SUBJECT: Interim Report

TO : Commanding Officer

1. This letter is of an informational character, rather than a formal report. We shall institute a regular system of reports, as soon as we get our feet on the ground. I have a Monthly Activities Report planned, which we shall forward to you later on for your approval. However, if we are to make complete reports, it will be necessary to have one administrative officer, who can be used for assembling the mass of data now being reported into a concise report for your headquarters.

2. We are at present operating under many difficulties, as you know. However in spite of these difficulties, some headway is being made.

3. The Civil Assistance team composed of four officers, and two civilians arrived Pyongyang 29 October 1950. A civil affairs staff from the 2nd Infantry Division had just arrived ahead of this team, and taken over from the 1st Cavalry Division, who in turn had taken over from I Corps. Four days, after our arrival the 187th airborne BCT took over, and they are now working with us.

4. This constant turn over is not conducive to good civil affairs management. Also, each Commanding Officer arriving, assumes area responsibility, which includes civil affairs, and in each case has a civil affairs section which has ideas of their own. Both General Bowen of the 187th and Colonel Sloan of the 9th Infantry Regiment have give us full cooperation, but the blending of the tactical civil affairs sections and our own has not been all that it should have been. The unit civil affairs officer assumes the responsibility for his Commanding Officer and passes such information on to us as he desires. The sooner a permanent team of sufficient size is set up in this province, the sooner our work will be established on a permanent basis.

5. There is also the question of divided command. In this immediate area, there is 187th BCT, also in the province there is I Corps, IX Corps and 2nd Infantry Division, each with area responsibility and each with a civil affairs section. Actually it is working out alright with I Corps and 2nd Division sending us such information as they pick up.

6. In addition to very bad conditions in the area, one of the most serious problems confronting is that of the NK Army personnel in this area.

7. There are a few units actually located in the city, some of which should not be here, such as the ROK Airforce (without planes), and representation of the ROK Navy. However, even with those units the total number of ROK's should not exceed three hundred-fifty (350) officers and men. Actually, it is estimated that there are five thousand (5,000) ROK Army personnel in this city, scrounging food and supplies, individual soldiers holding houses for their commanding officers, and numerous stragglers and deserters. We have talked to the ROK CIC, and to the local ROK commanders. Also General Bowen and Colonel Collier have taken steps to assist us, but to no avail. There has been a slight improvement in the last day or two, but the more serious aspects have not improved. For example we will list a few as follows:

a. The ROK's claim to have civil affairs in this area, although we cannot locate them. They post proclamations, and orders to the general populace.

b. They come in with large numbers of trucks, and take anything they want in the form of rice and other food, machinery, clothing, and medicines. They seize trucks and buildings.

c. In the village of Chungwa, ROK soldiers took a truck which was being used by the village. The driver showed them a permit signed by a civil affairs officer. They tore it up, took the truck, and then went to the mayor, and demanded rice, which he gave them. They then threatened the mayor with death, if he disclosed his hidden rice to the Americans.

d. A representative of the Chinese Embassy from Seoul, who was with us for a few days reported, that the ROK's are giving the Chinese farmers a hard time by seizing their products. About two thousand (2,000) Chinese in this area are truck farmers, and all their farms are being raided daily by the ROK. In the city numerous Chinese own restaurants, and although not open, the soldiers force their way into the establishment, and demand food and then refuse to pay.

e. Two (2) rice mills were discovered in operation, both run by enlisted men from the 8th Regiment, 7th ROK Division with large stores of rice on hand.

f. Numerous private houses have been seized by ROK Army officers, who have placed enlisted men in them to hold them, while the officers are with their various units in the field.

g. These are only a few of the many incidents we are up against daily, and I believe, that only pressure from the top level will help remove these problems.

8. We have a city government, which is functioning, and we shall have a fairly complete provincial government started by tomorrow. We have had a temporary governor, since last Sunday, and we have been working on the plans for various ministries or departments.

9. Our police department is functioning, and we have an intensive police school in operation. However, we could use some able South Korean police for officers.

10. Our financial condition is precarious, and might collapse real soon, if it is not bolstered. We are the central supply agency for all this area, and are handing out money to all units requiring it, but are pretty tight, and the units do not like it. We must pay our city employees and police; none of whom have been paid as yet. This problem is probably the worst one facing us in the near future. We are certain, that numerous army units in the north have good North Korean won, which they have seized. Something should be done about getting them to release it to us for proper disbursement. Two days ago a truck drove through the city with soldiers scattering money along the streets.

11. A working agreement has been reached with C-4 TUSAK to get trucks, which we are now using to haul foodstuffs into the warehouse. We are three weeks late, however, and the ROK's and many civilians have large stocks hidden.

12. The public utilities are in bad shape. When we arrived, there was no water, no lighting or power of any kind, nor any transportation. At present we do have water, and some lighting in the eastern part of Pyongyang across the river, and also are pumping some river water in the water mains in the main part of the city. All this takes money, and we are running out of it.

13. One (1) coal mine is operating, but only furnishing sufficient coal to operate the power plant. Other coal mines can be put to work immediately. However we must have more personnel to supervise this, and must get rid of the interference from ROK troops. At another mine the ROK's have taken all of the food, and the miners are in a starving condition.

14. Rehabilitation of factories are impossible at this time. Everything has been either systematically sabotaged by (the Reds, or looted by others. Some buildings are now in the process of rehabilitation under our supervision.

15. There is a report, that thirty (30) tons of gold, and silver crude ore has been located at the refinery at Chinnampo.

16. Generally, things have been in chaotic condition, but slowly we are beginning to see slight changes for the better.

17. We have received at least ten requests to open newspapers in this city. We have explained, that we are not limiting them, but are wondering how they can make any money, since their circulation will be small, and no advertising. I believe, that we have discouraged some. Have you any policy regulating newspapers other than Par 14 of Annex I?

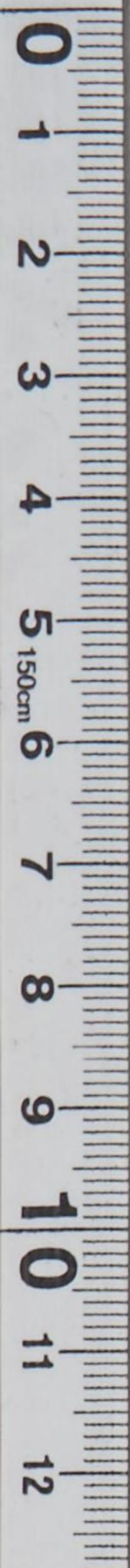
18. These comments could go on endlessly, and no doubt I have overlooked some important items. However this is a small picture as conditions are today.

19. Just adding one more fact, just received. The mayor of Mirim-Ni, located seven miles from this city, just reported, that the ROK Airforce had visited him, and demanded that the first one thousand (1,000) bags of rice harvested would be delivered to them. We are issuing orders to the mayor to refuse delivery. We shall probably have to look for a new mayor shortly.

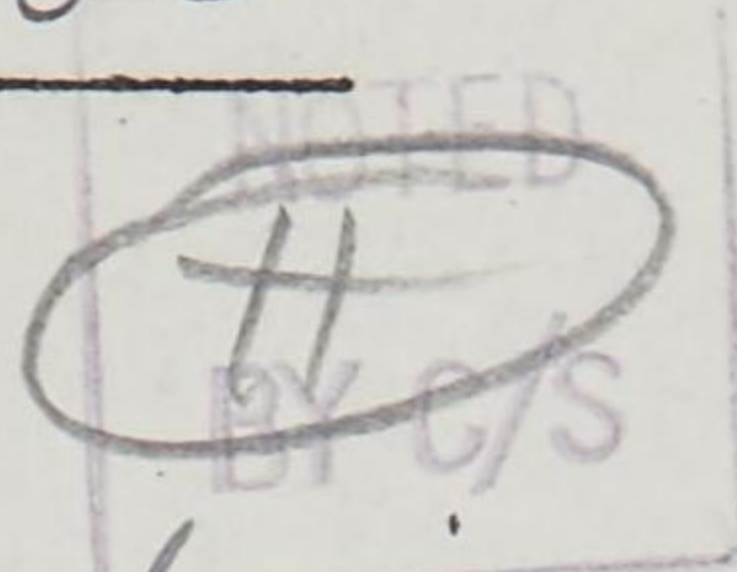

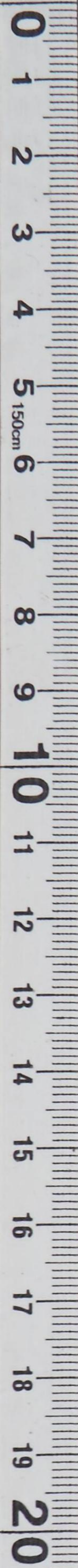

1. CINCFE msg CX 64606, 27 Sep 50 required addressees to report certain information ref airlift for the Korean Opn. FEAF msgfm 228139, 28 Sep 50 indicated that since report requested had not been assigned a reports control symbol, it was a violation of reports control regulations and therefor reports requested were being held in abeyance. Above referenced FEAF msgfm was forwarded to G-4 by Compt C/N 1, 30 Sep 50. (JN 13853)

2. A complete resume of G-4's opinion on this subj was submitted to the CofS by C/N 1, 3 Oct 50 (JN 13988) with the recommendation that the Compt take whatever action necessary to secure waiver of reports control symbol from DA on those reports connected with combat operations.

3. By memo dtd 3 Oct 50 the CofS forwarded G-4's C/N to AG and JA in turn with request for comments. The AG concurred with G-4 in his opinion that provisions of AR 305-15 do not pertain to reports incident to combat operations. JA was of the opinion that report was not exempt from reports control regulations.

4. G-2 by C/N 2 to CofS, 7 Oct 50 concurred with G-4 in that the provisions of AR 305-15 were intended for normal peace time administrative reports.

5. The DCofS FEC instructed the Compt by memo, 7 Oct 50 thru G-4 to take necessary steps to recommend the exemption of combat operations reports and those reports in support thereof from the provisions of AR 305-15. The DCofS also approved a proposed msgfm to FEAF instructing compliance with request for report in CINCFE msg referenced para 1 above, which was dispatched 8 Oct 50. (JN 14335)

6. Compt C/N 1 to DCofS FEC thru G-4, 6 Nov 50 forwards: a. A copy of GHQ ltr AG 319.1 (20 Oct 50) which recommended combat reports and feeder reports thereto be included in list of exemptions in AR 305-15. b. A copy of DA msg WCL 23787, 3 Nov 50 which states that reports required by DA directives referred to in Compt ltr of 20 Oct are fully subject to reports control and that cited directives have been rescinded. DA msg also advises that interpretation of reports prescribed by FM 101-5 will be transmitted by mail. This C/N also states that Compt is suspending action on FEAF's reiteration of their request for reports control symbol which is contained in FEAF msgfm 228139, 14 Oct 50, pending receipt of the DA interpretation, and will further advise DCofS FEC upon receipt of this interpretation.

7. Recommend G-4 indicate concurrence by initialing C/N 1 and forwarding to DCofS FEC.

1. Prior to the Korean conflict, determination of requirements for petroleum products within the Far East Command was based on past monthly consumption rates; however, in the interest of more accurate planning by placing the initial responsibility for forecasting requirements on the agencies concerned with the need for petroleum products and of assuring that the departmental authorities receive an opportunity to review forecasted requirements, to insure that theater plans are in consonance with departmental plans, it is desired to establish for planning purposes the following reporting procedure on current and long-range requirements for petroleum products in the Far East Command.

2. The Commander, Naval Forces, Far East, will be responsible for determining and reporting to the Area Petroleum Officer, Far East Command, in accordance with paragraphs 6 through 8, the total petroleum requirements of the United Nations Naval Forces (including Marine Corps, Coast Guard, and Naval air components) operating within the Far East Command.

3. The Commanding General, Far East Air Forces, will be responsible for determining and reporting to the Area Petroleum Officer, Far East Command, in accordance with paragraphs 6 through 8, the petroleum requirements of the United Nations Air Forces (exclusive of Naval air units) including the requirements of the Military Air Transport Service and commercial carriers.

4. The Deputy Commander, Military Sea Transportation Service, Western Pacific, will be responsible for determining and reporting to the Area Petroleum Officer, Far East Command, in accordance with paragraphs 6 through 8 the petroleum requirements of all agencies utilized by the Military Sea Transportation Service in carrying out its assigned mission.

2. General:

a. In accordance with the instructions contained in reference 1 b(2) above, the Commander-in-Chief, United Nations Command is responsible for the provision of minimum necessary civilian type supplies and equipment to Korea to prevent disease and unrest and to further military

operations in Korea.

b. The instructions contained in this letter constitute the basic directive for the implementation of the responsibilities assigned the Commander-in-Chief, United Nations Command, stated in 2a above.

c. Specifically, General Headquarters, United Nations Command is responsible for providing:

- (1) Direct civilian relief assistance, in the form of food, clothing, fuel, shelter, and medical supplies to prevent disease, starvation and unrest among the civilian populace in Korea.
- (2) The minimum necessary civilian type supplies and equipment for construction or reconstruction essential to the military operations of the United Nations Command, including such facilities as public utilities, transport and industry, so long as these facilities are controlled or utilized primarily by the United Nations Command.
- (3) Civilian type supplies and equipment required by the Republic of Korea Army.

d. KORCIV 39, reference 1 b(2) above, charges the Economic Cooperation Administration with the responsibility for provision of supplies and equipment and advisory aid for long range rehabilitation, economic stabilization, and assistance to United Nations Command within limits

of funds available. In general ECA may not procure goods and supplies for direct civilian relief by way of food, clothing, and medical supplies, however supplies and equipment for the production of relief supplies and to repair and rebuild facilities for the production of relief supplies are suitable ECA procurement.

3. Responsibilities of Major Subordinate Commands:

a. Commanding General, Eighth Army will:

- (1) Determine total requirements separately for North and South Korea to fulfill responsibilities under paragraph 2 a for balance of fiscal year 1951. The program submitted to General Headquarters will include:
  - (a) Quantity of each item
  - (b) Estimated cost
  - (c) Desired phasing by month for balance of FY 1951
  - (d) Category of use (paragraph 2c above)
  - (e) Justification and basis
  - (f) A statement that the items included are not available from existing stocks in Korea and are beyond the Korean economy's capacity to produce for its own welfare.
- (2) Review the above program at least monthly and oftener if necessary to insure that it reflects modifications imposed by changing conditions, and give immediate

notification of such changes to this headquarters.

- (3) Maintain necessary liaison with the Republic of Korea Government, the State Department as represented by the Ambassador to Korea, other agencies of the United Nations established in Korea, and Economic Cooperation Administration in Korea in order to coordinate requirements and insure the most adequate and effective means for receipt, distribution, and use of supplies and equipment.
- (4) Call forward required supplies and equipment within approved program from Japan Logistical Command, giving quantities, port of destination and consignee.
- (5) Arrange with the Republic of Korea Government and with indigenous sources in North Korea to make available sufficient storage capacity for these supplies and equipment.
- (6) Insure that the Republic of Korea Government and indigenous sources in North Korea provide maximum self-help. Maximum use should be made of indigenous labor, purchasing, contracting, and disbursing facilities, incident to handling and distribution of these supplies and equipment.

- (7) Maintain necessary records of receipt and utilization of supplies and equipment, indicating donations from United Nations separately.

b. Japan Logistical Command will:

- (1) Obtain supplies and equipment to be furnished from the FEC area to include local procurement and directed shipments within the Command based on requirements approved by General Headquarters, UNC.
- (2) Move supplies to Korea on call from Commanding General, Eighth Army.
- (3) Call forward from the Zone of Interior supplies and equipment requested by Commanding General, Eighth Army, within approved programs for direct shipment to Korean ports.
- (4) Maintain complete records of the status of procurement and delivery of supplies and equipment to Korea.

4. Requirements:

a. Requirements for this program within the limits of responsibility charged to Commander-in-Chief, United Nations Command will be submitted to General Headquarters, United Nations Command for appropriate action, indicating requirements for North and South Korea separately.

b. After screening of requirements by General Headquarters,

the portion which is beyond the capabilities of this command to supply will be furnished to the Department of the Army for supply action. Information of the requirements furnished to Department of the Army will be provided to the interested agencies of the United Nations Command.

c. When production facilities in Korea are available, the necessary raw materials or supplies should be submitted as a requirement for the production of required end products. When raw materials are included as a requirement sufficient time must be available in order that the end item may be utilized for the stated purpose. This will reduce the required dollar outlay for relief, and will assist in stabilization of the Korean economy.

d. Prior to submission of requirements, the Commanding General, Eighth Army, will coordinate with the Economic Cooperation Administration in Korea to determine eligibility for Economic Cooperation Administration funding. Percent of ECA participation will be determined in each case. General Headquarters will be informed of such agreement by item. Differences which cannot be resolved will be referred to this headquarters.

e. Emergency requirements or revisions of previously projected requirements should indicate the applicable purpose category and justification therefor.

f. Amendments or revisions to the program, made necessary due to changing conditions as reported by Commanding General, Eighth Army, and UN contributions, will be forwarded to interested agencies of UNC
