My dear Sir

I have de-  
layed answering your letter  
until I could see my way  
a little more clearly than  
I have hitherto. I was to  
have met Mr. Fairbanks  
at the Copper Mine in  
Aornich last Wednes-  
day, in that case I should  
have been with you last  
Sabbath. But the conve-  
nience of some gentlemen  
made it necessary to post-  
pone that meeting until the  
31<sup>st</sup>. I would be with you  
the last of the week but  
I should be obliged to be at  
home on Monday, and the

time enough with you  
people. Now the arrange-  
ments will turn very  
much upon the facts  
that develop themselves  
at Norwich. If it is ne-  
cessary for us to have a meet-  
ing of our Corporation on  
Tuesday next, I do not see  
that I can be with you  
this week. We wish to  
do up Addison County  
before we spread abroad  
much. We are making

from again soon. If I do
