Parish Court for the Parish and City of New-Orleans.—Present the hon. James Pitot. Honoré René vs. his wife, Marie F. Chevrol. THE plaintiff in this cause, Honoré René, a f. w. c. having married the defendant, Marie-Françoise Chevrol, a f. w. c. in 1826, has now instituted a suit against her for both, a separation from bed and board and divorce, from him, on the ground that she has rendered herself guilty of adultery, by running away with the matrimonial domicile with a certain individual of the name of Louis Bayard, and cohabiting to live with the same at his house, and dwelling since some time last year 1829, in open perpetration of her said guilt.
