NOTES:

1. DURN was originally named as an interrogator targeted who was not the KVF. At this time he was also at UV 131 of st Z, which was headed up by Hans Guenther (see 1).

2. In Aug 1953 arrested by KGD for master Karl ERICK, former member of the SS and Hitler's personal bodyguard. The recruitment was formalized in August 51, and DURN worked for KGD/MG until January 52 when he went to the police in Berlin and claimed KGD/MG had tortured him with a gun to force him to reveal certain information. Investigation of KGD/MG revealed ERICK as an SSO man who was working against KGD/MG. DURN was exonerated and ERICK was sentenced to prison, but the resulting publicity blew BERNAU, DURN, and several other members of KGD/MG's organization to all the Western and hostile intelligence services. See "ERICK Flap" for details.

3. At one time during this period DURN was leader of Filiale 200 of UV 131, and was subsequently put on inactive status for a time. It is likely this was done in connection with the ERICK Flap.

4. In May and June 1952 DURN received training in positive operations.

5. In March and April 1953 DURN was arrested three times on suspicion of espionage resulting from attempts to interrogate or brief East Zone refugees. Following the third arrest DURN was cautioned that KGD/MG would be unable to in Berlin if he continued to be arrested with such frequency. There is no subsequent arrest record.

6. As of March 56 DURN was still working in Berlin as an interrogator targeted against the KVF.

1. Enclosures 1 through 12 to this report consist of all BAUN material dated August, September, or October 1947.
 2. Enclosure 1 is a note from DINTER to BAUN, dated 5 August 1947, asking who received the payments of \$9,000, \$4,000, and \$2,000; the name of the recipient had been indicated only by an abbreviation. DINTER also asks when, by whom, and from what funds did ~~Marina~~ (MINTA) (later spelled MULATTI by DINTER) receive the sum of \$2,000. (Field Comment: Marina MULATTI or MULATTI does not appear in POB files. She has previously appeared, however, in para. 3 of reference.)
 3. Enclosure 2, dated 8 August 1947, is BAUN's answer to the above query. He states that, as well as he can remember, the recipients were as follows:

a. Of \$9,000, V-man SPIRIDONOV (at the time of his trip to France); ties to former Comintern circles. (Field Comment: Former Colonel Alexis Ivanovich SPIRIDONOV appears frequently in POF files. A POF request for info, dated 6 October 1948, asks ZIPPER about SPIRIDONOV and states that he was formerly a colonel in the ROA (Russian Army of Liberation), that before 1948 he became a member of the SAF (St. Andrews Flag), that he was close to General Peter von GLASENAPP, and that he was a member of the central committee of AZDOR. He also published a newspaper, Free World, in Freising and Regensburg. The POF query adds that he "is reportedly working for an American intelligence service" without pay. A memo of 1 December 1948 states that Col. SPIRIDONOV does not enjoy the confidence of ZIPPER. Another ZIPPER memo, same date, is a lengthy study of the Russian emigration. It criticizes Gen. GLASENAPP for surrounding himself with persons of dubious loyalty and mentions SPIRIDONOV as one such person. A 7821 Composite Group memo to ID Ops Branch, 3 December 1948, states that Alexis Ivanovich SPIRIDONOV is not a member of ZIPPER and is suspected of maintaining connections with pro-Soviet circles. He published Swobodnoje Slovo, supposed to be an SAF paper, which failed to back the anti-Bolshevik line. Working with him on this paper were fmu DAR and fmu GARKUSCHA, reportedly Soviet agents and criminals. SPIRIDONOV was also the friend of fmu SUDSEFAZKIJ, suspected of being a Soviet agent.

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Fmu JULIA, an agent of the Soviet Mission in Munich, told a ZIPPER source that in his opinion certain persons connected with the SAF were receiving money from Soviet sources and said that two such persons might be fmu KARAKATSKO and SPIRIDONOV. A ZIPPER memo of 11 January 1949 states that the fact that one ALEXANDROSTAEV is a member of the SPIRIDONOV circle is another cause to suspect that he is cooperating with the Soviet IS. The last entry in the attachment to NCL-A-6651, 25 May 1951, places SPIRIDONOV in the BAVARIA complex. NCS-A-3994, 26 May 1951, names three persons whom the British name as able to give info about the whereabouts of the Soviet agent Alexander CHIKILOV. One of these is SPIRIDONOV, said by the British to be residing in Bavaria.)

b. Of \$4,000, V-man BLAHLER (on the occasion of his trip to Switzerland) to be used to maintain former connections to the HELMICK and LEMITZKI groups. (Field Comment: Although BLAHLER is one of the cover names formerly used by Alfons Ferdinand RÖDLICHENNER (who appeared previously in para. 2 j of NCL-A-12943), it is more likely that the person meant here is Erich BLAHLER, who was passed by ZIPPER to the Swiss. See NCL-A-1942 and 5716.)

c. The recipient of the \$2,000 was V-man BAUER, who was to use the money in an attempt to take up a connection with fmu BERCHTOLD. (Field Comment: Fmu BAUER might possibly be the Frits BAUER mentioned in para. 2 h of NCL-A-12943. Another long shot is Dr. Herbert BAUER, who appears in para. 1 a of ECL-A-73. Fmu BERCHTOLD appears in para. 2 m (2) (a) of NCL-A-12943 and in para. 1 g of ECL-A-73.)

d. When Dr. G (UTILITY) went out of Germany for the second time, he left \$2,000 in the custody of BAUER, from a total of \$4,000 received by UTILITY. The \$2,000 was to remain with BAUER until a courier picked it up. On the request of Marina JURLATTI the \$1,000 was forwarded to Italy in two payments. \$1,000 was forwarded through JURLATTI herself, who was escorted to Munich by KILLER. The other \$1,000 was taken by DPC to Italy and handed over there.

h. Enclosure 3, 11 August 1947, is a second query by DINTEP re the \$2,000 given to Marina JURLATTI; and Enclosure 4, 12 August 1947, is BAUER's reply that he has already answered the query on 8 August.

5. Enclosure 5, dated 16 August 1947, is a letter from Walter CILLASUS to Frau Ruth Baal in which CILLASUS asks how certain Christmas gifts were distributed at Christmas 1946. (Field Comment: Walter CILLASUS has previously appeared in para. 17 a of NCL-A-12673 and in para. 7 a of reference. It may be worth noting that the letter is in his own hand.)

6. Enclosure 6, dated 19 August 1947, states that the gifts were passed out, as nearly as Ruth Baal can remember, as follows:

a. Suits: KOBADI, SCHLEIDER (radio), DANIELT, KÖNIGERG, BARN, LOHDE, FICHLER, MAS (?), BASCHKE, KULFERT, WOLF, FÄTTNER (?), von KOSTECKY, KENTZEL. (Field Comment: fmu KOBADI, a cover name, appeared

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in para. 2 of reference. Although time does not permit a check of all POS cards on fmu SCHREIDER, a check with our contro section has shown the name to be a cover name of Leopold PAPPS of 236, who has appeared in HGL-A's 7632 and 7993. Fmu DERHILT may be i/w the Paul DERHILT who appears in PULLI's - 2204, 2205, and 2213, as well as NCL-A-6774 and NCL-W-11023; it is more probable, however, that DERHILT is here a cover name. POS has cards on Hans KROHNBERGER, Kennkarte H 420 582, but no record of a fmu KRONEBERG. Alfred DERNBORN has appeared previously in para. 17 b (2) of HGL-A-12873. Fmu LORENZ appears in para. 6 b of reference and enclosure 10 to reference. Fmu PICHLER (another cover name of KLAUSNER) appears in para. 2 of reference. Edu DAUS has appeared previously in para. 4 f (2) of ECL-A-73 and in para. 2 of reference. Fmu RASCHKE was mentioned in para. 9 e of reference. Fmu WOLFERT is almost certainly identical with Otto WOLFERT, the cover name of Otto MUELLER, now chief of the voice monitoring group of 236. Otto MUELLER appeared in HGL-A-7632, HGL-A-7993, and para. 2 j of HGL-A-12943. Fmu KLF appears in para. 2 of reference. Fmu BANNER is the cover name of Alfons BOEDI HAIMER; see para. 4 c (2) (b) of ECL-A-73. E. von GAGAZSKI appears in the attachment to NCL-A-25709. Fmu KESTEN has been difficult to trace because of the frequency with which the name appears in our files. A memo of 30 September 1947 from the ICO to 34.3 states that the (fmu) KESTEN concerning whom 34.3 had made inquiry is not identical with the brother-in-law of fmu DAUS but is a courier who worked in the British Zone in 1946 and had been in the U.S. Zone since the beginning of 1947. Under its jurisdiction, unfortunately, the ICO had two couriers named KESTEN. One of these is Dietrich KESTEN, whose address (in a ZIPPER memo of 1 June 1948) was listed as "Froes Ostheim Villa Eder, Aschaffenburgstrasse. The British, a year earlier, had identified a fmu KESTEN as a courier for Hugo Karl Horitz LACHMUND of Organization 102 (which was part of the ICO, having been originally part of Org. 500). Since LACHMUND is listed, in still another internal ZIPPER memo, as the person administratively responsible for the Villa Eder in Gross Ostheim, it follows that Dietrich KESTEN worked for LACHMUND; he carried money and supplies to agents. Dietrich KESTEN was born 1 May 1926 in Berlin. POS carries not only the Gross Ostheim address for him but also # 65 Bahnhofstrasse, Munich-Zorneding. He has been dropped, although our records do not show when. Another person who may be the man mentioned in Frau ERW's letter is Walter KESTEN, born 6 July 1926 in Obersuhl and living (in July 1947) at Elmeteinstrasse 16, Obersuhl. Walter KESTEN was also a courier in Organization 500. Walter KESTEN also appears in an ICO list of 13 May 1947 as a courier of Org. 500; his address is given as Obersuhl, Detra. He was dropped in May 1948. First listed as courier 109, he was later given the number 11 11, which number belongs to the block assigned Org. 101. This fact would seem to exclude any possibility that Dietrich and Walter KESTEN are identical. The 11 11 number also appears on the Christmas list of 6 December 1949, where it is assigned to SV H. Other KESTENS who may have worked for the ICO also appear in our files. In April 1949 we received via SCID a French identity request on Robert TALLISHEE, Robert S. E. ZLIPER, Robert KIRSHEN, born 26 May 1925 in

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Leipzig. We have no record of a ZIPPER reply to this query. A Hans KERSTEN was issued "E" ID card # 02677, dated 23 June 1951. Abstracted from this card is the following: Bayrische Lagerversorgung Muerburg; 238 Oberer Viehaeckt, Muerburg; truck registration # AB 46-5268. A Udo von KERSTEN was one of twenty-five agents of Org. 900 (and later of a splinter org., 101) arrested in the Russian Zone (in Neuruppin) and dropped on 1 February 1947 because it was suspected that he had been turned by the Soviets. The address of Udo von KERSTEN was listed in 1948 as Piepen bei Bad Neundorf/Hannover.)

b. Overcoats: KORNADI, PICHLER (?), SCHMIDLE (radio), DINTER, ERNST.

c. Material: Mrs. DANS, LORLZ, POHL, ~~ERNDT~~, Herr von LOSSO, HOLT, ERNDT. One sent to Schnitten without being assigned to a recipient. (Field Comment: Frau POHL previously appeared in para. b f (2) of MCL-A-73. Eva Lachitz von LOSSO appears in para. 2 of reference and numerous earlier memos. Frau HOLT may be identical with a Dr. Eva HOLT who appears in a U.S. DREDGER housing list as having lived in the Blue House in Oberursel as of 1 February 1948. Another and remoter possibility is Winfried von HOLT; see MCL-N-12787 and MCL-A-11266.)

d. Shoes: KELLER, RENNER, ERNSTMEYER, GORE, RASCHKE, PICHLER, WOLF, SCHMIDLE (radio), WOLFERT, KORNADI, von GACZINSKI. Five or six pairs of women's shoes, of which one pair to Fraulein GLIES and one to Frau ERNDT. (Field Comment: Frau KELLER, who is probably i/w Alex GALLIANS, appeared in para. 9 c of reference. Frau RENNER has been mentioned in para. 9 b of MCL-A-12873 and in Enclosure 10 of reference. Fr. Frau GLIES does not appear in POB files. We do have, however, a record of a telephone conversation of 18 February 1952, a person-to-person call from MalerMeister (Master painter) Frau GLIES to Frau Frau RASCHKE, whose phone number is Neustadt/Harburg 235. GLIES was calling from Munich 73842, which is the telephone number in the GWG operational house at Koderbacherstrasse 3, Munich 25.)

7. Enclosure 7 is a letter written to the ICO by DINTER and dated 23 August 1947. It states that because the Jagdhaus has only a few occupants left, the retention of three servants can no longer be justified. In accordance with a discussion held with Fr. Mathilde SCHNEIDER, Fr. Waltraut SCHNEIDER will go to the house in Schnitten on 25 August 1947 to work as a paid (Hausgehilfin). (Field Comment: POB has a record of a Fr. Mathilde SCHNEIDER who is a nurse in the compound. She was born on 21 October 1902 in Moenchroeden and lives in Moenchroeden at Schulstr. 76. She appeared in MCL-A-4584. It is unlikely, however, that she is i/w the Fr. Mathilde SCHNEIDER mentioned here. POB has no record of Fr. Waltraut SCHNEIDER.)

8. Enclosure 8, undated, is BAUN's memo for the record, in which he socializes upon the causes of his downfall and makes DINTER the villain of the piece. The enclosure adds nothing to our present fund of information.

9. Enclosure 9, dated 17 September 1947, is a letter to BAUN from TILITY. It reads as follows:

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"Because I cannot come to you today, as I had intended to do, I should like to transmit the following short orientation to you by way of your son.

"About two days ago documentary evidence appeared to show that the Jagdhaus has been compromised as your dwelling. We must therefore start to think about changing your dwelling as soon as something suitable can be found. This fact is for your personal guidance only, and I request that you handle it as very secret.

"The original assumption that your 'Gartenlaube' ("arbour") and especially your son PENNER had been compromised has been proven groundless, and therefore there is nothing to prevent an exchange of the automobile then in use for your car - at least, for the car which PENNER now drives. (Field Comment: PENNER is thus established as a cover name for BAUN's son Rolf. See para. 6 d, above, and earlier references.)

"I request of you that the official explanation should continue to be that the automobile was down here as a replacement for my own car, on which repairs were first completed this evening.

"I should also like to ask of you, as I shall explain further during a visit to be held this week, that you write out a not-too-detailed report on the experiences encountered in first building the organization, the basic rules and policies, as the first part of your new assignment. I intend to submit this piece of work to Col. K. It is desirable that the job be finished in about three weeks; sooner would be better.

10. Enclosure 10 is a memo from 34.0 to the recipients listed. It was hand-carried by UTILITY to BAUN on 22 September 1947, the date it was typed. It states that the following persons would begin work on 25 September 1947 in the stated sections:

- a. Herr (fmu) SE.DOFF will break in with 34.2.
- b. (Herr)(fmu) BORIS will break in with 45.1.
- c. Frl. (fmu) LIETZ will start work with 34.4.

(Field Comment: SFRAN 6168 of 3 September 1952 reported that a Manfred DOLF had worked for ZIPPER until recently, but SPULL 4037 of 4 September 1952 states no record POE or ZIPPER. Please note, however, that para. 15 e refers to a fmu FENDOFF who, in October 1947, was to be appointed deputy to KOERNIG in the evaluation section. It appears probable that he is i/w the ENDOFF mentioned by 34.0 in Enclosure 10. POB has no record of fmu BORIS. (Frl. Herta LIETZ, born 19 November 1927, a German, was dropped without prejudice on 8 October 1951. She appears in HGH-A-13306.)

11. Enclosure 11 is a letter dated 11 October 1947 and sent to BAUN by P. WEBER. (Field Comment: Although we have cards on three men named Peter WEBER (cover name) plus one Paul, none of them seem to be identical with the writer of this letter.) A translation of the letter follows:

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"In settling the matter of pay for Dr. (lawyer) HÄHNISCH, doubts have arisen concerning the conditions under which he was given the assignment of representing the interests of the organization. Because it is important to me to fulfill correctly the various commitments incurred by us as well as by Dr. HÄHNISCH, I should be thankful to you if you would state the conditions under which you gave him an assignment last year and whether an agreement about his compensation was reached at that time.

"With the wish that you remember me to your wife,
"I am, with best greetings,

(Field Comment: Dr. Paul Kurt HÄHNISCH, special connection, has been a legal advisor to UJILITY almost since the founding of the organization. He was born on 27 August 1899 in Schrimm, Germany, and now resides in Koenigstein/Taunus, 19 Adelheidstr. His Kennkarte, # M 101 499, was issued 30 September 1946 in Bad Homburg. He has payroll # 4612. He appears in PULL-2448. He is being UJ-DREDGERed.)

12. Enclosure 12, dated 14 October 1947, is BAUN's reply to the foregoing. He states that it was agreed with Dr. HÄHNISCH that he would receive all incidental costs incurred in the course of transacting organizational business and that to avoid needless friction he could draw such costs in advance. In addition, he was to be repaid whenever he represented the organization in his capacity as a lawyer. A car and paid chauffeur were to be given him by the organization, and this was done. From time to time small gifts in goods were given him. Until January 1947 Dr. HÄHNISCH had not been required to act on behalf of the organization, and therefore no legal fees were paid to him.

4. Von Fall zu Fall wurden Dr. H. nach Bedarf kleinere Wareneinswendungen gemacht.
5. Hatte ich mir vorbehalten, Dr. H. für besonders wertvolle Unterstützung eine Extravergütung zukommen zu lassen.

Bis Januar 1947 hatte Dr. H. noch keine Angelegenheit der Organisation abschliessend durchgeführt, weshalb bis dahin auch keine Anwaltskosten an ihn entrichtet werden konnten. Es war ihm lediglich ein Vorschuss, dessen Höhe mir nicht mehr erinnerlich ist, gezahlt worden, über den er zu gegebener Zeit abrechnen sollte. Der Wagen und Brennstoff waren ihm schon zur Verfügung gestellt.



* UVENTURE Study of Dienststelle 62

ACTION REQUIRED: None, for your information

(1). Forwarded herewith is an UVENTURE study of Dienststelle 62, one of the six large UWING operations bases. The study is based on an analysis of certain basic source documents and the Munich Base files. The source documents include the 1955 OPER (UWING Field Organizational Chart), the Master List of UWING agents current to 15 March 1956, the UWING Base List dated 1 April 1956, and the UVENTURE Notebooks. The Munich Base files include the V-Hum (Agent) card file, an extremely valuable source of personality data.

(2). Also forwarded as attachments to this study are the UVENTURE Sheets on forty-one members of the Dienststelle. This includes all members of the Dienststelle who were included on the Base List and upon whom UVENTURE Sheets have not already been prepared with the exception of ten individuals upon whom insufficient information is available in Munich Base files. Of these ten, three are case officers and seven are secretaries.

History of Dienststelle 62

(3). Dienststelle 62 in its present form can be traced back to Organization 120, a large and unwieldy group set up in the post-war period with Headquarters in Stuttgart and targeted against obtaining OS information in the Soviet Occupied Zone of Germany. In late 1949 Project 125 outlined a proposed re-organization of UWING sub-offices and field operations, and in the fall of 1950, the various General Agencies, or GV's were set up. Organization 120 was split into two groups and GV 2 under the leadership of Eberhard HUBER, FACKERMANN came into being. GV 1 had its headquarters in Ulm and was targeted principally against the Soviet Occupied Zone of Germany and the DDR. In January 1954 a further re-organization took place when the General Agencies were replaced by Dienststellen, and GV 2 became Dienststelle 73. HUBER remained Leiter, and apparently the internal organization was not drastically affected by the change. Headquarters of Dienststelle 73 was Augsburg. On 15 May 1955 the final re-designation took place and Dienststelle 73 became Dienststelle 62. Dienststelle Headquarters remained Augsburg, and HUBER remained Dienststelle Leiter.

In addition to the above staff members, one man, Herbert Böck, works as Staff Sergeant in West Berlin with the details of commanding the efforts of the various organizations operating out of that city. He is the "open and direct" of the Western Staff in Berlin. Finally it is believed the Staff employs a driver and a chauffeur.

(8). An eight-membered unit designated V-333, code name "Eg" and "Y", and held into three categories. It is charged with organizing stay-behind "A" agents within the FRG. "B", "C" and "D" are relatively small, here no aliases under them, and have relatively large missions, all within the Federal Republic. "E", "F", "G", and "H", the third group, have large organizations with several aliases under each, and carry on active operations in West Berlin and the FRG.

c. **Intelligence**.

The mission of this intelligence is the training and placing of stay-behind "A" operations (agents) throughout the FRG. In late 1955, "E" had six men in place with their equipment and had three more, in various stages of training. One other "A", code name "ECHO", was arrested in the FRG in 1956 and his equipment was confiscated. He was sentenced to death for espionage, but there is no indication whether the sentence was carried out. Another "A", code name "UNION", is of interest.

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also assigned to his being placed within the [redacted], he was selected as one of a group of residents to study at the University of Bonn. He was later dropped from the university allegedly for health reasons, but probably because of his refusal to take part in Communist student groups, and is presently in place where the [redacted] can again. It should be noted that due to the nature of his mission, 2 is unable to effectively meet his responsibilities. The leader of Zingelhalle 2 is also from Germany and Zingelhalle members are in West Berlin.

b. Zingelhalle 3

The leader of Zingelhalle 3 is Comptine [redacted], and his Party is Robert [redacted]. These two individuals together with two reporters and two informers comprise the main Zingelhalle, those involved in the interviewing of refugees, informants, and legal sources in that area formerly the British占领区 or Ganzviertel. The present area of operations of the Zingelhalle is Berlin and into two sections: the Hamburg area and North Rhine-Westphalia. One reporter is located in each of these areas, and three of the five Zingelhalle are based in the Hamburg-Bremen area. As of 1973, the Deputy and one of the informants operated out of British Interrogation center. The Zingelhalle Headquarters are in Bremen, now [redacted].

c. Zingelhalle 4

Zingelhalle Headquarters is located in Frankfurt and consists of a leader, Martin [redacted], his deputy, [redacted], and a secretary. The unit's tasks is quite small and is largely against the GDR, but consists only legal operations consisting of the interviewing and fabricating of refugees and legal informants. The area of operation is generally confined to America. Although only the term "individuals" listed above operate in the Frankfurt area, as of 1973, Zingelhalle 4 had two additional air interceptors, [redacted] and [redacted], one man writing reports, and two "big men". In addition to these other members, 2 million euro funds obtained along the West German-GDR border to purchase spy planes.

d. Zingelhalle 5

Zingelhalle 5, the fourth of the smaller Zingelhalle has its headquarters and area of operation in West Berlin, and all of the personnel are located there with the exception of one member who lives in Friedenau, W. Berlin and who operates throughout the GDR. The Zingelhalle leader is Hartmut von [redacted] and his deputy is Martin [redacted]. The Zingelhalle staff is composed of three men and four members. The Zingelhalle 5 staff has a varied selection and has six interrogators, each of whom is assigned to handle a particular type of interviewing including such topics as economy, politics, science, and the GDR. At least two of these interrogators also carry on CI operations. The options work with the interrogators. A further security measure on by the Zingelhalle is early

a. weigstelle

Weigstelle is possibly the biggest of the Innenstelle 62 sub-offices, and contains, in addition to three large Illices, or principal agent units, two additional Illices which were reported to be quite small and in the process of organization as of March 1956. Weigstelle headquarters is located in West Berlin and is under the leadership of Friedrich Hill. Hill maintains a small staff composed of a deputy and a secretary and works mostly through the Illices. The three large Illices also operate out of West Berlin and have large agent operations running into the ... The Illices, like the Innenstellen, bear letter designations. Weigstelle I, Illice are "a", "b", "c" and "d". II, "e", "f", and "g", the large Illices, are targeted against "Any A", "B", "C" and "D", electric installations, respectively. In this effort they have recruited agents, observers, photo teams and legal travellers. Hill is known about the current status of Illice "a" and "b", although it has been determined that ... was to be targeted against the ...

b. weigstelle 2

Headquarters for Weigstelle 2 is not Berlin and the area of operations of this group includes East Berlin and the DDR. Helmut Simon, an "old-timer" with W. B. H. is Weigstelle 2's leader and his deputy is Günther Tschau. As other member of the Weigstelle 2 staff, As with Weigstelle 1, the bulk of the work is apparently carried on within the Illices. The Weigstelle has three Illices, I, II and III. If these, I and II are quite large and have agent units throughout the DDR. I targets itself against the collection of "Any B" throughout the DDR, but does have one penetration agent within the DDR in Chemnitz. I works against all Illices at the transportation industry within the DDR and has, in addition to seven penetration agents, four agents whom they classify as high-level sources. The II Illice was established in April 1955 and as of March 1956 was still in the formative stages, and had as of that date one source within the DDR. The mission of Illice 2 is the collection of "Any B" information.

c. weigstelle 3

Werner Ganscher B. 1910 (see paragraph (11 b) below) is the leader of Weigstelle 3 and his deputy is Edward F. Kuhn (probably an alias). Secretary completes the Weigstelle 3 unit. The Weigstelle operates out of West Berlin and do its two large Illices. Illice 3 operates against the transportation industry within East Berlin and has ten penetration agents including one who is classified as a highly placed source. An element agent, also a penetration, works against an unspecified economic target. Illice 3, the largest Illice under any of the Weigstellen, has the mission of reporting on economic targets throughout East Berlin, and in 1956 had nineteen agents classified as penetration agents, one of whom

was considered to be a high-level source. In addition to the Klasse Lester, Klaus K. and his secretary, various other individuals work for the Klasse Berlin organization links and spotting.

b. Klasse Y

Klasse Y has its headquarters in West Berlin and is under the leadership of Dr. Paul SCHILLER, a man considered by USIC to be extremely capable, particularly in the scientific and technical field. He is an old friend of PETER H. KRAMER. His present duty is unknown. Klasse Y differs from the other large organizations in that it carries on extensive operations within West Berlin through the spotting or targets for both detection and recruitment. Also, several operational activities are carried on directly under the Klasse Y Staff. Possibly because of SCHILLER's abilities, a number of operators work directly under him. He directly supervises large numbers of interrogations in the scientific and technical field, and works directly with the Klasse in the person of MAYER as well as with KRAMER. Actual activity carried on directly under SCHILLER is the control and direction of a principal agent within West Berlin who directs a large East Berlin group targeted against the penetration of journalistic circles to obtain insight into current political opinions and trends. Three Klasse men have been set up under "Klasse Y"; however, none have been given letter designations. One of the Klasse is directed against the DDR air-force industry, and in early 1956 had six officers, one within the USA, and two journalistic agents in place. The other two Klasse were in the formative stage in early 1956, one targeted against the East Berlin political situation in an effort similar to that run by the Freibergle Staff, and the other targeted against scientific targets, including personalities, within the DDR. Some of the principals of the Klasse appear on the Klaus List, an indication that they may have never given off the ground, possibly due to flags or to lack of probation.

i. Klasse G

Klasse G had one Klasse operating directly under the Klasse Schiller staff as of early 1956. It had two general missions involving contact with USIC Special Commissions in the Berlin area and the organization of a penetration of journalistic circles in West Berlin. In the case of the Klasse under Zang-Klasse Y, none of the members of Klasse G appeared on the Klaus List, which could point to the possibility it has been disbanded, reorganized, or possibly absorbed by one of the Klasse Y.

Lover

(9). The secret cover files used by Klasse G staff is not known, nor are the covers used by the lower-level organizations known. It is known that the WDR ^{WDR} Klasse Staff uses the firm "Gesamtbüro Administrations GmbH", located in Berl-Britz, a village outside of Berlin, for ordering office supplies, servicing vehicles, and other daily housekeeping needs. This is a blank, however, and probably exists only as a telephone located in the home of one of the staff members.

In 1948 Julian R. S., a former captain in the Soviet Army joined

internment camps after the war. Shortly after joining WIS-ING, R. had realized his
wife had extramarital affairs in climbing and varied trades in climbing companies,
and a divorce was agreed upon. Because of the housing situation in Germany at the
time, the divorce was granted, but the couple was forced to continue sharing the
same home. This led to two complications: relations between the two became ex-
tremely bad, and the wife came into possession of the list of ARA whom R. had
already placed in the DDR. In 1950, R. returned to his former wife his in-
testate to remarry. Within two weeks, however, he had been placed under ar-
rest within the DDR. While the Clap was never resolved, every indication pointed
to the wife's having turned her information over to the KGB or the KGB. Although
this flag occurred long before the formation of "Unterstelle" G2 it is of importance
since it involved a predecessor organization and a man who was still working for the

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Dienststelle as of March 1956. It is of additional importance since it apparently covered the organization to some extent for re-organization operations.

b. ERIC Log

With this copy had some of the KRGK modifications of the Radio or his staff agents. In early 1953 one Karl RUEHL, a former SS officer and member of Hitler's personal bodyguard, was recruited by the Counterespionage Bureau and other members of his Flaksta. In January 1952 K RUEHL was to the police and charged RUEHL with attempted murder. Specifically, he charged RUEHL was connected with an intelligence report he had made and had held a gun on him to force him to reveal additional information. RUEHL was arrested and publicly tried. The case was resolved in a unusual way when the investigation turned up the fact that K RUEHL himself, was a KGB agent. RUEHL was freed and K RUEHL subsequently received a prison term for espionage, but the damaging publicity had already been circulated, while RUEHL security had been destroyed.

Possible organizational changes

(12). Although the following is only based on fragmentary information, it appears that these changes are likely in the overall Dienststelle structure:

- a. New organization led by Michael FISCHER has been established, probably resulting at the reorganization of the East Bloc State Security Program through the absorbing of individual agents in West Germany. In 1956 it became apparent that Michael FISCHER was too able and valuable a man to continue in the capacity of deputy to East German SUMMERS, Headquarters I Leader. Later reports indicated that FISCHER was operating in the Rostock although the Zimmerman Commission reportedly confined him to Berlin and the DDR. In early 1958 Zimmerman recommended to Peter A. Hahn that FISCHER had not been with SUMMERS to Rostock but for "short a year". In the Rostock file JUGUL is grouped along with Karl FRÖBACH, former deputy of Zimmerman II. Thus it would seem that FISCHER and FRÖBACH have been given the task of forming a new Dienststelle, probably to operate in the Rostock area.
- b. Franz STÜLLE, the Scientific and Technical Department on the Meissner Staff as of the latest March 1956 revision does not appear on the Rostock list. Mr. Harold FISCHER, formerly an interpreter with Zimmerman C is listed on the Dienststelle Staff according to the same list. It is possible he has replaced STÜLLE.
- c. The Dienststelle Staff has been augmented by the addition of one secretary, an indication of an increased workload. This would seem likely if there is a new intelligence unit or any of the proposed Flaksta materialized.
- d. Zimmerman I appears to have undergone the most re-organization. The Zimmerman I agency has been replaced and little or nothing has been heard from the Flaksta which were being formed under the Zimmerman. Additionally, none of those persons designated "filed letters on the 1955 April paper on the home list.



1. DORN was originally hired as an interrogator targeted against the KVP. At this time DORN worked under UV 131 of BV E, which was headed up by Hans Guenther KRICK.

2. In May 51 DORN assisted by BERNAU recruited Karl KRICK, former member of the SS and Hitler's personal bodyguard. The recruitment was formalized in August 51, and KRICK worked for HESSING until January 52 when he went to the police in Berlin and claimed BERNAU had threatened him with a gun to force him to reveal certain information. Investigation of BERNAU revealed KRICK as an SSD man who was working against KVP. BERNAU was exonerated and KRICK was sentenced to prison, but the resulting publicity blew BERNAU, DORN, and several other members of BERNAU's organization to all the Western and hostile intelligence services. See KRICK Flap for details.

3. At one time during this period DORN was Leiter of Filiale 900 of UV 131, and was subsequently put on ~~inactive~~ status for a time. It is likely this was done in connection with the KRICK Flap.

4. In May and June 1952 DORN received training in positive operations.

5. In March and April 1953 DORN was arrested three times on suspicion of espionage resulting from attempts to interrogate or debrief East Zone refugees. Following the third arrest HESSING was cautioned that DORN would be unwelcome in Berlin if he continued to be arrested with such frequency. There is no subsequent arrest record.

6. As of March 56 DORN was still working in Berlin as an interrogator targeted against the KVP.

1. In October 1959, EOB attempted to contact Identity 1 (Subject of Reference A) through

Gerd Heinz *JOPPIEN

who had refugeeed to West Berlin in September 1959. Under our direction, JOPPIEN wrote Identity 1 to come to West Berlin, and the latter complied, bringing his wife with him. The wife had made the trip primarily, she subsequently averred, to make certain that her husband did not become involved in intelligence activity. During the course of a long discussion in which all three parties participated, the woman asserted that she knew all about the way in which innocent refugees (like JOPPIEN) were snapped up in Marienfelde to be used by AIS as instruments to recruit East Germans for espionage purposes. The source of her arcane wisdom, she claimed, was a cousin, Identity 2 (possibly identical with the person of the same name cited in Reference C) whom she said worked at Marienfelde and knew the "truth" about AIS's nasty habits. She and Identity 1 had apparently spent many evenings with Identity 2, absorbing his tales of deceit and perfidy. It seems reasonable to assume that her presence at the meeting definitely contributed to the fact that JOPPIEN was overcome with reluctance to make any kind of pitch to Identity 1. (After this abortive effort, JOPPIEN was released and he has since settled in the Federal Republic.)

2. We have no reason to doubt that JOPPIEN was not giving us a relatively accurate account of his meeting with Identity 1 and wife, nor do we doubt the existence of an Identity 2. A person of this name does work at Marienfelde and is not employed by any Berlin AIS unit. We are not, however, certain that Identity 2 is in fact an UPSWING staffer, a question to which we must have an answer since we intend to make another approach to Identity 1. We are by no means interested in starting a joint operation with UPSWING, but believe it would be unwise to try to recruit Identity 1 until the question of his possible UPSWING affiliation has been clarified, and, if it is determined that he does work for the Organization, until he has been told of our intention to go after Identity 1. We request therefore that you advise UPSWING of our interest in Identity 1, grounding this disclosure on our feeling that Identity 2 might belong to them. Further, should this prove to be the case, UPSWING should make certain that he be directed to refrain from any activity which might jeopardize our activity against Identity 1. Pending receipt of the results of your inquiries and negotiations with UPSWING, we shall undertake no action in regard to Identity 1.




