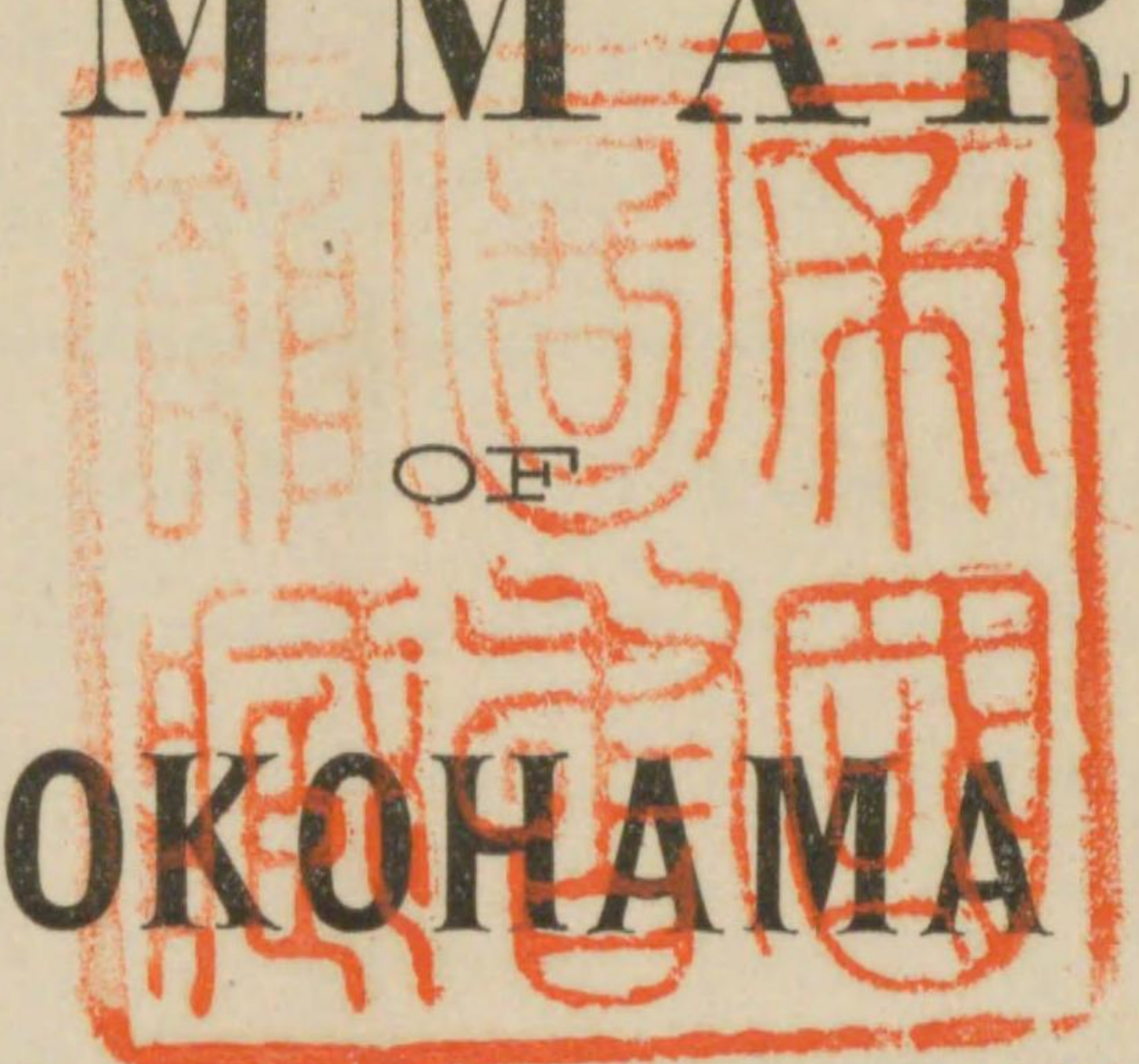

## PREFACE.

This summary comprises extracts from "The Annual Statistics of the City of Yokohama for 1908", which was published in the Japanese language in December 1909. The principal object of this compilation is to show the present state of Yokohama in a foreign language and tabular form. For the sake of brevity some statistics arranged in two or more tables in the Japanese original are shown here in one table, while others which seem to be of less interest to foreigners are altogether omitted. For the same reason, figures per month or by ward in some tables are omitted and the total numbers or yearly sums only are given. Those who desire to learn more precise figures or detailed classifications than those shown in this summary are requested to refer to the Japanese original.

The first publication of "The Summary of the Yokohama City Annual Statistics" in English was in September 1903, the second publication of the same was in September 1905, and the third in May 1908.

For the compilation of this volume the following tables were newly adopted, viz.

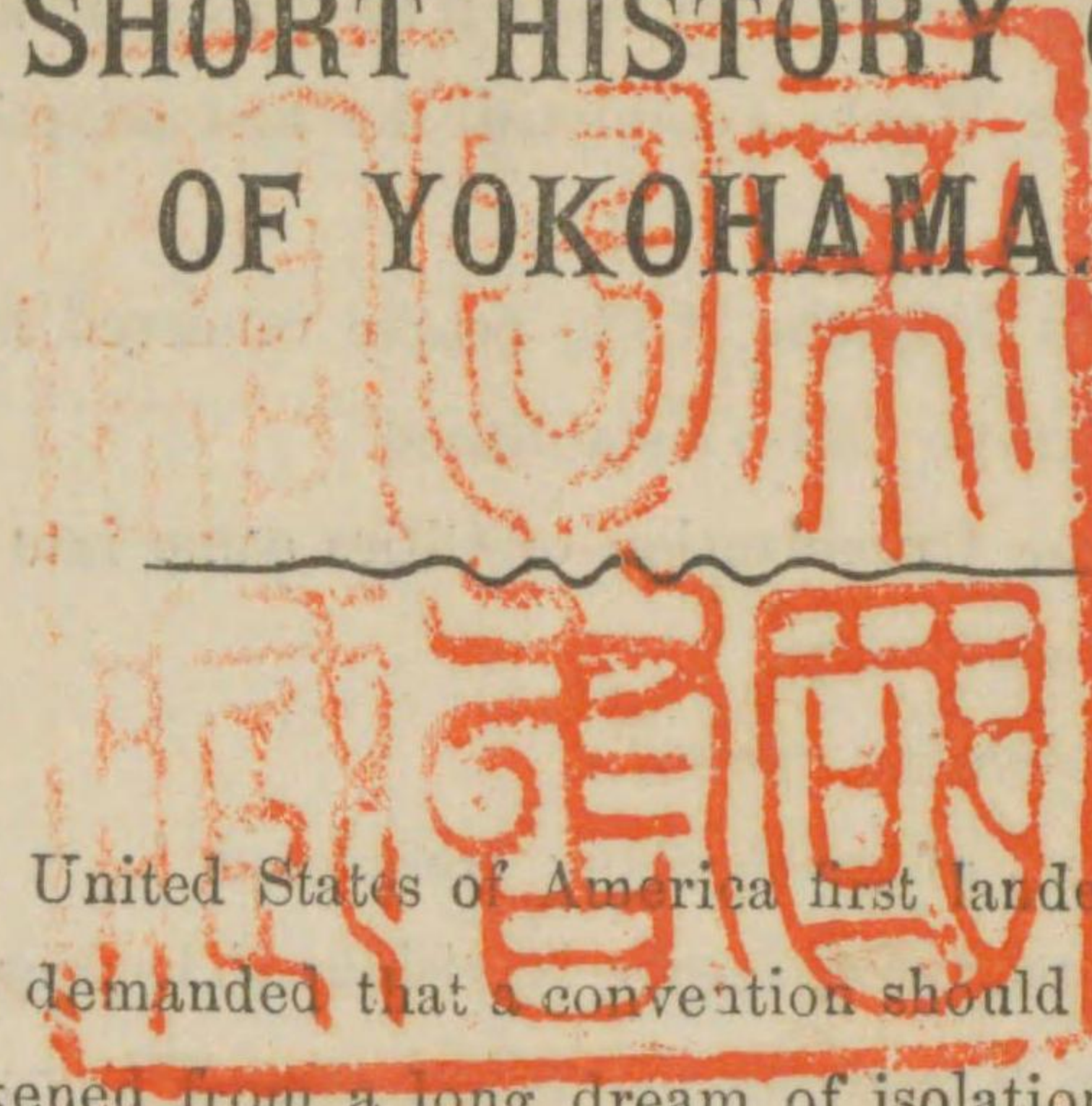

PART I. A SHORT HISTORY OF THE CITY  
OF YOKOHAMA



Since Commodore Perry of the United States of America first landed in Japan, at Uraga, under orders of the President of the Republic, and demanded that a convention should be concluded to regulate navigation and commerce, the Japanese have awakened from a long dream of isolation and opened their long-closed doors to foreign intercourse. Thenceforward the City of Yokohama has rapidly developed into the most prominent port of Japan and has at the present day a population of 407,432 and an area of 1,608 square *Ri*.

When we look backwards some half a century and note that the City at that time was simply a deserted village having only eighty-seven dwellings, the denizens of which supported themselves by fishing or farming, we cannot help expressing a feeling of gratified surprise at the rapidity of its progress.

By the Treaties of 1854 and 1855, concluded between America and Japan, Yokohama and four other ports of Japan were opened to foreign trade and commerce, although the actual date of the opening of Kanagawa was the 1st July, 1859. Yokohama was officially declared by the Shogunate Government to be a part of Kanagawa and set aside a portion for foreigners as a place of residence and business. There were several reasons for this step, the most important of which was that the Government desired to keep foreigners in Yokohama separated from the Japanese, which was necessary in order to maintain peace and order at that time. This part of the City remains now as the Former Foreign Settlement.

The following are the dates and events connected with the opening and history of Yokohama:—

- 1859, July, —. Yokohama Port opened.
- ” ” —. First Noge Bridge built.
- 1860, April, —. Sales of raw silk first effected between Japanese and foreigners.
- 1863, March, —. Arrival of a British squadron consisting of seven men-of-war at the port caused excitement among the people.
- 1864, January, —. East pier opened to traffic.
- 1868, March, —. Restoration of the Imperial Government.
- 1870, November, —. First Iron bridge built.
- ” ” —. Japanese Newspaper founded.
- ” December, —. Telegraph Office established.
- ” ” —. Jinrikisha invented and brought into use.
- 1871, July, —. Post Office opened.
- ” October, —. Gas Office established.
- 1872, September, —. Opening of the Railway between Tokyo and Yokohama, the first line in Japan.
- 1874, —. —. Kuboyama Cemetery established.
- 1875, February, —. Branch of the Nippon Yusen-Kwaisha established.
- 1878, November, —. Yokohama Ward Office (present City Office) opened.
- 1880, February, —. The Yokohama Specie Bank opened its business.
- 1882, March, —. Commercial School established.
- 1882, March, —. The Yokohama Chamber of Commerce established.

PART III. LAND AND POPULATION.

INCORPORATED LIMITS AND AREA OF THE CITY OF YOKOHAMA.

The city of Yokohama is situated on the south-eastern coast of Japan, being one of the most prominent and oldest open ports, about 18 miles west of Tokyo and about 357 miles east of Kobe. It lies almost entirely between 35. 26' 53" north latitude and 139. 38' 38" east longitude from Greenwich.

It is bounded on the south and east by the Tokyo Gulf, a coast line extends over 3 ri 24 cho; on the west, it is bounded by Hodogaya, on the north and north-east by Shiroato and Koyasu, two villages in Tachibana district and on the south-west by Okagawa village, Kuraki district.

The area comprised within the above limits is estimated at 1.608 square ri, which added to the suburbs amalgamated with the city on the 1st April, 1901, makes it larger than that of the city of Kobe.

The length of the City, from Kanagawa on the north to Hommoku on the south is 2 ri 7 cho and from east to west 1 ri 21 cho 20 ken.

The Yokohama City Assembly consists of 48 members, who are elected from amongst eligible citizens, for a term of six years. This number is fixed according to the Law for the Organization of Cities, on the basis that a city of less than 50,000 inhabitants shall have 30 representatives, a city over 50,000 inhabitants shall have 36, in a city with more than 100,000 inhabitants, 3 members shall be added for every 50,000 inhabitants and in a city with more than 200,000 inhabitants 3 members shall be added for every 100,000 inhabitants. Thus the number of representatives of a city is increased in proportion to its population, the maximum number however being 60.

The Yokohama City Council consists of the Mayor, two Assistant Mayors and six honorary Councillors. According to the Law for the Organization of Cities dated the 17th April, 1888, the Mayor and Assistant Mayors are elected by the City Assembly; the appointment of the former is subject to the Imperial approval, while the latter requires the approval of the Prefectural Governor only; their respective terms of office are six years and they shall be paid officials.

The City Treasurer is elected by the City Assembly on the recommendation of the City Council subject to the approval of the Governor. Honorary Councillors are also elected by the City Assembly for a term of four years. The appointment of clerks and other necessary employees is made by the City Council.

The Yokohama Water Works were originally designed under the control of the Japanese Government in 1885, by a British Engineer, the late General Palmer, R. E. and were completed two years afterwards. It was the first adoption in Japan of a foreign system of water works. On March, 1890, the Government transferred the System to the control of the Yokohama Municipality.

In 1892, the Municipality found that the water supply was insufficient for the needs of the growing population, and recognized the necessity of extending Sagami-gawa Intake to Doshigawa and of adopting the gravitation system instead of that of pumping. Accordingly, they prepared plans to increase the supply so as to provide amply for 300,000 people. To carry out these plans, they required 3,075,600 yen, for the necessary works, and with the consent of the Imperial Diet they received 1,020,000 yen as a subsidy from the Government, thus leaving a balance of 2,055,600 yen as a public municipal debt to be paid by the City. During the fiscal years 1893-1902, they raised 1,155,600 yen by public subscription by the home capitalists, and, in 1902, the balance, 900,000 yen, was raised from foreign capitalists and thus the works were completed.

However, soon after the completion of the works, it was found that the supply of water was still very inadequate, owing to increase of population, more especially by the amalgamation of the suburbs to the municipal area. Thus arose the necessity for a further extension of the works. A plan was proposed by Dr. R. Hara, chief engineer of the Yokohama Water Works, whereby the daily supply of water should be 20,000,000 gallons to meet the demand of a population of 800,000. This plan was approved by the City Assembly, on the basis of an estimated cost of 7,000,000 yen, one fourth of which was to come from the government, while the remaining three fourths would be met by the proceeds of the Yokohama Water Works Loan Bonds raised in London.

Above is the brief history of Yokohama Water Works up to this date.

## SHORT HISTORY OF THE YOKOHAMA GAS KYOKU.

A scheme for supplying gas to the City of Yokohama was drawn up, in 1870, by Mr. Kayemon Takashima and eight other prominent residents which was adopted and the works completed in September 1872. This was the first gas works established in Japan, and although the organizers have encountered several obstacles they have all been successfully overcome. In June, 1875, the works were sold to the Daiichi Daiku (the First Great Ward of the City), by whom they were owned and worked under the name of the Gas Kyoku until transferred to a Ward consisting of Honcho and thirteen other streets in September 1879. Under the new ownership, the works were carried out with increasing success until April 1892, when the Municipality of Yokohama purchased them for Yen 120,000. Since then, the demand for gas has increased so much that extensions of the works had to be carried out thrice.

The latest extension of the works was started in November 1907, and was completed in December 1908. Its result was the raising of the daily production of gas from 380,000 cubic ft. to 1,400,000 cubic ft. The expense of this works was met by a "Yokohama City Gas Works Loan" raised in London, amounting to 648,000 Yen.

Thus has come about the present prosperity of the works.
