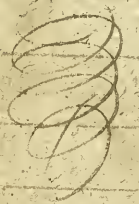

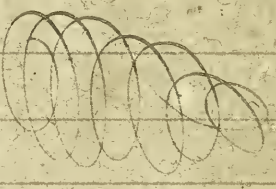

Remarks

The great loss of property especially of bedding and clothing, having been reported in my march report (see the account November 18th) of this Hospital (by order) to a place of safety 33 miles distant on the thousand capture of this Post by the enemy, this property return could have been ample testimony to the diligence and care bestowed on the proper preservation of the public property.

On the approach of the Enemy this Hospital was evacuated with our 500 patients, all of whom were quickly transported within a very short time, and the order to pack & be ready for removal by us a war march the midnight previous. The transportation was expedite and orderly arranged, more than fifty patients were in such condition that they were transported to other Hospitals, some on their beds, and all with out their bedding, after previous exertions but very little of the bedding was lost that has been or can be recovered.

Some of the property was in doubt stolen but much the larger portion was transported with the patients, & soon off

by them, and therefore still in the Service of the Confederate States Army, and have been sent to this Hospital.

It is hoped that the unfavorable circumstances mentioned will serve to under the laws which have been sustained.
