



1. An unidentified flying object was sighted at Nouasseur Air Base, 33°22'N 07°35'W, 25 March 1953 at 2123 hours, by the crew of a C-47 on a routine training flight. The air crew of the above aircraft was interviewed and an investigation was conducted at Nouasseur Air Base by the Preparing Officer.

2. Reference letter, Air Technical Intelligence Center, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio, AFOIN-ATIAE-5, 2 April 1953, requesting specific electronics data on ground radar, further investigation reveals that no additional information was obtained from the GCA Site at Nouasseur Air Base. The following report is based on the interrogation of A/2C John Ibanez, AF-12381750, who has eight months experience in radar. An Electronics Data Sheet on ground radar was submitted to this operator with negative results. However, his statement is included in this report. An extract of the flight dispatch records for 25 March 1953 has been included with the Tower Operator's Log.

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The following information was received by the Directorate of Intelligence, Headquarters 5th Air Division, from Headquarters 80th Air Depot Wing on 8 May 1953, and is transmitted for evaluation:

"a. In an interview with A/2C John Ibanez, AF-12381750, on 22 April 1953, the following report is forwarded. Statement of A/2C Ibanez is as follows:

'At approximately 2200 hours, 25 March 1953, while I was on duty at the GCA Section at Nouasseur, I received a call from the AO (Major Melvin G. Scheer) via the Nouasseur Control Tower wanting to know how many blips I had on my Radar Screen. I reported that I had four (4). Approximately four (4) or five (5) minutes later I received another call from Major Scheer requesting that I keep a time log and also track the aircraft on my set. I kept this report as requested and it was turned over to the AO upon completion of duty.'

"b. Extract from Nouasseur Flight Dispatch Records for 25 March 1953: 2135: Tower notified us that AF 9181 was reporting an unidentified object flying around their aircraft. - 2150: Notified OSI when 918k reported that the object now seemed to be stationary.

"c. Report of landings and take-offs at Nouasseur, 25 March 53:

French aircraft #FBFGP C-54 landed from Marseille 2120 hours.
Aircraft 3007, C-47 (Pilot Captain Stuart M. Pritchard AO-674520) ATO 1732 landed at 2140.
Aircraft 3066, C-47 (Pilot Major William G. Jackson AO-750391) ATO 1908 landed at 2253.
Navy (MATS) R6D 1587 landed at Nouasseur at 2256 from Tripoli."

"Bcn & obst lts ch 5x5, AF 9181 observes OBJECT under Af 3007 who is on final. Advised Af 3007 of OBJECT. AF 3007 acknowledged. AO advsd twr to call AF 9181 and to circle the spot where OBJECT is at. AF 9181 rogered and is proceeding back to Nouasseur. Af 9181 is over area where OBJECT is and is circling it. At present, AO and OSI is in tower. AF 9181 describes the OBJECT as being small with one bright light. AO & OSI is going to check on this matter. AO is taking 1 flare-gun and 3 flares with him. fld is beginning to get fog-in. AO & OSI is using Crash Ambulance. Communication between Crash Ambulance is good. AF 9181 informed twr that they cannot see OBJECT due to fog. At this time AF 3066 request landing instructions at 4000 feet homing in on the NR Bcn. Twr advsd a/c to remain at 4000 since ATC has advsd us of MATS 1787 is at 3500 feet inbound to NR. Af 9181 rept that he is going back to CNSE since he cannot see the OBJECT any longer. TWR thanked the A/C. The AO & the OSI is still checking on this matter. MATS 1587 called tower when 4 min from CNCA rng. Twr advsd MATS 1587 of present wx and to rept when over CA rng. Then Twr cleared AF 3066 for an approach.

"By then Base Wx rept -X with .1 nm vsby. Twr advsd AF 3066 of wx and that NR fld is closed. 3066 was on downwind then. MATS 1587 rept over CA rng. Twr cleared a/c to the NR bcn and to maintain his altitude (3500') until further advsd. Twr then called AF 3066 which I (Alfred Arneho) tried contacting him advising a/c of wx and that the fld was below minimums. Twr rcvd no reply from this a/c. Aircraft was then seen on runway. AF 3066 landed safely and had the 'follow-me' jeep to meet the aircraft.

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"Then MATS 1587 rept over the NR Bcn taking up the holding pattern and so stated that he sure hope the twr will bring him in safely and that the twr will be held responsible. Twr replied that fld is completely closed and that twr & MATS operations that landing will be done at his own discretion. Aircraft "Roger" twr. When MATS 1587 rept visual etc, twr did not clear aircraft to land but that r/w 35 is appropriate with wind C. MATS 1587 landed safely and all is well. About the OBJECT again, twr advsd all aids to navigation namely: GCA, DF, Pursesnatcher, CATC, AMC, & flt service, and that to keep a log of what they might pick up on their scope. So now it is 2345 and Major Shears has just been up in the twr to return the flare-gun and that OBJECT is still unknown.

"2355 off duty, briefed relief."



SUBJECT: Flying Saucers

On Wednesday, 25 March 1952, at about 3 o'clock (Central Standard Time) I observed one (1) unidentified flying object which was circular and shiny. I could not determine the altitude, but the object was flying straight and level from Greenwood Cemetary near the city of Saint Andrews towards Panama City, Florida. I first sighted the object while sitting in a chair looking out the window. The sun was not shining in the window, but away from it, so that it cast a reflexion of the object.

When I first sighted the object it was quite far away, and I have no idea of the actual or estimated distance. I watched the object for about three (3) seconds, and then rushed to the front door in an attempt to get another look, but the object had disappeared. It could have been possibly a very fast jet aircraft.
