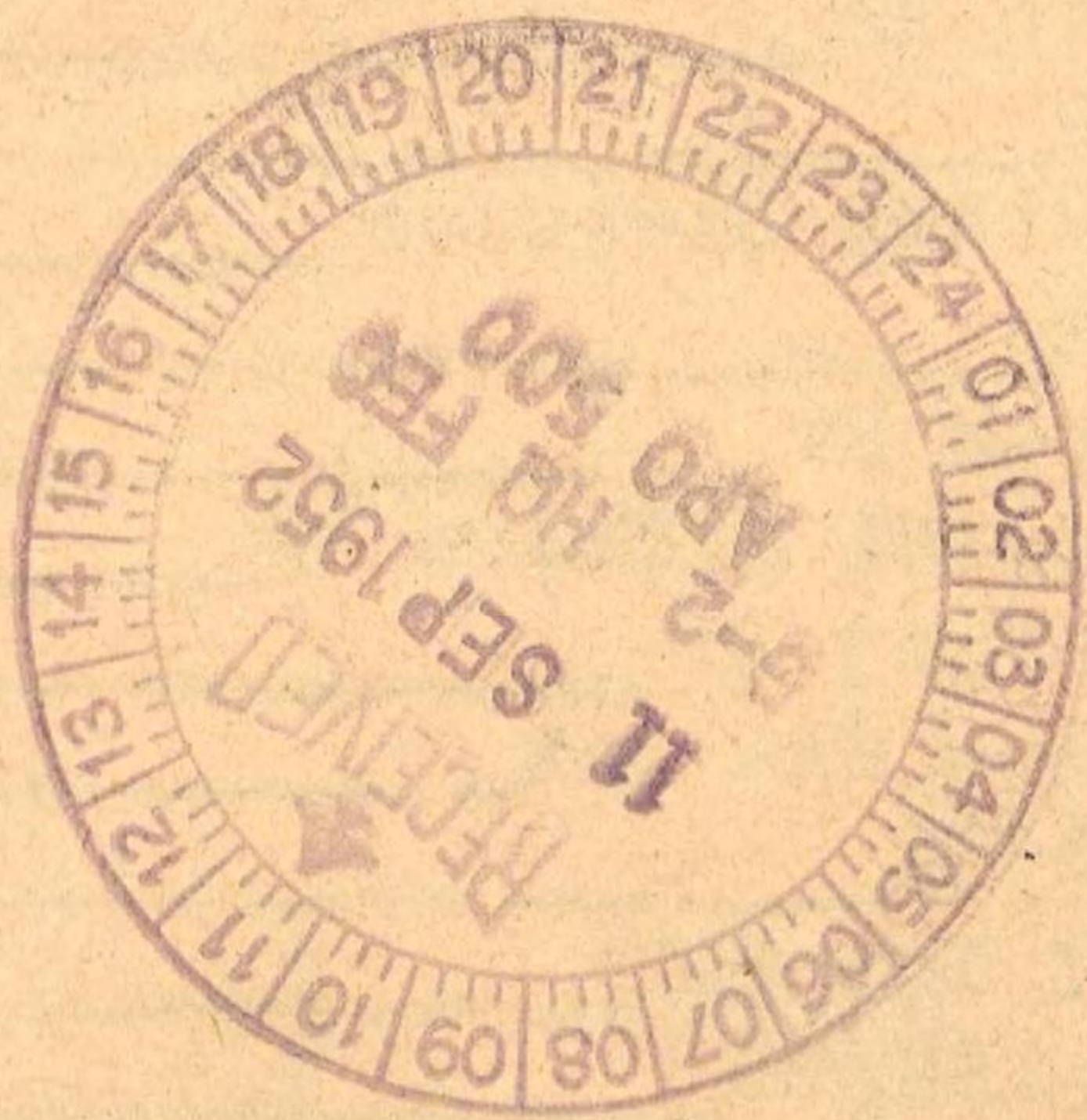

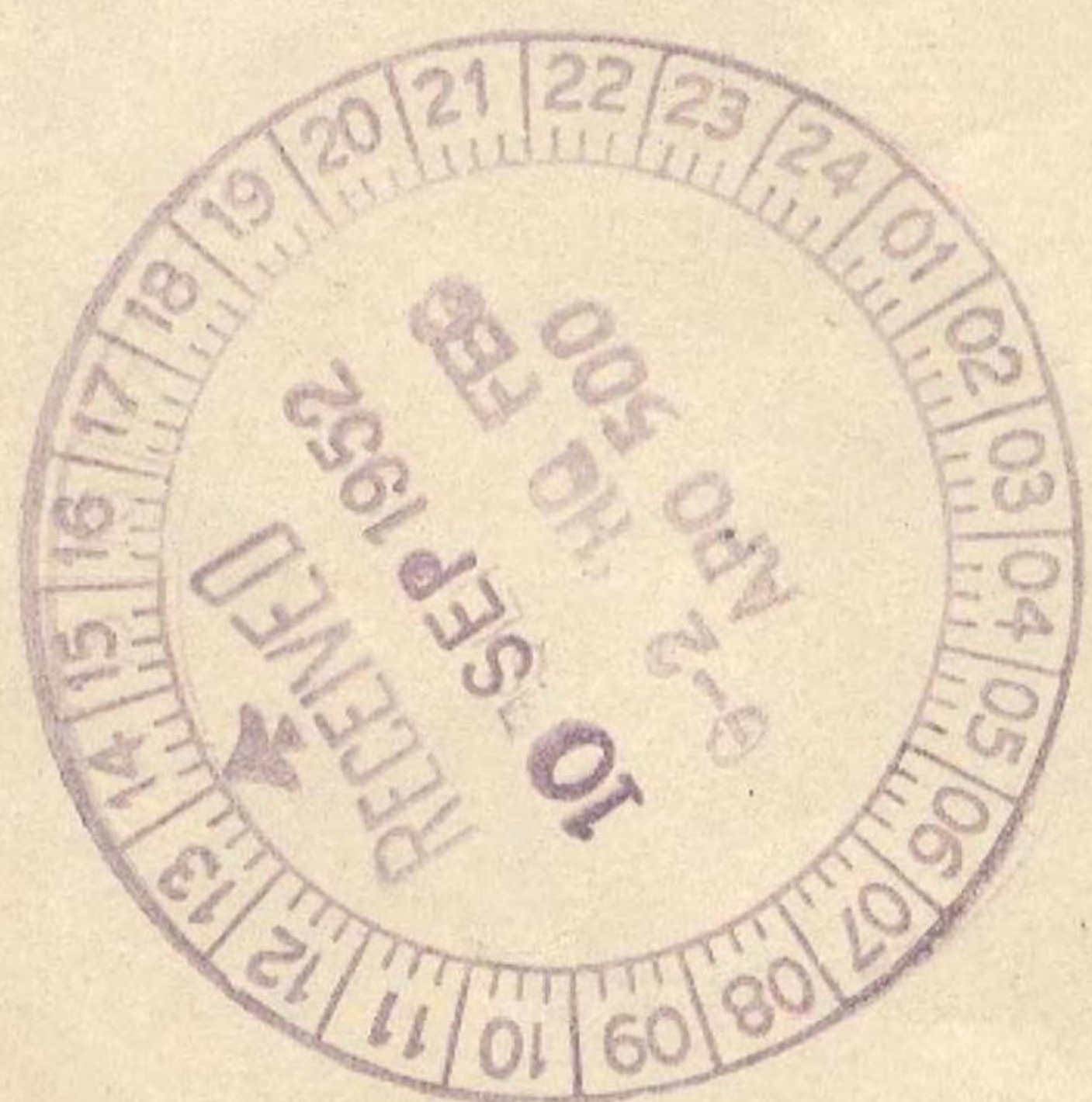
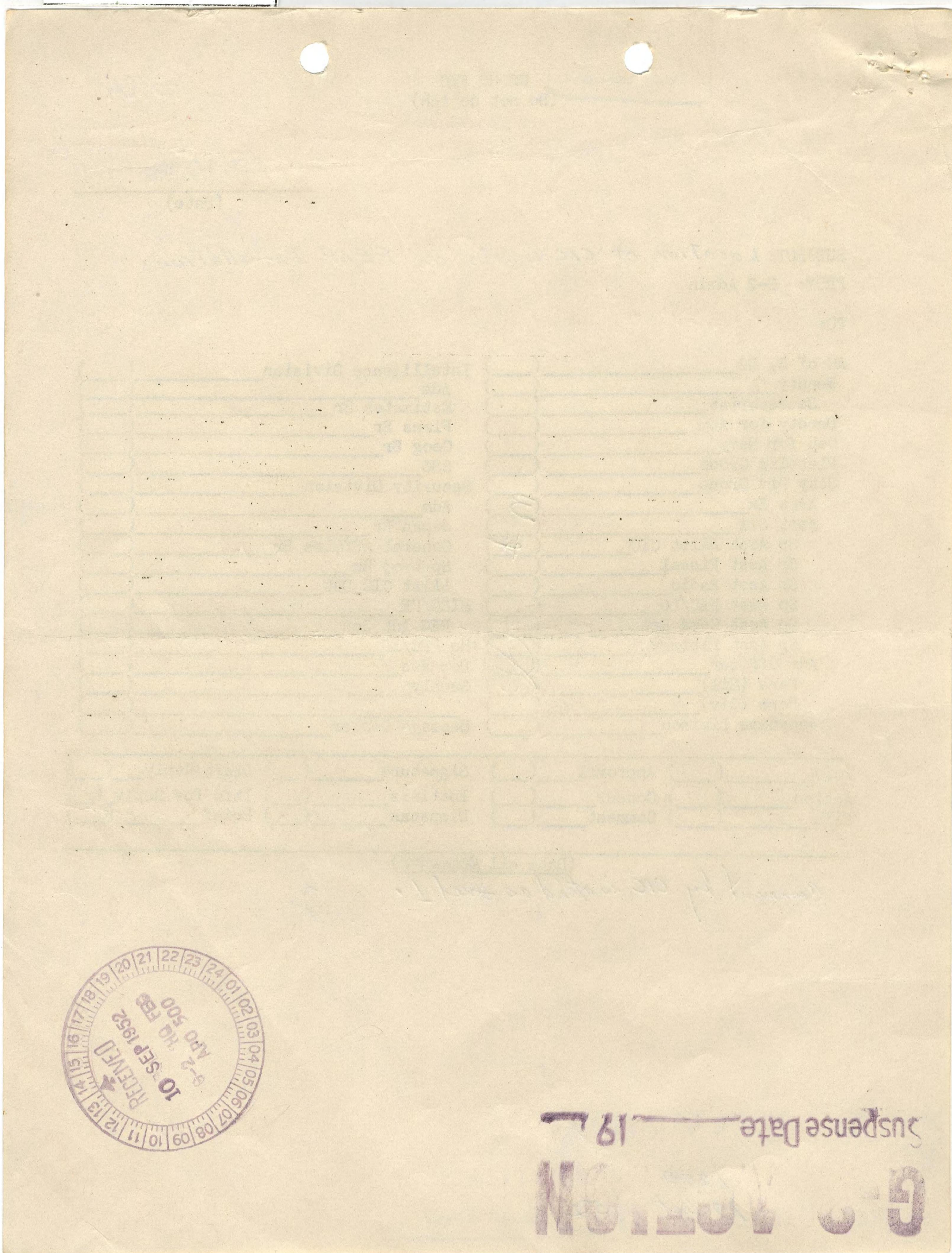

Those files and indices, which are of Counter Intelligence Corps interest to the Korean Communications Zone, will be transferred to the 704th Counter Intelligence Corps Detachment. In the case of files of mutual interest, copies will be exchanged between the 308th and 704th CIC Detachments. Lateral dissemination of copies of investigative reports is directed, so that the two respective Counter Intelligence Corps Detachments will be able to maintain and build up central repositories for counterintelligence information pertinent to Korea-wide operations.

e. Compilation and dissemination of lists indicating individuals considered as security risks which fall within the respective zones of responsibilities will be maintained by the Headquarters of the CIC Detachment having jurisdiction. 1. Reference letter, AG 602 (2 Apr 52)GA, General Headquarters, Far East Command, 2 April 1952, subject: "Release of Japanese Residences from Procurement Demand."

2. Because of sensitive political factors it is imperative that CIC field units in Japan be relocated into on-post facilities as soon after the effective date of the Peace Treaty as possible. It is also essential that CIC have as wide a deployment throughout the four (4) main islands of Japan as may be obtained by means of on-post locations in order that it may carry out its assigned mission. Proposed on-post deployment of CIC is shown on attached map (Incl 1).

3. It is desired that 441st CIC Detachment field units be given the highest priority in the assignment of on-post facilities necessary for their functions. Office space assigned for operations and administration must be suitable for the maintenance of the prestige of a GHQ unit and must provide the utmost in security safeguards. As far as practicable, CIC enlisted men will be billeted separately from other units. In most instances, CIC units will require access to centrally-operated messes and motor maintenance facilities and motor pools contingent upon the CIC strengths involved at each location.


POST PEACE TREATY DEPLOYMENT OF CIC IN JAPAN (PROPOSED)



SUBJECT: Considerations for Movements to "On Post" Facilities

TO: See Distribution

The following considerations will govern the move to "on post" facilities:

- a. CIC must not be the cause of any delay in moving; make doubly sure of this fact.
- b. New CP's must be open before old CP's close.
- c. Office space must be in permanent or semi-permanent construction. Remember our strength will gradually reduce, a little overcrowding is acceptable. I am currently making efforts to allow reduction in overall strength commensurate with new deployment.
- d. Strength figures on the map are discretionary. Placement of a few more people at one location, less at another location is within the District Commander's prerogative. It is desirable but not mandatory that over-all district strength figures be adhered to.
- e. Officers and EM may be billeted temporarily in tents with adequate lights, wooden floors, etc. In general we ask no more than that afforded any permanent post unit.
- f. Messes and motor pools generally will be combined with other units. Clubs will not be operated at other than district hq locations and difficulties may be encountered at such level; however, in the event that a separate district hq mess is authorized, consideration may be given to operation of a club in connection therewith during non-messing hours. In motor pools we must retain our own dispatching prerogatives for official purposes.
- g. Be practical and realistic on security requirements; real security depends on interior arrangements and discipline.
- h. Be wary of the "prestige of a General Headquarters unit." Our prestige lies in our efficiency and ability to do a job; not in our physical plant. The quality and extent of our good relations with post

personnel will be measured in direct proportion to the correct behavior and attitudes displayed by our personnel. We are "newcomers;" we will make the overtures; we will do the "getting along."

i. When suitable facilities are found - move! Do not wait for my concurrence. Our goal is "on the post."

j. Northern, Central and Southwest Commands have been authorized by General Weible to deal directly with my headquarters in any problems requiring a 441 decision. They will skip JLC channels. I hope such an arrangement will prove unnecessary.

k. We are soldiers - so are JLC personnel.

l. In clarification of possible conflicts or doubts on jurisdiction in specific instances due to changes of district boundaries the following delineations of responsibility will govern:

- (1) CO, 1st District will arrange move of Yamaguchi to Camp Crouch; will coordinate move of Shimane Area to Miho AFB with CO, 2d CIC District.
- (2) CO, 2d District will coordinate with CO, 1st District on move of Shimane Area to Miho AFB and consolidation thereof with Tottori Area; will arrange move of Hyogo Area to Koshien Air Strip; will handle move of District Hq to Camp Hiro; will handle all other deactivation in present 2d District zone of responsibility.
- (3) CO, 3d District will coordinate with CO, 2d District on acceptance of Hyogo Area (Koshien Air Strip) into 3d District.
- (4) CO's 4th, 7th and 8th Districts will coordinate efforts under supervision and instructions of CO, 7th District who will ultimately take over command of new 4th District.
- (5) CO, 5th District will arrange move of Niigata Area to Niigata AFB; will coordinate with CO, 7th District (intended CO, new 4th District) on acceptance of Niigata into new 4th District.
- (6) CO, 6th District will include FEC/LD requirements in making arrangements for redeployment.

m. CIC must not be the cause of any delay in moving to on post facilities.

1st District

Fukuoka Field Office - Location undecided; awaiting decision on letter requesting assignment of a reserve medical facility at Camp Hakata.

The remaining units of First District have been relocated according to plan.

2nd District

Headquarters, Yamaguchi and Hiroshima Areas have relocated according to plan and former facilities have been returned to logistical support unit.

Kochi Area - All T/O&E property has been shipped to District Hq. One (1) house has been cleared, and contents of two (2) others are ready for shipping. Packing and crating team expected to depart Kochi 1200 hours 13 June.

Okayama Area - Operational files being shipped to District Hq.

Ehime Area - Arrangements made for LCT to load vehicles and equipment 18 June.

Kagawa (and Tokushima) Area - Will be cleared when packing and crating team arrives and completes its work, probably in about two (2) weeks.

Shimane and Tottori Areas to MIHO AFB - Tottori opened at Miho 4 June. Shimane has been cleared with the exception of a few items of supply; old location will be completely cleared by 16 June.

3rd District

Headquarters and Kyoto Area to CAMP FUSHIMI - Both moves completed as of 23 May.

Camp Fushimi Resident Agency at CAMP OTSU - Two (2) additional personnel will be assigned when 3rd District completes redistribution of personnel.

Gifu Area to CAMP GIFU - Personnel have moved "on post". Completion of move scheduled for 13 June and former facilities will be reported as available for return on that date.

Nagoya Area to NAGOYA AFB - No facilities available. Conditions remain static. Hq, 3rd District has initiated letter recommending the unit remain in place until local conditions make a move possible.

Myogo Area to KOSHIN AIR STRIP - See next paragraph.

Osaka Area to SHINODAYAMA BARRACKS - Move completed 24 May; however, in conference with Lt Col Keyes, on 12 June 1952, the Commanding General, Southwest Command, informed Col Keyes that Camp Shinodayama will not be retained

by the US Forces, Japan. The CO, Camp Kobe, is giving favorable consideration to assigning facilities at Koshien Air Strip for CIC use, but Camp Kobe is still using the location he is considering. Col Keyes is planning to visit the CO, Camp Kobe, on 17 or 18 June to determine what arrangements can be made for relocating Hyogo and (former) Osaka Areas.

Camp Nara CIC Field Office - Move completed; unit operating.

Toyama Area - Closed out and facilities reported for return 12 June.

Fukui Area - Closed out 12 June.

Mie Area - Partially cleared; estimate it will be completely cleared on 16 June.

4th District

Niigata Area to NIIGATA AFB - Base commander has offered tentatively one (1) of the five (5) barrack-type buildings under construction on the base. Estimated date of completion, 1 August. Building will be adequate for offices and billets. Messing and vehicle maintenance facilities available.

The remaining units of 4th District have been relocated according to plan.

5th District

Headquarters, Fukushima and Miyagi Areas to CAMP FOWLER - All moves to "on post" locations completed. Fukushima PD property relinquished.

Akita and Yamagata Areas to CAMP YOUNGHANS - Akita, now designated Camp Younghans CIC Liaison Office, has completed all moves except dependents, whose moves will be completed by 15 June. Camp Younghans has been notified of vacated PD property. PD Houses #2776 and #2777 are now occupied as office-officer billets and EM billets, respectively. Yamagata, now designated Camp Younghans CIC Field Office, move completed; headquarters is in temporary location "on post" pending completion of permanent structure about 15 July. PD property relinquished.

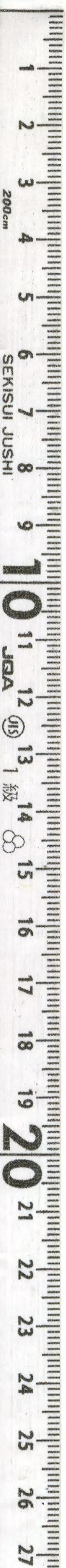

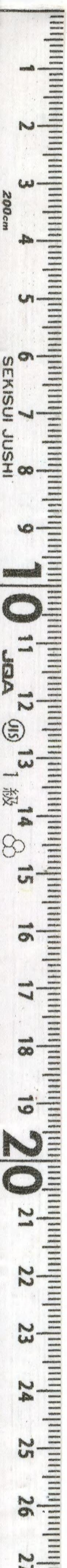

2. With the realization that sooner or later CIC operations must be relocated to nearby military installations throughout Japan and as a result of the reply of the CIC representative to our offer, this headquarters has made a further study of the CIC requirements.

3. Although it is realized that separate messing, billeting and vehicular services cannot be provided and that the convenience to and the efficiency of operations will be impaired to some extent, it is the opinion of this headquarters that with a few minor alterations of the space offered, the minimum CIC requirements can be met for the Miyazaki and Oita CIC Detachments.

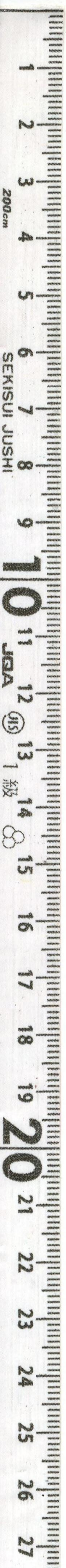

1. Reference letter this headquarters, dated 13 February 1952, subject: Availability of SCAP Authorized Type Facilities for Use of CIC, and subsequent indorsements thereto.

2. Prior to preparation of letter referred to in paragraph one (1), subject was, as you will recall, discussed with you and members of your staff. At that time our opinions and recommendations were in consonance with our beliefs concerning the necessity for relocation of the Oita-ken and Miyazaki-ken CIC units.

3. Subsequent to the writing of letter referred to in paragraph one (1) above, this indorsement, we have again discussed subject with you and members of your staff during your absence. These conferences and discussions were held with an exacting view in mind of obtaining information which this headquarters could utilize as a basis for intelligence planning of any required moves of Counter Intelligence Corps units to on-post or enemy-seized facilities. In this respect, this headquarters wishes to advise you, again, that it is aware of and most cognizant of the desires of the Commander-in-Chief, Far East Command, relative to release of Metropolitan real estate.

4. Upon receipt of basic communication which stipulates that certain facilities and/or property are now available in Camp Chickamauga proper, another space analysis and utilization survey was conducted of the offered facilities. This action was taken in order to determine, in accordance with requirements and instructions from my higher headquarters, the suitability of offered facilities. These requirements and conditions are:

- a. Present deployment
- b. Present authorized strengths
- c. Continuation of present mission

d. Considerations for consolidation of mess and motor pool facilities.

e. Separate billeting for CIC personnel.

5. During the latter survey, it was revealed that facilities offered in Camp Chickamauga do not meet, in the considered opinion of this headquarters, our requirements for relocating the Oita-ken Counter Intelligence Corps unit or the Miyazaki-ken Counter Intelligence Corps unit. The inadequacy of facilities offered is substantiated somewhat by remarks in your letter dated 21 March 1952, subject: Disposition of Procured Property, which was transmitted to this headquarters.

6. If the Counter Intelligence Corps mission remains unchanged, operations will be affected adversely, in our opinion, if CIC units must move to on-post facilities. The operational necessity of contacting casual informant Japanese police, government officials, business men and others by inviting them to come to Counter Intelligence Corps Offices will be difficult to accomplish if all such persons must pass through military police check points. However, this problem is not insurmountable if certain restrictions, as they apply to the situation, can be lifted by Camp Chickamauga authorities. Other plans would, of necessity, have to be made by us and consummated in order for us to maintain our required operational efficiency.

7. Other reasons substantiating our opinions as to the suitability of the offered space are:

a. Due to the larger number of buildings and facilities of type concerned, fire hazards would be potentially increased.

b. Maintenance of Counter Intelligence Corps security of facilities utilized would be far more difficult. Our present manning table would not permit sufficient guards to control properly.

c. Space offered is in two separate sections of a building which would cause another serious security problem and hamper seriously the CIC efficiency.

d. A considerable amount of work would be required in rehabilitating the space offered.

e. The location of the motor pool facilities offered does not lend itself towards efficiency as it is one-half mile from other space offered. Serious delays in appointments could result easily, due to distance involved. Spot calls that require immediate attention would be affected adversely unless drivers were hired on the same basis as they are for post vehicles, i.e., on a 24 hour basis to be available and ready to meet all operational necessities. Our manning table will not permit, at present, the hiring of such personnel.

f. Messing provisions by the post would have to be made to feed agents returning late from an operational trip. Odd hour couriers must also have facilities for messing.

g. Our organization has valuable photographic equipment for a laboratory. It must be set up to get maximum results during operations. The on-post facilities offer space that would require rehabilitation causing a considerable amount of work in order to make it operational. There is nothing in the space proposed that would indicate a suitable photo laboratory. Inclosure No. 1 shows that the photo laboratory would be located on the 2d floor and as such, out of ready accessibility of operational personnel and at the same time dividing further the organizations facilities.

h. The on-post facilities offered do not provide for the following:

- (1) Interrogation Rooms (minimum - 3)
- (2) Rooms for Translators
- (3) Room for Interpreters and reception
- (4) Radio Communications room
- (5) Other facility space peculiar to CIC

i. The Oita-ken and Miyazaki-ken headquarters are well established in facilities which meet exacting requirements of this and higher headquarters.

j. Facilities utilized at present are more compact and are much better suited for the accomplishment of our assigned mission.

8. My recommendations for alternate plans, in priority sequence, are:

a. Retention of facilities utilized at present in Beppu-shi and Miyazaki-shi.

- (1) This recommendation is based on information received by this headquarters which states, "It is imperative that continuing aggressive efforts be made by District Commanders to attempt to relocate CIC installations outside of Metropolitan Areas in all instances in which the CIC mission can be carried out with such relocation." In my opinion, Beppu-shi and Miyazaki-shi may not be considered by higher headquarters to be Metropolitan Areas and hence retention may not be contrary to the spirit of intent of recent directives.

- (2) It is realized that a recommendation of this nature will have to be approved at GHQ level, but I offer it as the one which seems, at present, the most practical and feasible. Funds and effort have been expended on the facilities to adapt them to their present needs.
- (3) If such retention is considered by GHQ to be contrary in any way, or not in consonance with recent directives, this headquarters has no desire to retain the facilities, and withdraws this recommendation in favor of 8b below.

b. Assignment of other on-post facilities which would suit our requirements more satisfactorily than those offered.

- (1) Assignment of facilities of on-post character should be such as to preclude deficiencies stipulated in paragraphs six (6) and seven (7) above.
- (2) Assignment of on-post buildings and facilities and necessary rehabilitation thereof would permit an immediate releasing of facilities utilized at present.
- (3) Our assigned Counter Intelligence Corps mission could be more successfully carried out with facilities such as herein recommended than it can be with facilities now being offered.

9. Other than the above alternate plans, I do not visualize, at present, any other suitable facilities in the vicinity of Beppu-shi.

10. This headquarters is not authorized to make any definite commitments for any moves prior to approval of GHQ. However, tentative local "Hold" arrangements are authorized. Therefore, it would be most helpful to intelligence and appreciated if your headquarters could offer suitable facilities upon which a tentative local "Hold" could be placed.

11. Recommendations as above, emanating from this headquarters, are being forwarded to our higher headquarters for review, decisions and necessary action as appropriate.

12. Your headquarters will be advised immediately upon receipt, by us, of any pertinent findings and/or decisions.

1. The CIC Detachment on Tsushima Island at the present time consists of one (1) enlisted man. This detachment occupies a quonset hut in the Signal Detachment Compound on the Island. This hut is utilized only by the CIC Detachment.
2. The Signal Compound in which the above described hut is located is the only real estate on the Island under the control of this headquarters. In the event signal installations thereat should no longer be required and the Signal Compound released from Army control, no U.S. Army facilities will exist on the Island for relocation of the CIC Detachment.
3. It is not known to this headquarters whether the CIC Detachment would be required on the Island in the event of closing the signal installations thereon. This problem is further complicated by the fact that it is understood that this detachment comes under the control of the Nagasaki CIC Office instead of the Fukuoka CI Office. 1. The outline plan is for US CIC coverage of Korea up to the demilitarized zone for the post "Cease Fire" period. US CIC coverage, as outlined below, constitutes Phase I of the counterintelligence deployment in Korea during an armistice period and until US troops are withdrawn from Korea.

2. This plan covers personnel, equipment requirements, organization and deployment of US CIC teams with necessary linguistic support (T/O & E 30-500, 15 Sep 48, as amended, and T/O & E 30-600, 20 Oct 48, as amended) throughout the entire United Nations' zone in South Korea.

3. Coverage should be provided from personnel made available to the Eighth Army Counter Intelligence Officer by the Theatre Counterintelligence Officer. (See paragraph 13, SR 380-310-1, 29 May 50). This plan contemplates that all CIC personnel in Korea will be assigned to the EUSAK CIC detachment (308th CIC Detachment) at a proper time, when circumstances favor it subsequent to the "Cease Fire." In the event a need for tactical employment of US troops should arise, the US CIC detachment commander having centralized control would release sufficient US CIC personnel to the tactical commanders as required by the situation.

4. Since the ROK is a sovereign state with an organized functioning government and a CIC agency furnishing area coverage of South Korea, US CIC coverage is not required nor desired. The requirement for complete area coverage is of primary interest to the Korean government and can best be provided by agencies of that government, therefore the actual deployment of US CIC strength available for Korea will be determined largely by the disposition of US troops and military installations after an armistice agreement. An examination of the probable situation which will exist after the armistice indicates that:

a. CIC coverage will be needed just south of the demilitarized zone. It is felt that the strength of the CIC teams operating within a division zone probably would consist of twelve (12) spaces and that in the corps zone eight (8) spaces per corps would be sufficient.

b. CIC personnel will be required at those locations which are essential to the security of EUSAK, viz. corps and division rears, ports supporting EUSAK, and the main bases of supply.

c. CIC personnel will be required at refugee collecting points along the principal routes of communications for the preliminary interrogation of all refugees prior to their being sent to the central interrogation center.

d. CIC personnel will be needed to operate a central interrogation center to process returning ROKA prisoners of war and other indigenous personnel who will be returned to South Korea after the conclusion of an armistice agreement.

5. US CIC coverage in area within the demilitarized zone may be by means of informant coverage.

6. Organization will be adjusted to fit the situation and the mission. In general, cellular organization will be followed as closely as possible. The following is a likely frame of organization:

a. The Army headquarters detachment will be an AC-BC combination.

b. Major port areas will be assigned AC-BC or AB-BB detachments.

c. Four CA and nine DA teams will be required for food service and motor maintenance. These are not available but have been requested.

7. The linguist situation, if present trend is continued, will not be adequate. Either CIC replacements must be linguists or civilian linguists must be hired. This last course presents a major security hazard. A separate report on this matter has been made.

8. a. Except for linguists, food service and motor maintenance, personnel presently available are adequate for the expected needs.

b. Normal equipment requirements are available from T/O&E allowances; necessary deviations for emergencies will be handled as the needs arise.

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SUBJECT: Post-Treaty Activities of the CIC, 9 Jan 52, contd

9. In this plan it is assumed that indigenous personnel will be utilized for housekeeping, guards, motor maintenance, translators, interpreters and like duties. Translators and interpreters to be in addition to those mentioned in paragraph 8 above. It is estimated that it will require approximately three (3) indigenous employees to each military space. Manning tables, based on the requirements of each unit, can only be determined after organization is more firm.

10. Logistic support and courts-martial jurisdiction will depend on the organization and deployment selected.

11. Present signal communications available in Korea are adequate for normal operations. However, they will not be adequate for estimated post hostilities operations. A teletype terminal is desirable at each major team.

12. It is believed that the modifications planned will adequately safeguard US troops and military installations without infringing on the ROK government. Continued assistance and guidance to ROK CIC will, of course, be extended as long as US CIC units remain in Korea.
