Champs Elysees, reddish purple.

Comus, clear cherry-red, overspread bright scarlet; sturdy growth; medium height.

Crimson Glow. New. The large, broad heads display flowers of deep glowing crimson. \$1.50

Dorothy, uniform shade of clear pink.

Europa, white, with red center; tall.
