NOTES:

1. DERN was originally viewed as an informant targeted against the KVP. At this time he was assigned to UV 151 of the E, which was headed up by Hans Guenther (see below).

2. In August 1952 arrested by BND requested Karl KRICK, former member of the SA and Hitler's personal bodyguard. The recruitment was formalized in August 52, and he worked for BND until January 53 when he went to the police in Berlin and claimed BND was threatening him with a gun to force him to reveal certain information. Investigation of BND revealed KRICK as an SS man who was working against BND. DERN was exonerated and KRICK was sentenced to prison, but the resulting publicity blew BERNAU, DERN, and several other members of BND's organization to all the Western and hostile intelligence services. See KRICK Flap for details.

3. At one time during this period DERN was leader of Filiale 000 of UV 151, and was subsequently put on inactive status for a time. It is likely this was done in connection with the KRICK Flap.

4. In May and June 1952 DERN received training in positive operations.

5. In March and April 1953 DERN was arrested three times on suspicion of espionage resulting from attempts to interview or brief East Zone refugees. Following the third arrest DERN was cautioned that DERN would be unwell in Berlin if he continued to be arrested with such frequency. There is no subsequent arrest record.

6. As of March 56 DERN was still working in Berlin as an interrogator targeted against the KVP.

1. Enclosures 1 through 12 to this report consist of all BAUN material dated August, September, or October 1947.

2. Enclosure 1 is a note from DINTER to BAUN, dated 5 August 1947, asking who received the payments of \$9,000, \$4,000, and \$2,000; the name of the recipient had been indicated only by an abbreviation. DINTER also asks when, by whom, and from what funds did Marina (later spelled JURIAATI by DINTER) receive the sum of \$2,000. (Field Comment: Marina JURIAATI or JURIAATI does not appear in POB files. She has previously appeared, however, in para. 3 of reference.)

3. Enclosure 2, dated 8 August 1947, is BAUN's answer to the above query. He states that, as well as he can remember, the recipients were as follows:

a. Of \$9,000, V-man SPIRIDONKA (at the time of his trip to France); ties to former Comintern circles. (Field Comment: Former Colonel Alexis Ivanovich SPIRIDONOV appears frequently in POB files. A POB request for info, dated 6 October 1948, asks ZIPPER about SPIRIDONOV and states that he was formerly a colonel in the ROA (Russian Army of Liberation), that before 1948 he became a member of the SAF (St. Andrew's Flag), that he was close to General Peter von CLASENAPP, and that he was a member of the central committee of AZODIR. He also published a newspaper, Free World, in Freising and Eggenburg. The POE query adds that he "is reportedly working for an American intelligence service" without pay. A memo of 1 December 1948 states that Col. SPIRIDONOV does not enjoy the confidence of ZIPPER. Another ZIPPER memo, same date, is a lengthy study of the Russian emigration. It criticizes Gen. CLASENAPP for surrounding himself with persons of dubious loyalty and mentions SPIRIDONOV as one such person. A 7821 Composite Group memo to ID Ops Franch, 3 December 1948, states that Alexis Ivanovich SPIRIDONOV is not a member of ZIPPER and is suspected of maintaining connections with pro-Soviet circles. He published Svobodnoje Slovo, supposed to be an SAF paper, which failed to back the anti-Bolshevik line. Working with him on this paper were fru DAR and fru GARKUSCHA, reportedly Soviet agents and criminals. SPIRIDONOV was also the friend of fru BUDEFAZKIN, suspected of being a Soviet agent.

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Fnu WILHELM, an agent of the Soviet Mission in Munich, told a ZIPPER source that in his opinion certain persons connected with the SAF were receiving money from Soviet sources and said that two such persons might be fnu KARAKUTSKO and SPIRIDONOV. A ZIPPER memo of 11 January 1949 states that the fact that one Alex. VESOSTAYEV is a member of the SPIRIDONOV circle is another cause to suspect that he is cooperating with the Soviet IS. The last entry in the attachment to WEL-A-6651, 25 May 1951, places SPIRIDONOV in the BARNOWSKI complex. WES-A-399h, 26 May 1951, names three persons whom the British name as able to give info about the whereabouts of the Soviet agent Alexander CHERLOV. One of these is SPIRIDONOV, said by the British to be residing in Bavaria.)

b. Of \$4,000, W-man ELUER (on the occasion of his trip to Switzerland) to be used to maintain former connections to the WELNIK and LESITZKI groups. (Field Comment: Although ELUER is one of the cover names formerly used by Alfons Ferdinand SOLDIERMANN (who appeared previously in para. 2 j of WEL-A-129h3), it is more likely that the person meant here is Erich ELUER, who was passed by ZIPPER to the Swiss. See WEL-A-1942 and 5716.)

c. The recipient of the \$2,000 was W-man BAUER, who was to use the money in an attempt to take up a connection with fnu BERCHTOLD. (Field Comment: Fnu BAUER might possibly be the Fritz BAUER mentioned in para. 2 h of WEL-A-129h3. Another long shot is Dr. Herbert BAUER, who appears in para. 1 a of WEL-A-73. Fnu BERCHTOLD appears in para. 2 m (2) (a) of WEL-A-129h3 and in para. 1 g of WEL-A-73.)

d. When Fr. C (STILTYE) went out of Germany for the second time, he left \$2,000 in the custody of BAUN, from a total of \$4,000 received by STILTYE. The \$2,000 was to remain with BAUN until a courier picked it up. On the request of Marina JURLATI the \$2,000 was forwarded to Italy in two payments. \$1,000 was forwarded through JURLATI herself, who was escorted to Munich by MILLER. The other \$1,000 was taken by DIC to Italy and handed over there.

4. Enclosure 3, 11 August 1947, is a second query by DINTEP re the \$2,000 given to Marina JURLATI; and Enclosure 4, 12 August 1947, is BAUN'S reply that he has already answered the query on 8 August.

5. Enclosure 5, dated 18 August 1947, is a letter from Walter COLLASIUS to Frau Ruth BAUN in which COLLASIUS asks how certain Christmas gifts were distributed at Christmas 1946. (Field Comment: Walter COLLASIUS has previously appeared in para. 17 a of WEL-A-12873 and in para. 7 a of reference. It may be worth noting that the letter is in his own hand.)

6. Enclosure 6, dated 19 August 1947, states that the gifts were passed out, as nearly as Ruth BAUN can remember, as follows:

a. Suits: KOPADI, SCHMIDLE (radio), DANIEL, KOENIGBERG, BARN, LOUIS, FICHLER, HA S (?), BASCHNE, WULFERT, WOLF, FANPER (?), von ROCKLEY, KEP. (Field Comment: fnu KOPADI, a cover name, appeared

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in para. 2 of reference. Although time does not permit a check of all POB cards on Frau SCHNEIDER, a check with our cover section has shown the name to be a cover name of Leopold PARS of 236, who has appeared in MGL-A's 7832 and 7993. Frau DEBELT may be i/w the Paul DEBELT who appears in PULLF's - 2204, 2205, and 2213, as well as MGL-A-677a and NK-A-11023; it is more probable, however, that DEBELT is here a cover name. POB has cards on Hans KRUMHOLTZ, Kennkarte H 420 582, but no record of a Frau KRUMHOLTZ. Alfred KRUMHOLTZ has appeared previously in para. 17 b (2) of MGL-A-12873. Frau LORENZ appears in para. 6 b of reference and Enclosure 10 to reference. Frau FICHLER (another cover name of KLAUSNER) appears in para. 2 of reference. Frau DAUS has appeared previously in para. 4 f (2) of ECL-A-73 and in para. 2 of reference. Frau RASCHKE was mentioned in para. 9 e of reference. Frau WOLFERT is almost certainly identical with Otto WOLFERT, the cover name of Otto HUELLER, now chief of the voice monitoring group of 236. Otto HUELLER appeared in MGL-A-7832, MGL-A-7993, and para. 2 j of MGL-A-12943. Frau WOLF appears in para. 2 of reference. Frau BANNER is the cover name of Alfons BOEDI BANNER; see para. 4 c (2) (b) of ECL-A-73. E. von SACZYNSKI appears in the attachment to NK-A-25709. Frau KERSTEN has been difficult to trace because of the frequency with which the name appears in our files. A memo of 30 September 1947 from the ICG to 34.3 states that the (Frau) KERSTEN concerning whom 34.3 had made inquiry is not identical with the brother-in-law of Frau DAUS but is a courier who worked in the British Zone in 1946 and had been in the U.S. Zone since the beginning of 1947. Under its jurisdiction, unfortunately, the ICG had two couriers named KERSTEN. One of these is Dietrich KERSTEN, whose address (in a ZIPPER memo of 1 June 1948) was listed as Gross Ostheim Villa Eder, Aschaffenburgstrasse. The British, a year earlier, had identified a Frau KERSTEN as a courier for Hugo Karl Heritz LACHMUND of Organization 102 (which was part of the ICG, having been originally part of Org. 500). Since LACHMUND is listed, in still another internal ZIPPER memo, as the person administratively responsible for the Villa Eder in Gross Ostheim, it follows that Dietrich KERSTEN worked for LACHMUND; he carried money and supplies to agents. Dietrich KERSTEN was born 1 May 1926 in Berlin. POB carries not only the Gross Ostheim address for him but also # 65 Bahnhofstrasse, Munich-Zooetting. He has been dropped, although our records do not show when. Another person who may be the man mentioned in Frau ENICH's letter is Walter KERSTEN, born 6 July 1926 in Obersuhl and living (in July 1947) at Einsteinstrasse 16, Obersuhl. Walter KERSTEN was also a courier in Organization 500. Walter KERSTEN also appears on an ICG list of 13 May 1947 as a courier of Org. 500; his address is given as Obersuhl, Detra. He was dropped in May 1948. First listed as courier 109, he was later given the number 11 11, which number belongs to the block assigned Org. 101. This fact would seem to exclude any possibility that Dietrich and Walter KERSTEN are identical. The 11 11 number also appears on the Christmas list of 6 December 1949, where it is assigned to G. H. Other KERSTENS who may have worked for the ICG also appear in our files. In April 1949 we received via ECID a French identity request on Robert KALLISCHER, Robert SCHNEIDER, and KERSTEN, born 26 May 1925 in

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Leipzig. We have no record of a ZIPPER reply to this query. A Hans KOSTER was issued "E" ID card # 02677, dated 23 June 1951. Abstracted from this card is the following: Bayrische Lagerversorgung Muerzburg; 238 Oberer Viehsarkt, Muerzburg; truck registration # AB 46-5268. A Udo von KOSTEN was one of twenty-five agents of Org. 500 (and later of a splinter org., 101) arrested in the Russian Zone (in Neuruppin) and dropped on 1 February 1947 because it was suspected that he had been turned by the Soviets. The address of Udo von KOSTEN was listed in 1948 as Tiepen bei Bad Neunorf/Hannover.)

b. Overcoats: KOWADI, PICHLER (?), SCHNEIDER (radio), DEBELT, KEMMEL.

c. Material: Mrs. DAUS, LORENZ, POHL, ERNDT; Herr von LOSSOW, HOLT, ERNDT. One sent to Schritten without being assigned to a recipient. (Field Comment: Fnu POHL previously appeared in para. h f (2) of MEL-A-73. Hans Ludwig von LOSSOW appears in para. 2 of reference and numerous earlier memos. Fnu HOLT may be identical with a (Dr.) fnu HOLT who appears in a UJ DRESDEN housing list as having lived in the Blue House in Oberursel as of February 1948. Another and remoter possibility is Dr. Walter von HOLT; see HQ-W-12787 and MEL-A-11266.)

d. Shoes: KELLER, RENNIG, KRONENBERG, KORN, RASCHKE, PICHLER, HOLT, SCHNEIDER (radio), WOLPERT, KOWADI, von SACZYNSKI. Five or six pairs of women's shoes, of which one pair to Frau GIES and one to Frau ERNDT. (Field Comment: Fnu KELLER, who is probably i/w Alex CALLARIUS, appeared in para. 9 c of reference. Fnu RENNIG has been mentioned in para. 9 b of MEL-A-12673 and in Enclosure 10 of reference. Frl. fnu GIES does not appear in POB files. We do have, however, a record of a telephone conversation of 18 February 1952, a person-to-person call from Malermeister (Master painter) fnu GIES to Frau fnu RASCHKE, whose phone number is Neustadt/Harburg 235. GIES was calling from Munich 73442, which is the telephone number in the G C operational house at Koderbacherstrasse 3, Munich 25.)

7. Enclosure 7 is a letter written to the IGO by DINTER and dated 23 August 1947. It states that because the Jagdhaus has only a few occupants left, the retention of three servants can no longer be justified. In accordance with a discussion held with Frl. Mathilde SCHNEIDER, Frl. Waltraut SCHNEIDER will go to the house in Schritten on 25 August 1947 to work as a maid (Hausgehilfin). (Field Comment: POB has a record of a Frl. Mathilde SCHNEIDER who is a nurse in the compound. She was born on 21 October 1909 in Moenchroeden and lives in Moenchroeden at Schulstr. 76. She appeared in MEL-A-4584. It is unlikely, however, that she is i/w the Frl. Mathilde SCHNEIDER mentioned here. POB has no record of Frl. Waltraut SCHNEIDER.

8. Enclosure 8, undated, is BAUN's memo for the record, in which he speculates upon the causes of his downfall and makes DINTER the villain of the piece. The enclosure adds nothing to our present fund of information.

9. Enclosure 9, dated 17 September 1947, is a letter to BAUN from TILITY. It reads as follows:

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"Because I cannot come to you today, as I had intended to do, I should like to transmit the following short orientation to you by way of your son.

"About two days ago documentary evidence appeared to show that the Jagdhaus has been compromised as your dwelling. We must therefore start to think about changing your dwelling as soon as something suitable can be found. This fact is for your personal guidance only, and I request that you handle it as very secret.

"The original assumption that your 'Gartenlaube' ("arbour") and especially your son REINER had been compromised has been proven groundless, and therefore there is nothing to prevent an exchange of the automobile then in use for your car - at least, for the car which REINER now drives. (Field Comment: REINER is thus established as a cover name for BAUN's son Rolf. See para. 6 d, above, and earlier references.)

"I request of you that the official explanation should continue to be that the automobile was down here as a replacement for my own car, on which repairs were first completed this evening.

"I should also like to ask of you, as I shall explain further during a visit to be held this week, that you write out a not-too-detailed report on the experiences encountered in first building the organization, the basic rules and policies, as the first part of your new assignment. I intend to submit this piece of work to Col. K. It is desirable that the job be finished in about three weeks; sooner would be better.

"With best wishes, to your wife as well,

10. Enclosure 10 is a memo from 34.0 to the recipients listed. It was hand-carried by UTILITY to BAUN on 22 September 1947, the date it was typed. It states that the following persons would begin work on 25 September 1947 in the stated sections:

- a. Herr (fnu) BEENDORFF will break in with 34.2.
- b. Herr (fnu) BORIS will break in with 45.1.
- c. Frä. (fnu) LIETZ will start work with 34.4.

(Field Comment: SFRAN 6168 of 3 September 1952 reported that a Manfred BEENDORFF had worked for ZIPPER until recently, but SPULL 4037 of 4 September 1952 states no record POE or ZIPPER. Please note, however, that para. 15 e refers to a fnu BEENDORFF who, in October 1947, was to be appointed deputy to KOENIG in the evaluation section. It appears probable that he is i/w the BEENDORFF mentioned by 34.0 in Enclosure 10. POE has no record of fnu BORIS. Frä. Saltraut LIETZ, born 19 November 1927, a German, was dropped without prejudice on 8 October 1951. She appears in HCF-A-13306.)

11. Enclosure 11 is a letter dated 11 October 1947 and sent to BAUN by P. WEBER. (Field Comment: Although we have cards on three men named Peter WEBER (cover name) plus one Paul, none of them seem to be identical with the writer of this letter.) A translation of the letter follows:

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"In settling the matter of pay for Dr. (lawyer) HAENISCH, doubts have arisen concerning the conditions under which he was given the assignment of representing the interests of the organization. Because it is important to me to fulfill correctly the various commitments incurred by us as well as by Dr. HAENISCH, I should be thankful to you if you would state the conditions under which you gave him an assignment last year and whether an agreement about his compensation was reached at that time.

(Field Comment: Dr. Paul Kurt HAENISCH, special connection, has been a legal advisor to UTILITY almost since the founding of the organization. He was born on 27 August 1899 in Schriem, Germany, and now resides in Koenigstein/Taunus, 19 Adelheidstr. His Kennkarte, # M 101 499, was issued 30 September 1946 in Bad Homburg. He has payroll # 4612. He appears in FULL-2648. He is being UJ-DREDCERed.)

12. Enclosure 12, dated 14 October 1947, is BAUN's reply to the foregoing. He states that it was agreed with Dr. HAENISCH that he would receive all incidental costs incurred in the course of transacting organizational business and that to avoid needless friction he could draw such costs in advance. In addition, he was to be repayed whenever he represented the organization in his capacity as a lawyer. A car and paid chauffeur were to be given him by the organization, and this was done. From time to time small gifts in goods were given him. Until January 1947 Dr. HAENISCH had not been required to act on behalf of the organization, and therefore no legal fees were paid to him.

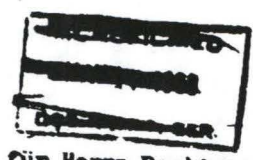

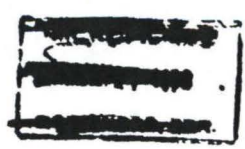

Sehr geehrter Herr Weber!

In Beantwortung Ihres Schreibens vom 11.10.47 betr. das Honorar des Rechtsanwaltes Dr. H. kann ich Ihnen folgendes mitteilen:

Ein monatliches Fixum war nicht festgesetzt, sondern unter Voraussetzung der Wahrung der Interessen der Organisation ist folgender Ausgleich geschaffen worden:

1. Sämtliche Berauslagen, die im Zusammenhang der Tätigkeit für die Organisation entstehen, werden auf Anforderung zurückerstattet. Zur reibungslosen Erledigung war ihm die Erhebung von Vorschüssen genehmigt.
2. Dr. H. ist berechtigt, neben den Unkosten die normalen Anwaltsgebühren für seine Tätigkeit von der Organisation einzusuchen.
3. Dr. H. waren zur Ausübung seiner Tätigkeit ein Wagen mit Brennstoff und die Besahlung eines Fahrers zugesagt. Die Wartung des Wagens übernahm die Organisation im eigenen Interesse.
4. Von Fall zu Fall wurden Dr. H. nach Bedarf kleinere Warenswendungen gemacht.
5. Hatte ich mir vorbehalten, Dr. H. für besonders wertvolle Unterstützung eine Extravergütung sukzessen zu lassen.

Bis Januar 1947 hatte Dr. H. noch keine Angelegenheit der Organisation abschliessend durchgeführt, weshalb bis dahin auch keine Anwaltskosten an ihn entrichtet werden konnten. Es war ihm lediglich ein Vorschuss, dessen Höhe mir nicht mehr erinnerlich ist, gezahlt worden, über den er zu gegebener Zeit abrechnen sollte. Der Wagen und Brennstoff waren ihm schon zur Verfügung gestellt.

• UJVENTURE Study of Dienststelle 62

ACTION REQUIRED: None, for your information

(1). Forwarded herewith is an UJVENTURE study of Dienststelle 62, one of the six large UFFWING operations bases. The study is based on an analysis of certain basic source documents and the Munich Base files. The source documents include the 1955 OPTIK (UFFWING Field Organizational Chart), the Master List of UFFWING agents current to 15 March 1956, the UFFWING Base List dated 1 April 1956, and the UJVENTURE Notebooks. The Munich Base files include the T-Plan (Agent) card file, an extremely valuable source of personality data.

(2). Also forwarded as attachments to this study are the UJVENTURE Sheets on forty-one members of the Dienststelle. This includes all members of the Dienststelle who were included on the Base List and upon whom UJVENTURE Sheets have not already been prepared with the exception of ten individuals upon whom insufficient information is available in Munich Base files. Of these ten, three are case officers and seven are secretaries.

History of Dienststelle 62

(3). Dienststelle 62 in its present form can be traced back to Organization 120, a large and unruly group set up in the post-war period with Headquarters in Stuttgart and targeted against obtaining OS information in the Soviet Occupied Zone of Germany. In late 1949 Project 125 outlined a proposed re-organization of UFFWING sub-offices and field operations, and in the fall of 1950, the various General Agencies, or GV's were set up. Organization 120 was split into two groups and GV 5 under the leadership of Eberolf ZUBER, and ACKERMAN came into being. GV 5 had its headquarters in Ufa and was targeted principally against the Soviet Occupied Zone of Germany and the CSR. In January 1954 a further re-organization took place when the General Agencies were replaced by Dienststellen, and GV 5 became Dienststelle 73. ZUBER remained Leiter, and apparently the internal organization was not drastically affected by the change. Headquarters of Dienststelle 73 was Augsburg. On 15 May 1955 the final re-designation took place and Dienststelle 73 became Dienststelle 62. Dienststelle Headquarters remained Augsburg, and ZUBER remained Dienststelle Leiter.

In addition to the above staff members, was man, Herbert Duester, works as Staff Sergeant in West Berlin with the duties of coordinating the efforts of the various Intelligence operating out of that city. He is the "eyes and ears" of the West-Berlin Staff in Berlin. Finally it is believed the Staff employs a driver and a pedestrian.

(8). The eight intelligence under Wintelstein are bear the letter designations, X, Y, A, B, C, D, E, G, H, I, and J, and fall into three categories. X is charged with establishing stay-behind W/I agents within the DRG. Y, B, C, and V are relatively small, have no facilities under them, and have relatively narrow missions, all within the Federal Republic. Z, E, H, I, and J, the third group, have large organizations with several facilities under each, and carry on active operations in West Berlin and the DRG.

C. Wintelstein

The mission of this intelligence is the training and placing of stay-behind W/I operators (Afus) throughout the DRG. In late 1955, W had six Afus in place with their equipment and had three more in various stages of training. One other Afu, code name HAIN, was arrested in the DRG in 1956 and his equipment was confiscated. He was sentenced to death for espionage, but there is no indication whether the sentence was carried out. Another Afu, code name WACH, is of interest

also subsequent to his being placed within the cell, he was selected as one of a group of students to study at the University of Moscow. He was later dropped from the university, allegedly for health reasons, but probably because of his refusal to take part in Communist student groups, and is presumably in place within the USSR once again. It should be noted that due to the nature of the mission, it is unable to effectively test the capabilities. The father of Zsigmondo is in British SOE/USAID, and Zsigmondo headquarters are in West Berlin.

3. Zsigmondo 3

The chief of Zsigmondo 3 is Osmund BISHOP, and his deputy is Robert SMITH. These two individuals together with two others and five interpreters comprise the entire Zsigmondo, whose mission is the intercepting of radio signals, messages, and legal travelers in what was formerly the British occupied zone of Germany. The present area of operations of the Zsigmondo is broken down into two sectors: the Hamburg-Dresden area, and North Berlin-Berlin. One sector is located in each of these areas, and three of the five interpreters are located in the Hamburg-Dresden area. As of 1955, the Deputy and one of the interpreters operated out of British interception centers. The Zsigmondo headquarters are in Helligshagen, near Wessendorf.

4. Zsigmondo 4

Zsigmondo Headquarters is located in Gumbach and consists of a father, Kerstin SCHMIDT, his deputy, Almut KRIST, and a secretary. The workable is quite small and is targeted against the GDR, but contains only legal operations consisting of the intercepting and deciphering of refugees and legal travelers. The area of operations is generally confined to Berlin. Although only the three individuals listed above operated on the Deutscher Luft, as of 15 February 1956, Zsigmondo 4 had two others, six interpreters, a special communications unit, a secret writing expert, and two "leg men". In addition to these staff agents, it utilized four agents stationed along the West German-GDR border as primary interceptors.

5. Zsigmondo 5

Zsigmondo 5, the fourth of the smaller Zsigmondos, has two headquarters and area of operation in West Berlin, and all of its personnel are located there with the exception of one operator who lives in Dreyersdorf, 100, and who operates throughout the GDR. The Zsigmondo father is August von PAULSEN and Zsigmondo and his deputy is Kerstin SCHMIDT. The Zsigmondo staff is composed of three two men and four secretaries. The Zsigmondo, itself, has a varied mission and has six interpreters, each of whom is trained to handle a particular type of intercepting including such topics as commands, politics, medicine, and the GDR. At least two of these interpreters also carry on GDR operations. The systems work with the interceptors. A further activity carried on by the Zsigmondo is early

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1966 was an attempt to build a list aimed at the penetration of the ... In this effort the Weigstalle worked through a man who had been trained in such operations in Amsterdam. This man (NY) supports the operations of the Weigstalle.

e. Weigstalle:

Weigstalle is possibly the biggest of the Amsterdam 62 sub-offices, and controls, in addition to three large Filiales, or principal agent units, two additional Filiales which were reported to be quite small and in the process of organization as of March 1966. Weigstalle headquarters is located in West Berlin and is under the leadership of Friedrich Stiller. Stiller maintains a small staff composed of a deputy and a secretary and works mostly through the Filiales. The three large Filiales also operate out of West Berlin and have large agent operations running into the zone. The Filiales, like the Weigstalle, bear letter designations. Weigstalle I, Filiales are NY 1, 2, 3 and NY 4, 5 and NY 6 and 7. The large Filiales, are targeted against NY 1, 2, 3 and 4 and NY 5 and 6 and 7. NY 1 and 2 are the large Filiales, are targeted against NY 1, 2, 3 and 4 and NY 5 and 6 and 7. In this effort they have recruited agents, observers, photo teams and legal travelers. Filiale is known about the current status of Filiale 1 and 2, although it has been determined that ... was to be targeted against the ...

f. Weigstalle:

Headquarters for Weigstalle is West Berlin and the area of operations of this group includes East Berlin and the ... Helmut Stiller, an "old-timer" with ... in Weigstalle later and his deputy is Gunther ... as of March 1966 ... Weigstalle I, the bulk of the work is apparently carried on within the Filiales. The Weigstalle has three Filiales, 1, 2 and 3. Of these, 1 and 2 are quite large and have agent agents throughout the zone. I targets itself against the collection of NY 1, 2, 3 and 4, but does have one penetration agent within the zone in Chemnitz. I works against all fronts of the transportation industry within the zone and has, in addition to seven penetration agents, four agents who are classified as high-level sources. The Filiales was established in April 1955 and as of March 1966 was still in the formative stages, and had as of that date one source within the zone. The mission of Filiale 1 is the collection of NY 1, 2, 3 and 4 information.

g. Weigstalle:

Under Gunther ... (NY 1, 2) below) is the sister of Weigstalle I and his deputy is ... (probably an alias). A secretary completes the Weigstalle staff. The Weigstalle operates out of West Berlin as do the two large Filiales. Filiale 1 operates against the transportation industry within East Berlin and has two penetration agents including one who is classified as a highly placed source. An eleventh agent, also a penetration, works against an unperfected economic target. Filiale 2, the largest Filiale under any of the Weigstalle, has the mission of reporting on economic targets throughout East Berlin, and in 1966 had thirteen agents classed as penetration agents, one of whom



was considered to be a high-level source. In addition to the Pillale letter, Klaus ... and his secretary, various other individuals work for the Pillale (Pillale) communication links and spotting.

b. Wiegeltalle I

Wiegeltalle I was its headquarters in West Berlin and is under the leadership of gen Paul SCHULDER, a man considered by WIEGELT to be extremely capable, particularly in the scientific and technical field. He is an old friend of Peter H. Ramos. His present degree is unknown. Wiegeltalle I differs from the other large Wiegeltalle in that it carries on extensive operations within West Berlin through the spotting of targets for both destruction and harassment. Also, several operational activities are carried on directly under the Wiegeltalle Staff, possibly because of SCHULDER's abilities, a number of spotters work directly under him. It directly supervises large numbers of laboratories in the scientific and technical field, and works directly with the controls in the person of ALBERT as well as with ALB. Final activity carried on directly under SCHULDER is the control and direction of a principal agent within West Berlin who directs a large East Berlin group targeted against the penetration of journalistic circles to obtain insight into current political opinions and trends. Three Pillales have been set up under Wiegeltalle I; however, none have been given letter designations. One of the Pillales is directed against the DAI air-frame industry, and in early 1966 had six spotters, one within the DAI, and two penetration agents in place. The other two Pillales were in the formative stage in early 1966, one targeted against the East Berlin political situation in an effort similar to that run by the Wiegeltalle Staff, and the other targeted against scientific targets, including personalities, within the DAI. Some of the principals of the Pillales appear on the Home List, an indication that they may have never gotten off the ground, possibly due to flags or to lack of protection.

1. Pillale G

Wiegeltalle G had one Pillale operating directly under the Wiegeltalle staff as of early 1966. It had two general relations involving contact with WIEGELT Special Comotions in the Berlin area and the organization of a penetration of journalistic circles in East Berlin. As in the case of the Pillales under Wiegeltalle I, none of the members of Pillale G appeared on the Home List, which could point to the possibility it has been disbanded, re-organized, or possibly absorbed by one of the Wiegeltalles.

COVER

(9). The current cover firm used by Wiegeltalle G Staff is not known, nor are the covers used by the Lower Level organizations known. It is known that the PHD Wiegeltalle Staff uses the firm Schneiders Industrieherrings GmbH, located in Wiesbaden, a village outside of Wuppertal, for ordering office supplies, servicing vehicles, and other daily housekeeping needs. This is a blind, however, and probably exists only as a telephone located in the home of one of the staff members.

business. The firm no longer exists, but it has been determined that the staff is  
located in a public office building near the center of Augsburg. Division staff  
members list themselves, with two exceptions, as salesman, and this indicates by  
inference that commercial cover is still used by the Wiesenthal staff.

(10). Wiesenthal headquarters and the central maintain a daily courier run  
by rail in addition to cable communication. Routing is known of the communication  
between Wiesenthal headquarters and the lower echelons except that pouch traffic  
between the headquarters and those elements in West Berlin is routed through the  
central communication line between Frankfurt and West Berlin via De Wittsburg. It  
transportation facilities, generally communication between the case officers and  
their agents include all those methods of clandestine communication generally in use  
including V/C. V/C is available only to Wiesenthal, whose agents are all trained  
in stay-behind assets.

Flags

(11). Flags are found to occur when an organization as large as Wiesenthal 62  
runs extensive operations into the USSR, where the KGB is fully alert to the effort.  
It should be noted, however, that compared to other Disruption which have been  
disrupted or suspended because of flags, Wiesenthal 62 has been relatively free  
of serious flags. Two are worthy of mention: the Radio flag and the SINK flag.  
The first involved the pulling up of an entire V/C (AKA) net while the latter re-  
sulted in a considerable amount of adverse publicity and blew a number of staff  
agents to Western and East Bloc intelligence services.

W. Otto flag

In 1948 Julius W. O., a former captain in the Wehr Army, joined  
USIA to organize an active AKA net within the FBI separate from the stay-behind  
program. O. had married during the war and had been held with his wife in various  
Internment camps after the war. Shortly after joining W. O., O. realized his  
wife had extravagant tastes in clothing and varied tastes in sleeping companions,  
and a divorce was agreed upon. Because of the housing situation in Germany at the  
time, the divorce was granted, but the couple was forced to continue during the  
same home. This led to two complications: relations between the two became ex-  
tremely bad, and the wife came into possession of the list of AKA whom W. O. had  
already placed in the AKA. In 1950, W. O. announced to his former wife his in-  
tention to re-marry. Within two weeks twenty of his AKA had been placed under ar-  
rest within the AKA. While the flag was never resolved, every indication pointed  
to the wife's having turned her information over to the SED or the KGB. Although  
this flag occurred long before the formation of Wiesenthal 62 it is of importance  
since it involved a professional organization and a man who was still working for the

Disruptible as of March 1956. It is of additional importance since it apparently covered the organization to some extent for day-to-day operations.

b. ERIC LAG

KRICK

While this Group had none of the serious ramifications of the Radio Tag, it was none the less serious since it exposed a Middle Eastern and several of his staff agents. In early 1953 one of ERIC LAG's former SE officers and member of Hitler's personal bodyguard, was recruited by James Thompson KIRBY and other members of his Filiale. In January 1952 ERIC LAG went to the police and changed KIRBY with attempted murder. Specifically, he charged KIRBY was connected with an intelligence report he had made and had had a gun on him to force him to reveal additional information. KIRBY was arrested and publicly followed. The case was resolved in an unusual way when the investigation turned up the fact that ERIC LAG himself was an FBI agent. KIRBY was freed and ERIC LAG subsequently received a prison term for espionage, but the charging publicly had already been elevated, and Filiale security had been destroyed.

Possible Organizational Changes

(12). Although the following is only based on fragmentary information, it appears that these changes are likely in the overall Disruptible structure:

a. A new Filiale led by Michael FURBY has been established, probably wrapped in the exploitation of the East Block Atomic Energy Program through the sub-facility of technical experts in West Germany. In 1956 it became evident that Michael FURBY was the able and valuable man to establish in the capacity of deputy to Leon Paul GUBERGER, Disruptible X leader. Later reports indicated that FURBY was operating in the Reichland although the Disruptible X mission supposedly confined him to Berlin and the DDR. In early 1958 GUBERGER mentioned to Peter A. Ramon that FURBY had not been with SUMMERS' Disruptible for "about a year". In the same late JAGOW is grouped along with Earl FRANKS, former deputy of Disruptible II. Thus it would seem that FURBY and FRANKS have been given the task of forming a new Filiale, probably to operate in the Rhein-land area.

b. From Berlin, the Scientific and Technical Regiment on the Disruptible staff as of the latest known List revision does not appear on the known List. Maj. Harold BARRY, formerly an interrogator with Disruptible 0 in London on the Disruptible staff according to the known List. It is possible he has replaced STJUL.

c. The Disruptible staff has been augmented by the addition of one secretary, an indication of an increased workload. This would seem likely if there is a new Filiale set up of the proposed Filiales mentioned.

d. Disruptible I appears to have undergone the most re-organization. The Disruptible Deputy has been replaced and Little or nothing has been heard from the Filiales which were being formed under the Disruptible. Additionally, none of those persons designated Middle Eastern on the 1955 UPTA appear on the known List.

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Some studies have had much startling success in the scientific and technical fields, it is possible that his assignment has been given a reduced and more highly concentrated mission.

6. As mentioned in paragraph (8) above, it would appear that the work which was set up to function directly under the scientific headquarters, may have been re-organized or withdrawn.

7. Frank's collector recently elicited the information from a SOURCE, outside that of operational security, that as many as possible of the scientific and technical headquarters are being removed from West Berlin and relocated in the Federal Republic. This would be a significant reversal of policy since in 1955 and 1956 WESTPA took advantage of the relative stability of the West Berlin situation and moved a number of their headquarters into the city. Prior to that time the letters occurred from the Federal Republic and it can be presumed that they are being to come again. Possible further confirmation of this move is the fact that upon West BERLIN, rather of West Berlin, moved to Munich in late 1957.

(13). Following is a list of those individual members of West Berlin who appeared on the Bonn list, but about whom insufficient information is available to warrant the completion of a V-FILE sheet: V-4888, V-3139, V-3210, all of whom are case officers, and V-3134, V-3140, V-3145, V-3146, V-3149, V-3161, and V-3536, all of whom are secretaries.

(14). Once studies of all the active West Berlin are planned, comments and suggestions for Bureau guidance are encouraged.

## NOTES:

1. DORN was originally hired as an interrogator targeted against the KVP. At this time DORN worked under UV 131 of BV 2, which was headed up by Hans Guenther BERNAU.
2. In May 51 DORN assisted by BERNAU recruited Karl KRICK, former member of the SS and Hitler's personal bodyguard. The recruitment was formalized in August 51, and KRICK worked for WESLING until January 52 when he went to the police in Berlin and claimed BERNAU had threatened him with a gun to force him to reveal certain information. Investigation of BERNAU revealed KRICK as an SSD man who was working against BERNAU. BERNAU was exonerated and KRICK was sentenced to prison, but the resulting publicity blew BERNAU, DORN, and several other members of BERNAU's organization to all the Western and hostile intelligence services. See KRICK Flap for details.
3. At one time during this period DORN was Leiter of Filiale 900 of UV 131, and was subsequently put on inactive status for a time. It is likely this was done in connection with the KRICK Flap.
4. In May and June 1952 DORN received training in positive operations.
5. In March and April 1953 DORN was arrested three times on suspicion of espionage resulting from attempts to interrogate or debrief East Zone refugees. Following the third arrest WESLING was cautioned that DORN would be unwelcome in Berlin if he continued to be arrested with such frequency. There is no subsequent arrest record.
6. As of March 56 DORN was still working in Berlin as an interrogator targeted against the KVP.

1. In October 1959, BOB attempted to contact Identity 1 (Subject of Reference A) through

Gerd-Heinz \*JOPPIEN  
DPOB: 4 July 1929 in Apolda, East Germany  
Occ: East German Postal Employee

who had refugeeed to West Berlin in September 1959. Under our direction, JOPPIEN wrote Identity 1 to come to West Berlin, and the latter complied, bringing his wife with him. The wife had made the trip primarily, she subsequently averred, to make certain that her husband did not become involved in intelligence activity. During the course of a long discussion in which all three parties participated, the woman asserted that she knew all about the way in which innocent refugees (like JOPPIEN) were snapped up in Marienfelde to be used by AIS as instruments to recruit East Germans for espionage purposes. The source of her arcane wisdom, she claimed, was a cousin, Identity 2 (possibly identical with the person of the same name cited in Reference C) whom she said worked at Marienfelde and knew the "truth" about AIS's nasty habits. She and Identity 1 had apparently spent many evenings with Identity 2, absorbing his tales of deceit and perdition. It seems reasonable to assume that her presence at the meeting definitely contributed to the fact that JOPPIEN was overcome with reluctance to make any kind of pitch to Identity 1. (After this abortive effort, JOPPIEN was released and he has since settled in the Federal Republic.)

2. We have no reason to doubt that JOPPIEN was not giving us a relatively accurate account of his meeting with Identity 1 and wife, nor do we doubt the existence of an Identity 2. A person of this name does work at Marienfelde and is not employed by any Berlin AIS unit. We are not, however, certain that Identity 2 is in fact an UPSWING staffer, a question to which we must have an answer since we intend to make another approach to Identity 1. We are by no means interested in starting a joint operation with UPSWING, but believe it would be unwise to try to recruit Identity 1 until the question of his possible UPSWING affiliation has been clarified, and, if it is determined that he does work for the Organization, until he has been told of our intention to go after Identity 1. We request therefore that you advise UPSWING of our interest in Identity 1, grounding this disclosure on our feeling that Identity 2 might belong to them. Further, should this prove to be the case, UPSWING should make certain that he be directed to refrain from any activity which might jeopardize our activity against Identity 1. Pending receipt of the results of your inquiries and negotiations with UPSWING, we shall undertake no action in regard to Identity 1.



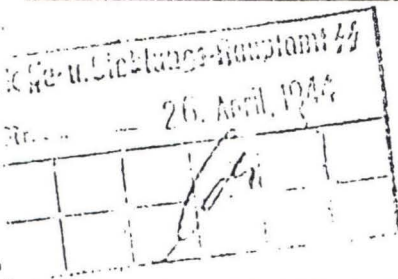
