1. Information received under date of 1 October 1946 from American Zone, Germany, indicates that following his departure from San Remo in April 1944, Subject worked for Amt VI, RSHA.

2. In April 1945 Subject and two other RSHA personnel, Dr. Emil AUGSBURG and Annemarie BUSCHMANN, cached eight trunks of anti-Komintern files at Ettal Bavaria. At Ettal, Subject was in frequent contact with Polish officers and at the end of August 1945, he and his associates were taken from Ettal by Polish officers in a car. The exact fate of the documents, which AUGSBURG stated before departure were to be placed at the disposal of the Vatican, is unknown. The possibility that they are still at Ettal is being checked, although it is strongly felt that they may have fallen into Polish hands.

3. Subject and AUGSBURG were both reported at Ancona in February 1946, at which time one KERSCHKE, a Polish priest presumably stationed at Ancona, visited Ettal.

5. USFET and Amzon, Only: Subject is well-known to the Italian CE who contacted him at the Polish church, San Remo, photographed all of his materials and aided him in retrieving a case of original materials from Warsaw without the knowledge of the Germans, in 1942-43. Unfortunately, all of their copies were destroyed at the moment of the Italian armistice, 8 September 1943.

6. This information was forwarded for [ ], which reported on 8 February 1946 that Subject had had German passport No. 487, issued at Genoa on 12 August 1943, valid until November 1945, and that he had left San Remo about April 1944 taking with him all his personal possessions, including his anti-Communist files. His last known address was given as AntiKomintern, Berlin, Schoenberg, Badenschstrasse 2.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE OFFICER IN CHARGE:

SUBJECT: files of the German Anti-Comintern Research, AMT VI  
RSHA

RE : summary of information

1. All news and research pertaining to Comintern, which came through RSHA and ABWEHR channels, were collected by a team of scientists, Monsignore KIRIATOWSKY <sup>Anton</sup> ~~Cor KIRIATKOWSKY~~ and SS-STUBAF DR. AUGSBURG of AMT VI RSHA. Their job was to gain an overall picture of Russian intelligence through the means of the COMINTERN organization.

2. On 14 <sup>Annemarie</sup> April 1945, KIRIATOWSKY, DR. AUGSBURG, and their secretary, Miss BUSCHMANN, arrived by truck from the WANNSEE-INSTITUT near Berlin at Garmisch-Partenkirchen, and took lodging at the HOTEL ZUR POST. Part of their luggage consisted of 6 to 8 filing cabinets, each estimated to weigh more than 100 pounds. This truck continued its trip to the SD office in Innsbruck, No. 3 Herrengasse.

3. On or about 26 April 1945 this team received orders from the Gruppenleiter AMT VI RSHA, SS OSTUBAF Albert RAPP, to leave Garmisch and to seek refuge in a monastery, to protect their files against enemy capture and to destroy them only if they were apt to fall into the hands of the Russians.

4. The team moved to ETTAL and the community of OBERAU. Acting under a direct order from the Gauleiter of Bavaria, the abbot of the monastery ETTAL quartered the threesome in the community, and allowed Monsignore KIRIATOWSKY to hold a daily service in the monastery.

5. During their 4 months stay they continued their work and acquired half a dozen more filing cabinets built by hermit SOHAECHTELE who also cared for their food, etc. Due to billet requirements of U.S. occupational troops, they were forced to move several times, living at various times at Oberau and ETTAL at the following addresses: Hotel zur Post, Hotel Ludwig der Bayer, c/o Oberinspektor A. D. Lang, c/o policeman Heinlein. At various times during this period, they received short visits from Polish officers.

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6. some time in July or August, 1945, a U.S. 6x6 truck arrived from a Polish camp in Murnau and loaded their files as well as personal belongings and left for an unknown destination.

7. In November 1945, Monsignore KIRIATOWSKY, clad in U.S. uniform with Polish officer's insignia, called on the local policeman, Sgt. Heinlein (his former landlord) and said, "I am just arriving from Italy. My car and driver are waiting outside. I am on my way to Oberammergau. All three of us are with the Polish division, and we are doing fine. He picked up some odds and ends they had forgotten, held a service in the monastery, and went on.

1. It is required that Dr. Emil AUGSBURG, presently carded as X-3053-IV-K, be dropped from your records as an officially carded informant of this region.

2. subject is being dropped for the following reasons:

a. subject has been reporting on eastern zone positive intelligence for the past year. In the re-organization of the "Peterson Net" subject was dropped as he was unable to produce any information of a local level of CIG interest.

b. subject is alleged to have been contacted by TIB agents and is currently attempting to negotiate employment with that organization.

c. subject was in close contact with members of the "General Vlassow group" and it is alleged that subject assisted certain members in a material way.

d. subject is known to be a strong anti-Bolshevik but he has strong nationalistic political views.

3. subject has not been in contact with CIG for several months, no EEI's have been given, and further classification is deemed unnecessary.

Emil AUGSBURG dropped as of 12 Nov 48 by CIC. BARBIE stated that Dr. A. had been visited several times by a former SS GEN. BERNAU of CIC. B. told A. that he could furnish the PETERSEN net EEIs that he rec'd from TIB and they could exchange the information. BARBIE stated that if any info exchanged, it was thru Dr. A. Dr. A. has a brother, who is with the Stuttgart SS net; however this was only recently discovered because Dr. A. introduced his brother under an alias. BARBIE stated his net never trusted the Stuttgart SS net because of their connection to the French.

10. In pruning down the [ ] group, one member, Dr. Emil AUGSBURG, was taken over into GVL's Headquarters staff but works out of Munich. AUGSBURG comes from Lodz and he speaks Polish and Russian. (Possibly Agent [ ] He has now been entrusted with the exploitation of Case SCHWARZ (on which we have as yet received no reports). In Case SCHWARZ one former General Staff officer, Col. WEISS of Berchtesgaden is the central figure. KUEHNE, SCHACK's deputy, in [ ], had been assisting the WEISS family while the husband was a PW. He returned in the late spring of 1950 and wanted to express his thanks to KUEHNE. It developed that WEISS had been a PW of the Poles and that he had been released when he agreed to work for the Polish IS. KUEHNE introduced him to an 'interested party' (AUGSBURG) and WEISS is now writing down his experiences. Since this might turn into a DA operation, AUGSBURG has been instructed to deliver his reports directly to KERBL (former scenery designer for Fritz FISCHER at the Gaertnerplatz Operettentheater) and now [ ] headquarters on Munich visits, also a letter drop, from whence messages can be picked up directly by [ ] headquarters.

Summary of traces on Emil AUGSBURG

REFERENCE:

1. There are no traces here on Paul BOHKOHL, and he is not listed in the 1950 Berlin telephone directory.

2. We have the following traces on Dr. Emil AUGSBURG.

[ ] dated 19 September 1949  
Dr. Emil AUGSBURG was included in a list of members of the ANTEROOM chain.

[ ] dated 1 December 1948  
Dr. Emil AUGSBURG & ALTHAUS - born 1 May 1904; resided at Feilbergstrasse 12, Kempten; dropped by US intelligence agency in Austria or Germany without prejudice.

[ ] dated 1 October 1946  
In April 1945, Monsignor Anton KWIATOWSKI, Dr. Emil AUGSBURG and Annemarie BUSCHMANN, all of Amt VI, RSHA, cached eight trunks of anti-Cominterra files at Ettal, Bavaria. In August 1945, KWIATOWSKI and his associates were taken from Ettal by Polish officers in a car. The exact fate of the documents, which AUGSBURG stated were to be placed at the disposal of the Vatican, is unknown. The possibility that they are at Ettal is being checked, but it is thought that they fell into Polish hands. KWIATOWSKI and AUGSBURG were reported to be at Ancona in February 1946, at which time KERSCHKE and a Polish priest, presumably stationed at Ancona, visited Ettal.

Carded information

Dr. Emil AUGSBURG was added to the list of war criminals wanted by the Polish government. He was accused of stealing Polish art treasures in 1944.

Dr. Emil AUGSBURG - specialist on Soviet state ideology and law; born in Lodz and attended school there; studied Germanics at Breslau and Leipzig Universities; took his degree in 1934; has been with the SD since 1934, first with Amt VII and then with Amt VI; born about 1905; 1.75m tall; large head; thick gray hair; very fair eyebrows and lashes; pale face; thick pale lips; wears glasses.

Dr. Emil AUGSBURG was deputy director of the Wernicke Institute (Eastern & European Institute of Economy) of Berlin and later Plankowitz, Austria. In 1943, the Institute was placed under the command of Gruppe VI G for ideological research and was to provide scientific support for the intelligence services. The scientists of Sonderlager L cooperated closely with the Wernicke Institute.

Hauptsturmfuehrer AUGSBURG - head of Sonderlager T, then joined Amt VI WI T; brother of Dr. Emil AUGSBURG; born in Lodz; qualified engineer; worked for Siemens on their foreign orders; speaks Russian and Polish; joined the SD in 1934; served with Amt III until 1943 and with Amt VI since then; born about 1905; 1.75m tall; graying hair; rather thick set.

SS Untersturmfuehrer AUGSBURG who later became Obersturmfuehrer was the head of Sonderlager L, a Special Interrogation Camp for scientists of all types attached to Waldlager Breslau-Orlitz in 1943. AUGSBURG was an engineer and a specialist in power installations. He reportedly occupied a leading position with the ADG before joining Amt VI.

3. The following information was extracted from the German Army dossier of Oberleutnant Rudolf WEISS.

Born 27 September 1910 in Potsdam; attended school in Potsdam until 1931; married Vera von der GOLZ in May 1937; daughter born in 1939; sons born in 1940 and 1944.

April 1931 - entered the German Army as a private

March 1934 - promoted to Leutnant; assigned to I/Kraftfahr Kommando, Posen.

October 1936 - promoted to Oberleutnant; assigned to 5 Pz. Div. IIa Nr. 2066/36g.

January 1939 - Adjutant des Chofs des Heerespersonalrats, OBR.

March 1940 - promoted to Hauptmann.

June 1940 - assigned to the 6th Panzer Regiment of the 8th Panzer Brigade.

September 1940 - assigned to the Oberkommando des Heeres, Heerespersonal

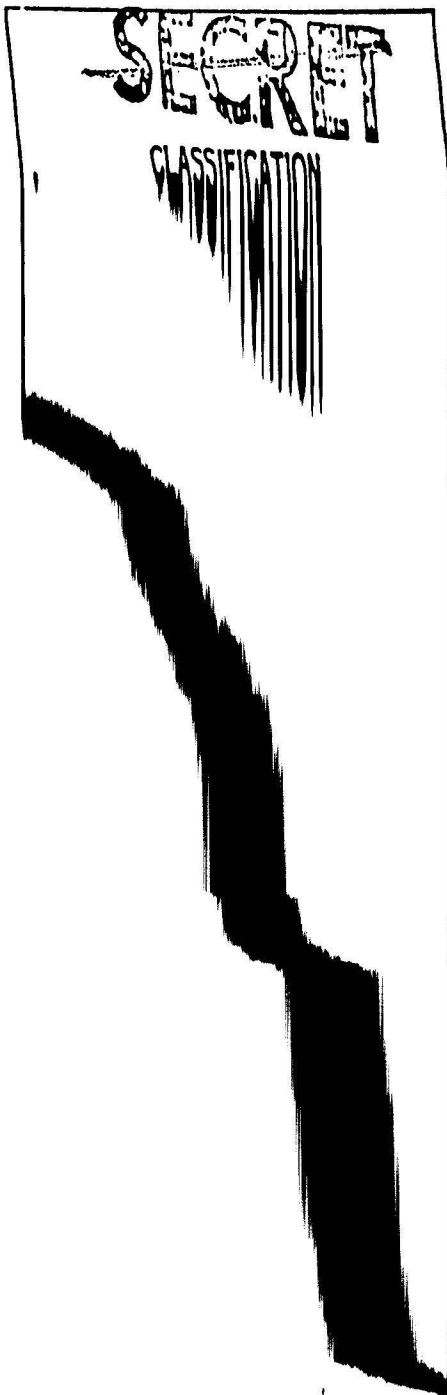

1. Enclosed is ZIPPER memo 4885 giving the latest developments in subject case. [ ] has now been able to get a job which requires less traveling in the LKAD Vehicle Factory located in Bochum-Essen. This will facilitate his being carefully run by ZIPPER. On the other hand [ ] has temporarily lost contact with [ ] [V-2907] attributes this to [ ] moving. He feels that as soon as the FIS establishes some new surveillants in Bochum that [ ] will once more be contacted.

2. It is interesting to note that [V-2907] reiterates his conviction that [ ] is being surveilled by the FIS, but that he feels there is no particular danger as long as [ ] is not seen with people who are known as Western IS operatives. [V-2907] can hardly avoid considering himself in this category. Apparently [V-2907]'s research project for the RSHA was quite well known to the Poles as he was frequently contacted by Polish officers in the latter part of 1945 [ ] [V-2907]'s general meeting techniques as outlined in second ref., don't seem to lessen the security problems in this case. However, [V-2907] seems to be fully aware of the problem and may be undertaking the more detailed security measures necessary to counteract the security difficulties evolving from such meetings. Perhaps the past difficulty of meeting [ ] necessitated a lengthy meeting in [ ]'s locale in Oberalchingen, and a more detailed study of the counter-surveillance techniques employed in connection with this one meeting would illustrate that [V-2907] is doing all possible within the realm of practicality to avoid his being seen in public with [ ]. We are not going to press ZIPPER for more operational details in connection with this meeting or others, unless a blatant lack of security arises. We feel that it would only aggravate them and lessen other operational reporting in the future. We will use our information on above meeting only as a possible starting point for digging into a flap.

2. Subject is a rather large man, 6 feet or perhaps 6'1" tall. He weighs <sup>193 lbs.</sup> 88 kilos, and wears a (German) (size) hat 62. He is an Albino, or nearly so, with almost <sup>(naturally)</sup> white hair and typically weak eyes. He wears strong bifocal glasses, smokes fairly heavily.
3. Subject speaks Russian, regards himself as something of an authority on Communism and the Soviet IS. He served with von KLUGE 1941 on the Eastern Front, was constantly occupied with problems of occupation of Russian territory, propaganda. He prides himself on the fact that he accurately predicted the catastrophe on the Eastern Front as early as 1941, since he is convinced that a military victory in Russia is impossible, but that the Russian people can be brought to oppose their Communist overlords.
4. If you have time to sit and listen, he will tell you the story of his life on the slightest provocation. In the course of our conversation with U/M, he described in some detail his participation in "KORSAER", "Hugo", and the famous SRIS "agent" from Turkey who passed the polygraph [            ].
5. He commented, rather gratis, that the current adviser on Eastern European matters in BONN, (?) Otto SPRINGER? had served as an adviser of this sort before Hitler, during the Nazi period, and now, and is, in Subject's eyes, a "100% *eds* Communist (he said Bolsheviki)".

**Russian Emigre Denunciations**

1. On 25 May 1954, during the course of conversation with ZIPPER's CE Soviet expert, @ Dr. ALBERTI, the latter mentioned rumors within Russian emigre circles concerning persons of interest to you. Although emigre rumors should probably be rated E-4 or F-6, at best, @ Dr. ALBERTI stated that these rumors were not limited to HIS sources and that although the sources could probably never be traced back, nevertheless, he believed that behind all this smoke there might be at least a few sparks.

2. During the time that MVD Capt. Nikolai E. KRUKHLOV was working with the Soviet partisans in the area of Minsk during World War II, Georgi S. OKOLOVICH, who was then on the German Army Special Staff "R," was rumored to have been in contact with KRUKHLOV and to have made available to him information from Special Staff "R."

3. Dr. Alexander TRUCHNOVICH, NIS leader recently kidnapped in Berlin, has two sons, one of whom is alleged to be an officer (lieutenant ?) in the Red Army, which fact allegedly could only be possible if TRUCHNOVICH, the father, cooperated at least to some degree with the Reds. According to these emigre rumors, it was considered possible that he might have worked for both sides.

4. We do not feel competent to pass on the degree of improbability or possible probability of these reports, but pass them on to you as a matter of interest to your office.

Reference (1) (re Helmut Johannes WEICHERT, born 7 March 1913) and other sources [ ] see reference (2)) have reported that a Frau Justina (or Jastyra) was a Polish IS interrogator and recruiter in PW camps in Poland in the postwar period (1948-1949), along with Karl WLOCHMIESNER [ ] and 1st Lt. LIPSKI [ ]

2. Reference (2) reported the possibility that this Frau Justina might be identical with Subject. Source, who knew her and drank champagne with her before the war, has described her as very intelligent and a long-time intelligence figure. She was a courier and recruiter for the London Free Poles during World War II. In North Italy she was betrayed by one of her agents in San Passo to the Gestapo, which had her held in the Ravensbruck concentration camp. Source saw her after her release by the Americans. She returned to the Free Poles in England, where she found her betrayer enjoying a relatively leading position—this so disgusted her that she returned to Poland.

NOTE (US ONLY): Source of this paragraph is V-2907, now C. Mr. ALEXANDER of ZIPPER Reg. [ ] The betrayer is Non-signor Antoni KWIATKOWSKI (aka KWIATKOWSKI) [ ] Source reported that toward the end of the war he evacuated KWIATKOWSKI to Kloster Ettal (vic. Oberammergau).

1. Subject, born 28 July 1916 in Petersburg, Russia, is a Ukrainian who offered his services to the Germans in Kiev in World War II. He served among other things as interpreter for General MO [ ] and worked with the SD and the KGB. After World War II, he worked for ZIPPER's CI Field Base as V-6666, & Oleg DVALSKI. As late as 1953 he was still carried as a ZIPPER CI Field Base "Special Connection" for Russian and Polish emigre matters [ ]

2. In the spring of 1954, S Dr. ALBERTI [ ] for with the ZIPPER Headquarters CI Section, told me that he still runs Subject personally for general emigre information and that S ALBERTI considers him one of the best and most reliable men in emigre circles. In order for he able to keep his lines open to so many groups as possible, he has purposefully avoided taking a leading role in emigre politics. In view of his special status in connection with the reports on Russian and Polish emigration, we call Subject's existence to the attention of MO and FOS requesting any information on his currently available or that may come to light in the future.

3. Subject has resided from at least 1948 to date in Karlsruhe, Harris Alton-ambuster. IO. He has also given as addresses probably either temporary or accommodations: Weihenstephan/Bavaria, Parthenriedling #2, c/o Olga GUTT (1949); and Ettlingen/Baden, Bahn Postlageramt (railway post office general delivery), c/o Franz SAUDLIN.

4. ZIPPER travel records indicate travel to and/or through the following towns among others: Ettlingen, Dornstausgaden, Kitzville/Wiesbaden, Kessich, Lichtenfels, Wehrburg, Frankfurt, Bamberg, Bad Reichenhall, Mernau, Mittenwald, Triesling, Wehrburg, Innsbruck, Kempten, Tübing, Gailing, Fochlingen, Krimingen, and Neallingen.

5. According to [ ] Subject was a fairly frequent visitor at the apartment of Nikolai ZARAIKY & ROHRIG, born 24 April 1904 in Ashkhabad, ex-Soviet colonial who emigrated to the U.S.A. in January, 1952, after several years of service for ZIPPER CI Field Base (L).

Struggle for Power in the USSR - A ZIPPERite's Views

1. On 25 May 1954 during the course of a conversation with ZIPPER's CE Soviet specialist, @ Dr. ALBERTI, the latter discussed views concerning the struggle for power in the USSR. He indicated personal disagreement with the view of ZIPPER's reports staff presented shortly after the fall of BERIA, that the latter's fall signified Red Army ascendancy in the USSR. @ ALBERTI also pointed out that the top military man, although a general, was not really an army man but a "GD" (state security) general and that his two subordinates leading army generals are in almost direct opposition personally and in professional strategy/tactics concepts; hence, presumably easily and deliberately played off against one another. @ ALBERTI personally considered that the ZIPPER line as published by its reports section originated from [ ] who is, according to him, too impulsive and too inclined to the military viewpoint.

2. According to @ Dr. ALBERTI, the importance of the Communist Party in the USSR cannot be overestimated. However, he now inclines to the belief that Georgi MALENKOV, because of his involvement in the government apparatus, is playing a lesser role in the party itself and as such may be headed for a decline. @ Dr. ALBERTI ascribed considerable significance to Soviet Russian press reports that during recent speeches MALENKOV addressed the Chamber of Nationalities, an assembly lesser in stature than the Chamber of Soviet Republics which was addressed by Nikita KHRUSHCHEV, whose speech received more space in the Soviet press than did MALENKOV's. Also, the report of enthusiastic reception and applause for KHRUSHCHEV received a higher rating than that given to MALENKOV.

POB Comment: Substantive disagreements on political evaluation within ZIPPER are inevitable and interesting. We have no feeling of any underestimating of Party importance or strength by [ ]'s line. On the contrary, the economists in [ ]'s staff are well impressed with the growing (i.e., in the next two to five years) effectiveness and realness of the Party's program in the USSR and several of the Satellites.

3. @ Dr. ALBERTI believes that the purge of the intelligence/security (NIE/MVD) apparatus has almost reached completion and that the next institutions to undergo drastic purge will be the Army and the Party itself. He [ ]

The following views on the struggle for power in the USSR have been expressed  
by the source identified above:

1. Source does not believe that the fall of Beria signified Red Army ascendancy in the USSR. Source points out that although the top military man in the USSR is a general, he is not really an Army man, but a State Security general. The views of his two subordinate leading army generals are in almost direct opposition with each other, both personally, and in regard to their concepts of professional strategy and tactics. Therefore, it is assumed that these two are easily and deliberately played off against one another.
2. Source believes that the importance of the Communist Party in the USSR cannot be overestimated. However, he is now inclined to believe that Malenkov, because of his involvement in the government apparatus, is playing a lesser role in the Party and therefore may be headed for a decline. Source gave considerable significance to the Soviet press reports indicating that, during recent speeches, Malenkov addressed the Chamber of Nationalities. This assembly is of lesser stature than the Chamber of Soviet Republics which was addressed by Khrushchev, and the latter's speech received more space in the Soviet press than did Malenkov's. Source also considered significant the fact that Khrushchev received a more enthusiastic reception and applause than did Malenkov.

During the past 6 months, undersigned has had occasion to conduct five or six discussions with Emil AUGSBURG, ZIPPER's RIS specialist, on information furnished by [ ] and the DIPPER's which information has been passed to ZIPPER for the completion of their files, and as well as with the request that they add anything known to them ~~through~~ <sup>to</sup> this material. During these discussions one difficulty has always arisen in the difference in nomenclature employed by ZIPPER ~~vis-a-vis~~ <sup>and</sup> that employed by our headquarters. On these occasions, AUGSBURG has always insisted that possibly our headquarters nomenclature might be valid for a short period, that, however, the nomenclature employed by himself and ZIPPER is much more nearly correct. He insists in this context that regardless of what number any particular section, division, or directorate might have, basically its mission must remain the same, therefore the name of the organization must be at least closely akin to any previous name which it has had. To this undersigned has been obliged to agree but maintains the position that he is obliged to employ that ~~name~~ ~~name~~ nomenclature used throughout our headquarters.

2. On these occasions, with possibly at the most, one exception, AUGSBURG has indicated that were he given the opportunity to talk with some of the Russian defectors known to be in American hands, at ~~this~~ <sup>such</sup> time<sup>s</sup> he usually mentions [ ] and [ ] by name as well as the RIS defector from Turkey, that he should be able to clear up any differences in nomenclature within 1 or 5 minutes. On one occasion when the material furnished us by the [ ] <sup>from</sup> PETROV was the topic of discussion, AUGSBURG indicated that he felt that undersigned was holding out on the pertinent information received from PETROV. On the assurance that all information received from PETROV was being forwarded to ZIPPER, AUGSBURG merely stated that in that case, headquarters must be holding out on undersigned since the material was extremely sketchy and in AUGSBURG's opinion, not of a CE nature and not the sort of information which PETROV must ~~actually~~ have. On this particular occasion AUGSBURG again mentioned that certainly much more valuable information ~~must~~ <sup>would</sup> be forthcoming should he have the opportunity to debrief some Russian defector. It was on this occasion <sup>that</sup> he threw in the remark that even [ ] who had actually been in Germany, was not made available for AUGSBURG debriefing; that the only people with whom he was permitted to contact were the two German nationals who ~~actually~~ had not valuable information, that is, valuable information with regard to the structure of the RIS.

3. In AUGSBURG's opinion, the individuals who do the debriefing of the *defectors* in the US are either not sufficiently informed on the RIS history or are not sufficiently trained as interrogators. When undersigned suggested that he was of the opinion that the people had been carefully selected for these debriefings, AUGSBURG retorted, that in that case, the only other solution he can think of is that we must be holding out information on him. On each occasion when this particular topic has come up [ ] of ZIPPER headquarters has tried his best to pour oil on any troubled waters which might arise. [ ] has on quite a few occasions offered apologies to undersigned for AUGSBURG's direct and undiplomatic statements.

1. In accordance with Ref. 2, undersigned discussed the interrogation of [redacted] in the following terms with [redacted] on 29 August 1955 in [redacted]'s office. 837 informed [redacted] that the interrogation was to be continued. In this connection, should ZIPPER so desire, they might prepare a written brief which would be forwarded to Headquarters to be used in these interrogations. [redacted] was further told that Headquarters had assured us that ZIPPER would be provided with the results of any additional work done on [redacted]. [redacted] expressed great interest in this and indicated that he would discuss the problem with Dr. Alberti as soon as he had the opportunity. It should be noted that Dr. Alberti will not be back for work until the 5th of September while [redacted] is going on leave from the 2nd of September through the 22nd. It must be anticipated, therefore, that we will not have any answer to this question until after [redacted] comes back from his leave.

2. After a moment or two of hesitation, [redacted] suggested again that naturally ZIPPER would be more interested in doing a personal interrogation of [redacted]. Thereupon undersigned suggested, since Headquarters had brought up the subject, that this suggestion might be forwarded to Headquarters along with the reply which ZIPPER gives to Headquarter's query on the written brief, or actually with the written brief if this were to be prepared. Undersigned left the writing of the brief entirely up to ZIPPER and did in no way indicate that this was something which Headquarters specifically requested, rather it was an opportunity which was being afforded to ZIPPER if they wished to avail themselves of it.

1. Sonderkommander PANNWITZ took over the Rote Kapelle assignment in Paris from REGER (now [ ] in 1943. REGER had been responsible for capturing two important SRIS agents, Henry ROBINSON and LEOPOLD TREPPER. Shortly after PANNWITZ took over TREPPER escaped. Long-time SRIS agent, Victor SOKOLOV, KENT was doubled by PANNWITZ and they worked together. There is a possibility that KENT turned PANNWITZ. HIS Rote Kapelle study states that KENT and PANNWITZ left Paris together in August, 1944. Possibly in Alsace in W/T communication with Moscow, Oct. 1944. Later reported that KENT was in Bregenz. BIS study further states that while PANNWITZ reputedly arrested in Vorarlberg by French in May 1945, KENT escaped probably into Switzerland or Soviet Zone. This misinformation in view of PANNWITZ's recent return from a Russian POW camp.

2. Personnel of PANNWITZ's Paris Amt located and debriefed after the war. These included Rolf Werner RICHTER, Waldemar LENTZ, Hans KURFESS, KOPKOW, Walter HARECKER and Willy BERG. POB has only extracts, see below, but debriefings available Washington. RICHTER reported he saw PANNWITZ in April 1945 in Hof, Bavaria. PANNWITZ was with his secretary and mistress Hilda KEMPA, KENT, SS H/Schaf OSSIIG, Kriminal Sekretar ROELLIICK. PANNWITZ then planned to go to Bodensee.

3. Dr. Otto Hermann Waldemar LENTZ, DOB: 2 Dec 1909, POB: Darmstadt, Journalist, long-time pre-war Russian contacts. Worked in Koenigsberg monitoring broadcasts from USSR, 1936-1938; father in consulate at Danzig which Nazis considered suspect; involved SCHULZE-BOYSEN group, Berlin. 1942 arrested but released and sent to Paris to work under PANNWITZ. At end of war, LENTZ was again suspected of SRIS activities. Told SCHULZE-BOYSEN's brother-in-law, Johannes HAA S-HYK in 1947 that he had seen Guenther WEISENDORF, who said Russians wished him to keep in touch with Germans who were members (ex-members) of the Rote Kapelle.

4. Only info we have on rest of group is an Inu KOPKOW suspected of working for BIS in January 1953 and Wilhelm BERO, whom DIR 49025, 20 April 1955, calls "expert on Western aspects of the Rote Kapelle; handled Alexander SAUTER for the Gestapo".

5. In May 1956, [ ] told [ ] that he and Dr. ALBERTI were former colleagues of PANNWITZ, the latter being especially friendly with him. [ ] felt that seeing PANNWITZ would be embarrassing as he might wish a job, etc., which request Dr. ALBERTI particularly would find hard to refuse.

1. [ ] has again asked us for information on the German NKVD records which were captured by the U.S. Army at the end of World War II: [ ] (acting on behalf of Cdr. ALBERTI) some time ago had mentioned to [ ] that [ ] would be particularly interested in getting back some 14-18 volumes of [ ] manuals which the Germans had captured when they overran Siedlitz. According to [ ] at the end of the war there existed three known sets of these manuals in western hands. One was in what is today the Soviet Zone of Germany and [ ] has been learned about it; the second set was presumed to have fallen into British hands and is believed to be in London today; the third, believed to have been an incomplete set, was located at the offices of the "Anti-Comintern" at [ ] on the Unstruth where CALBERTI believes it was taken by U.S. forces [ ] that part of Thuringen. [ ] claims they have queried the [ ] re [ ] their set but have received a negative reply. Has Headquarters ever ascertained whether these records are among the files taken from Siedlitz that are now in Washington or Alexandria respectively? Identity 1 of [ ] a recent [ ] to this case, said that he had heard of this set of volumes and suggested that Identity 2 of Identity 3 be queried regarding them. He also intimated that if the set in London existed, the negative reply to [ ] not withstanding.

2. CALBERTI states that these manuals are entitled "Uchobniki i uchebnye zadaniya po chekistskoi rabote" or "die chekistskoi raboti". He gave their [ ] as "Lehrbuecher und Anschauungsmaterial fuer die Tschekistische Arbeit" and described them as 14-18 volumes, most of which were of standard octave size, printed on grey-blue coarse paper and bound in grey-blue calico. Some of the [ ] were, namely those including pictures, were of folio format. Each book carried a specific title on its back. In addition to these volumes, CALBERTI claimed that the Germans also captured some NKVD training manuals (Schulungsbriefe) at Siedlitz. These were of size DIN A 4 and were bound in a light maroon-like type of cover with a black calico back. Needless to say these, too, would be of interest to [ ]

Miscellaneous CE information obtained from @ALBERTI by the undersigned was an exercise designed to keep KUBARK's channel to V-2626 Gleb UMNOV, open for useful information which can supplement and support the OD/CE effort. As a result, a good deal of chaff has been exchanged between @ALBERTI and [ ] and in many instances, such as in the case of listing former KGB personnel now in the West, the information exchanged thus far is probably worthless. In the case of the KGB personnel, @ALBERTI had originally promised to identify to us his "private" source on the KGB, allegedly residing in Kempton. This man, it will be remembered, is allegedly a former chief of the KGB training school near Smolensk. He apparently was involved with the

○ AIS and was dropped under circumstances none too pleasant. There are also indications that he probably concealed all or part of his

○ KGB background from his American handlers. In any case, we do know that the man, according to @ALBERTI, lives under a false name and appeared in [ ] [ ] [ ] .

2. Still, while we can guess as to his identity, we have failed so far to make a good one. @ALBERTI has refused to identify the man because this former KGB officer prefers to take his chances at trying to immigrate into the U.S. under a false name rather than revealing his true identity and past background. @ALBERTI takes the position that he cannot very well identify the man to us against

his wishes. In order to give himself (©ALBERTI) a completely free hand, ©ALBERTI has made very sure that no one can ever make this a really official matter. The agent is not listed in [ ] Agent Control Section and apparently receives no money (although the undersigned does not believe this). In any case, ©ALBERTI claims that vis-a-vis his superiors, this agent is "simply a friend of ©ALBERTI's".

3. One of the guesses as to the identity of this man could be Nikolai WAYLOR, Landsberg/Lech, or possibly Georg LUTTER. [ ] born in Riga. Since I thought that [LUTTER] might possibly be the man, I buried LUTTER's name among other request for traces which I fed to ©ALBERTI. Interestingly enough, ©ALBERTI never replied on LUTTER although that may be due to completely different reasons. Certainly 831 should occasionally call on ©ALBERTI and discuss reports from W-2626, borrow some from ©ALBERTI and show them to the OD side (CE and Sov sections who are both particularly interested in seeing them).

15 Jun 59. @Dr. ALBERTI: In connection with the NTS discussion, [ ] said that he was delighted that approval had been granted for @Dr. ALBERTI to get into the act as far as NTS and the [ ] case were concerned. [ ] said that he had had to do a fair amount of pushing to get this approved because [ ] was much against it. On the other hand, @Dr. ALBERTI was very enthusiastic about the idea and also very enthusiastic about the [ ] case. [ ] said that in his opinion @Dr. ALBERTI would be very helpful, would be able to take a considerable load off of [ ] (ALBERTI would be dealing directly with the NTS case officer on the [ ] case) and that ALBERTI was considerably more competent than he often was given credit for being. [redacted] said he had requested [redacted] on the basis of a suitable pretext, to discuss the question of UMNOV with ALBERTI. [redacted] said the result was that ALBERTI had no doubts whatsoever concerning the reliability of UMNOV, and that in discussing the matter in considerable detail, [redacted] also got the impression that UMNOV probably was okay. [redacted] said it was probable that ALBERTI had an inevitable feeling of loyalty toward UMNOV, who was an old friend, but that ALBERTI was objective enough so that he would inevitably bring up any really questionable aspects of UMNOV's background or indications there should be any doubt about his bona fides.

- [ ] asks if we might be able to locate a copy of a publication called "Protokoll der Vernehmung zweier Mitarbeiter des Toxikologischen Instituts des NKVD". According to [ ] the OGH-Fremde Heere Ost published a series of brochures called "Rotor Ksal", so called because of their red covers. The above Protokoll was one of them, and probably was published in 1942 or 1943.
- This particular document is remembered by alias ALBERTI who claims it is an extremely interesting and thorough description of the RIB use of poison, apparently a highly developed technique even before the war. As the title suggests, the contents are based on the interrogation of two NKVD toxicologists captured by the Germans.
- We do not suggest that an all-out search be made for this paper, but we feel it would be worthwhile for Headquarters to canvas persons who might be aware of its existence, and who might know where a copy could be located. The paper could certainly be put to good use in connection with TORCH and the plan to surface BREWER.

We are quoting below (in translation) a letter received from the Institut fuer Zeitgeschichte, Munich:

"In answer to your letter of January 12, 1962, we regret to inform you that our Institute does not have the brochure PROTOKOLL DER VERBANDLICHEN ZWISCHEN MITARBEITERN DES TOXIKOLOGISCHEN INSTITUTS DER WEHR. We do not know of any library being in possession of the brochure.

The brochure appears to be an official document, classified secret, which was issued by the General Staff of the Army, Abteilung Franke Heere Ost. It is most likely in the files of this department. Guide # 30 to German records, microfilmed at Alexandria, (Records of Headquarters, German Army High Command, Part III) indicates that above files are not available for research; the guide lists on page 117 ff. files of the Generalstab der Wehr, Abteilung Franke Heere Ost but not those of Abteilung Franke Heere Ost.

As far as we know, approximately 114 linear feet of files of Abteilung Franke Heere Ost were captured and transported to the U.S. If the brochure is not in the world

F His name is Dr. Emil AUGSBURG, like the city near Munich.

A-U-G-S-B-U-R-G. And he has two other names: the one is Dr. ALBERTI and the other one Dr. ALTHAUS. He came originally from the so-called Hochschule fuer Politik - means sort of a university for politics in Berlin. And he promoted - there he got his degree as a doctor, being a doctor of political science. In the Third Reich he was with SS of course. He was an SS Sturmbannfuhrer which means in the rank of a major in the SS. He had a leading position in the so-called Wannsee Institut. This Wannsee Institut was part of RSHA, Branch VI. He speaks fluently Russian and Polish and Ukrainian and some other Eastern dialects and languages. He has a lot of connections and contacts to people from - well, emigres as well as under-cover people which were formerly in Eastern states and Satellite states and live now in the Bundes Republik and so on, especially to emigres from the Polish people and from the Soviet Union. During the war I think he was at least sometimes on special services in Russia where you never know what his real duties were. They are covered up like most of these. I personally think he must have had to do with the so-called Einsatzkommandos which had to do with Jews and the elimination of Jews and so on.

[ ] On 7 September [ ] is [ ] informed us that [ ] is now finally completely disenchanted with both [Gleb UMNOV] aka [Oleg UMANSKI] and Dr. Emil AUGSBURG, alias Dr. ALBERTI. After a great deal of soul and file searching [ ] apparently has come to the conclusion that most likely both men are at least untrustworthy if not actually under Soviet control. [ ] has also come to the realization, however, that they will not be able to prove any suspicions they might have against either of the men and that as long as both of them are kept at arms length they will not be able to do any more damage than they have already done.

2. The real problem [ ] is now facing is termination. It appears that under German labor laws a person can not be fired except for cause as long as he has been on the payroll for a period of ten years. At least the Government can not do so. Both AUGSBURG and UMNOV meet those requirements. They are also, apparently, fully aware of their position and have indicated that they will fight any attempt at separation. The inquiries made last year about UMNOV (ref) were apparently based on the hope that KUBARK traces and a possible EDC check would unearth some derogatory information on UMNOV which would give [ ] a cause for dismissal. That was not the case. [ ] now suggests that [ ] on both men in the hope that it will reveal some illegal or at least unauthorized intelligence activity which may give them a cause for termination. They are convinced that both men maintain unauthorized contacts and that it is simply a matter of finding what contacts these are. They also intend to state to each of them again that they are forbidden to maintain contact with each other. Breaking of that injunction alone, might be cause for dismissal, depending on the nature of the contact following the reiterations of the prohibition. By the way [ ] are now of the opinion that the reason for the negative EDC traces on UMNOV is most likely the fact that Subjects true name is neither UMNOV nor UMANSKI, and that most likely both his dprob's are false.

3. Both subjects are well known throughout the Russian emigre circles in Europe and have a large number of supporters and friends in those circles. [ ] would like to know whether [ ] headquarters has a [ ] who is in no way connected with the emigration who could process [ ] admitted to us that [ ] has no one who could be considered

Summary: [ / ]'s Special Security Office is currently engaged in an investigation of Gleb UMNOV ( A ) and his friend and handler, ALBERTI ( A ). This dispatch is primarily concerned with UMNOV. It contains background information on, and a review of [ / ]'s investigation of UMNOV to date, information developed from research in depth in [ ] files, information developed through [ 9 ], and some preliminary comments on our findings.

1. Background and Review of Current Investigation: In a memorandum dated 14 July 1964, [ 2 ] (Operational Security) requested traces including HDC on Gleb UMNOV, born 28 July 1916 in Petrograd, USSR, alias Oleg UMANSKY, born 12 April 1916 in Rostov, USSR. He asked particularly whether it was true that Subject had changed his name from UMNOV to UMANSKY while in Camp King on orders from American authorities. [ 2 ] told [ 3 ] orally that UMNOV was a [ / ] agent whom they hoped to fire because they now believed he may have been working for the RIS over the years and because he had been associated with [ 4 ]. Our request for traces was forwarded in [ R ] 23 July 1964. We received negative replies in [ R ] 19 August 1964; [ R ] 25 August 1964; and from JSAREUR CR dated 12 August 1964. [ R ] 20 August 1965 stated that there was nothing specific in his file to indicate UMNOV was a Russian agent. It mentioned that earlier [ 9 ] information indicated that he maintained contact with an impressively large number of women around Germany. We advised [ / ] that we could find no information to substantiate UMNOV's story about his change in name and that we had no additional information.

A meeting was held on 7 September 1965 with [5] and [7] from [1] and [3] and [8] from [1] [7] informed us [1] was finally disappointed with UMNNOV and ALBERTI [A]. UMNNOV's handling officer. After a great deal of soul- and file-searching [1] has come to the conclusion that both men may be Soviet penetrations of [1] and that, in any case, neither man is to be trusted. [5] believes that AUGSEURG and UMNNOV knew each other in Smolensk during the war, that both were involved in war crimes, and that both are aware of each other's role in that respect. [1] has no way to verify its suspicions that the men may be under Soviet control and can only keep them at arm's length so that they may do no more damage than has already been done. [7] said that [1] could not terminate them because of their length of service, but intended to forbid their maintaining contact with one another (this has not yet been done as we indicate in paragraph 15 below). [7] opined that the SDC check was most likely negative because the true name of their suspect is neither UMNNOV nor UMNANSKY.

3. [7] said that they would request [9] on both men but were concerned about translation from the Russian because all of [1]'s Russian speakers moved freely about in Russian emigre circles where UMNNOV maintains numerous contacts, and therefore could be expected to hear about the coverage. [7] was especially anxious to keep [10] [A] from learning about the investigation because [10] is hopelessly biased in favor of ALBERTI. [9] was requested as indicated in Reference A., and [9] agreed to do the translation. Neither of the two [9] employees doing the translations is a Russian.

4. We received negative traces to Reference A in [R] September 1965 and [R] October 1965. This time, however, USAREUR CR came up with positive traces, which were transmitted in [R] 27 September 1965. The information contained in paragraphs one through six of the CR reply were transmitted to [5] and [7] on 6 October 1965. [7] stated that our memorandum contained far more information than was available in their files. [7] attributed this fact to a decision made years before by [12] [A] not to card emigre types. [5] has since advised us that [11] of [2]'s shop has been delegated to pull together everything [1] has on UMNNOV but that to date he has been able to find disappointingly little. [1] is also checking through Ludwigsburg War Crimes Office for any information that might be available there.

5. Information Obtained from Research in [A] Files: [7] asked whether it would be possible to search old emigre files to see if anything could be turned up on UMNNOV. We pointed out that this would be a monumental task to undertake at our Headquarters but promised to search local files for leads that might enable our headquarters to come up with pertinent information. This we did as we found time and the results of that research is contained in succeeding paragraphs.

6. [R] August 1952, which was a study of Colonel BAUN's ([A]) activities in the immediate post-war years, mentions a meeting that took place in 1946 between BAUN and General DRO (Drasjanzt KANAYAN). DRO asked BAUN to intercede to have UMNNOV released from detention at Mannheim; note that WGLA-1291, February 1951 (see also paragraph 8 below) indicated UMNNOV had been an interpreter for General DRO during the war. DRO was an Armenian who worked with the Germans during WW II. It appears that BAUN may have complied with DRO's request because [ ] files contain old [R] documents [R].





We found no traces of an Olga COSIT and no identifiable traces on KALUGIN. (See also paragraph 17 below).

11. [ R ] 12 November 1956 was a report on UMNOV and Professor Mykhaylo MILLER (Born 26 November 1933, Millerovo/Don, USSR). The dispatch transmitted on [ 16 ] [ A ] report of a meeting he had with Ivan KASHUBA ([ A ]), Intelligence Chief of the OUN/BANDERA organization. KASHUBA believed that UMNOV was implicated with "DNIPRO", the Ukrainian branch of the MIKHAILOV RETURN TO THE HOMELAND COMMITTEE. KASHUBA claimed that during the war UMNOV had served with the GESTAPO and had liquidated Ukrainian nationalists. KASHUBA said that UMNOV could have served in the GESTAPO as an NKVD agent. UMNOV's name also appears in a PERSHAN contact report forwarded as attachment 3 to [ R ] August 1957. We quote the pertinent excerpts: "...LARIONOV ([ A ]) gave LEBEDEV ([ A ]) 'tips' and photos relating to Gleb Konstantinovich UMNOV...and his suspected IS work for a western service. According to these 'tips', UMNOV plies his friends with liquor to obtain information; it is also insinuated that UMNOV is a double agent. LEBEDEV allegedly told SKARZHINSKY ([ A ]) he would not write anything about UMNOV, after SKARZHINSKY told LEBEDEV not to publish false information. SKARZHINSKY speculated that.....in the case of UMNOV, LARIONOV.. acted on behalf of SHUBA-100 which in this case wanted to get even with an old opponent from WW II days (CASE OFFICER COMMENT: Since all of this information comes from SKARZHINSKY, it must be taken with a big grain of salt)". According to the [ 17 ] ([ A ]) contact report forwarded with [ R ] and [ ] November 1958, [ 17 ] KGB case officer was particularly pleased when he [ 17 ] identified a photograph as portraying Gleb UMNOV. Another report forwarded with [ R ] 30 March 1960 was interesting in that the KGB officer asked [ 17 ] if he knew UMNOV's true name; [ 17 ] did not. (We note with interest that although Subject has officially used the name of UMANSKY since 1946 he was known throughout Russian emigre circles as UMNOV. We have already communicated this fact to [ 5 ] without giving any particular source for our information and he commented that the KGB must also be aware of Subject's use of the name UMNOV).

12. UMNOV's name also appears in the following dispatches:  
[ R ] these dispatches had no particularly illuminating information. [ R ] and [ R ] dealt with the [ ] of UMNOV.

13. [ R ] 13 September 1961 transmitted contact reports having to do with [ 4 ]. An excerpt from one of the reports [ 18 ] with [ ], 7 September 1961) is in our UMNOV file. [ 19 ] told [ 18 ] that while in Washington [ 20 ] had been briefed on the security problem involving (Alexander) MELBARDIS ([ A ]), on MELBARDIS's contact with UMNOV and the suspicion that UMNOV might be an RIS agent and actually serve as a commo channel between MELBARDIS and the KGB. At the time [ 19 ] had [ 7 ] take up the case with ALBERTI who vouched for UMNOV unequivocally and [ 7 ] accepted ALBERTI's judgement. We have no further information on this point and the sensitive portions of the MELBARDIS file were destroyed. We would appreciate any enlightenment Headquarters can provide on this score.

14. [ R ], 9 July 1962 on [ 20 ] linked ALBERTI and UMNOV with Victor Aleksandrovich LARIONOV ([ A ]). Unfortunately the dispatch did not help much as far as UMNOV is concerned and the other key files in the case - viz. those on Marion BALDWIN ([ A ]) and Helmut RINKE ([ A ]) were destroyed. We would appreciate your checking with [ ] to see if they can provide any information on UMNOV not available in his Headquarters [ A ] [ R ] was the last document on UMNOV received in [ ] prior to the replies to [ R ] July 1964.



15. UMNOV's Current Situation as Learned Through [ 9 ]  
 UMNOV is still in touch with ALBERTI and this fact is known to [ 19 ] who recently gave tentative approval for UMNOV to make an operational trip to Braunschweig. UMNOV does not have German citizenship and he had to send his passport and other data to ALBERTI before he could get permission for the trip. UMNOV does not have any regular job and claims to be an invalid. An alias [ 22 ] (who we think may be identical with [ 23 ] ) called ALBERTI one day to check on the condition of UMNOV's mother who was listed in [ 1 ]'s wartime evacuation plan along with UMNOV. UMNOV is still in touch with a great many women around Germany and it is not clear just what his game is. We will provide an analysis of the information gained through [ 9 ] by separate dispatch at a later date.

16. Some Points Worth Noting: We have most of our information about UMNOV's life from [ ]

[ ] In spite of certain inconsistencies most of the reports agree with each other but this is not surprising since UMNOV himself was probably the ultimate source of most of the information. Certain points might be noted: According to UMNOV himself, he joined the Germans in Smolensk, but according to [ ] and to KASHUBA he joined the Germans in Kiev. KASHUBA also stated that UMNOV was not a Russian as he claimed but a Ukrainian ([ ] indicated UMNOV has an abiding interest in Ukrainian Church affairs). According to UMNOV his father was killed in 1938, presumably for holding anti-Communist views but WOLF's story sent with [ ] states his father was a Czarist officer killed by the Bolsheviks in 1920. In either case it is difficult to understand how UMNOV was able to get such an advanced education. This is even harder to understand when he states he was known to be anti-Communist and was thus selected to direct the Russian police under the German occupation within a month of the time Smolensk was overrun. In one report he is called German-obsessed but he himself claims not to like Germans. There are other inconsistencies but the most interesting question is the one of name. Oleg UMANSKY is admittedly an alias; [ 7 ] believes that UMNOV is also an alias, a belief apparently shared by [ 17 ] KGB case officer. At any rate he must have used the name UMNOV during the war because he was wanted for war crimes under that name; the change to UMANSKY was probably done to keep UMNOV from being prosecuted for those crimes. See the next paragraph for certain far-out possibilities regarding UMNOV's true name.

17. The coincidence of the names used by UMNOV for cover addresses in 1949 (paragraph 10 above) viz. Olga GOSIT and Frau KALUGIN, with the carded reference to Helene KALUGIN-GOSIT who apparently moved to UMNOV's address in Karlsruhe may have provided another tracing possibility for us. UMNOV currently lives with his mother, who goes under the name Olga Nikolayevna UMANSKY (as known from [ 9 ]) and it is possible that she is identical to Helene KALUGIN-GOSIT and also possible that parts of her name were used by UMNOV as a cover address. While it is quite possible that UMNOV's mother also changed her name we believe it worth while to check out all possibilities. We are therefore forwarding trace requests in Reference B on UMNOV's mother using all possible variations and on UMNOV using the names KALUGIN and GOSIT. (We have also asked [ 5 ] to check out the names). As another remote possibility for developing further information on UMNOV we are asking for up-to-date traces on UMNOV's old agent, Irene KUSINA (see paragraph 7 above) in Reference C.

18. Comment: From the evidence available it appears certain that UMNOV was involved in war crimes for which he was never punished and that ALBERTI might also have been involved. Although we have no evidence to prove UMNOV is or has been a Soviet agent he has certainly been susceptible to approach and we know that the KGB

was interested in him at one point. We are inclined to agree with [ 5 ] and [ 7 ] that both men are security risks but we are not sanguine about developing clear proof of their having ties to hostile intelligence. We can only hope that [ / ] will be able to come up with something based on leads we are able to furnish. We would therefore appreciate an early Headquarters reply to the questions raised in paragraphs 13 and 14 above; please advise what may be [ / ] We would also appreciate Headquarters advice as to how much of the information contained in paragraphs 5 through 11 above may be [ / ]

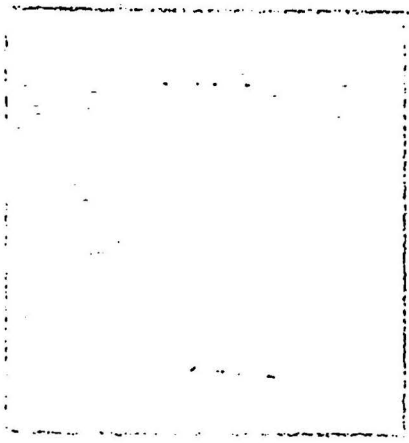
