Outcomes

Outcomes: Demographics

- 70% of respondents from the English Wikipedia
- Almost all current administrators
- Half of them are currently CheckUsers,
 60% current Oversighters, more than
 half current or former Arbitrators





Outcomes: Issues and policies

Users being uncivil to others

 Communities see this issue very often, and generally feel that this should be an issue delegated to them.

Users attempting to obtain personal information about an underage person to contact them off-wiki

- Half of respondents hadn't seen this issue locally in the past 12 months.
- Almost half disagreed or strongly disagreed that this should be a community-led concern.

Users harassing others through their contributions ("hounding")

 A less regular issue, but one that communities equally feel should be their responsibility.

Users engaging others in personal conversations that make others uncomfortable

 Mixed responses as to the communities' ability to handle this issue, though almost all respondents considered it at least "Somewhat" a problem for communities to handle.



Outcomes: Issues and policies

Users advocating for, encouraging, or defending child abuse / pedophilia

- 40% of respondents stated they had seen this issue more than twice in the past 12 months.
- More common on English Wikipedia than on other wikis.
- Other wikis more likely to believe this should be a community concern rather than one led by the Foundation.

Users with off-wiki / "real-life" convictions for child abuse

- All communities believe this should be something for the Foundation to handle, rather than community members.
- Half of respondents believe their community is totally unable to handle these issues.



On your home wiki, which of these positions have you held?






In the past 12 months, how often have you seen issues related to the following subjects?


Regarding these issues, to what extent do you believe your community can currently deal with them?


Regarding these issues, how much do you believe your community should deal with them?







* Responses were "normalised" by providing them with "scores" as follows, and then taking the average of these scores across all responses.






In the past 12 months, how often have you seen issues related to the following subjects?






Regarding these issues, to what extent do you believe your community can currently deal with them?






Regarding these issues, how much do you believe your community should deal with them?





With regards to the following issues, do you agree or disagree that the community should be in charge of dealing with them?




