season, file with Conservation Commission sworn inventory showing number and kinds of skins purchased.

SHIPMENT AND EXPORT: See above. Skins of protected fur animals legally taken may be exported under permit during open season and first 10 days of close season.

LICENSES: Resident, 15 traps or less, \$1; more than 15, 15¢ per trap, including tag. Nonresident or alien, \$25, plus tag fee of 25¢ per trap. Fur dealers must be licensed - Communicate with Conservation Commission, Des Moines, for information as to fees.

KANSAS

NOTE: State game warden is authorized, after investigation, to cause to be taken, under his supervision, as many beavers as he deems necessary for protection of property.

POSSESSION AND SALE: Skins legally taken may be possessed during first 10 days of close season. No other restrictions on possession and sale of skins legally taken.

SHIPMENT AND EXPORT: Skins may not be shipped except during open season and 10 days thereafter, but licensed dealers may make shipments out of season under permit.

LICENSES: Resident, \$1. Nonresident not permitted to trap. Fur dealer: Resident, \$10; nonresident, \$25.

KENTUCKY

LICENSES: Resident, \$1; nonresident, \$10.50. Fur buyer: Resident, \$2; nonresident, \$7.5.

SHIPMENT AND EXPORT: State tax (otter 25¢; mink, raccoon, 5¢; alligator 1 to 3¢; all other pelts 1¢ each) must be paid on all pelts before being bought and shipped, or exported. No furs or alligator skins may be exported except by the holder of a dealer's license or by the trapper shipping his own catch. Dealer must make sworn statement of shipments out of State.

LICENSES: Resident, \$2. Nonresident not permitted to trap. Fur dealer: Resident, \$150; nonresident, \$300. Fur buyer: Resident, \$25; nonresident \$100.

MAINE

NOTE: Trapping prohibited in Peel River, Yellowknife, Arctic Islands, Mackenzie Mountains, and Slave River Preserves, which have been set aside as hunting and trapping grounds for native Indians, Eskimos, and Halfbreeds.

Royal Canadian Mounted Police, as game officers, may issue permit to trap not more than 15 beavers to any male over 18 years of age who is the holder of a hunting and trapping license, but pelts taken must be delivered to game officer for stamping and recording before exportation. No person other than a permittee may possess unstamped beaver hides. Pelts may be sold under regulation to licensed trader.

POSSESSION AND SALE: Licensed trapper may sell or trade skins he has lawfully taken (See note above relative to beavers).

SHIPMENT AND EXPORT: Furs legally taken may be exported under permit if stamped or sealed by permit officer, upon payment of export tax.

LICENSES: Issuance of trapping licenses is restricted to residents who, on May 3, 1938, held hunting and trapping licenses, and who continue to reside in the Territories, and the children of those who have had their domicile in the Territories for the past four years -- Fee \$2.
