

2. The first report (Incl 1), prepared by the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, USAFIK, on OCS 17, answers each requirement set forth in above reference letter and covers radio stations in both North and South Korea. Information on South Korean stations was obtained from open sources and evaluated B-2. Information on North Korean stations was obtained covertly and is evaluated as indicated in the report.

3.
