What we learned...

- Psych/Med classes require special attention
 - Now flagged in ADW
- Limit class sizes
- Develop a course checklist
- Wiki Ed staff, not volunteers
- Helaine and Jami will track student work
- Dashboard will improve class tracking







- Instructors who don't ask for help may need it most
- Students are active in brief windows of time
- Timing for feedback matters
- Anticipating problems



- Students don't understand copyright, copyvios and plagiarism. Few people understand close paraphrase.
- MEDRS is and will continue to be a problem because it runs contrary to what students *think* they have learned in class.



- Timing feedback
- Knowing where students are
- Student training is just a foundation
- Use course timelines (ADW), dashboard, copyvio bot
- Keep track of courses, timelines
- Catch problems before they turn into incidents






