### PROGRAM 1: Increasing Participation

The set of activities under ‘Increasing Participation’, will ensure we meet our goal of helping Ghanaians online to discover Wikipedia and other Wikimedia open knowledge projects, build editing skills, as well as keeping editors engaged.

<b>New Reader Campaign on radio</b>	Since 2017, a group member who is a radio presenter has been sharing facts and historical anniversaries found on <a href="https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Main_Page">en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Main_Page</a> on Citi FM’s Citi Breakfast Show from Mondays to Thursdays. <b>Monthly workshops</b>	<p>Workshops are designed to host beginning and experienced editors who edit and create content for Wikipedia, Wikidata and any other wiki.</p> <p>Events come in various focuses.</p> <p>Some are held around themes, held at conferences organised by our partners, or just a regular workshops in a new city to recruit new editors.</p> <p>We usually target 10-15 participants in events lasting 4-6 hours.</p>	<p>We plan to hold 4 events each month.</p> <p>There are about 11 cities in Ghana spread across 16 regions, and the user group organises events in about 6 cities. They are led by experienced editors based in those cities.</p>	<p>The desired result of this project is to teach new recruits how to edit Wikipedia and give existing ones an opportunity to edit in a group setting.</p> <p>We also achieve content creation.</p> <p>Our successes can be measured by number of recruits trained, editors engaged and articles improved.</p> <p>This year for example, we recruited 63 new editors, who created 8 articles, improved 183 <a href="#">in just one program</a>.</p>
