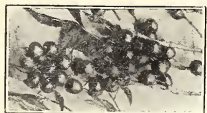

Bushcherries Are Fruitful

He has developed what was formerly the rather small, little known western South Dakota Sand Cherry, to a fruit of large size, desirable taste, good habits, wonderful bearing and beautiful in flower, fruit and foliage. The fruit is good to eat from the bush and makes a wonderful jam. The juice makes fine jelly and a not to be forgotten cordial which won't keep long.

Though the fruit of this cherry much resembles a plum in size and shape, the plant itself grows in a bush like shape, branching and bearing from the ground up, usually bearing the year after planting. It always retains its dwarf stature which is of fine value for planting in the garden as it doesn't take up near the room of an ordinary plum tree and yet often bears more. The bushes should be planted 2 to 4 feet apart, in rows 4 to 6 feet apart, about 12 to 25 or more to every home garden.

In landscape planting a few of the bush cherries are very desirable as they are dwarf and bushy and so a great aid in foundation covering-planting work. While the foliage itself, a beautiful silvery green, turning a rich red and gold in fall, adds a very desirable color touch to landscape planting. The profuse masses of white flowers in early spring, completely covering the bushes are a glorious sight. The fruit later is ornamental as well as useful. Because of their dwarf bushy habit these Hansen Bush Cherries make a splendid ornamental low hedge for the front lawn as well as garden use.

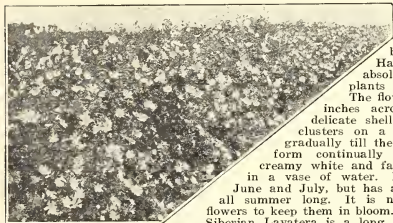

Siberian Lavatera

A Beautiful Everblooming Perennial Siberian Lavatera was brought by Prof. N. E. Hansen from Siberia, and is absolutely hardy anywhere plants will grow.

The flowers are large, up to three inches across, single, and a pretty delicate shell-pink. They are borne in clusters on a long spike, blooming out gradually till the tip buds open. New buds form continually as the flowers fade to creamy white and fall. Bouquets last for days in a vase of water. It blooms heaviest during June and July, but has a good showing of flowers all summer long. It is not necessary to pick the flowers to keep them in bloom.

Siberian Lavatera is a long lived perennial. It makes a good border or back ground plant, and is splendid as a summer hedge. The plants offered will bloom this summer if properly cared for.

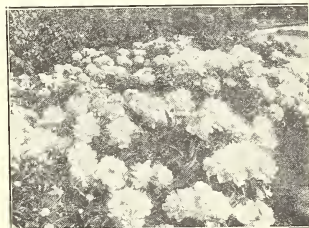

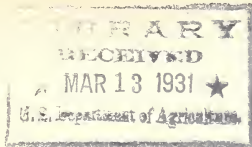
