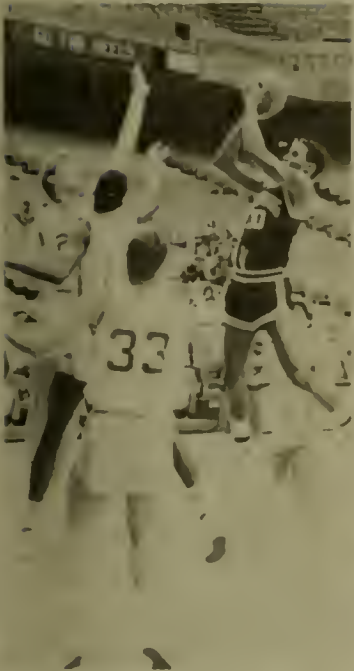

# Founders Day 1987

"Whereas establishing an Academy in the said county for the education of youth will be attended with great advantages to the State in general, and the County of Franklin in particular . . ." These are the words of the original charter approved by the State of North Carolina General Assembly on January 6, 1787. Two hundred years later the college administration, faculty, alumni, special guests, and friends gathered in Holton Gymnasium to celebrate the continuing legacy and tradition of a very special Junior College.

Among the notables participating in the celebration were keynote speaker Dr. William C. Friday, President Emeritus of The University of North Carolina; The Honorable Robert B. Jordan, III, Lieutenant Governor of North Carolina who represented the State of North Carolina; and Bishop Carlton P. Minnick, Jr., who gave greetings from The North Carolina United Methodist Church. Also among the well-wishers were Louisburg's Mayor, Lucy T. Allen; Ben E. Jordan Jr., Chairman of the Board of Trustees; Harold A. Morris, President of the Alumni Association; Dr. George Ann Willard, Chair of the Bicentennial Committee; and Lisa Buffaloe, President of the Student Government Association for the 1986-87 academic year.

Dr. Friday said, "The great adventure of learning and the freeing of a young mind from the boundaries of fear, prejudice, despair, and bigotry are through the wonders of knowledge and its joys and compassion. This is why Louisburg College and The University of North Carolina are so important, and this is why that what is done today on these campuses by these teachers is so critical to the future."

Happy Birthday Louisburg College with many more to come. Just think — Two hundred years of dedicated service.

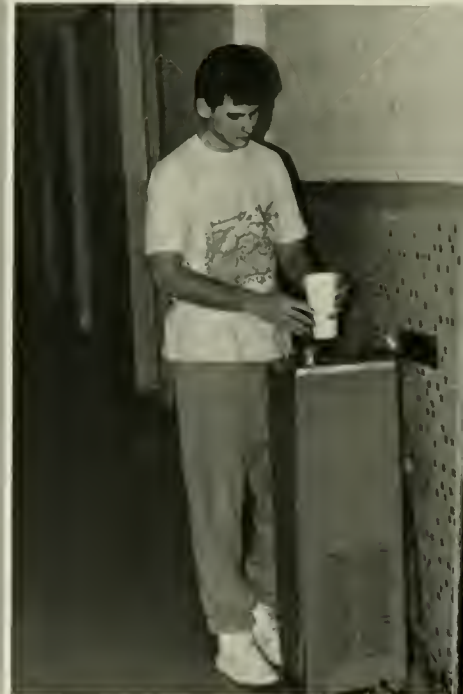
# The Good Life '87

Under the leadership of Dan Steinert, Instructor of Music and Director of the Glee Club and Ensemble, the trip to England was made possible. The trip was in keeping with the Bicentennial celebration of Louisburg College and its great tradition of the "educational experience." "Louisburg College has long been associated with Methodism, and in 1909 was donated to the Methodist Episcopal Church. When Miss Sarah Foster joined the faculty in 1945, she immediately formed a small group of singers from the larger Glee Club, and as the "Choristers" they sang during worship services at area churches and for civic functions in the surrounding communities. After being called the "Chapel Choir" for an extended period thereafter, the name "Ensemble" has been associated with them since 1975." 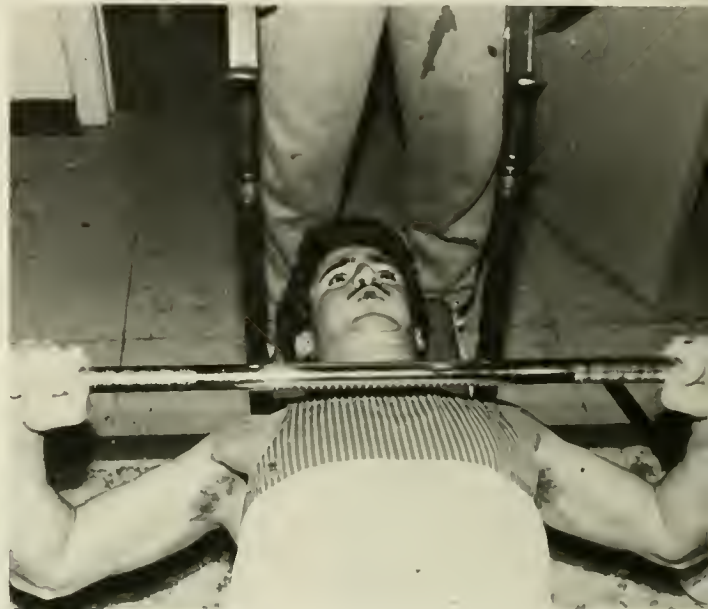

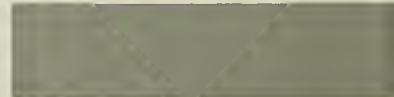

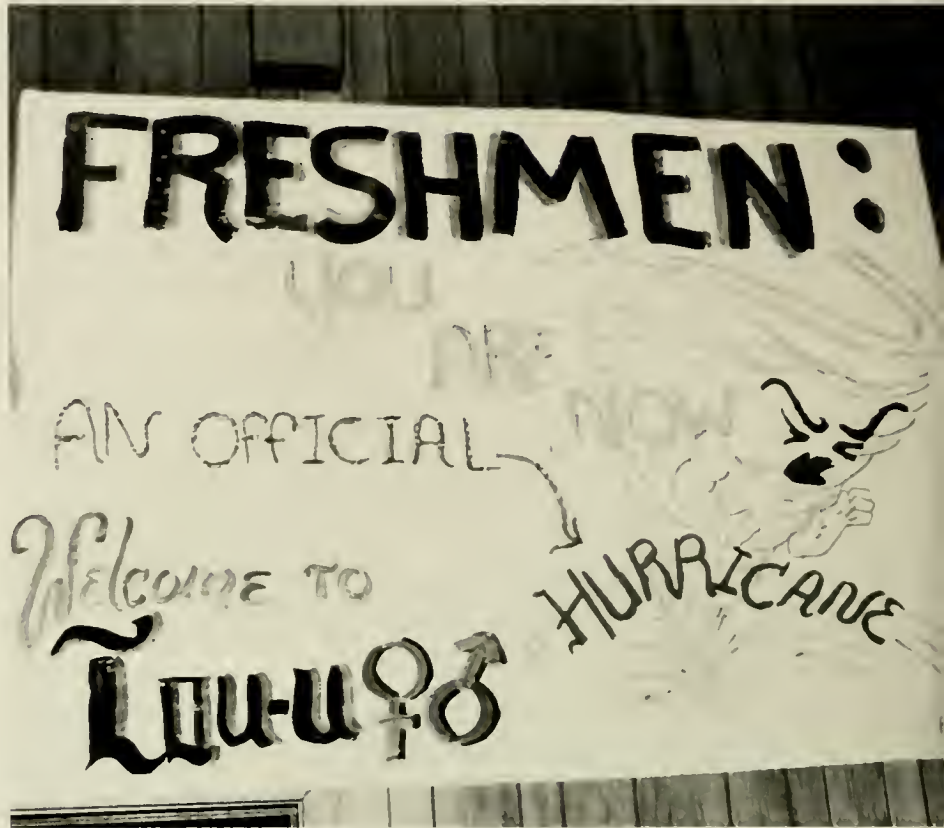

Dr. Mac Ricketts Chairs the Religion Department. He has been with the department since 1971

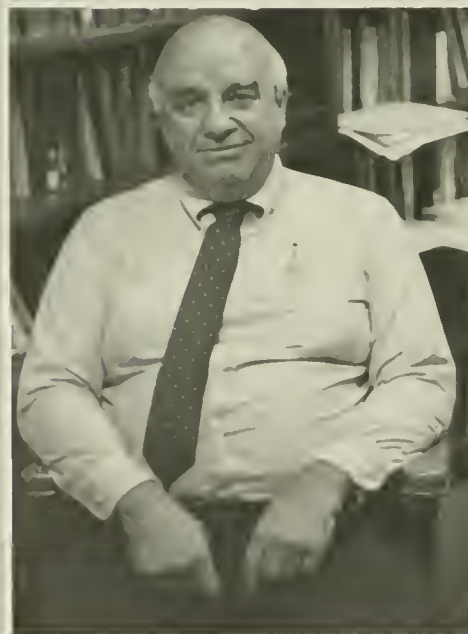


Mr. Walter McDonald is Professor of Religion and has been associated with Louisburg College and the department since 1956.

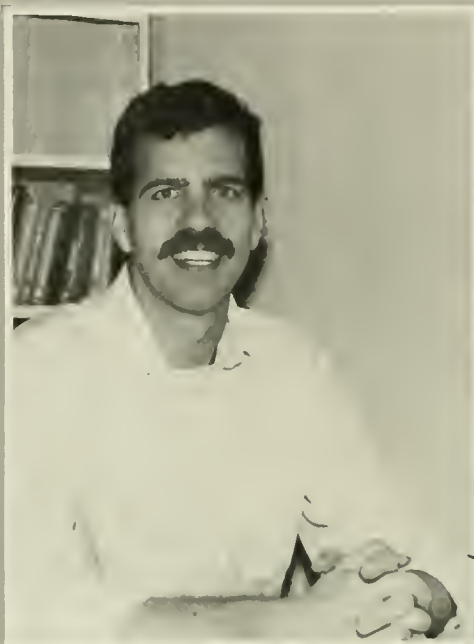

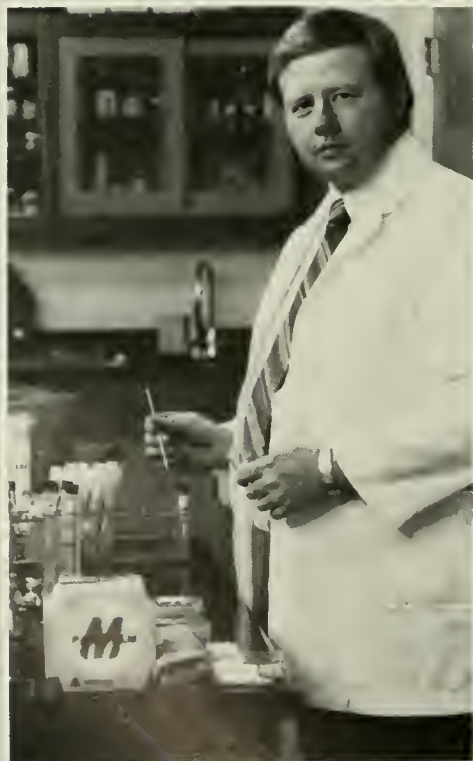

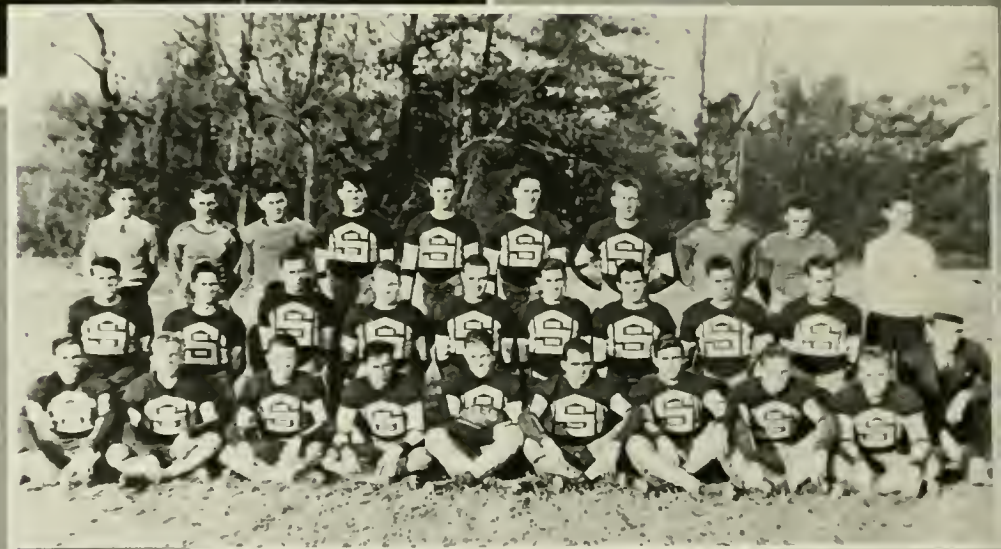

# The 14th Annual Convention

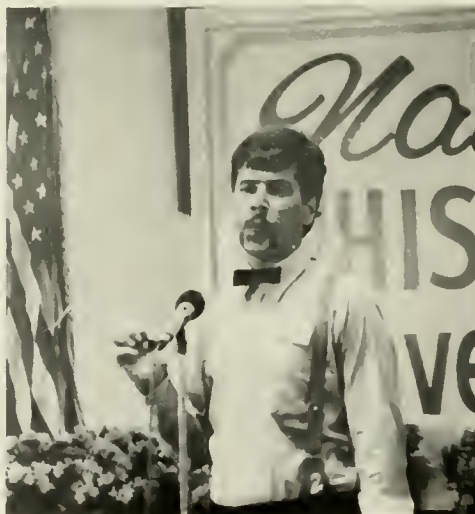

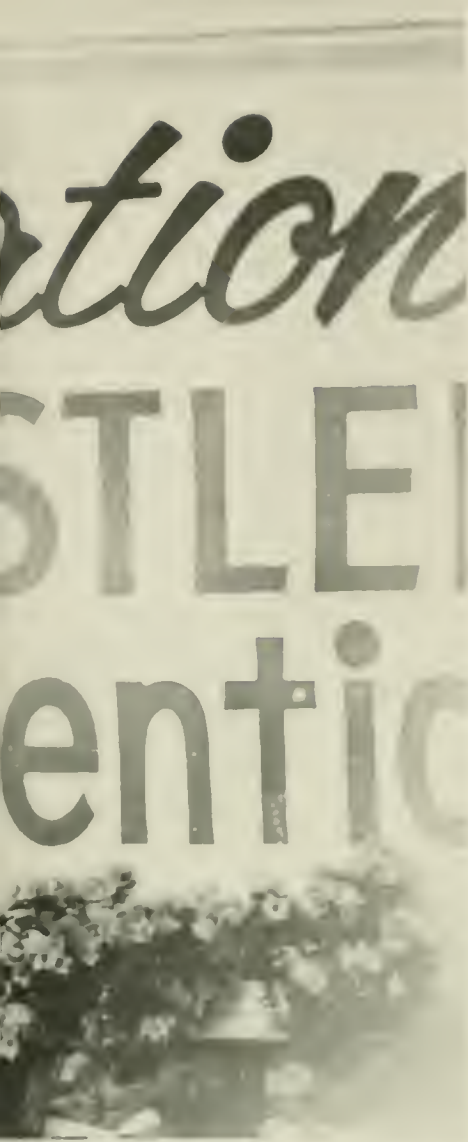

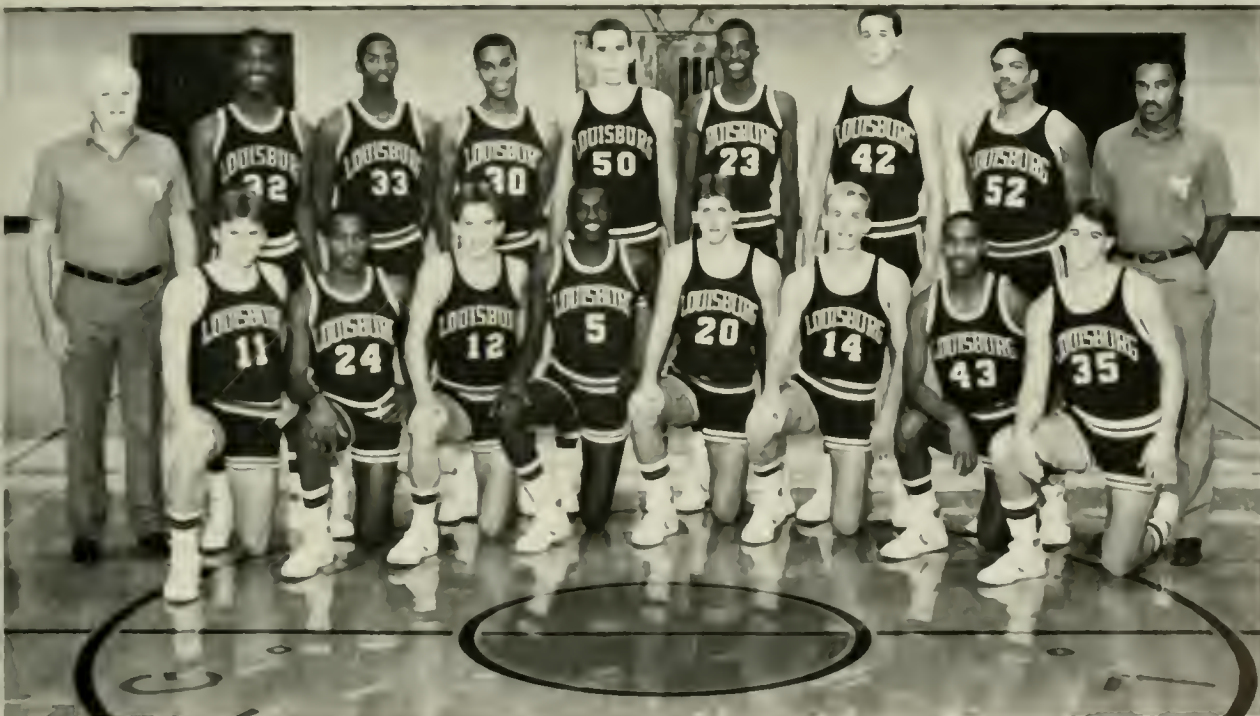


# The Competition was strong

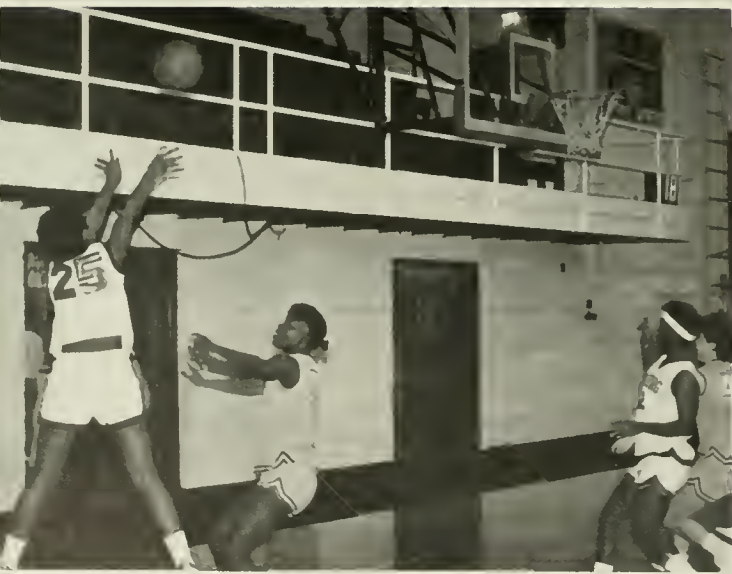
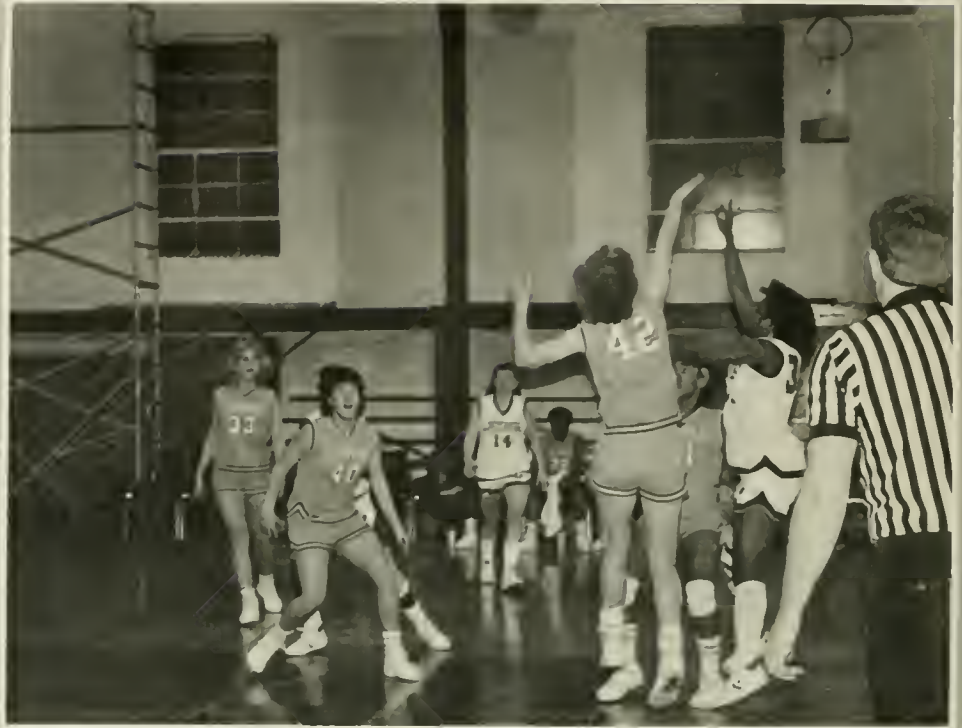

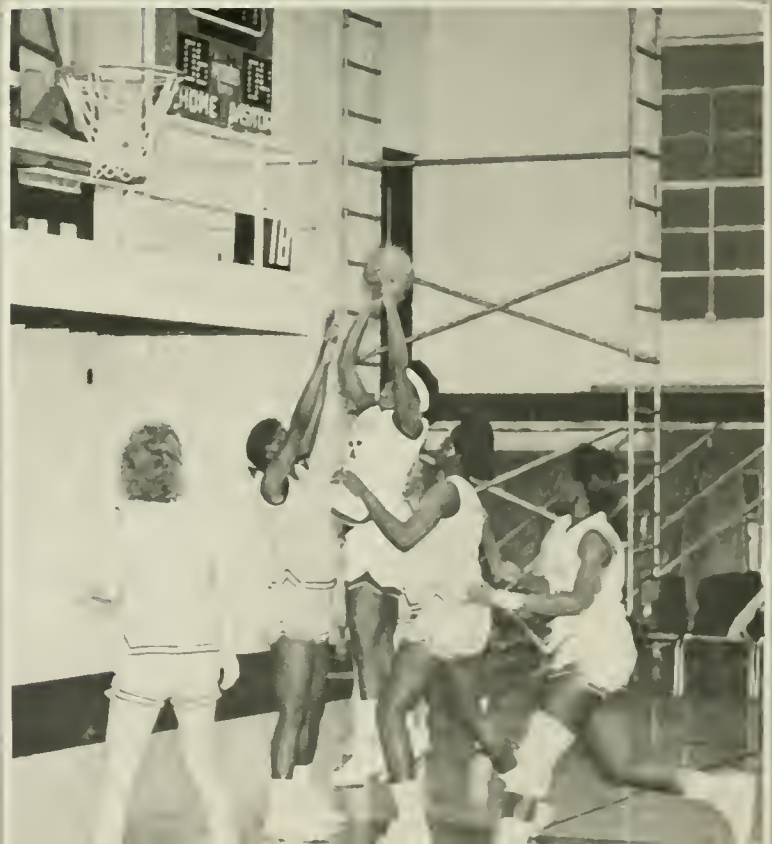

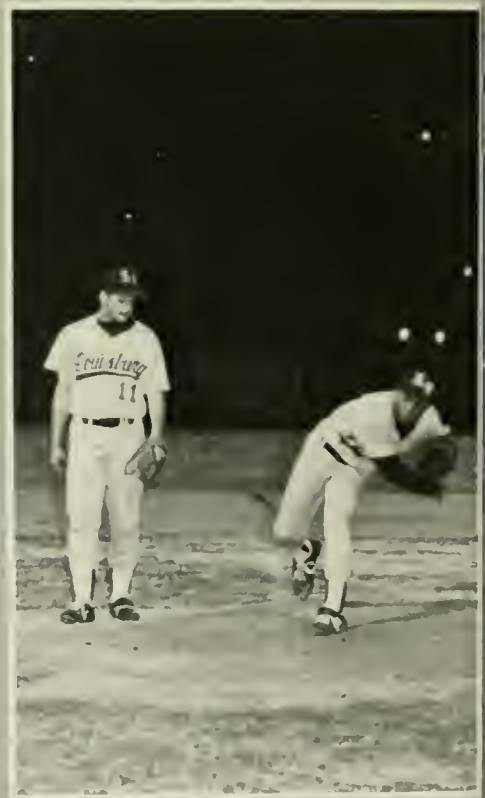
