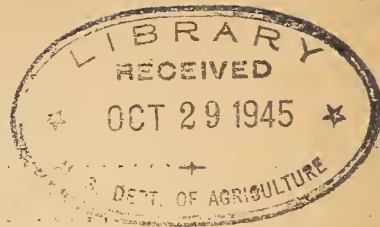

Value of "all wheat" differs slightly from sum of wheat by kinds due to rounding of "all wheat" price.
