The Alleluatic Sequence was written, and the music composed, in the eleventh century; as some will have it, by Godeschalkus. Though now employed on the highest festivals, it was originally intended as "The Farewell to Alleluia" on Septuagesima Sunday. It is not very common in Missals and Sequentiaries.

It was first translated by me for the *Hymnal Noted*; where the music was, for the first time in England, published. The varying metre only represents that of the original. Most unhappily it has usually been sung to a chant composed (or rather, altered) by the late Mr. Troyte; a proceeding which utterly destroys all the picturesque of the original melody, and reduces to a monotonous level the exquisitely appropriate character of each recurring *Alleluia*.

This may partly be owing to the cost of the Harmonies of the *Hymnal Noted*, and the Sequence is now therefore reprinted by itself. Most earnestly I trust that, in future, and especially in those great choral meetings which now, happily, are becoming so common, this melody, and this only, will be used. When it has once been heard, it will be matter of wonder that the other was ever tolerated.
