MEMORANDUM FOR: General Eberle

Subject: Desirability of Reducing Stockage at Pusan to that Necessary to Support Troops in the Southern Portion of Korea when Practicable.

1. Reference is your pencil memo of 17 Nov (Tab A) which returned P&O Memo of 16 Nov, subject: "Tonnage Scheduled for Korean Ports".
2. P&O Division has continued to review port and LOC operations in Korea from daily reports received from Korea through Trans Section. It has been noted that in the last few days port capacity at CHINNAMPO and rail and highway clearance from CHINNAMPO and SEOUL to PYONGYANG and forward has reached sufficient tonnage to support the Eighth Army offensive on a minimum basis. Also the X Corps has about completed its transfer of port activities from WONSAN to HUNGNAM and is currently getting more than 3500 long tons a day through HUNGNAM which is adequate to support X Corps including supply build-up and support of the F-86 Wing scheduled for its area about 10 Dec 50.
3. The following is present status of ports and LOCs in Korea:
  - a. PUSAN: With a developed capacity of at least 24,000 short tons per day and fine transshipping, rail clearance and storage facilities, it is currently handling an average of about 9,600 short tons per day inbound and a total tonnage of about 12,000 short tons. Of the inbound tonnage about 4,000 per day is forwarded to Seoul by rail and an unknown amount transshipped to forward bases. There has been an average of about 10 ships mostly LSTs loading at PUSAN for both forward bases and return to Japan. Logistic planning factors normally consider that 1/3 of tonnage landed is consumed in base area, 1/3 travels one half the LOC and 1/3 reaches forward areas. From the foregoing, it is indicated that no excessive buildup of stocks is underway in PUSAN. When desired, stocks in PUSAN can be reduced with facility by forwarding by rail or transshipment or removing to Japan for strategic reserves. Recently 1/3 of the Pusan Port operating personnel have been diverted to CHINNAMPO.
  - b. Rail line PUSAN-SEOUL: This is currently operating as a double track line except in five places where it is still singletracked. The line is 280 miles long and is currently delivering about 4,000 short tons a day to Seoul. Consumption by troops between PUSAN and SEOUL is not known.
  - c. INCHON: This port has been operating at an average daily tonnage of about 5,600 short tons per day.

d. Rail line SEOUL to PYONGYANG: The daily tonnage on this line reached 2,200 short tons on 23 Nov. This line is expected to reach 3,000 by 10 Dec or earlier. Maximum capacity of this line as a single track operation will probably be 4,000 short tons/day.

e. CHINNAMPO: Average tonnage discharged through this port on 21, 22, and 23 November was 3,000 short tons per day. Dependent on amount of dredging required of dredge DAVIDSON now enroute and the effect of ice on port operations, CHINNAMPO should reach the planned capacity of 4,000 short tons per day in the near future. Clearance of the port and movement to PYONGYANG has been the bottleneck to date. About 1,700 short tons were cleared by rail on 23 Nov 50. Maximum rail clearance capacity can be developed to 4,000 short tons per day equalling the planned port capacity as soon as additional rail equipment is available in the area.

f. LOC north of PYONGYANG: Clearance north of PYONGYANG is by highway and by 2 single track rail lines to SUNCHON and SINANJU. It is expected that this LOC can be developed to handle 4,000 - 6,000 short tons per day and will constitute the main method of supply as only isolated re-supply by LST is envisioned on the west coast of Korea north of CHINNAMPO.

g. Rail line SEOUL to WONSAN-HAMHUNG: X Corps Trans O reported on 17 Nov that 30 miles of the line from SEOUL to the X Corps area is in the hands of guerrillas and that a tunnel is blown. Rail line is usable for local X Corps distribution between X Corps ports. This line was scheduled to be in operation to KILCHU about 20 Nov.

h. WONSAN: This port has a developed capacity during current operations of about 4,200 short tons per day. Its use as a military port is being discontinued by X Corps. Its capacity remains available for civil affairs and emergency operations.

i. HUNGNAM: X Corps representatives give this port a maximum capacity of up to 15,000 short tons per day after development, clearance and dredging. It handled over 5,000 short tons on 22 Nov. 3,500 short tons per day will more than adequately support X Corps.

j. There are four major ports north of HUNGNAM on the east coast of Korea as follows:

<u>Port</u>	<u>Capacity L/T day</u>	<u>Location</u>
SONGJIN	6,800	40°40'N
CHONGJIN	19,400	41°50'N
NAJIN	25,100	42°10'N
UNGGI	6,500	42°20'N

The rail line in this area is already in operation beyond SONGJIN. No planned use of these ports other than local coastal haul to support ROK units with X Corps is known or currently considered necessary.

4. Basic concept of port and LOC operation in Korea. It has always been considered in P&O planning that the maximum economical use of forward ports in support of Eighth Army would be effected and that this tonnage would be supplemented by rail shipments from PUSAN as required. Further, that major support of X Corps would be primarily by direct shipment from Japan to either WONSAN or HUNGNAM. Discussion with Eighth Army G-4 Plans and the pattern of Eighth Army operations reflect this concept.

5. Tonnage required to support forces in Korea: Total input tonnage to support forces in Korea should be about 10,000 short tons of dry cargo and the same for POL per day. Much of the POL in forward areas is being handled as packaged product through forward ports and is reflected in port tonnages.

6. There is a definite indication at this time that Inchon and CHINNAMPO can support a major portion of the 8th Army and HUNGNAM can support the entire X Corps; however, additional port capacity is needed to supplement the capabilities of the west coast ports in order to completely support the 8th Army. Also the possibility that ice conditions at CHINNAMPO may restrict the use of this port provides further reason for continuing military operation at PUSAN in support of forward areas.

7. When redeployment and roll-up of supplies in Korea is initiated, it will be necessary to depend on PUSAN to augment the northern ports if these operations are to be accomplished expeditiously.

8. It is concluded that:

a. PUSAN should continue as a military operated port because

(1) It is necessary to supplement northern ports in support of 8th Army.

(2) It will be required for expeditious redeployment and roll-up.

(3) Conditions at CHINNAMPO may require its use.

(4) It supports forces south of SEOUL.

b. Eighth Army appears to be making every effort to get maximum tonnage through advance ports.

c. Cargo discharge at PUSAN is commensurate with tonnage forwarded to SEOUL.

d. No action by GHQ in the matter is indicated.

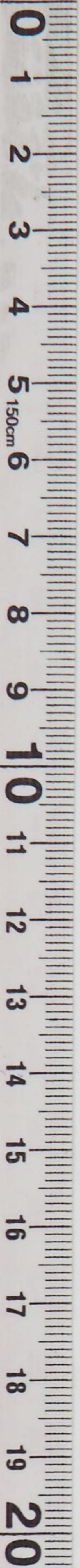

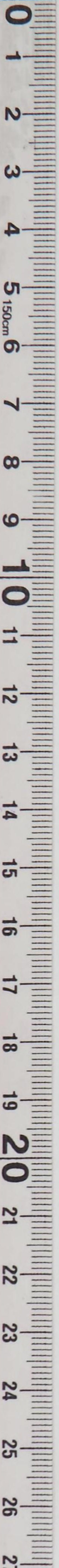

1. 30 ves are scheduled to arrive Pusan during period 13-18 Nov. (63,318 M/T is from Japan and 75,630 M/T from ZI and Britain.)
2. Latest TC-58 report from Pusan for period ending 2400 11 Nov shows approximately 80,728 M/T cargo awaiting discharge.
3. Instant msg is to advise Army Eight that maximum effort must be maintained in discharging cargo at Pusan in order not to delay discharging vessels during 19-25 Nov (approximately 103,324 M/T).
4. During Oct Pusan discharged as high as 23,283 M/T in one day. Therefore, a maximum effort of approximately 20,000 M/T per day must be maintained in order to alleviate any backlog from developing at Pusan.

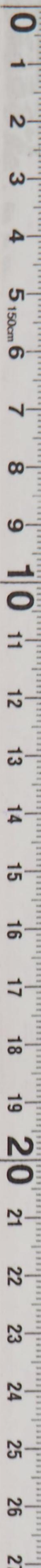

Subject: Tonnage Scheduled for Korean Ports

1. Reference is made to CINCFE msg CX 68979, 14 Nov 50 and G-4 Memorandum, 15 Nov 50, quoted as follows:

"Reference large tonnage scheduled Japan to Pusan as per CX 68979. Please have this looked into with Supply Division and other Sections interested to see if cargo is going into Pusan which probably should be delivered to Inchon, Chinnampo or Hungnam." (Tab A)

2. Trans O (Lt Col Hunt) discusses the problem of port congestion and ship diversion by telephone daily with Eighth Army and JLCOM Trans O. Likewise, JLCOM Trans O frequently discusses this problem with Eighth Army Trans O. Using this system of daily coordination, ships are diverted in accordance with CG Eighth Army's desires and the ability of the port to accept cargo.

3. The message (Tab A) prepared by Trans O was for the purpose of giving advance warning of impending ship arrivals which would necessitate maximum effort at Pusan. With this advance warning Eighth Army is now in a position to plan diversions if they so desire. This Hq is not in a position to determine whether ships loaded with supplies destined Korea should be diverted without first consulting CG Army Eight.

4. Submitted as Tab B is a list of vessels scheduled to arrive Pusan showing ETA, type of cargo and measurement tons involved. It will be noted that a major portion of cargo arriving between 13 - 18 Nov consists of drummed POL, vehicles, general resupply and a portion of the British 29th Brigade. These supplies will be offloaded at Pusan or diverted in accordance with CG Army Eight's desires. It is further noted that the major portion of cargo arriving between 19 - 25 Nov consists of normal resupply, subsistence, and the remainder of the British 29th Brigade. These will also be shipped to Pusan or diverted to other Korean ports as requested by Eighth Army.

5. JLCOM msg EX 32059 PSU, 14 Nov 50, (Tab C), is one example of method being used to assure vessels will arrive at desired port. The vessels listed in this message are a portion of those scheduled to arrive between 19 - 25 Nov.

6. The normal capacity of Pusan Port varies from 20,000 to 25,000 M/T daily depending on the type of cargo handled. When drummed POL and vehicles comprise a major portion of the cargo handled, the port capacity in M/T is increased proportionately. It is therefore anticipated that no undue port congestion should result at Pusan provided maximum discharge effort is maintained. Diversion of ships will be accomplished in accordance with wishes of CG Army Eight.

4 1. Events of the past few days have convinced me still stronger that the original request is sound and is necessary. These further arguments are presented in par 2 and for these reasons this request is resubmitted for consideration. Should G4 still be unable to concur, then an alternate plan presented in par 3 is submitted.

2. a. A recent visit by one of the division Quartermasters to this office revealed the fact that little or no knowledge existed in units as to reasons for supply failures. The fact that harbors were heavily mined, air freight curtailed, rail traffic practically stopped and highway transportation reduced to oxcart capacity had not impressed itself forward. Such thinking resulted only in demoralization, which could have been easily changed to whole-hearted tolerance had proper liaison existed to convey knowledge of actual conditions.

b. Excessive delays in unloading ships have created further unbalanced stocks--some Thanksgiving supplies shipped on or about 8 November are still aboard ship and it therefore became necessary to air lift duplicate shipments. By liaison knowledge of ship loadings, this could have been prevented. I grant that knowledge should have been available and transmitted; but the fact remains, something failed, and until such time as routine procedures are employed, the liaison system is required.

c. The X Corps is very isolated, with insufficient QM personnel to make frequent personal trips, especially to the rear. The Eighth Army has great difficulty in determining X Corps requirements, with the result a very strained supply situation between supplier and consumer exists. They need better supply liaison.

d. Personal expressions by several key QM officers in the net involved in this plan enthusiastically endorsed it.

e. It was not the intention that the liaison officers report directly and only to QM, GHQ. It was intended to give each headquarters officers well versed in the entire quartermaster supply situation, who would be working for the Quartermaster of the echelon to whom he is attached. Attempting to increase the allotment of each Division, Corps, Army and Logistical Command to establish this group is impractical. The allotment could be simply set up here and the individuals attached for this purpose. This system will, however, permit direct quick reporting to this headquarters where and when essential.

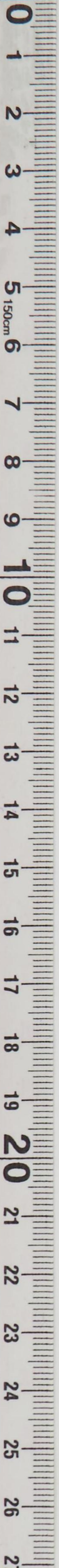
f. The application and need for this system is not so strongly indicated in other tech services as is apparent in the QM Corps, as a comparison of commodities furnished by each conclusively shows that personal articles are in preponderance in the QM Corps, and recent events show they need more attention than they are receiving.

g. With over 300 press correspondents in Korea closely watching this situation, additional factual knowledge is essential to prevent false rumors and reporting.

3. An alternate plan would be the creation of three - three-officer teams to periodically visit all echelons, all groups to work through Eighth Army and its Log Commands, but one going to American Divisions in Eighth Army, one to Divisions in X Corps and one to UN units, POW enclosures and ROKA and KMAG. One officer would head up these liaison teams in the QM Section, GHQ. This would require an increased strength allocation of 10 officers.

4. It is recommended and requested that the original plan be reconsidered and approved. If this is not favorably considered, it is then requested that the plan indicated in par 3 be approved.
