At this writing the possibility of securing Dutch grown bulbs for planting, even late this season, is remote in the extreme. As planting time drew nearer we felt compelled to make available to those who have depended upon us in the past, the best substitute for genuine Dutch stocks.

Fortunately we have been successful in booking fairly adequate supplies of the limited list of varieties that are grown in England on a commercial scale. These are offered below and we suggest that orders be sent as early as convenient. All of the varieties will be recognized to be thoroughly tried and dependable.

BARONNE DE LA TONNAYE—A

nice large rose colored tulip, slightly deeper tones of pink at the rim. Works splendidly planted in combination with Wm. Copeland and Inglescombe Yellow. 3 bulbs 25c; 6 for 45c; 12 for 82c; 25 for \$1.50; 100 for \$5.35, postpaid.

BARTIGON—Fiery red and very dependable. Bartigon is especially well adapted to forcing as well as being one of the most popular border or bedding varieties. See the suggestions for forcing on this page. 3 bulbs for 20c; 6 for 38c; 12 for 68c; 25 for \$1.25; 100 for \$4.90, postpaid.

CENTENAIRE—A large flowering tulip of striking appearance. The color is deep rose, flushed claret with light blue center. Plant in large groups of 25 or more or in solid beds for rich color effect in the border. 3 bulbs 35c; 6 for 60c; 12 for \$1.10; 25 for \$1.95; 100 for \$6.90, postpaid.

CITY OF HAARLEM—One of the outstanding tulip introductions of recent years. Typically darwin in shape and size this is the reddest of red flowers. FARNCOMBE SANDERS—Famous as a bedding variety but also very fine for forcing. The large flowers are borne on tall stately stems and have good form and texture. TULIP FORCING

Use a 5-inch pot for 3 to 5 bulbs; a 6-inch pot for 5 to 6 bulbs, or an 8-inch pot for 8 to 10 bulbs.

Average garden soil mixed with leaf-mold or thoroughly rotted cow manure is well adapted to tulip forcing. If the mixture is not friable add sand. Make plantings September to November for succession of blooms.

Place coarse material such as broken pots or gravel in the bottom of the pots to insure ample drainage, then fill pots about $\frac{3}{4}$ full of soil. Do not pack. Place bulbs and press down until the tops are about $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch below the top level of the pot,

finish filling with soil and work firmly around bulbs. The top of bulbs should be covered. When planting has been completed enough space should remain between the soil and top of pot for watering. Water thoroughly. At least six weeks should elapse before the bulbs are ready to be taken indoors. The pots should be stored in a cold-frame, underneath shrubbery or beside a wall and covered with straw or similar material to a depth of about 6 or 8 inches.

If stored outside rains will generally keep the soil moist. Care should be taken to see that it does not become dry. As soon as good root systems have developed and the tops show color they are ready to be carried indoors. Place pots in a cool room for several days, later transferring them to a temperature of about 65°F. Keep water on heating units and elsewhere to maintain humidity which is very essential. Prevent freezing.

High and fluctuating temperatures, dry air, insufficient light and too much or too little water are detrimental. Avoid strong sunlight. A light, airy, humid room with a mild temperature should prove ideal.

Carefully kept notes as to date planted, soil used, length of rooting period, temperature, etc., will be of considerable value in future plantings.

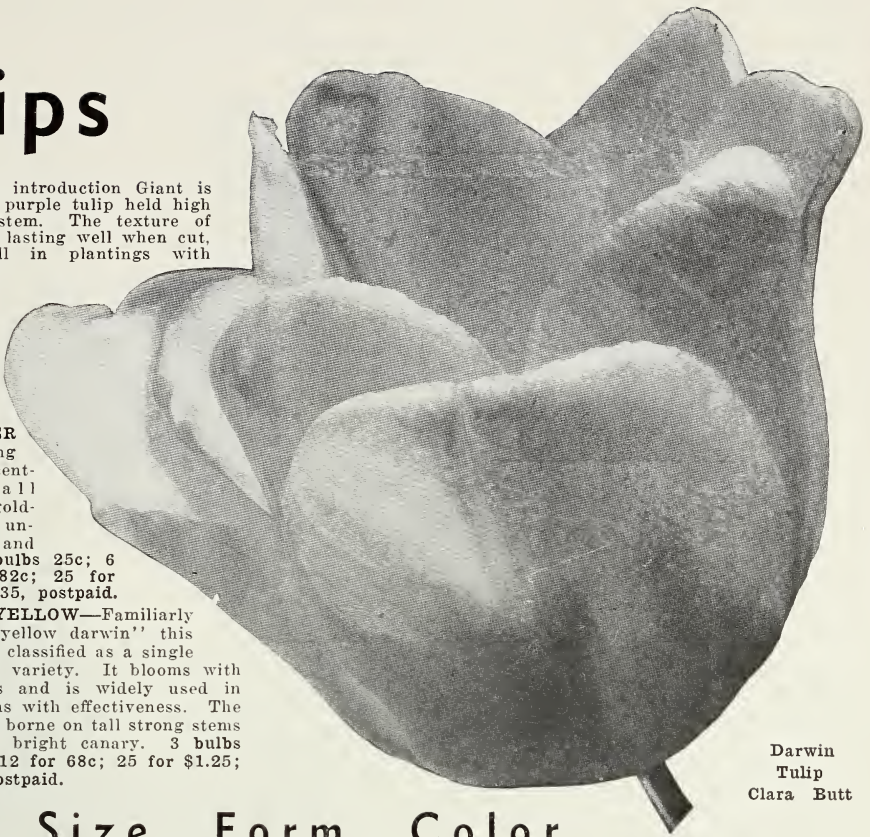
GIANT—Of recent introduction Giant is a fine large violet purple tulip held high on a strong tall stem. The texture of the flower is good, lasting well when cut. 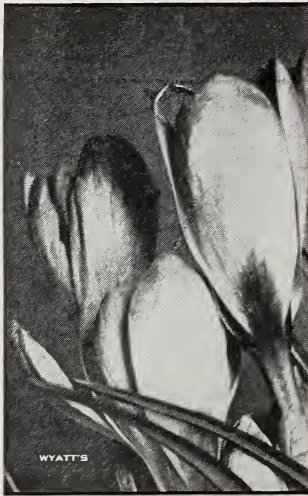
