The history of Arras dates back beyond the Christian era when it was the chief town of a Gallic tribe known as Atrebatum. It was then known as Nemetacum, or Nemetocenna, but its present name is derived from that of the tribe...

Your flag need not be lowered at sunset. No less an authority than Adjutant General Simpson, stationed at Governor's Island, is responsible for the statement that the flag can remain up during every hour of the twenty-four and until the end of the war...

"Arras boasted of a charter as early as 1180, and the instrument was adopted as a model by many of the neighboring communes. But this document did not protect the city against the ravages of hostile armies which swept back and forth over this fertile region throughout the middle ages..."

But a special regulation provides that at the beginning and during an action in which the forts may be engaged, the flag shall be kept masted whether by day or by night or until the action closes.

"Under the circumstances it was particularly unfortunate that he was tried before a judge against whom there rested the imputation of interest, bias or prejudice. If the judicial enforcement of law is to command universal respect, it must deserve that respect, too great care can never be exercised to see that it does deserve that respect."
