A cool project would be a new project, or a project with some changes that make it new and attractive.


I think that a 'cool' project has to inspiring. If I can get any inspiration from the project, then I would think it is cool.

- Labels for use inside buildings, e.g. for objects in museums.






#### WikiTown/Toodyaypedia Australia

# WikiCheese France Project that aims to improve the content on French cheeses on Wikimedia projects (Wikipedia articles, Wikidata data definitions of the Wiktionary) • A group of French Wikimedians, led by Pierre-Yves Beaudouin, designed a project to photograph many cheeses, up to 200 for the moment





#### WikiCheese

France

- The donors to the project depending on the amount of money they gave - are invited to participate in WikiCheese nights, once a month.
- Every month, 10 cheeses are photographed and their articles improved;
- Experienced wikimedians train new editors;
- All participants enjoy eating good cheese with a nice glass of wine, provided by the guests in Wikimédia France's office.





- A combination of a physical internet kiosk stand, combined with an open source web application that offers a curated selection of Wikimedia for museum visitors.
- The kiosk is visible in two Dutch museums until the end of 2015: the Catharijneconvent in Utrecht and the Textielmuseum in Tilburg.



## Coding da Vinci

Germany

- Only a small part of cultural treasures can be shown at the same time during exhibitions. Most of these treasures are hidden away in archives of museums, libraries and other cultural institutions.
- To avoid those data treasures lying dormant German programming competition with cultural data – Coding da Vinci (CdV).
- In 2014, during this cultural hackathon, 150 enthusiastically programming volunteers transformed the data-sets provided under a free license into new web services, mobile apps and games.


