Such a revival of mercantile shipblulding as is said to be in progress now was, of course, to be expected, because the immense capital which is fixed in shipbuilding and marine en gineering has a tendency to create it's own demand. A peculiar thing this may appear to be to say, but it is a fact, we think, says the Engine Times, that the shipbuilder has more to do with revivals than what is vaguely called "the state of trade." He has built his industry up to what it is by cheapening ships, and the cost of work-ing them whenever the demands of a legitimate shipping trade have been ap-parently satisfied.
