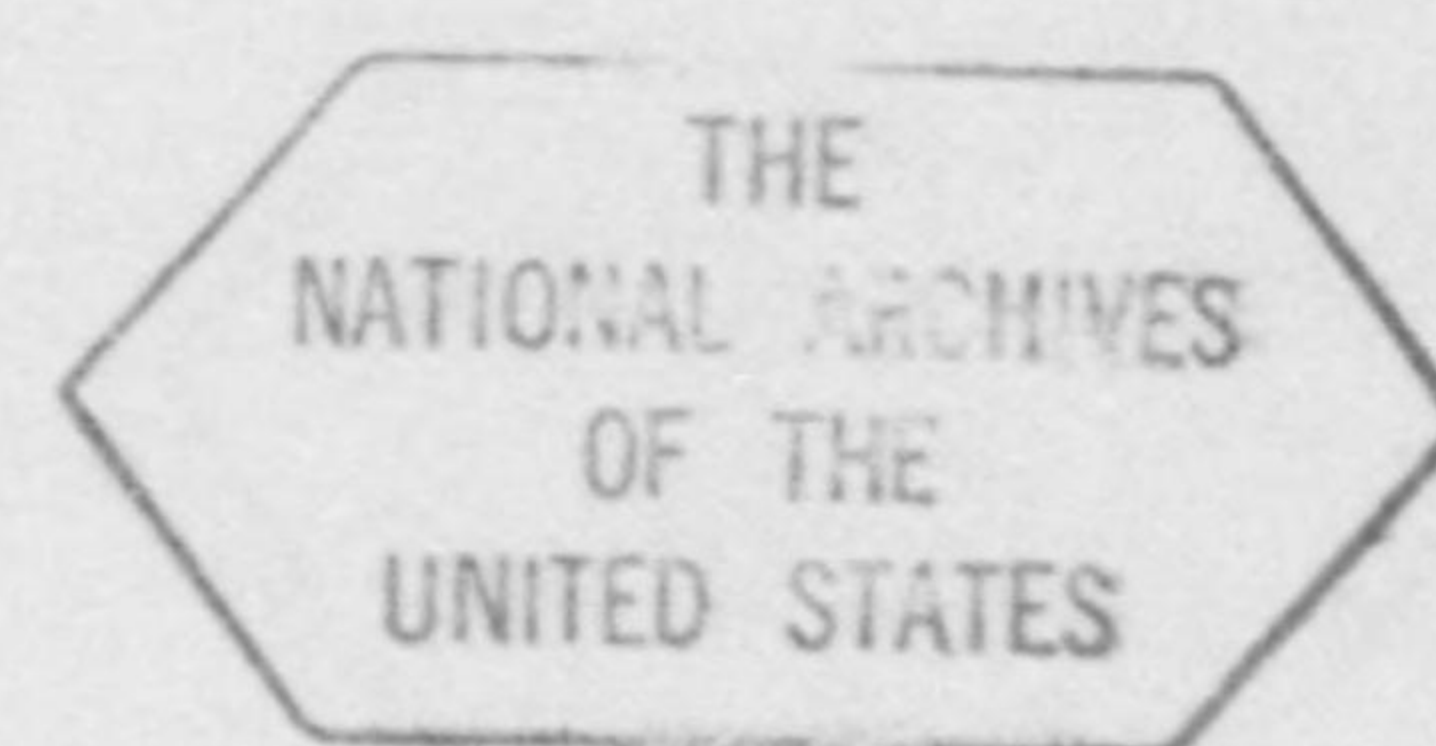

was informed that this equipment, through seized at Hanoi, was at the time of seizure crated and addressed to Chungking, China.

5. In enclosure # 2 (page 2) to letter reference 1.b. this Headquarters reported that 5 items (37-23(a)-8AN, 9AN, 10AN, 11AN, and 14AN) were forwarded to the Yokohama Engineering Depot for authorized use of Occupation Forces. It has been discovered that these equipment were not shipped, and remain under custody at the Arsenal. On the same list item 37-23(a)-504 should have been listed as 37-23(a)-504AN. This motor was not shipped and now carries a CPC number (CPC 5333). A new motor was purchased by the Financial Bureau and sent to the Yokohama Engineering Depot in lieu of the inventoried motor.

6. Corrected cover sheets on inventory 37-23(a) necessitated by the removal of the 43 looted items from inventory are forwarded herewith. These inventory sheets have been removed from the Governor's copy of this inventory.
