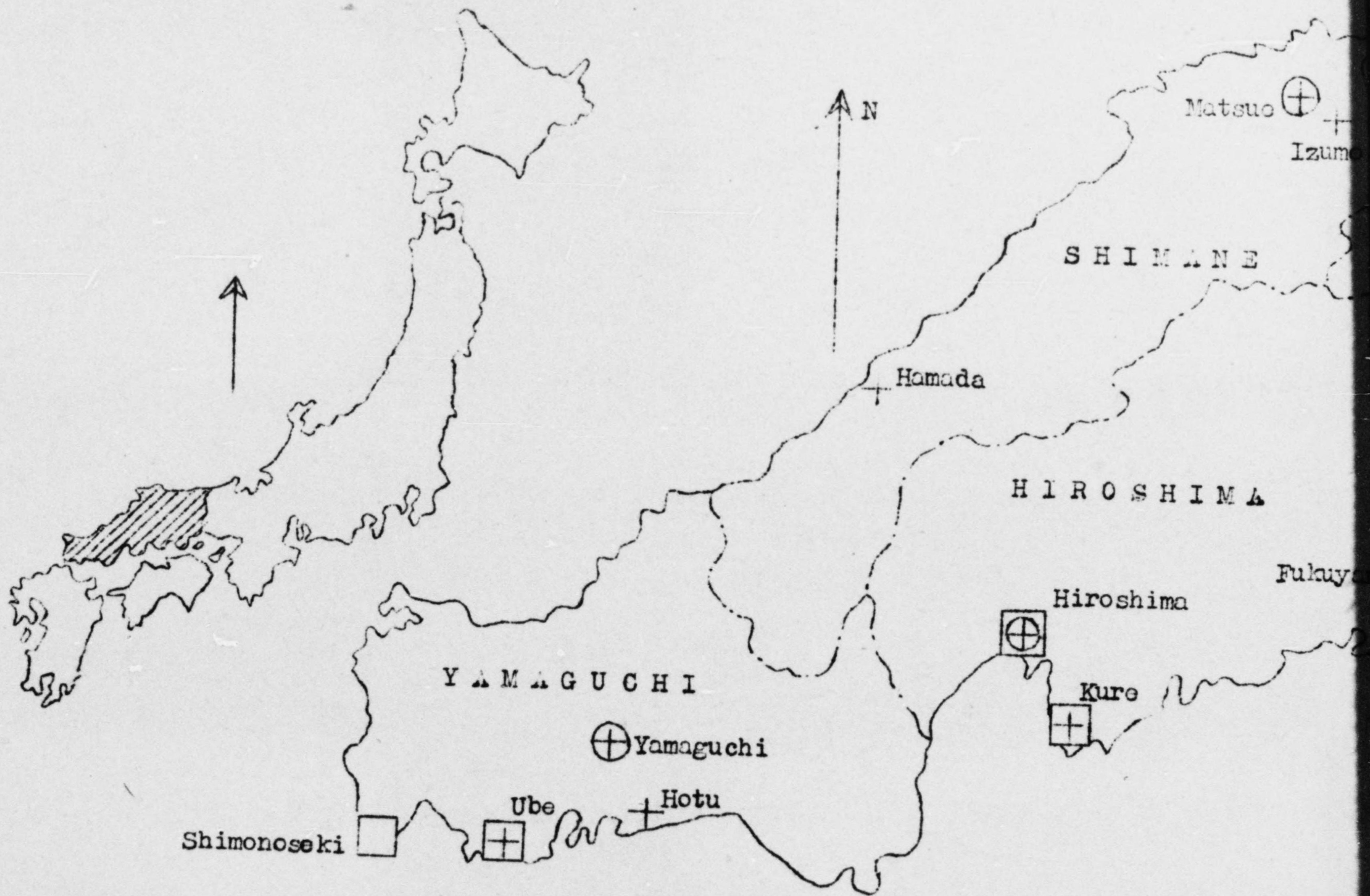

- + Institutions of Higher Learning



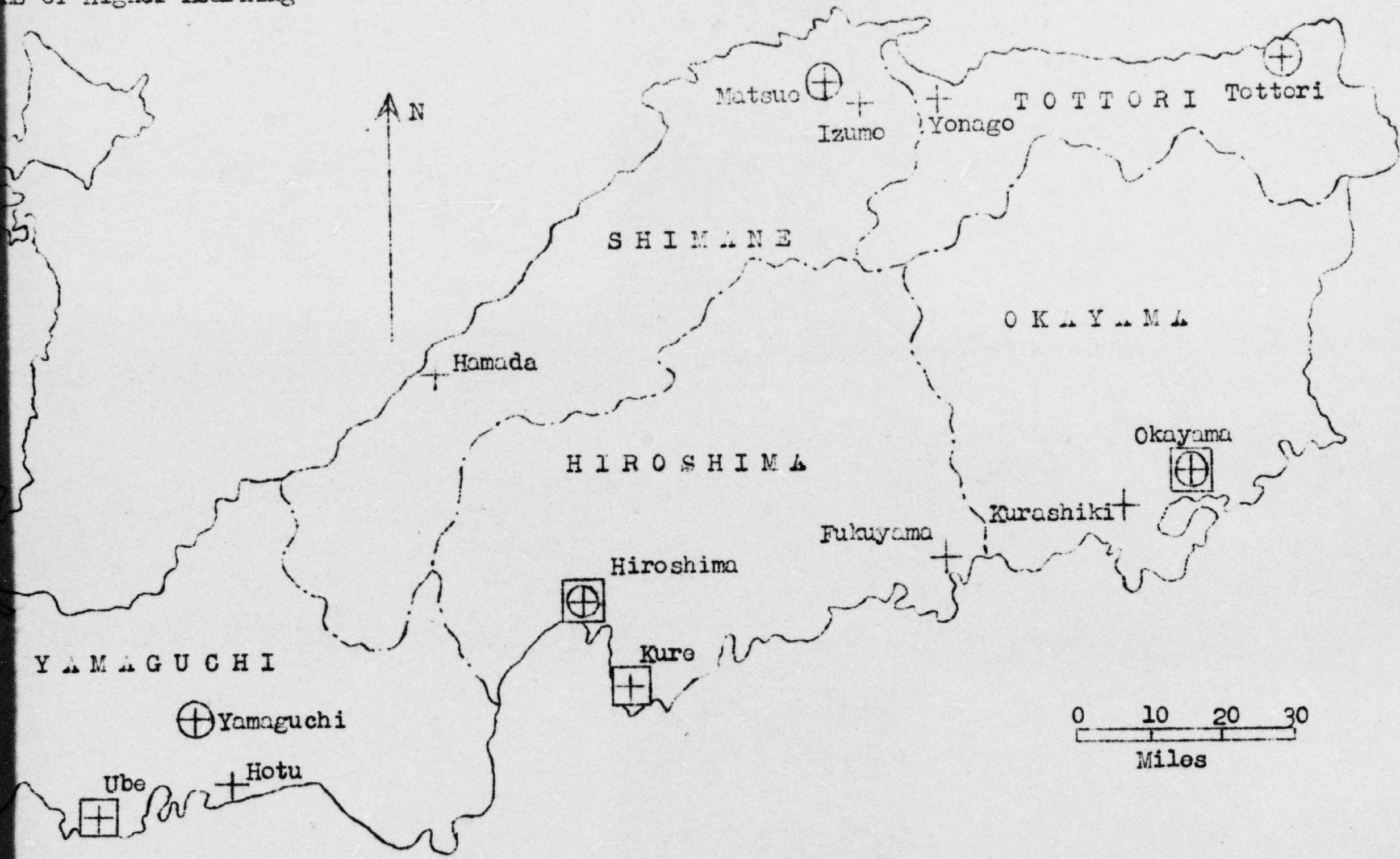
MAP OF CHUGOKU

INTRODUCTION

Group games and team sports provide children with fine opportunities to learn the virtues of sharing, respect for others, and the rules of good sportsmanship under practical and trying conditions. If these attitudes can be generalized to apply to other life situations, they are given a meaning and substance not likely to follow from purely didactic methods.¹

PURPOSE

This report has been prepared to show what the Bureau of Physical Education in the Japanese Ministry of Education has done to build a constructive physical education program formulated along democratic lines, and to eliminate the evils that had sprung up, during the years prior to 1945, from the use of physical education to serve the ends of militarism and ultranationalism.

SOURCES OF DATA

The sections on the history of physical education in Japan prior to the termination of the war and on physical education conferences are based largely on material contained in three unpublished reports prepared by Civil Information and Education Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. Utilized in the writing of other sections were the texts of various directives and instructions issued by the Occupation authorities and the Ministry of Education, the report of the Education Mission to Japan, the new handbook on physical education compiled by the Ministry of Education, press releases, records and reports in the files of Civil Information and

Education Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, and conferences with authorities in the field.

EVALUATION OF DATA

This report covers all major aspects of the postwar physical education program in the schools of Japan. It is based almost entirely on official records and documents cited under "Sources," and the factual data presented may be accepted as accurate and reliable.

SUMMARY

The physical education program in Japan prior to the termination of the war had been used to further militarism and ultranationalism. As a result of the joint cooperation of the Bureau of Physical Education in the Japanese Ministry of Education, officials of the General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, and leading authorities and experts in the field, Japan's physical education program has been reconstructed to serve as a medium to further democracy and to provide healthful recreation and diversion for school children. This process has entailed eliminating military elements from the curriculum, purging militaristic teachers and officials, working out a new teaching guide in physical education, holding conferences and short courses on physical education, decentralizing control by the Bureau of Physical Education in the Ministry of Education, inaugurating a health and sanitation program, endeavoring to secure greater allocation of equipment and facilities for physical education, introducing new games to exploit fully the meager equipment on hand, and eliminating over-emphasis on competition in sports organizations and schools by substituting emphasis on group participation in intramural activities.

Chapter 1

BRIEF HISTORY OF PHYSICAL EDUCATION IN JAPAN
PRIOR TO THE END OF THE WAR¹

When the educational system first was inaugurated following the Meiji Restoration, the course of study outlined for elementary schools included physical education as a subject of instruction, but in actuality no time was allotted to it in the curriculum. Hygiene, however, was taught. There was no mention of physical education in the course of study for middle schools.

Interest in some form of physical education increased, however. In 1875, physical education was added to the curriculum of the Tokyo Normal School, and the Taiso Renshujo (Physical Training Institute) was established under the direct control of the Ministry of Education in 1878. It had as its purpose the training of physical education instructors and the teaching of various subjects related to physical education.

In the revision of the educational system which occurred in 1879, the place of physical education in the school curriculum was still not clearly established.

The New Educational Code of 1879 specified that physical education could be given as a course of study in elementary schools "according to local conditions". No specific hours for instruction were mentioned. Hygiene was eliminated from the curriculum.

The revision in 1880 made no changes with respect to physical education, but in 1881 the Ministry of Education first specified a definite amount of time to be allotted to physical education when it issued an instruction² that gymnastics should be given for twenty minutes every day in elementary schools. The Ministry also made the first mention of games, stipulating that they should be introduced at the beginning of the primary grades. Physical education was added as a subject of study in secondary schools, to be given "at suitable times".

In this period military drill first made its appearance in the school curriculum, as an optional subject in middle schools. The Ministry of Education in 1883 and 1884 began to make surveys of the relative value of kendo, judo,³ and military drill for inclusion in the school program. The only decision reached was that judo was not originated for the purposes of physical education and should not be included in the curriculum.

In a series of ordinances⁴ issued by the Ministry in 1886, physical education was established as a compulsory course in the curricula of elementary schools, middle schools, and higher and normal schools. Military gymnastics, including infantry drill, were prescribed as part of the physical training program for middle, normal, and higher schools, and by this law military training officially became a part of the school physical education program.

Gymnastics came to occupy a more important place in the physical education program in the revised Elementary School

Ordinance of 1890. In 1894 the Ministry of Education issued a directive⁵ placing stress for the first time upon hygiene and the general health of students as aspects of the physical education program. The dress students should wear during exercise was prescribed, and teachers were directed to urge students to abstain from smoking and to walk rather than ride to school. The ordinance further stated that too much emphasis should not be placed on academic scholarship, and that teachers should provide students with as much physical activity as possible. Two years later a Council of Advisers on School Hygiene was established in the Ministry, and in 1897 provision was made for the appointment of regular school doctors.⁶

The following year the Ministry issued an ordinance to the effect that kendo and judo had certain values in the training of students' minds and bodies, but that they were not appropriate for inclusion in the school curriculum. However, there was no objection to their practice as extra-curricular activities.

In 1900, the Elementary School Ordinance was revised. According to this revision, the objectives of school physical education included the harmonious development of various parts of the body and the cultivation of the observance of rules and the practice of cooperation. The curriculum was divided into three parts, games, regular gymnastics, and military gymnastics. Students were not required to carry weapons during military drill.

In 1905, a motion was presented in the Diet to make judo and kendo a required part of the curriculum for boys' middle schools. It was defeated, but reintroduced three years later. The decision reached at that time was that the matter required more study.

In 1907, a Joint Committee for School Physical Education, composed of members from the Army and Education Ministries, was organized to investigate such matters as the inclusion of budo (military arts) in the curriculum and the question of military training. Army members favoured emphasizing military training in the school system in order to compensate for the shortened period of compulsory military service which was adopted after the

Russo-Japanese War, while representatives of the Education Ministry opposed this plan. The committee was unable to reach an agreement.

Two years later a similar committee was formed, which reached the decision that the essential part of school physical education should consist of gymnastics. Instruction in military drill, budo, etc., also might be given, but only as supplementary activities. On the basis of this decision, the Ministry issued a directive to elementary schools, girls' high schools, middle schools, and normal schools, entitled "Teaching Details of Physical Education",⁷ the first guide of its kind to be formulated.

With the beginning of World War I in 1914, emphasis again was shifted to the military aspects of physical education, and after the end of the war in 1918, disarmament and its attendant features focused attention on the schools as the logical place to continue military training. In 1925, Imperial Ordinance No. 135 was promulgated, assigning Army officers on active duty to schools for the purpose of supervising military training. Such training was given in all governmental or public middle schools, technical schools, special schools, normal schools, and higher schools, and had a marked influence on the physical training program. With the removal of military training from the jurisdiction of the physical education instructor and its development as an independent activity, encroachments began to be made on the time devoted to physical education as such. Middle schools and normal schools at the "first department" level, for example, were required to give up to military training, three of the five hours per week scheduled for physical education. Further pretext for encroachment was offered by an Army Ordinance issued in 1926, which provided for the inspection of schools at least once a year. In many cases, the Army officers assigned to direct military training requested additional time, taken from other subjects, to prepare for these inspections, in order that the school might make a good showing and no reflection be cast upon the officer in charge.

In 1931, budo became a required course of study in the physical education program for middle schools and took up one hour per week of the time allotted to physical education. In youth schools, first established in 1925, military drill was the sole feature of the so-called physical education program.

In 1935, the system of certifying graduating students as to their proficiency in military training was introduced and this gave the assigned Army officers additional pretext to exert more pressure on physical education instructors to apply military aims and objectives to the physical education program.

In 1937 an extra hour per week of military drill was added to the curriculum for the third year of middle schools, with the aim of attempting to reproduce in the third and fourth years of the schools the Army's three-months basic training. Drills and maneuvers, including overnight trips, came to encroach more and more upon the time allotted to physical as well as to general education.

This situation became more crucial in the period from the outbreak of the China Incident in 1937 until March 1941, when a sweeping revision was made in the elementary school system. According to the Imperial Ordinance⁵ issued at that time, the object of physical education was defined as serving "to train the body and mind in such a way as to develop generosity of mind and sturdiness of body, and to cultivate the practical power of self-sacrificing service to the nation". It was stipulated further that "students should be trained to understand that strong physical and mental power are the foundation of national prosperity and especially necessary for national defense". It was directed that military drill be emphasized in the case of boys in the higher department of elementary school, together with the spirit of obedience, respect, and cooperation. Boys in the primary and higher departments of elementary schools were required to take judo and kendo as part of the physical training curriculum; training in use of the naginata (halberd) was specified for girls. The Ordinance further stated: "Mind and body should be disciplined as one, and the spirit of respecting courtesy and esteeming honor should be cultivated".

By this ordinance, military training became a part of the elementary school curriculum. It also spread for the first time to universities, and thus completely permeated the entire school system.

Commencing in 1942, after the outbreak of war, all activities not directly connected with the war effort were eliminated from the physical training curriculum. Western

sports disappeared completely. Military training assumed paramount importance, and other physical training activities were relegated to the background. Hand grenades were thrown in place of shot-puts; students ran in track exercises with packs strapped to their backs. Even girls were given military training in addition to naginata practice.

Various new games were originated to focus the students' attention on the war. In elementary schools these included such games as gunkan asobi (warship game), hata ubai (flag snatching), and kiba sen (cavalry battle); and in middle schools, kurosane no onikara (strength of iron), and kachidoki (battle-cry) were played. Normal school students were thoroughly indoctrinated to serve as instructors in this type of program.

Labor service for students was initiated by a notification⁹ issued by the Ministry in 1933 under the pretext of affording them a means of practical training in group activities. This program was transferred to the jurisdiction of the Bureau of Physical Education in 1942, and a Special Labor Service Section was established to supervise and administer it. Activities consisted of work on school farms, repair of school and hospital facilities, repair of roads, and construction work on parks, play-grounds, and air defense installations. The following year, the Labor Service Section was replaced by a Students' Mobilization Section, and the objective of the program ceased to be that of utilizing labor as a means of education, but became that of mobilizing students' labor to facilitate the prosecution of the war. In 1944 jurisdiction over the program was removed from the Bureau of Physical Education and centered in a Mobilization Planning Section in the Administrative Bureau of the Ministry.

By 1944, when the war began to go adversely for Japan, school boys and girls largely had been mobilized into war industries, and regular education, military or otherwise, came practically to a standstill.

Chapter 2

ELIMINATION OF MILITARISTIC PRACTICES

The Potsdam Declaration,¹ issued 26 July 1945, contained the following clauses:

There must be eliminated for all time the authority and influence of those who have deceived and misled the Japanese people.

A new order of peace, security, and justice will be impossible until irresponsible militarism is driven from the world.

The Japanese Government shall remove all obstacles to the revival and strengthening of democratic tendencies among the Japanese people.

The Ministry of Education, anticipating the enforcement of this policy by the Allied Powers through the Occupation Army which landed in Japan after her capitulation on 15 August 1945, immediately issued an order to halt all labor service except in agriculture² and shortly thereafter abolished military training and dismissed Army officers from schools.³

In a press release issued early in September, the Ministry heralded the restoration of physical training and sports to the school curriculum: "Physical training and sports will be restored in order to foster the spirit of fair play and to enable the students to participate in the future in international competitions, thereby promoting friendship and understanding with the world's youth."⁴

In an order issued a day after this release appeared, youth school students currently assigned to factories were
