1. The 330th M12 Platoon recently completed training referred to in radio, G-80501, 11 September 1951, GINCE to Eighth Army (Incl 1).

2. Inspection of state of training conducted on 9 January 1952 disclosed much improvement over previous test conducted 29 August-2 September 1951. Present strength of the unit is seven (7) officers and eighteen (18) NCOs.

3. Action is being taken to request assignment of the 330th M12 Platoon to Eighth Army for purpose outlined in your basic communication above, with necessary adjustment of spaces above present Eighth Army troop ceiling. Current shortages and anticipated losses in personnel are as follows:

1. In Aug 1951 Eighth Army requested that British Govt be requested to furnish Military Intelligence Service Platoon personnel for British Commonwealth Division and that either 330th or 340th MIS Platoons (8 Off and 20 EM each) be sent to Eighth Army for use with the Commonwealth Division as an interim measure.

2. Following inspections of the two (2) platoons by personnel of G2, GHQ it was recommended on 9 Sep 51 (Incl 1), that in view of inadequate training, the units be given additional training in Japan for sixty (60) to ninety (90) days. This was approved by CofS on 10 Sep 1951.

3. Ltr G2, Eighth Army to G2, FEC, dated 9 Dec 51, subject, "Additional MIS Platoon" (Incl 2), requested that the 330th MIS Platoon be assigned to Eighth Army for intel support of British Commonwealth Div and I ROK Corps.

4. The 330th and 340th MIS Platoons recently completed their training cycles and inspection was held on 9 Jan 52.

5. Radio GX 50694 RCGI, XVI Corps to CINCFE, 12 Jan 52 (Incl 3), informs that inspection on 9 Jan 52 indicated both units showed much improvement over previous inspection and recommends that both units be sent to Korea for on-the-job training prior to other future attachment. Interim reply stating recommendations were under study was dispatched on 14 Jan 51.

6. Since both the units have just completed a cycle of intensive training and indications are that XVI Corps has no requirements for them, it is believed that they should be now utilized in some gainful capacity. Further training as such in Japan would be anticlimactic and probably detrimental to morale.

7. FEC Intel School is presently conducting limited operations at Camp Palmer with administrative and instructional personnel borrowed from other G2 sections. MISG/FE is preparing an augmentation to MISG/FE T/D, which will consist of approximately 30 Off and 35 EM and/or DACs, to provide the school with adequate administrative and instructional personnel for an expanded curriculum and student body. This will be an increase of approximately 10 Off and 20 EM over the present strength.

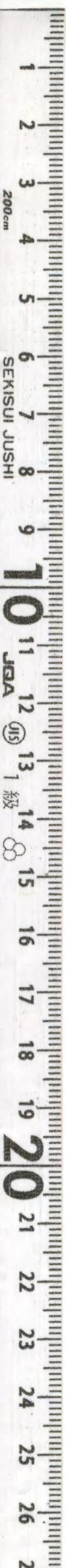
8. In view of the above, MISG/FE proposes to G3 in Incl 4 that:

- a. The 330th MIS Platoon be transferred to Eighth Army.
- b. The 340th MIS Platoon be attached to MISG/FE for duty with FECIS for use as school troops and instructional personnel.

This would reduce the additional requirements in the augmentation T/D to approximately 2 Officers.

9. Incl 5 is draft 1st Ind to G2, Eighth Army stating that action is being taken to have 330th MIS Platoon assigned to Eighth Army and recommending the organization of a Provisional MIS Bn for providing administrative support of MIS units in Korea.

10. The troop spaces of both the above units will be utilized in the proposed MIS Organization.

1. In Aug 1951 Eighth Army requested that British Govt be requested to furnish Military Intelligence Service Platoon personnel for British Commonwealth Division and that either 330th or 340th MIS Platoons (8 ORT and 20 EM each) be sent to Eighth Army for use with the Commonwealth Division as an interim measure.

2. Following inspection of the two (2) platoons by personnel of G2, GHQ it was recommended on 9 Sep 51 (Incl 1), that in view of inadequate training the units be given additional training in Japan for sixty (60) to ninety (90) days. This was approved by G2 on 10 Sep 1951.

3. For G2, Eighth Army to G2, HQ, dated 9 Dec 51, subject, "Additional MIS Platoon" (Incl 2), requested that the 330th MIS Platoon be assigned to Eighth Army for intel support of British Commonwealth Div and I ROK Corps.

4. The 330th and 340th MIS Platoons recently completed their training cycles and inspection was held on 9 Jan 52.

5. Radio OK 30094 HQG, XVI Corps to CIMOP, 12 Jan 52 (Incl 3), informs that inspection on 9 Jan 52 indicated both units showed much improvement over previous inspection and recommends that both units be sent to Korea for on-the-job training prior to other future assignment. Interim reply stating recommendations were under study was dispatched on 14 Jan 52.

6. Since both the units have just completed a cycle of intensive training and indications are that XVI Corps has no requirements for them, it is believed that they should be now utilized in some gainful capacity. Further training as such in Japan would be antieconomic and probably detrimental to morale.

7. The Intel School is presently conducting limited operations as G2P in cooperation with administrative and instructional personnel borrowed from other G2 sections. MISG/TE is preparing an augmentation to MISG/TE T/D, which will consist of approximately 30 ORT and 25 EM and/or DAGs, to provide the school with adequate administrative and instructional personnel for an expanded curriculum and student body. This will be an increase of approximately 10 ORT and 20 EM over the present strength.

8. In view of the above, MISG/TE proposes to G2 in Incl 4 that:

a. The 330th MIS Platoon be transferred to Eighth Army.

b. The 340th MIS Platoon be attached to MISG/TE for duty with FWDIS for use as a school for instructional personnel.

This would require additional requirements in the augmentation T/D to approximately 10 ORT and 20 EM.

9. Incl 5 as per Incl 4, Eighth Army stating that action is being taken to have 330th MIS Platoon assigned to Eighth Army and recommending the organization of MIS in providing administrative support of MIS units.

10. The above units will be utilized in the proposed MIS organization.

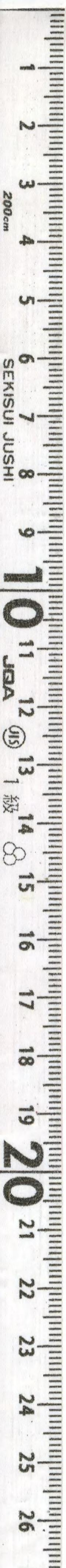
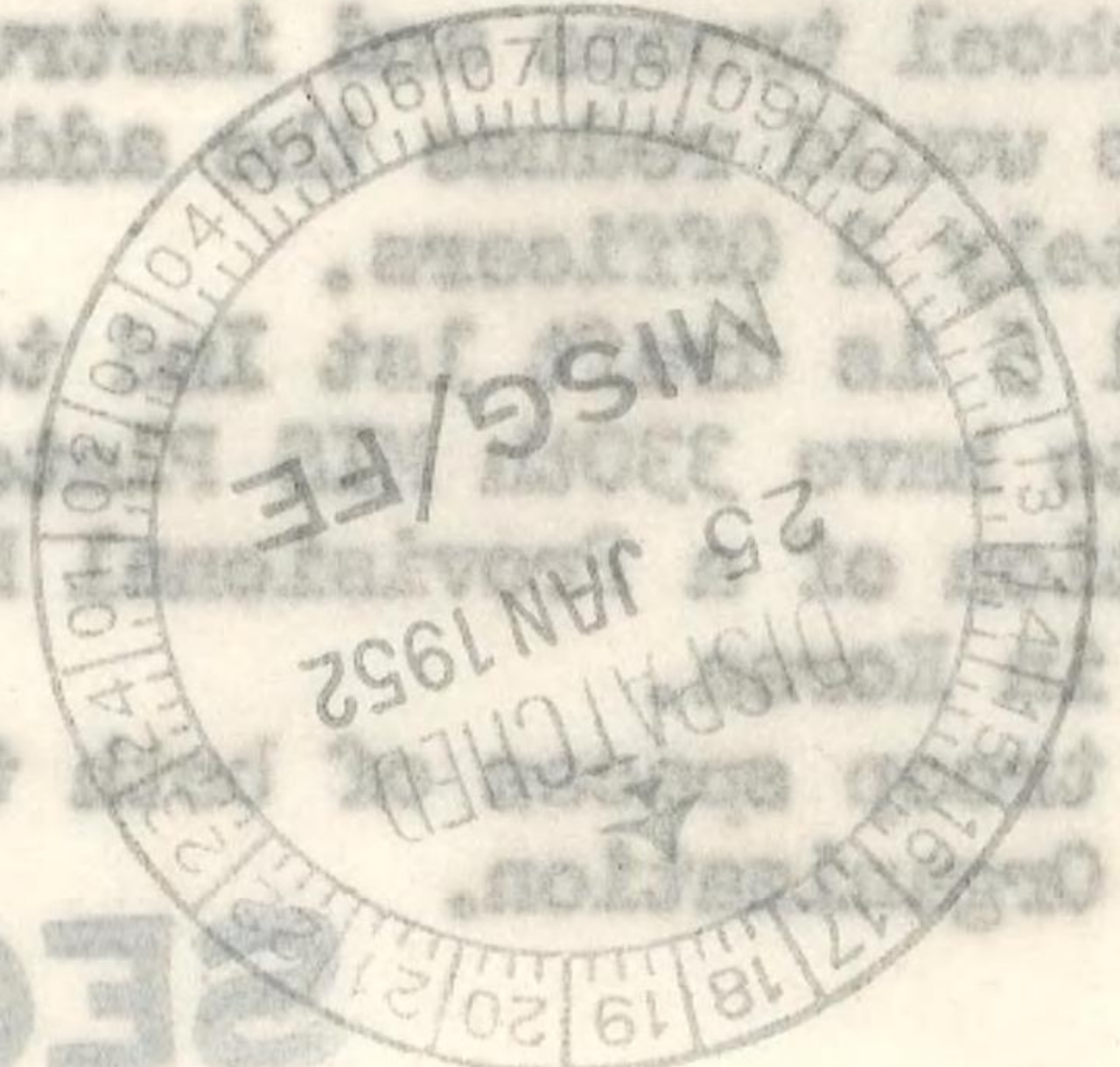

SUBJECT: Request for Military Intelligence Personnel

With reference to your letter of 25 Aug 51, the Commander in Chief, British Commonwealth Forces in Korea, has discussed this matter with the General Officer Commanding, 1st Commonwealth Division and desires me to advise as follows:

1. A Military Intelligence Platoon is not part of a British Division.
2. It is not considered desirable that there should be any division in the Intelligence organization of the United Nations Command which at present provides all requirements in Korea.
3. It is considered that United States of America Intelligence personnel should handle the whole problem, and it would be appreciated if a suitable group, similar to that provided in your own Divisions, could be provided to work with the 1st Commonwealth Division.

1. Subject staff study has been reviewed by this section, and the following comments and recommendations are submitted:

a. Page 1, par 2e - the mission of the non-combatant supervisory organ is to carry out the functions of supervision and inspection and to report results of such supervision and inspection to the MAC, which is charged with insuring that the terms of the Armistice are complied with. Accordingly, recommend this paragraph be reworded to reflect this mission of the supervisory organ, and not infer a duplication of the mission of the MAC.

b. Annex 2, page 1, par 1 - the MAC shall also receive reports from the non-combatant observer teams stationed at mutually agreed upon ports operating in North and South Korea.

c. Annex 3, page 3, par 8 - requests for inspection by non-combatant observer teams should be made through the supervisory organ and not directly.

d. Annex 3, page 3, par 1 of Intelligence Division - recommend that it be reworded substantially as follows "Collates, evaluates, and interprets reports, etc."

e. Annex 3, page 4, par 2 - recommend deletion. Agencies listed should be required to maintain liaison with Intelligence Division.

f. Annex 4, page 3 - recommend consideration be given to the inclusion of liaison officers to accompany roving non-combatant observer teams when they are dispatched to points of violation in South Korea. It may be well that liaison officers also be provided to permanent teams at ports of entry in South Korea.

g. Annex 5, page 2, par 3a - preliminary studies at this headquarters indicate the desirability of limiting rank of senior delegates of supervisory organ to the grade of colonel.

h. Annex 5, page 2, par 3g - UNC has a requirement for 12 fixed teams in North Korea, and it is presumed that the Communists will require an identical number. For planning purposes, recommend that 12 fixed teams be considered.

1. In accordance with a desire expressed by G2 that Division Chiefs present for consideration plans and adjustments (without major reorganization) they consider necessary, or desirable, which would improve G2 operations and organization, the following, with the main objective of converting every space possible (within current personnel authorizations) to the collection and dissemination of intelligence, is submitted:

a. TIS

- (1) The function of carrying on research and production of collated intelligence reports should be the responsibility of T/Intel. Therefore, the personnel in the Strategic and Military Research sub-sections of R & I should be transferred to T/Intel along with the files. This will mean that T/Intel will not only be carrying on research for its own projects but will also prepare reports on items of interest to DA, State Department, Navy, Air Force, etc. That part of R & I (redesignated) remaining in TIS would be left with collating machinery which would compile Interrogation Reports, Korean Operations (Phase III), process CinC letters, and would be restricted to servicing TIS Operations only, keeping track of what TIS does by maintaining the collating machinery which would continue to develop necessary files for ready reference.
- (2) The DA Area and Language School (a DA project) to function directly under G2, or revert to MIS Div (if MIS Div is not dissolved due to PSYWAR becoming a special staff section).
- (3) Hq & Svc Comd to take over operation of TIS (NYK) PX, Snack Bar, Tailor Shop and Barber Shops. Might save some spaces in addition to relieving TIS of operational responsibility.
- (4) The basic function of the Town Plans Sec (previously a subsection of TIS Interrogation Center and now in Geog Br) is to obtain unevaluated (raw) intelligence from the interrogation of orientals. It should be under the control of the specialized experts in that field, and in any event, not placed in a section whose primary function is evaluation. The tendency of interrogation personnel to evaluate, intentionally or otherwise, is always difficult to control and must be continuously guarded against. Therefore, it is recommended that Town Plans revert to TIS control as a subsection of the Interrogation Section. T/Intel-JSPOG to decide priorities as in the past.

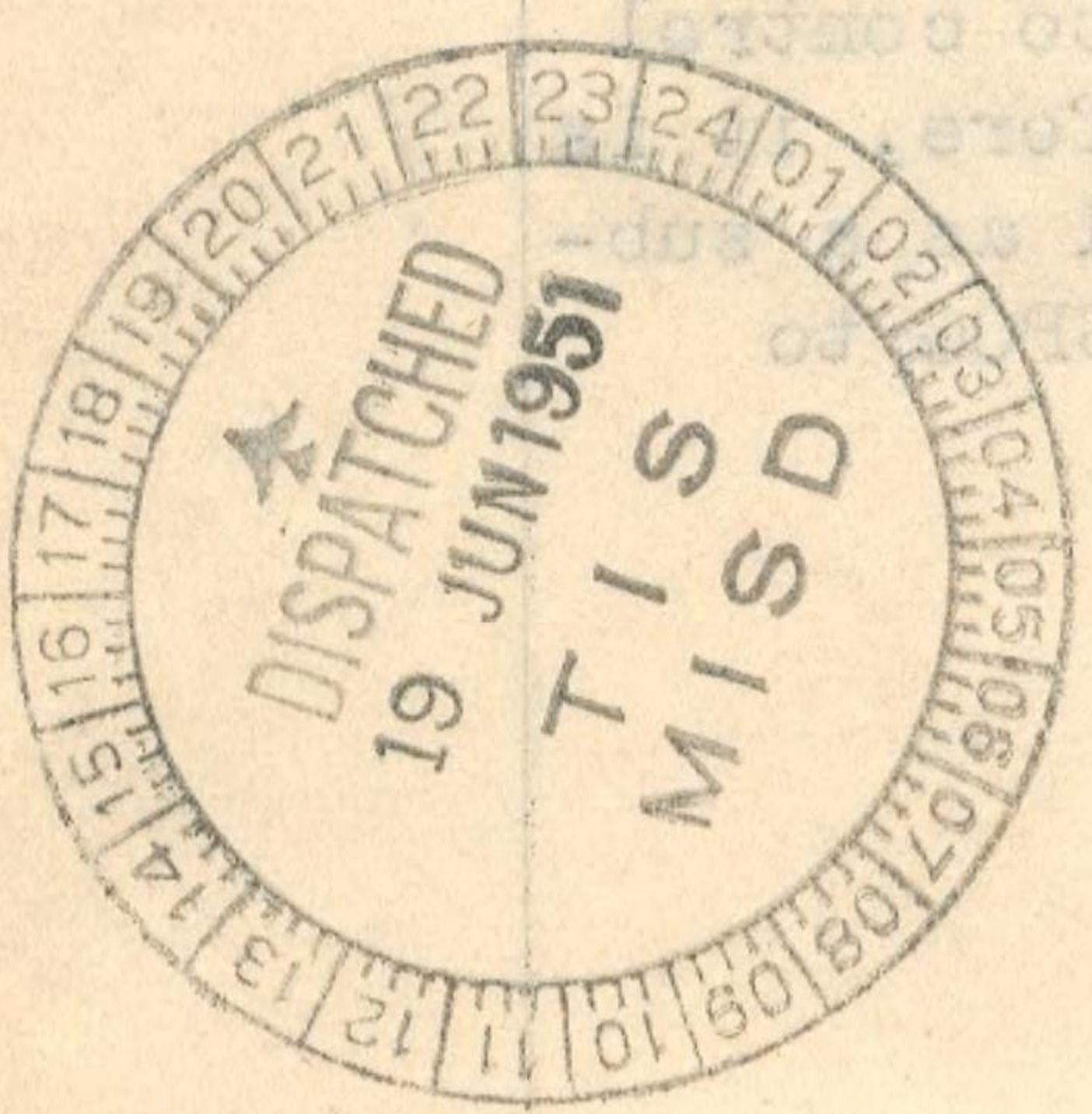

Recommendation will be submitted to inactivate the GHQ (G2) Tech Intel Det (2 officers, 8 EM) and spaces transferred from Hq & Svc Comd to G2 and/or ATIS. If Tokyo Arsenal #2 is to be retained, TIS can assume the responsibility utilizing 8 EM spaces gained by transfer as indicated above, and the two (2) officer spaces ^{can be} utilized for intelligence functions in G2 Tech Intel Coord Br which requires additional personnel to efficiently discharge its responsibilities. It has already been recommended that TIS files of Japanese Repatriate interrogation reports, or microfilms thereof, be shipped to G2, DA, not only for exploitation of unreported items, but also for safekeeping in event of loss by catastrophe or enemy action. The ICF information required by ICM 15 is considered the most important remaining in these files. These files are necessary for G2, DA, as a source for long range strategic reports or evaluations. 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files, until G2, DA, can handle the exploitation of this mass of material. This step will eventually release personnel, now engaged in this reporting, for current strategic interrogations (ADVATIS) which will continue to be sent to G2, DA, thus furnishing in original form current (including ICF) strategic information. Some personnel released from reporting ICF and Jap repat information backlog can be utilized in reducing the translation backlog. Therefore, it is recommended that if and when the Jap Repat interrogation report files, or microfilms thereof, are shipped to G2, DA, that TIS discontinue the so-called monograph interrogation reports but continue ICF reporting until G2, DA, can work down the backlog and catch up with current reporting thru media of raw interrogation reports. In this connection, the undersigned recommended the discontinuance of the TIS monograph type interrogation reports in Dec 1949 and that this info be reported to G2, DA, on OCS Form 17 in the belief that the DIS, other than special request reports, was sufficient for FEC needs. The recommendation to discontinue the monograph type reports was not favorably considered. It was later disclosed that G2, DA, was not set up to handle the volume of OCS Forms 17 that it was estimated could be forwarded monthly with the proposed integration of FEAF (Wringer) personnel into TIS Central Interrogation Center, and that OCS Form 17 was not acceptable to the AF due to its limited reproduction capabilities (ditto) as compared to USAF Form 112 (ozalid method). Therefore, nothing further was attempted to expedite the forwarding of the tremendous backlog of raw intelligence items in R & I files to G2, DA, other than an effort to step up the production of the monograph type reports and Town Plans, and an accomplished, and substantial, increase in ICF reporting by using TID personnel and such TIS personnel as could be diverted toward that effort.

1. a. (1) - Concur in principle. Col White concurs.
(2) - Non-concur. It is a linguist operation to run Detachment "S". CO, TIS is Linguist Control Officer; he is the expert and the operator in the linguistic field.

(3) - Non-concur. The personnel and spaces go with the function. If the PX goes to Headquarters and Service Command, they go with it. They are on the TIS guard roster now. If they go, TIS will have to use linguists on guard.

(4) - Non-concur. The basic function is to evolve Town Plans. That process includes evaluation and synthesis. The Town Plans unit deals in geography and for that reason should remain in Geographic Branch, Theater Intelligence. Town Plans was transferred from TIS over one year ago; this came about after consideration of all factors, and a conference. One of the objections to its belonging to TIS at that time was the circumstance that Town Plans completed in TIS were either the result of raw information, or of information evaluated by TIS personnel whose evaluation Geographic Branch hesitated to accept without having supervisory control of the process. The interrogation personnel, as employed by Geographic Branch, are simply a means to get information; interrogators have no opportunity to perform evaluation.

b. Concur. The transfer of spaces and personnel to the activities responsible for justifying their functions is desirable in the interest of simplicity and economy. A paper has already been submitted by G2 to G3 requesting approval of transfer to JSO (newly requested T/D unit) of those TID personnel now on TDY with CIS/JSOB.

c. Staff study to which reference is made here has already been approved and will be implemented along the lines indicated herein.

d. MISDiv is the operating agency for the NYK Bldg, as well as the G2 agency for supervision of TIS and of Tech Intel. Those functions would seem to suffice to justify its small staff, although with departure of PsyWar from the fold, it is possible to have CO, TIS and Chief, MISDiv one and the same, in a pinch. G2 Historical has passed out of the picture. Recommend Geographic Branch remain in Th/Intel, since it deals in evaluation and synthesis. Recommend that Targets Branch remain in Th/Intel; its function is closer to that branch than to MISDiv; further recommend that DA Area and Language School remain under TIS, as a linguist activity. Rather than dissolve MISDiv, recommend it continue with present functions. While it was practicable to have duties of Chief, MISDiv and CO, TIS performed by a single colonel prior to the Korean War, it would appear undesirable under present circumstances that require frequent visits by CO, TIS to Korea.

2. It appears that the "so-called monograph interrogation reports" are essentially a rehash of many interrogation reports. Such a document is difficult to evaluate, at best. For that reason, recommend their discontinuance. Further, recommend microfilming of interrogation reports and return of films to the DA, to insure their preservation and their fullest exploitation. In this connection, much of the tendency to hoard this information is believed traceable to fear of "scooping" by other agencies. The need for "credit lines" is, in principle, defensible on the ground that the source must be identifiable to prevent duplication that might result in apparent but false confirmation. The "scooping" is reprehensible for other obvious reasons; however, they hardly justify sitting on the information until it is outdated.

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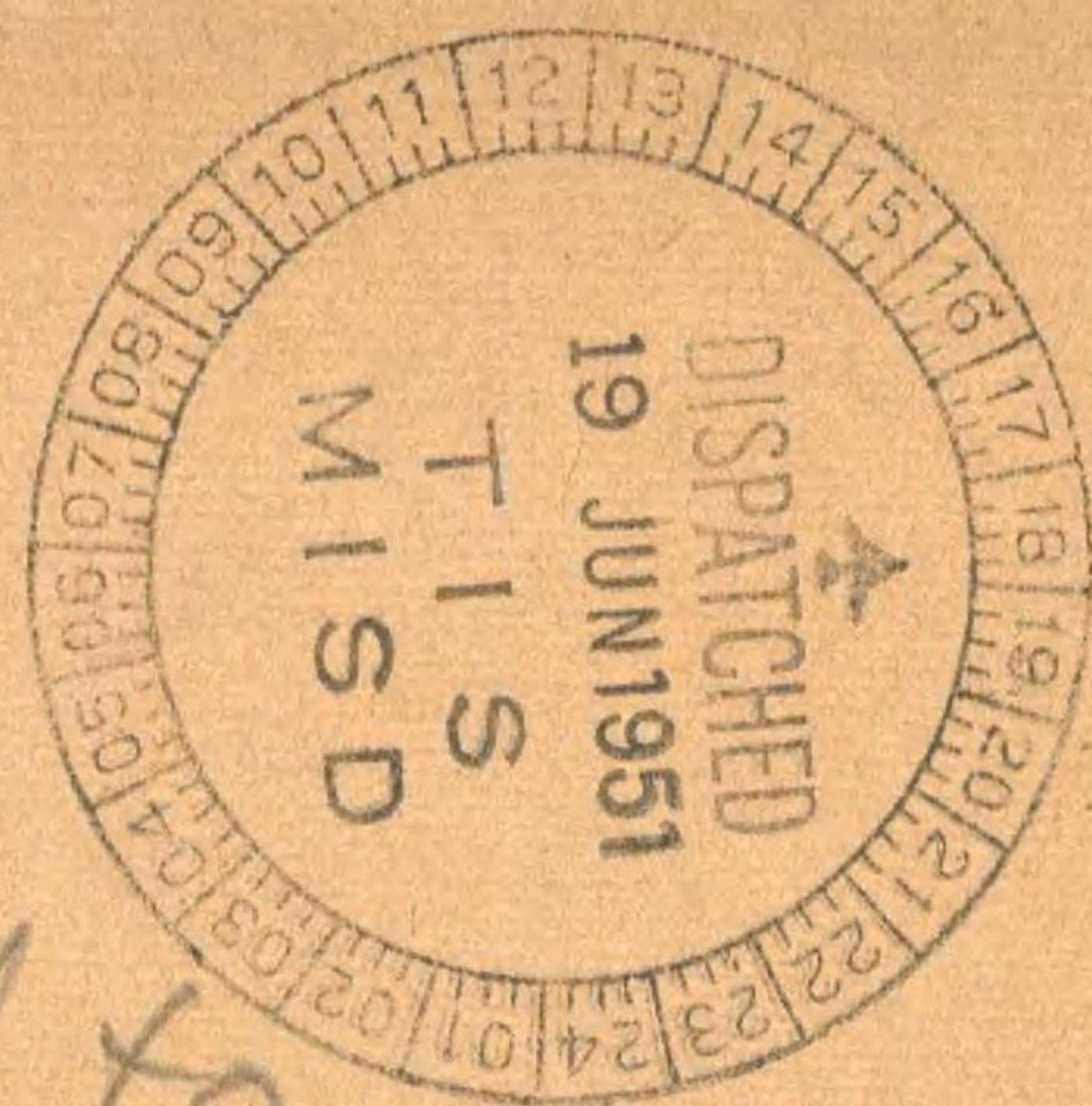

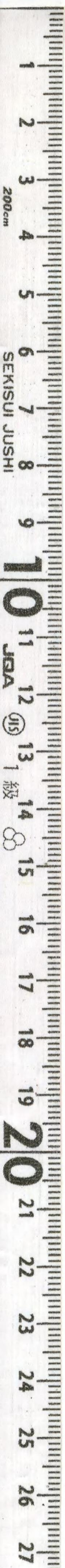

4. Col Smith explained to Mr Matsumoto that due to the recent visit of one of the procurator teams to Fukuoka-shi consisting of Mr Koyama and Mr Takehara and their announced desire to visit Itaguchi Air Force Base and Camp Mower in connection with their survey of JCP activities, the commanders of these two U. S. installations had made inquiry of CIC as to the reason for their visit. As CIC had not been advised of this activity, inquiry was made to Government Section, SCAP, through G2 FEC relative to this matter. Government Section had advised that the visit of the teams sponsored by the Attorney General's office, Japanese Government, was for the purpose of investigating JCP activities re the penetration of U. S. installations, the NRP, and the NPRJ. Mr Matsumoto was advised that this was considered a very fine activity and that CIC desired to cooperate in any way to assist these teams as far as their interest in U. S. installations was concerned. In view of the close cooperation between CIC field units, the NRP and local U. S. installation commanders, Mr Matsumoto was advised that local CIC field unit commanders would be helpful in providing for their contacts with U. S. installation commanders and that these CIC commanders would be alerted to the visits of the Attorney General's survey teams and asked to render any assistance the team desired. It was suggested that each team visit the local CIC commander in company with the local police officials and procurators to discuss informally the JCP situation in the area visited by the team. The CIC commander could arrange for visits to the commanders or the intelligence officer of the U. S. installation to discuss local problems with the JCP and the indigenous employees of the U. S. installation re security.

5. Mr Takeuchi mentioned the distribution of pamphlets and leaflets to U. S. Negro troops in certain localities and inquired if CIC considered these pamphlets sponsored by the U. S. Communist Party. He was advised that this could be possible as the U. S. Communist Party was featuring a world wide propaganda campaign toward U. S. Military forces.

6. Mr Matsumoto was advised that any activity of the JCP was of particular interest to CIC and that through the cooperation of the NRP and the local autonomous police, CIC maintained a very clear and up-to-date picture of JCP activities. Also that local U. S. commanders relied, to a great extent, on the determination of the security clearance by CIC of indigenous employees accepted for employ on U. S. installations.

1. Separate action is being taken to discontinue the 8229th Army Unit (Electronic Countermeasure). This unit is assigned to Headquarters and Service Command, under the operational control of the Signal Officer, GHQ FEC and attached to Eighth Army for administration and logistical support. The unit consists of 4 officers and 57 EM.

2. Information received from the Chief Signal Officer indicates that DA propose to assign an electronic search team consisting of between 32 - 35 officers and EM to the FEC in April 1952.

3. An electronic search team is self-supporting as far as normal operational requirements are concerned. The team is presently organized under a T/D but will be reorganized under T/O&E 11-500, revised. It is capable of supporting the theater tactical intelligence requirements and activities. In addition, it can provide the DA with intelligence information of a strategic nature. Specifically, the intelligence which the team will be capable of obtaining and providing follows:

a. Theatre - Support theatre tactical intelligence requirements by providing information of enemy electronic equipment, effort and operations such as: enemy ground based radar employed in offense and defense, planned bombing radar, proximity fuses, navigational aids, enemy electronic countermeasures equipment and employment.

b. DA - The raw intercept material collected by the team will, after being processed, support DA requirements for information and/or intelligence essential in:

(1) Providing a basis for guidance and determination of requirements for research and development of electronic countermeasures equipment for employment against enemy electronic equipment, aids and devices.

(2) Determining the tactics, techniques and procedures of enemy electronic operations, and the subsequent development of effective electronic countermeasures or counter-countermeasures operations, tactics and techniques against them.

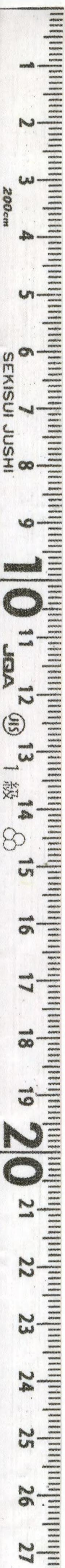

(3) Collation with similar information from other overseas areas on a strategic basis.

4. The Chief Signal Officer has informally concurred in the recommendation that personnel and equipment of the 8229th Army Unit be returned to the Signal Corps Electronic Warfare Center, Fort Monmouth, N.J., as a group shipment. In order to insure sufficient military troop spaces for the electronic search team expected in April of 1952, it is requested that thirty-five (35) troop spaces, not required as a result of discontinuance of the 8229th Army Unit, be reserved for the electronic search team.
