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Tuberculosis Knowledge.

Now that the control and prevention of tuberculosis is so well-known it is possible to improve conditions everywhere. A few facts should be generally told to those who have already contracted the disease, as well as to those who are free from it.

To say that you are not afraid of tuberculosis and to sleep with persons who have it, and eat and drink after them, does not mean that you will not catch it. Such a course shows ignorance. Nine times out of ten you will catch the disease.

Another way to catch tuberculosis is by kissing. People who have tuberculosis like to kiss. On greeting persons they love, they often want to kiss them not only once but twice. This is one of the symptoms of the disease.
