

Report on Conference Held with  
Tokyo Local EIA, Metropolitan Police & NRP.

6 December 1949

The main object of this meeting was to discuss on the enforcement program of bread, pastries, candies etc. made from staple food and sold in retail stores, in conjunction with the enforcement program on staple food by EIA. <sup>The necessity of</sup> coordination of Metropolitan Police Board and NRP with EIA was stipulated.

Reports from NRP and MPB indicate complete familiarity with enforcement program of staple food. However, no definite decision have been made for enforcing economic laws. Amount of staple food involved, indicated in the reports is very small.

EIA enforcement programs on producers and processors are yielding good results with the assistance of NRP and autonomous police. However retail sales are being entirely overlooked and they are the biggest outlet for blackmarket staple food. In Tokyo, bread, pastries, candies, etc., made from staple food are displayed everywhere, and many police boxes are located in places surrounded with stores of this type.

MPB claim: that it is very difficult to enforce a program of this nature for the following reasons:

- a) Checks are being made from time to time. However it is very difficult to get evidence on stores selling bread because the stores claim that breads are custom-processed.
- b) Some food are made from decontrolled materials, eg. starch, flour from edible wood etc.
- c) shortage of man.

NRP claims that since the areas covered by them are mostly towns & villages, it is not as bad as in large cities. They are doing their best to curtail the sales of illegal food in retail stores.

To curtail the sales, violators should be given maximum penalties to discourage them from repeating the offence.

Up to the present time, MPB has been concentrating on big processors, however in future retail stores will be included in their enforcement programs.

NRP will contact all other NRP's and will also take strong measures against retail sales of illegal foodstuff.  
Concrete result is expected in future.

Spot investigations and publicity campaigns were made continuously into restaurants within the districts of amusement centers all over the city.

SHOKURYOHIN HAIKYU KODAN ( Public Corporation of Staple foods Distribution ) , flour mill companies , rice cleaning factories and bakeries etc. were checked. On the other hand, Publicity campaign for general consumers were conducted effectively.

Additional rice allocation for longshoremen , employees of transportation companies ( Bus & truck companies ) and other manual labourers were checked.

iv) Spot investigation of smuggler of rice

Black market peddlers have been being examined at UENO , Asakusa and other railway stations in close connection with police officials.

Outline Program of Production ,  
Shipment and Distribution of  
Mizu-ame and Glucose.

1. With reference to products made by allocation of starch produced in 1948 , products for which the approval of the Director of Food Agency was necessary , inclusive of those remaining yet undelivered , will hereafter be freely sold without the said approval.
2. Allocation of starch produced in 1949 for factories which produce mizu-ame and glucose will be made to those who consume the said articles as raw materials for carrying on their business in case they have applied to the Director of Food Agency for the said allocation ( Form of application on separate paper ).
3. The sale of mizu-ame or glucose produced in accordance with the provisions of ( 2 ) will be freely made by the producer.
4. The Director of Food Agency may , if he considers it necessary to do so for supply of mizu-ame and glucose , attach certain conditions to the sale of the products when allocating the raw material starch in accordance with ( 2 ).
5. The Director of Food Agency may , if he considers it necessary to do so , render as much assistance as is necessary to consumers of mizu-ame or glucose in purchasing the said articles.

Brief Explanatory Notes on the Outline  
Program of Production , Shipment and  
Distribution of Mizu-ame and Glucose.

The purpose of this outline program is to retain minimum necessary control on mizu-ame and glucose , to remove all unnecessary or unurgent control and ultimately to bring about free sale of the said articles , and , as to starch this program aims indirectly at the effects it may have on promoted utilization and disposition of starch.

1) Of the program means that , except these goods of which instructions have already been given for shipment and which the parties concerned are willing to receive or deliver , all goods of which the delivery period has ended or for which

there is no receiving period fixed, inclusive of those remaining unreceived on the day of announcement of this outline program, will be freely sold hereafter.

2) Means that, there will be no more distinction between factories which receive allocation by the General Government and factories which receive allocation through local governments, and no more balance of allocation quantities, according to production capacities, etc. of individual factories. There is no statement made as regards the period and quantity of application for allocation, but this is because proper and appropriate allocation is to be made in consideration of the situation of starch possessed by the Government. In making this allocation, we are thinking of having any new and unknown applicant submit a certificate attesting that he is the operator of a factory.

3) Means that, unlike to the former practice, no instructions will be given concerning the sale of products from the raw material starch allocated in the new method.

4) Means that certain conditions will be attached and necessary instructions will also <sup>be</sup> given to producers considered adequate for assuring the quantities of mizu-ame and glucose necessary for production, distribution, etc. according to the nation plan.

5) Means that just as much assistance as is necessary will be given to the actual consumers of mizu-ame and glucose in case they find it difficult to obtain the said articles of food when they are needed for production or distribution in accordance with the national plan.

We herewith inform you about our investigation plan to be conducted into the distributional problems of charcoal within the district of Tekyo-to as follows;

## 1. Policy

Immediately after the abolishment of the Government Special Account concerning Adjustment of Supply & Demand of Charcoal & Firewood, 1st August this year, the new Regulating Ordinance adjusting the supply & demand of charcoal and firewood was put in force. We are going to carry out this special investigation laying emphasis on the enforcement of distribution control and the public relation activity against consumers based on the spirit of above mentioned regulating ordinance.

## 2. Detail program of Investigation

  - b) to prevent blackmarketings conducted by large consumers in conspiracy with brokers and producers.
  - c) to prevent price control violations and shortage of weight committed by retailers.
  - d) Public relation activity against general consumers aiming to inform them throughly the new official prices, new standard of quality and the new method of distributing. (classification)
- ( 4 ) Countermeasures to be taken against the results of investigation ;
  - a) Disposition against violators ;

a) We find out that the Chiba Plant received its whole volume of quota for 2nd half of fiscal year 1948 ( 50,000 "kin" ) actually from the Akihabara Warehouse of the Sugar Bureau of SHOKURYOHIN HAIKYU KODAN ( Foodstuff Distribution Public Corporation ) through the official shipping agency CHIBAKEN SATO NIUKE ORISHISHO KYODO KUMIAI ( Receiving & Wholesale Agencies Cooperative Association in Chiba Prefecture ) at 10th Dec. 1948.

b) Also the allotment for the Matsumoto Plant for the same period ( 40,000 "kin." ) was delivered from the same warehouse by the NAGANOKEN SATO NIUKE OROSHISHO KYODO KUMIAI at 9th Dec. 1948. This fact was confirmed by the Nagano Prefectural EIA in compliance with our request.

c) Allotments for the 1st half of 1949 ( total 105,000 "kin" ) is now under the process of delivering. So there have been no violation remarked in regard to the state of receiving the material.

3) State of consuming the material ;

The results of the investigation that was conducted into the allotments for the 2nd half of 1948 fiscal year ( 90,000 "kin" ) are as follows ;

Remarks ; We estimated that semi-finished products contained half volume of sugar compared with finishe one )

Consequently, 4,143 "kin" ( 3,891 plus 252 ) of sugar shall be the actual remaining stock in the company.

On the other hand, the real remaining volume in the company is reported 1,687 "kin" according to the inspection, and the company authority says that these volume of sugar were consumed in the process of production.

However, we are of opinion that our conclusion might be right, although there was no other way than to estimate the volume of consumption from the total volume of sales amount or to suppose that semi-finished products contained half volume of sugar compared with that of the finished one. So that 2,456 "kin" (4,143 - 1,687), including the volume that were frozen by inspectors = 1,119 "kin", of sugar might be consumed illegally. 1,119 "kin" of sugar was frozen, and written explanation was taken from the violator.

f) Analysis of products ;  
In order to confirm the actual volume of consumption, we requested to the Tokyo Prefectural Hygienic Laboratory the analysis of products ; the results are remarked as follows ;

However, we reached the conclusion that we could not ascertain the volume of consumption from the results of the analysis of products, because quality and unit weight of each tablet are different so often.

#### 4. Conclusion ;

There will still remain possibly a more vicious infraction concerning the said company ( KUZUHARA KOGYO KK ) than to be rumoured by the public mass, yet we could not find out the real state of violation no longer, because

- a) Products ( finished products ) are not controlled-goods, and moreover volume of products are not written exactly on the business books of the company.
- b) Volume of products is counted by "tablet" and weight of each tablets are not same.

c) There is no basis, by which the state of allocating of sugar is checked. So that, the allocating business being carried on by the Welfare Ministry shall be made strictly hereafter, that is, following items written on the present application are not enough;

- a) Name of Products
- b) Volume of sugar to be used for the production of 100 Kg of Products
- c) planned volume of production

Remarks ... There is no provision in the present Japanese Pharmacopoea concerning the volume of sugar to be contained in the Vitamin medicines, but the volume of Vitamin itself which must be contained.

Consequently, undermentioned countermeasures shall be taken immediately

- 1) Weight of products shall be made the basis of calculation of sugar distribution.
- 2) Unit weight of products and percentage of sugar to be contained in one tablet shall be prescribed strictly by the law or Government regulation.

We herewith submit you a special plan concerning the execution of the investigation to be conducted against the controlled fish and marine products with- in the district of Tekyo-to. This investigation program has been started based on the instruction issued by the Tokyo Regional EIA & the Central EIA.

Outline of the Text

## 1. Policy

We are going to execute this special investigation in accordance with the in- struction issued by the Central EIA and the Tokyo Regional EIA laying emphasis on the enforcement of fair trade within the wholesale market .

## 2. Executive Period

from November 1, 1949 untill further instruction

## 3. Objects to be investigated

- 1) authorized receiving agencies in each wholesale market within the Tekyo-to
- 2) major consumers within Tekyo-to
- 3) receiving organs within Tekyo-to
- 4) authorized retailers & registered retailers
- 5) general consumers

## 4. Major points aimed in this investigation program

- 1) fair dealing in weight ( quantity ) within the wholesale market
- 2) to eradicate so called " combination sale " within the wholesale market
- 3) to enforce fair dealing in quality within the wholesale market
- 4) to examine the general situation of receiving agencies within the whole sale market
- 5) to execute educational activity for general consumer

## 5. Details of execution program

## 1) Period

- (1) Educational activity against dealers shall be conducted untill 10 Nov.
- (2) Major investigation activities shall be started from 11 November.
- (3) Pleriminary conference or coordination with concerned agencies shall be made untill 11th November expecting a perfect investigation.

## 2) Each item of the investigation plan

## (1) Educational activity

- a) against dealers & dealers association ;

Lectures aimed at the strict enforcement of this control program shall be given to the dealers in each wholesale market untill 10th November. On the other hand, we want to execute spot investigations occasionally during this period. Educational activity thereafter shall be conducted in parallel with actual investigation making refference to the results of occasional inspection. Meanwhile , we want to conduct another educational program by means of dealers' newspaper and bulletin laying emphasis enforcement of the newly established dis- tribution ordinance and purpose of this special investigation program.

- b) against general consumers ;

Continuous activity of educational program shall be carried out through an educational plan for school children, SHUFU RENGOKAI ( Housewives' association of Tokyo-to ) or other public organizations. On the other hand, " spot announcement " by the Radio or other public information media are being planned.

(2) Coordinative activity with concerned Government agencies

a) relating to Government Offices within the district of Tokyo-to ;  
Sub-committee meeting of the Economic Investigation Council was held 9 Nov.  
Further activities shall be conducted in timely cases.

b) to Government offices in neighbouring prefectures ;  
Conference meeting with officials from KANAGAWA , CHIBA and SAITAMA Prefectural EIAs shall be held on 10th November.

(3) Execution of Inspection

a) concerning business transactions in whole sale markets;

(a) to check "fair dealing in weight (quantity) "

TSUKIJI Wholesale market ( Tokyo Central Wholesale market of Fish & Marine Products ) shall be examined chiefly , of course the circuit inspections against each Branch markets within Tokyo-to shall be conducted. And in a case where a vicious violation will be disclosed by the " surprise inspection " the violator shall be prosecuted immediately and necessary administrative dispositions against concerned persons will take place.

(b) to check so-called " combination sale "

Similar countermeasures as above mentioned shall be taken.

(c) to check quantity & quality

Economic investigators who are taking charge this investigation program will be present at the business of unloading or receiving in the wholesale market , and if they find out any shortage of quantity or difference of quality they will ask to the responsible person to conduct the re-examination and make him to take adequate dispositions, such as reduction of price etc. On the other hand , violation cases shall be informed to concerned Government offices , for instance local EIA covering the shipping agencies in producing area.

(d) to check big-scale consumers

Supervising activity against illegal purchasing of big-scale consumers shall be conducted intensively.

(e) to check the general situation of receiving agencies , especially the control of " Boss "

General tendency of receiving agencies within the wholesale market particularly the tendency of " boss control " shall be examined .

b) concerning retailers business

(a) Spot investigations ;

Spot investigations against authorized or registered retailers shall be conducted laying emphasis that these retailers are conducting fair dealing prescribed on the Article 25th of the Distribution Regulating Ordinance or not , controlled fish & marine goods are being distributed for general consumers or not, and official prices are being observed by concerned persons or not.

(b) Violations ;

Violation cases shall be turned over to the concerned Police Stations.

Periodical meeting with police officials shall be made occasionally, for we want to get informations each other.

(4) Organization & Detail Schedule of Investigation.

Organization of economic investigators and other detail plan shall be given from the Chief of Section respectively.

6. Report

1) Weekly Report of Special Investigation

Weekly Report shall be submitted according to the instruction issued by the Central EIA dated on 22 August '49 ( No. KEICHO 247 ). Publicity & educational programs are considered to be very important , so these items such as subject matters , number of persons attended , system , method and conditions of certain program shall be reported on separate sheets.

2) Monthly Report of Special Investigation  
 Monthly Report as of 25th of each month shall be filed to the Economic Investigation Division and the Administrative Inspection Division of the Tokyo Regional EIA by the end of each month according to the appendix Table No. 1 of the Control Program issued by the Tokyo Regional EIA. Reports concerning vicious violation or large-scale violation shall be forwarded immediately after the inspection against violation case finished to the Tokyo Regional EIA.

3) Reports concerning official recognition of retailer shop & general condition of registration  
 According to the appendix form 1. of (2) of No.3 of the administrative instruction issued by the Vice-President Director of the Central EIA the reports shall be filed to the Administrative Inspection Division and the Economic Investigation Division of the Tokyo Regional EIA.

4) Report regarding the inspection of "bunka sashizu" ( Direction of separate delivery of fish & sea goods )

A volley inspection is now being conducted concerning above mentioned control program in nation-wide scale by the Economic Stabilization Board , Hq of N.R.P. , the Economic Investigation Agency , Public Procurator's Office , the Marine Products Agency , Tekyo Metropolitan Office and other concerned agencies under their tight connection just like when the investigation program against " Ghost Population " was made. So that, you must carry out a strict control activity against violators as the terminal responsible organ of the control agency. Particulary, the occupation forces authority has a deep interest wether or not the concerned dealers are observing the provision of the newly amended distributing ordinance. As we have issued a administrative notification based on the conclusion of staff-meeting of concerned Government agencies , which was held on 14th October , we guess you are now conducting this investigation program strictly , however , there have been reported not a few violators on the part of registered retailers untill today. On the other hand , the Tekyo Prefectural EIA is now conducting an investigation program in accordance with the instruction issued from the Tekyo Civil Affairs Team requesting to us an effective cooperation.

As consequent, undermentioned points shall be examined mainly hereafter and reported as soon as possibly.

1) Timely and effective inspection shall be conducted at least once a week after 21 November untill you confirm the fact that registered ( licensed ) retailer will carry out the distributing business lawfully for the consumers observing the provision of this Distributing Ordinance.

2) Head of police station shall present weekly report informing general state of control program, tendency of violation committed by both side of consumer and dealer, etc. according to the attached report form. ( Running number shall be given to this weekly report )

We herewith submit you in accordance with your inquiry a report on a violation case of milk relating to IKEGASHIRA Tsuto, alias "Furijia" (Freesia), as follows ;

5. Results of the Investigation;

- a) General state of his business ;

He has been engaged in the business of producing and wholeselling of ice-cream, ice-candy and artificial cream (synthetic milk) since the end of the War at the above mentioned address. After mid of 1947 when he happened to know that a substitute of milk named "Pink Ford" has been sold from the SAITAMA RAKUNO SANGYO KYODO SHA (SAITAMA Dairy-farming and Industry Cooperative Company, Yorii-machi, Saitama-ken), he dealt in this products chiefly. This products is a kind of synthetic milk made of skin-milk, oils & fats, flour of minor cereals and animals' liver and sold under the permission of <sup>was</sup> Governor.

He was able to sell this products/ comperative smoothly while the supply of raw milk was short, but recently he faces serious difficulty of the business , because on one hand,the supply of raw milk is increased remarkably and the demand of "Pink Ford " is decreased so far, and on the other hand , he received huge loss from his red-figure management of ice-cream. So that he changed his plan of management since 10th October this year expecting favourable developement of ~~of~~ his business , and is now dealing in raw-milk , which is being purchased from above mentioned SAITAMA RAKUNO SANGYO SHA.

b) Route of purchasing Milk ;

He is now purchasing 4 "To " ( 1 "to" equals 10 " sho" 3,970 gallons ) of raw milk every day from the SAITAMA RAKUNO SANGYO SHA at the price ¥ 80.00 per one "Sho " ( 1" sho " is 0.397 gals ).But he <sup>paid</sup> ¥ 85.00 per 1 " sho " during the period from 10th October to 20th Oct. So that total volume of milk which he purchased untill 11th November becomes 1,310 " Sho" , ¥ 106,950 , but ¥ 70,400 is not yet paid. Actual milk has been sent by way of Tojyo line ( Tobu Railway Co. ) , usually it arrives at the IKEBUKORO Station 3 o'clock p.m. , stored in a ice-box overnight , then delivered to the consumer in next morning. Consequently , Exceeding price over the official one ( purchasing price ) is;

c) State of sales and disposition of milk ;

After the hot-water sterilization and bottling the said milk is being delivered by 4 boys that he employed to the restaurants , tea-houses and other consumers. He has got now about 30 regular costomers among them , and the transaction is used to be conducted on " Cash-sale " . Inspection conducted into the state of his business disclosed that ; ( as of 11th November )

He produced about 300 "sho" of synthetic milk from above mentioned 230 "sho" of raw milk and sold it at the price ¥ 80.00 or ¥ 85.00 per one "go" ( 1 "go" is 0.1 "sho" ), and on the other hand, he has been selling raw-milk at the price ¥ 110.00 - ¥ 140.00 per one "go" ( milk included some sweetness has been sold ¥ 160.00 per one "go" ), therefor, whole sales amount untill 11th November totaled ¥ 151,195. Consequently, his illegal profit over the official price has been estimated about ¥ 100,000 or more than ¥ 100,000, although we could not calculate his illegal profits exactly, because he added some sweetness in milk earning higher prices.

6. Provisions to be applicable to this violation Case ;

a) "Distributing Ordinance of Milk to drink & Dairy Products" shall be not applicable to IKEGASHIRA, because milk which dealt by him is not a one disposed by the proper milk processing operator.

b) Milk which dealt by him is a not-examined one by "the Law of Food Sanitation", therefor, his illegal processing & selling acts shall be a violation case relating to Article No. 7, No. 14 and No. 16 of this law, so that Article No. 31 shall be applicable to him.

c) This case is a violation case of Article No. 3 of "the Price Control Ordinance"; therefor Article No. 33 shall be applicable to him.

The administrative notification No. 531 issued by the Price Board on 27th July 1949 prescribed that the official purchasing price of milk shall be calculated according to the included oils & fats within milk, that is - every 0.1 % of oils & fats shall be estimated 99.37 sen ( per one "sho" ). So that, if the milk sold by him was a standard one, including 3.2 % of oils & fats, the official purchasing price must be ¥ 31.79 per one "sho", however, actually he paid exceedingly ¥ 53.20 during the period from 10th Oct. to 20th Oct. and ¥ 48.20 during the period from 21st Oct. to 11th November. On the other hand, his illegal profits over the official selling price were from ¥ 78.20 to ¥ 108.20 per one "sho".

7. Final decision to the violator ;

A Korean illegally held 12,000 kan ( 1 kan about 8.2 lb) but escaped arrest. An arrest warrant has been issued but the violator is still at large. As a result of the investigation, the MPD concluded that all bread bakers and dealers are operating on the blackmarket ~~ix~~ to some extent.

5. Investigation of the blackmarket of foodstuffs by MPD disclosed that the majority of blackmarketeers travel by either the first or last train to reach Tokyo. Illegal staple foodstuffs are shipped through close cooperation among baggage-room clerks, shop owners and brokers. Rice and flour is shipped camouflaged as pickles, machine parts etc.

6. MPD carried out raids on illegal fresh fish dealers and blackmarketeers on ~~16~~ <sup>17</sup> Oct and ~~17~~ <sup>19</sup> Oct with the following results; ~~16~~ <sup>17</sup> Oct. concentrating on Akibahara Station, 50 persons operating out of Funawashi, Chiba Prefecture were caught, and 207.5 kan of fish confiscated. Of ~~84~~ <sup>84</sup> cases, 42 resulted in conviction, 12 warned and 30 sent to Procurators Office; on ~~18~~ <sup>19</sup> Oct. of 49 cases, 36 were convicted and 13 warned and 120.55 kan of fish confiscated. A total of 33 women

7. Milk investigation by the EIA 2nd Food Section disclosed that 130 koku (1 koku 39.7 gal) of milk is rationed daily but 210 koku is being consumed. About 80 koku is being diverted to the blackmarket. Tokyo Nyugyo KK and Morinaga Shokuryo KK are exclusive milk distributors in Tokyo-To.

8. Investigation of petroleum was divided into three categories; fishing boats; iron and steel industry, metal industry and chemical industry, and the automobile, truck and bus companies. The automobile industry investigation disclosed the following; 30 out of 37 companies submitted ~~false~~ applications falsifying the purpose for which the gasoline was to be used; 10 companies failed to use the gasoline for the purpose for which it was obtained; 28 companies received their rations before allocation certificates were obtained; and many transportation companies are purchasing gasoline and oil on the blackmarket to make up for lack of sufficient allocations.
