What is Wikimedia?

- ⋈ Wikipedia supported by the Wikimedia Foundation
- Mission: to empower and engage people around the world to collect, develop, and disseminate educational content under a free, open license
- Wikimedia Foundation does not manage content: all content managed by volunteer community



Wikipedia: behind the scenes scavenger hunt

But Wikipedia isn't trustworthy!



Actually, in a comparative study, key Wikipedia articles had an average of 4 errors each; compare to 3 for Encyclopaedia Britannica online



Anyone can make up anything

It's very difficult to add false information to Wikipedia articles, especially larger, more active ones

You don't know if it's accurate

There are many communitybased assessments for article quality, and all this information is open and available



Wikipedians aren't experts, they're all amateurs and teens

Wikipedians are a very diverse bunch, and they're all judged on the quality of their edits, not their background



How to:

- ☐ Create headers
- ☐ Bold/italicise text
- ☐ Bulleted/numbered lists
- ☐ Link to internal articles
- ☐ Link to external urls
- ☐ Add a category
- ☐ Reference



Editing: getting started

- ✓ Click on your Userpage, then on 'start this page'
- ✓ Five minutes to write 2-3 lines about anything use bold text, italics, 1 list, 2 header sizes
- ✓ Add a internal Wikipedia link
- ✓ Add an external link to a website
- ✓ Add an in-line citation using the editing toolbar template
- ✓ Add the category 'Wikipedians in Scotland'
- ✓ Before saving: always 'preview changes' and write an edit summary!



Editing: taking the plunge

- k Keep a neutral point of view
- & Verifiability: no original information
- & Avoid conflicts of interest
- & Remember: it's an encyclopaedia
- k Is this notable? Is it relevant?
- & Assume good faith!



Writing on Wikipedia

- Find any Wikipedia article with an image
- Click on that image and find its image description page on Wikimedia Commons
- What other articles has this image been used on?




- What information can you find out about this image?

Can you place an image?

- & Wikimedia websites have 500 million viewers per month
- & Wikimedia sites have around 21 billion page views per month
- ₩ Wikipedia has 4.5 million articles in English
- k There are more than 25 million articles in 285 other languages


