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PREFACE.

THE Prayers and Devotions contained in this book are mostly derived from ancient sources. Those following after "the Hours" are chiefly from St. Augustine and the works of our early English Divines; some are from the services of the Greek Church; a few are from other and private sources. Alterations have also been made in some where it seemed necessary in order to make them fitting for the present book. The Hymns are mostly taken, by the kind permission of their publisher, from the translations in "The Hymnal Noted."

There is one particular point in which this felection differs from many others of the kind, namely, in the fetting apart a space of time in each Office for filent, mental, or unprecomposed prayer, any of which terms perhaps will fufficiently denote that which is here intended. And the strict compliance with this is strongly urged; for it has been often found, that persons have come so to lean on precomposed forms of prayer, that they have been unable to utter forth to God in their own words the wants of their fouls. The diligent use of Mental Prayer is so constantly recommended by the Saints of Gop, that no opportunity should be loft for infifting upon it. The whole principle of this pause, which is here enjoined, is granted by the Rubric in the Service for the Ordering of Priests, wherein, before the finging the "Veni Creator," the Bishop is bidden to desire the congregation "secretly in their prayers to make their humble supplications to God . . . for the which prayers there shall be silence kept for a space." The use therefore of this, as enjoined in the present book, cannot be objected to.

The prayers, devotions, and intercessions, which follow

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after "the Hours," may be added thereto according to the will of those who use them. They are mostly expressive of the warm love and earnest devotion of the heart which consciously loves God, and is loved by Him, which rejoices in the personal knowledge of reconciliation and forgiveness through the meritorious Sacrifice of God's dear Son; others give vent to the penitence which the soul feels at the perception of her own short comings, or are intercessions with God on behalf of various objects.

On Fridays and during Lent, the "Prayers commemorative of the Passion and Work of our Blessed Lord," and "for Obedience to the Will of Gop," may be used; the Acts of Contrition and of Faith will be useful for penitents; in the Acts of Love the soul aspires to perfect union with God. Let care be had that the HEART go along with the words of the lips.

To the use of faithful and loving souls this book is commended, with the earnest prayer that it may be blessed to the peace, and encouragement, and sanctification of many.

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O LORD, we give Thee thanks for that Thou hast kept us this night from all evils, both bodily and spiritual; and we beseech Thee, for Thy mercies' sake, to awaken those who sleep in the sepulchre of sin. Give us grace to cast off the works of darkness, and to walk as children of light; and do Thou preserve us this day from all sin, from all perils and dangers, for Jesus Christ's sake. Amen.

O God, whose nature and property is ever to have mercy and to forgive, receive our humble petitions; and though we be tied and bound with the chain of our fins, yet let the pitifulness of Thy great mercy loose us; for the honour of Jesus Christ, our Mediator and Advocate. Amen.

Into the hands of Thy bleffed protection and unspeakable mercy, O Lord Jesus, we commend this day our souls and our bodies, with all their faculties, powers, and actions, beseeching Thee to be ever with us, to direct, fanctify, and govern us in the ways of Thy laws and in the works of Thy commandments. Amen.

Note.—If these Early Morning Prayers have not been used at their appropriate time they may be said together with those of the following hour (the First Hour), beginning these last thus—

with fcourgings and reproaches, fpit upon, crowned with thorns, buffeted, fmitten with a reed, blindfolded, stripped, nailed to the Cross, lifted up upon the Cross, numbered among thieves, made to drink vinegar and gall, and wounded with a spear; do Thou, O God, by these Thy most holy pains, which I Thy unworthy servant call to mind, by Thy Cross and precious Death, deliver me from the pains of hell, and vouchsafe to lead me whither Thou didst lead the thief, who was crucified with Thee, Who livest and reignest with the FATHER and the HOLY GHOST, for ever and ever. Amen.

O merciful Jesus, by Thy most bitter Passion, and all the merits of Thy most sacred Humanity, I beseech Thee to pardon and blot out all my fins. Wash me with Thy precious Blood, heal,

purify, and fanctify me more and more.

O merciful Redeemer, Who didst suffer Thy facred Hands and Feet to be pierced with nails and fastened to the Cross, and there didst with effusion of Blood suffer inexpressible torments; Grant that I may always with a faithful and thankful heart bear in mind Thy exceeding great Love, Who wouldest endure so great and grievous things for me. Purge and wash my soul with those streams of Thy most precious Blood from all uncleanness, and offer them to the Father for the full fatisfaction of all my fins, and be merciful unto me. Amen.

Holy Jasus, Who wast listed up upon the Cross, to draw all men unto Thee; by Thy Cross and Passion, both in Soul and Body, cleanse me from all silthiness, both of slesh and spirit; crucify this corruptible slesh of mine, with all the inordinate affections and unruly lusts thereof, that, being conformed to Thy Death, I may be partaker of Thy Resurrection, that suffering with Thee here, I may reign with Thee hereafter, where Thou livest. Amen (Speriock) where Thou livest. Amen. (Sherlock.)

FOR OBEDIENCE TO THE WILL OF GOD.

O Holy Jesus, Who with all fweetness of patience and submission, didst give up Thyself wholly to the Will of thy Heavenly Father, endue me with the same spirit of lowliness and meekness, patience and contentedness in all conditions, submitting to the good Will of my God, both in prosperity and adversity, health and sickness, life and death. (From Sberlock.)

Mortify in me whatever is displeasing to Thee, adorn me with graces acceptable in Thy sight, illuminate my soul with Thy most pure and divine light, that I may clearly know Thee, and by a quiet enjoyment rest in Thee, to the glory of Thy great Name.

Therefore, O Holy Jesus, I desire and besech Thee that Thy most perfect Will may be accom-

plished in me, and concerning me, and by me, in

time and in eternity.

O Lord my God, Thou art to me whatfoever is good and gracious. And who am I, that I should dare speak unto Thee? I am Thy poor mean servant, more poor and contemptible than I can or dare express. Yet do Thou remember me, O Lord, because I am nothing, I have nothing, and can do nothing. Remember Thy mercies, and fill my heart with Thy grace. Thou willest not that Thy works should be void or in vain. Teach me, O Lord, to do Thy Will: teach me to live worthily and humbly in Thy fight; let Thy Will be mine, and let my will ever follow Thine, and agree perfectly with it. For Thou art the true place of my heart; Thou, its only joy; in Thee will I rest for ever. (From the Imitation of Christ.)

THE CROSS OF CHRIST.

A Prayer in Trials and Persecutions.

O LORD JESUS CHRIST, our only help in all trials and tribulations, Who hast not merely opened heaven to Thy people by the Cross, but Who hast planted the path of every one of them with such abundant crosses, that they may be continually reminded to look at their crucified Lord and live, and to turn away from that world in which there is no trace of Him; grant that I,

beholding Thee, may be transformed into Thine image, and may one day wake up in Thy perfect likeness. Help me never to forget that I am the soldier of a Captain made perfect through suffering, the member of a Mystical Body, whose Head was crowned with thorns, and Who expired upon the Cross.

And whither, O LORD, can I go to learn how I am to become Thy true disciple, and to follow Thee in the mystery of suffering, but to Thy Cross? that Cross whereon Thou sufferedst in the eyes of all men, not only to pay the ransom of all, but to leave us an example, in enduring Thy heavy Cross, how we should each bear our light one. (Port Royal Memoirs.)

Strengthen me then, O LORD, in my measure to walk in Thy path, so that the old man may be crucified within me, and that I may learn in all

things to do Thy Will.

Hear and answer these my prayers, O blessed Jesus, Who with the FATHER and the HOLY GHOST livest and reignest ever one Gon, world without end. Amen.

CHRIST OUR SACRIFICE AND EXAMPLE.

Almighty God, Who hast given Thine only Sow to be unto us both a Sacrifice for fin and also an Ensample of godly life; give us grace that we may always most thankfully receive that His inestimable benefit, and also daily endeavour ourfelves to follow the blessed steps of His most holy life; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

FOR HUMILITY.

Almighty God, Who refistest the proud and givest grace to the humble, mercifully grant that I may follow the example of the great Humility of Thy blessed Son, Who did humble Himself to take upon Him our sless, and to suffer death upon the cross; convince me that I am less than the least of all Thy mercies; that, as I am vile in myself, so I may know that I am vile, and may therefore esteem every one better than myself; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

FOR CONTINUAL ADVANCEMENT IN GRACE.

Grant me, even me, my dearest Lord, Who art the hope and delight of my heart, to know Thee, and love Thee, and rejoice in Thee. And if I cannot do this perfectly in this life, let me at least advance to higher degrees every day, till I can come to do this in perfection. Let the knowledge of Thee increase in me here, that it may be full hereaster. Let the Love of Thee grow every day, more and more here, that it may be perfect hereaster; that my joy may be great in itself, and full in Thee. I know, O Lord, that Thou art a God of truth; O make good Thy gracious promises to me, that my joy may

be full. And till it be so, let my mind meditate, my tongue speak, my heart desire and love, my soul hunger, my slesh thirst after it, and my whole nature gasp and pant most earnessly, till I actually enter into the joy of my Lord, there to remain for ever and ever. (St. Augustine.)

A Prayer to the Moly Spirit.

O HOLY SPIRIT, Love of God, Who proceedest from the Almighty Father and His most blessed Son, insuse Thy grace most plentifully into my heart. Come Thou and dwell in that soul that longs to be Thy holy temple. Heal the lurking distempers of my heart; pierce me through with the dart of Thy love, and kindle in me such a holy fire, that it may slame out in a bright and devout zeal, and burn up all the dross of sensual affections, and possess and purify my whole spirit, and soul, and body. (St. Augustine.)

And Oh that it might please Thee to descend in Thy might upon the world and reprove it "of sin, of righteousness, and of judgment to come," that many may be recovered out of the snare of the devil, and be led to look for salvation to the Cross of Jesus, and find Thee as the ever-abiding Comforter of their souls. And may it also please Thee to take of the things of Christ and shew them unto Thy people, that the Universal Church may be quickened to a high and holy life, and at last be presented unto the FATHER as the pure and spotless Bride of His well-beloved Son in the eternal glories of heaven.

Grant this, O bleffed Spirit, for the fake of Jesus Christ, our only Lord and Saviour.

Amen.

FOR THE INCREASE OF THE HOLY SPIRIT.

O Eternal God, the great Father of spirits, the great lover of fouls, Who didst fend Thy HOLY SPIRIT upon Thy Church in the day of Pentecost, and hast promised that He shall abide with Thy Church for ever; let Thy Holy Spirit lead us into all truth, defend us from all fin, enrich us with His gifts, refresh us with His comforts, rule in our hearts for ever, conduct us with His truth, and lead us in the way everlasting; that we, living by Thy Spirit, and walking in Him, may by Him be sealed up to the day of our redemption. O let Thy Spirit witness to our spirits that we are the children of God, and make us to be so for ever; through Jesus Christ our LORD, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee in the unity of the same Spirit, One God, world without end. Amen. (Bp. Jer. Taylor.)

These two prayers may be used especially at Whitsuntide.

For the Bishops and Clergy.

Most merciful Father, we beseech Thee to send down upon Thy servants, the Bishops and Pastors of Thy flock, Thy heavenly blessing, and especially upon ——, the Bishop of this diocese, and the Clergy of the parish under whose charge Thou hast placed me; and so endue them with Thy Holy Spirit, that Thy word spoken by their mouths may have such success, that it may never be spoken in vain. Grant that they may not only be earnest to reprove, rebuke, exhort with all long-suffering and doctrine, but may also be examples of the believers "in word, in conversation, in charity, in spirit, in faith, in purity;" that, suffilling their course, they may at the last day receive the crown of righteousness laid up by the Lord, the righteous Judge. Grant this, O Most merciful FATHER, we befeech Thee to the LORD, the righteous Judge. Grant this, O FATHER, for the sake of JESUS CHRIST, our only LORD and SAVIOUR. Amen.

For a Church and Parish.

O Almighty and everlasting God, Who didst give to Thy holy Apostle (or Evangelist) St. ——grace truly to believe and to preach Thy Word; grant, we beseech Thee, that in this Church, which is called by his name, many may be led to love that Word which he believed, and that here it may ever be faithfully preached and

meekly received by us and all Thy people, to the

glory of Thy great Name.

We pray Thee, bleffed Jesus, that Thou wouldest give us grace to follow Thee as did Thy holy Apostle (or Evangelist) St. —; and grant that we also, being called by Thy holy Word, may forthwith give up ourselves obediently to stuff Thy holy commandments. Holy Jesu, hear all our prayers for this Church and flock, and for those our brethren [especially] who unite with us in prayer to Thee, Who now livest and reignest with the Father and the Holy Ghost, ever one God, world without end. Amen.

Christian love. neighbourhood; promise on my part, especially [bere name] those for whom I am sponsor; their own desire [bere name], their lack of leisure.

AT THE THIRD HOUR. (See p. 16.)

For the Peace and Unity of the Church.

Vouchfafe we befeech Thee, Almighty God, to grant unto the whole Christian people, and especially to Thy servants in [N], and all for whom our prayers are defired, unity, peace, and true concord, both visible and invisible; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

AT THE SIXTH HOUR. (See p. 22.)

For the Conversion of sinners and awakening of the listless.

Almighty God, we befeech Thee to hear our prayers for such as sin against Thee, or neglect to serve Thee, especially those in [N.], and others for whom our prayers are desired, that Thou wouldst vouchsafe to bestow upon them true repentance, and an earnest desire to serve Thee, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

AT THE NINTH HOUR. (See p. 27.)

For the advancement and perseverance of the faithful.

Vouchfafe, we beseech Thee, O Lord, to strengthen and confirm all Thy faithful, especially those in [N.], and all others for whom we are desired to pray, and to lift them up more and

more continually to heavenly defires, through JESUS CHRIST OUR LORD. Amen.

FOR THE CONVERSION OF SINNERS.

(To be used very often.)

O Holy Saviour, Who favest all them that come unto Thee, have mercy upon all those who are called by Thy Name, but who are now wandering far from Thee, in the ways of error and destruction; grant them the gift of true. Repentance and hearty Faith, that they may seek Thee, and find Thee, and having found Thee may never go away from Thee, but ever rejoice with that joy which no man can take away, and love Thee with that Love which is shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Ghost, and that so persevering unto the end they may attain eternal life. Blessed Jesus, hear all our prayers for them for whom Thou didst once die upon the Cross, and now livest and reignest with the Father and the Holy Ghost for ever and ever. Amen.

O ever bleffed Saviour and Redeemer Jesus, the Bright and Morning Star, Who alone canst give light to them that sit in darkness and the shadow of death, shine with Thy bright radiance upon all those in whose hearts Thou hast not yet arisen, [especially I pray Thee for N. and N., and all others to whom Thou hast bound me by the ties of kindred or affection, whose names, O LORD, Thou knowest]. Dispet the clouds of

darkness with the brightness of Thy presence. Let the shadows of earth slee away, and do Thou appear with healing in Thy wings. Enlighten their eyes that they may no longer sleep in the death of sin, but may arise and shine with the light of Thy Divine Love, which is shed abroad in the hearts of Thy faithful people, O ever Blessed Saviour and Redeemer, Jesus. Amen.

A GENERAL INTERCESSION. (To be used frequently.)

O Almighty and most merciful God, Who didst accept the intercessions of Thy servant Moses for Thy people Israel, and by Thy Holy Apostle St. Paul didst command that "supplications, prayers, intercessions, and giving of thanks be made for all men," look down in mercy upon all those for whom I ought to pray; replenish them with the Gists and Graces of Thy Holy Spirit, assist them in all dangers, ghostly and bodily, may they seel truly Thy Love shed abroad in their hearts, and so be drawn to love Thee fully Who didst first love them.

Look especially upon those for whom, whether from causes known or unknown to me, I have been desired to pray [bere name, if this be so]; if they need strength, do Thou assist them by Thy grace; if they need desence and comfort, be Thou their shield and consolation; if they need to be

awakened to a sense of their danger, do Thou quicken them by Thy Holy Spirit; whatever or how great soever their wants may be, do Thou supply them all according to Thy boundless

loving-mercy.

And upon every object that concerns the Peace and Unity of the Church, the Conversion of finners and awakening of the listless, the advancement and perseverance of the faithful, especially [bere name], for which also my prayers have been defired [if this be so], do Thou most mercifully send down Thy Heavenly blessing, and bring it in Thy time to good effect.

And upon Thy whole Church do Thou be pleased to pour out a larger measure of Thy Grace, that we all being one, and partaking of that One Bread, Christ our Lord, may have an acceptable judgment at the last day, and be permitted to dwell with Thee for ever in Thy

eternal and glorious kingdom.

Hear and answer these prayers and intercessions, O most merciful FATHER, for the sake and merits of JESUS CHRIST, our only Mediator

and Advocate. Amen.

Acts.

Of Contrition.

Behold me, O Lord, behold me a miserable

finner. And what shall I now say? what shall I answer, when I am guilty, guilty, guilty? I will go over my fins unto Thee in the bitterness of my soul? Like a crane or a swallow, so will I lament; I will mourn as a dove. I beseech Thee, O Lord, by all Thy mercy, let Thy most righteous indignation and sury be turned away from me, because I have sinned, and that grievously.

O FATHER of mercies, I beseech Thy Fatherly loving-kindness, despise me not. Yea, rather regard me, O Lord, regard me with those eyes wherewith Thou didst regard Magdalene in the banquet, Peter in the hall, the thief on the Cross; that with Peter I may weep, with the thief may confess, with Magdalene may love; may love much, yea, very much, for that many sins are forgiven me. Spare me, O Lord, spare me, a penitent, at the least desiring to be a penitent and preparing thereto, recollecting my sins with bitterness, indignant with myself concerning them, remembering and laying hold of Thy most bitter Passion. Spare me, O Lord, have mercy, Spare me.

To Thee, O Lord, I confess my many, my very great sins. I profess also to grieve, as Thou knowest. But I need more grief. I can sin much; I cannot repent much. My leanness! my leanness! woe unto me! Thou, O Lord, increase the sountain of tears that I have; supply that I have not; give me a melting heart, un-

utterable groans.

After so many backflidings, what is my hope? that Thou wilt extend Thy mercy to seventy times seven; for that measure Thou hast enjoined to us. I then trusting in Thy mercy that forgivest at the least seventy times seven, say and repeat, again and again, "God be merciful to me a sinner."

Shall God forgive, and thou not repent? God forbid! I do in a fort repent; I grieve that I can no more. I confess that my very grief is to be lamented, and I grieve that it is thus to be lamented. And who will give me to lament it more?

Do Thou, O Lord, give me power; if Thou wilt, Thou canst; Thou canst turn even the hard rock into a pool. Give tears: give a fountain of waters to my head. Give the grace of tears. Drop down ye heavens from above, and bedew the dryness of my heart.

O Lord hear; O Lord forgive; O Lord hearken and do; defer not for Thine own sake, O my God; for Thou hast found a Ransom for me. Let not the price of His precious Blood perish; but visit me in Thy goodness; forgive me every sin; deliver me from eternal punishment; sanctify my spirit, soul, and body, and give me grace to worship and to please Thee, in piety and holiness of life, until the very end of my days.

Now unto Him that is able to do exceeding

abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that worketh in us, unto Him be glory in the Church, by Christ Jesus, throughout all ages, world without end. Amen. (From Bp. Andrewes.)

Another.

O my God, I confess against myself all those transgressions and pollutions, which render me unworthy of the least of Thy mercies. I have done many and grievous things against Thy laws, and my own good intentions. Instead of amending and forsaking my sins, I have added greatly to their number. Though Thou wert once pleased to wash and sanctify me, I have defiled myself anew with greater and more inexcusable sins.

Behold, O Lord, my wickednesses are gone over my head, and are like a fore burden too heavy for me to bear. And unless Thou, Whose property is always to have mercy and to forgive, be pleased to put forth Thy hand, I shall be lost for ever, and swallowed up in the great deep. Hearken, O Lord, to my cry, look down and behold my misery, O save me for Thy mercies' sake; have compassion upon Thy child, though he be rebellious and full of transgressions.

Consider, therefore, O my LORD and FATHER, that though I am a finner, I am still Thy son; I cannot cease to be so by a double title, for Thou art the author and giver, not only of my first and natural, but also of my second my spiritual and better life. Thou hast declared that Thou wilt not forget Thy children; forget not me, then, O my Father.

I confess, O Lord, that I am a finner, a great and grievous finner; my conscience reproaches me with guilt continually, and sets before mine eyes that Hell and condemnation which are the deserved wages of my evil doings. What shall I do? and whither shall I flee, but unto Thee? and therefore I take sanctuary in Thy mercy alone, in that mercy which can never be overpowered by any greatness or number of offences.

Thou, O Blessed Jesus, willest not the death of

Thou, O Blessed Jesus, willest not the death of a finner, but rather that he should be converted and live; suffer me not, then, to die, since Thou, O Blessed Lord, hast died for me. Thy death hath killed the death of sinners, and from that instant Thou diedst their life commenced. Under the shelter of this mercy I dare approach the throne of grace, and thus protected and encouraged, I run, I call, I cry for pardon, and knock importunately, incessantly, till Thou open and take pity upon me. For if Thou didst of Thine own free love call us to a pardon, which we never sought, how shall we not much rather obtain a pardon upon our own request, and that request grounded upon encouragements, and commands, and promises, which Thou Thyself hast given us?

For what is Jesus but a Saviour? By the import and goodness of Thy Blessed Name, arise, I befeech Thee, to help me, and fay unto my foul "I am Thy Salvation." Raise me, then, and quicken me, O LORD my GoD, that for the future I may serve Thee, live to Thee, and entirely devote myself to Thee. I know that the whole of what I am is Thy due as my Creator; I am fensible that more than I am is Thy due as my Redeemer. And had I it, I should owe Thee as much more than I am, as Thou, who gavest Thyfelf to be Man for my fake, art greater than the man for whom Thou wert given. But this poor self is all that I have to offer in return; and even this I could not offer without Thee. Accept me therefore, I beseech Thee, and draw me to Thyself, that I may from henceforth be Thine by imitation and refemblance, by obedience and love, who am already all Thine own as Thy creature and Thy purchase - even Thine, O fweetest Saviour, who livest and reignest for ever and ever. Amen. - (St. Augustine.)

Almighty and eternal God, the author of pardon, of life, of falvation, I confess that I am in Thy fight a polluted person; my conscience does accuse me, and Thy Holy Spirit is grieved by me. But my Saviour Jesus died for me, and Thou pitiest me, and Thy Holy Spirit still calls upon me, and I am willing to come; but I can-

not come unless Thou draw me with the cords of love. Draw me, and I will run after Thee, O God, my God. (From Bp. Jer. Taylor.)

An Act of Self-oblation.

Bleffed be Thy Name, O Lord God, who hast fet before me life and death, and hast bidden me choose life. Behold, Lord, I do with all my heart choose life; I choose Thee, O my God, for Thou art my life. Save, Lord, and hear me, O King of heaven, and accept my facrifice, even the facrifice of my whole heart, which I now give Thee. O my God, I offer Thee my senses and passions, and all my faculties; I offer Thee all my defires, all my defigns, all my endeavours, all the remainder of my life; I offer Thee my memory, my understanding, my will; all that I have or am, I offer up all entirely to Thy service. Lord, sanctify me wholly, that my whole spirit, soul, and body may become Thy temple. O do Thou dwell in me, and be Thou my God, and I will be Thy servant. Amen. (Bp. Ken.)

An Act of Faith.

O bleffed LORD JESUS, I do from my heart believe that Thou art the propitiation for my fins, and that Thou didft upon the Cross make an Atonement for all my transgressions. Thou didft then offer up Thyself a willing Sacrifice on my behalf; and by Thy death I live. Thou didst

shed Thine own most precious Blood for me, even for me, that I might be made pure and clean from all fin. By paying thus the ransom for me, Thou hast bought me for Thyself, that I may from henceforth live wholly unto Thee. Thou, O dearest Saviour, art alone my trust, Thou art alone my hope, Thou art alone my falvation, Thee only will I love; for whom have I in heaven but Thee, and there is none upon earth that I desire in comparison of Thee.

And to my FATHER Which is in Heaven I come pleading Thy merits, as my fole ground of acceptance, trusting only in Thy Cross for salvation both in this world and in the world to come, befeeching Him to let me be more and more throughly washed in Thy most precious Blood. Thou, O bleffed Saviour, haft paid all for me; therefore I come boldly to the throne of grace, trufting in Thy all-prevailing merits. who can condemn, fince Christ hath died? who can despair of salvation, since such a redemption has been wrought out for finners? All that I could do for falvation, all my own merits, which are nothing out of Thee, I entirely renounce; and I throw myself wholly upon Thy mercy, being affured that Thou wilt most graciously accept me, fince Thou hast so loved me.

And do Thou most mercifully grant, that as I now with heart-felt love accept Thy Cross and Passion as the ground of my acceptance, so I may henceforth learn to follow Thee as my Example. May I willingly take up that cross which Thou shalt give me, and thus, crucifying the old man, die unto self and live unto Thee, O blessed Jesus, Who didst bear all my sins in Thine own Body on the tree. Grant this, O holy Saviour, for Thine own dear Name's sake. Amen.

An Act of Hope.

O Almighty and most merciful FATHER, I firmly hope through the merits of Thy most dearly beloved Son, and for the sake of the Atonement which He made once for all for me, that Thou wilt at the last day receive me with Thy people into eternal glory. Trufting in His merits alone, I look for the time when He shall appear again in power and great glory, hoping that I may then be made like unto Him in His heavenly kingdom. O may it please Thee to keep this my hope, as an anchor of my soul, both fure and stedfast, so that at last I may obtain the fruition of those things which now I hope for, and be admitted into that rest that remaineth for the people of God. Grant this, O FATHER, for the fake of Jesus Christ, our only Mediator and Advocate. Amen.

An Act of Love.

I love Thee, O my God, I love Thee, and more and more would I fain love Thee. O

LORD my God, Thou who art fairer than all the children of men, grant me to long for Thee and to love Thee as much as I would, and as much as I should. Thou art immeasurable, Thou must be loved without measure, especially of us whom Thou hast so loved, whom Thou hast so saved, and for whom Thou hast made so great and so goodly things.

O LOVE. Which burnest ever and art never quenched, O fweet Christ, O gracious Jesus, O my God, Who art love itself, set me on fire wholly with Thy love, with love of Thee, with Thy fweetness, with defire of Thee, with longing after Thee, with Thy charity, with joying and exulting in Thee, with Thy affection and sweetness, with the pleasure of longing for Thee, which is good, and chafte, and clean; that, being entirely full of the sweetness of Thy love, wholly kindled with the flame of affection towards Thee, I may love Thee, O LORD my God, most sweet and most beautiful, with all my heart, with all my foul, with all my strength, and with all my intent, with much contrition of heart and shedding of tears, with much reverence and fear, having Thee in my heart and in my mouth, and before mine eyes always, that there may be no room in me for any counterfeit or unclean love. (St. Augustine.)

Acts of Love FOR EVERY DAY IN THE WEEK.

First Day.

O my Goo, Thou beauty of mine eyes and comfort of my heart, what dost Thou not supply to him that loveth Thee? why wander we away from Thee? why feek we any thing else but Thee? why long we for any thing besides? Oh, I befeech Thee, wound my foul with the dart of Thy love; fill all my defires, fo that nothing out of Thee may delight or affect me, that I may see Thee alone in every creature of Thine, may ever pant towards Thee with most ardent desires, and think of Thee always with the purest love. O LORD JESUS, inflame my heart with Thy most holy and constant love! O would that I might be afire with the love of Thee! O let me languish for love of Thee! O most loving Jesus, grant to me a constant flame of love for Thee. Draw me and I will run after Thee, and will not faint. Like as the hart defireth the waterbrooks, so let my soul long after Thee, O God. Grant me, most gracious Jesus, such an insatiable and boundless longing for Thee, that no created thing may be able to confole me. O most loving LORD JESUS CHRIST, Elect Spouse of my soul, I beseech Thee, by that Heart of Thine, both pierced by the spear and wounded wit bove, pierce, wound, and inflame my heart with so

fierce a flame of Thy love, that with my whole heart, that is, with full defire and perfect will, I may love Thee, feek Thee, and make Thee my end in all things and above all things. I will so love Thee, O Lord my God, with my whole soul, as to direct all my senses to Thee, and make Thee my sole end. I will so love Thee with my whole mind as to occupy my intellect and my memory with Thee only and Thy glory, and cling to Thee alone. I will so love Thee with all my strength as to spend the whole of it, both of mind and body, in Thy praise, and love, and well-pleasing. I will so love Thee, O Lord my God, that Thou alone mayest possess me wholly, that Thou mayest absorb me wholly, and transform me into Thyself!

Second Day.

O Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the living God, grant that I may with my whole heart and full defire aspire towards Thee with thirsting soul, and breathe only in Thee, Thou dearest and sweetest Lord, and that my whole spirit and interior man may pant for Thee, Who art the true blessing. Grant that every creature may seem vile in mine eyes, and that nothing may affect me, nothing please me, but Thee. O sweet Jesus, wound and inslame my heart with Thy most pure love. Draw all my desires after Thee, that after Thee alone my soul may hunger and thirst, may without ceasing sigh for Thee and run to Thee, may

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languish for love of Thee, and loathe earthly things. O sweet Jesus, fill my heart with those pure desires with which the soul ever burns for love of Thee, and, thinking of Thee always, knows nothing beside Thee. Oh would that Thou wert the only sweetness in my heart, Thou the only pleasure, most sweet Jesus. Alas! O LORD God, when shall I love Thee perfectly? when shall I gently hold Thee, my life, in the arms of my soul? when shall every desire of my heart embrace Thee, Thou dearest Lover of souls? O LORD my God, would that I might despise myself and the whole world entirely for love of Thee! would that my soul were melted with Thy love! would that it were borne along by and absorbed into Thee!

Third Day.

O fweet Jesus, grant me only those riches, Thyself, and I may be well poor in every thing else; make me poor in spirit, so that I may seek nothing else but Thee, O Thou adorable, honourable, worshipful, omnipotent, everlasting God, Thou most ardent Lover of souls, Thou most faithful exacter of love. When shall I love Thee in return? when shall I wholly go out of myself and wholly enter into Thee? would that I might leave myself wholly and pour forth myself into Thee! Excite my heart, O Lord, that I may seek Thee; enlighten my heart that I may find Thee; posses my heart that I may

rest in Thee, and forget everything that is out of Thee.

Fourth Day.

O most glorious Jesus, how fair, how lovely, how beautiful, how sweet Thou art; blessed are they who love Thee. O most merciful and most loving Jesus, Thou only treasure and joy of my heart, grant that I may wholly go out of and leave myself, and ever aspire towards Thee with most fervent defires. O true light, O never-failing life, O love that ever burnest, grant that I may wholly die to the world and to the flesh, and entirely forget all temporal things, that I may neither joy nor forrow for them, nor regard any thing else but Thee, Who art my love. O most highest, most powerful, most fair, most glorious, most sweet, most pleasant, most lovely, most to be defired, most dear LORD, make my heart like Thy Heart, that Thou mayest abide ever with me. Take me to Thyself, and give Thyself to me. Bind me fast to Thee by the most indissoluble bond of love, that neither death nor life may separate us for a moment. O Lord Jesus, make me to know my own vileness, and Thy majesty and goodness, that thence there may increase in me the most profound humility, and hence there may be kindled in me the most perfect love. O most merciful Jesus, since Thou commandest nothing else, and I desire that one thing alone, namely, that I should love Thee with my whole heart, and please Thee in all things and above all things, why is this not fulfilled in me, O most loving Jesus, for I can desire nothing that is good, much less can I do, except that which Thy grace shall have inspired me to desire and do? What, therefore, Thou inspirest, and commandest, and praisest, do Thou pour into me, that I may will it and perform it. O most merciful Jesus, now I make again the same request; do not deny me that which Thou commandest, since it is pleasing to Thee, and most desired by me. Fill my heart with the most perfect and most ardent love, full of faith and constancy, that all that I am, and all my powers, and every thing which is within me, and about me, may worship, may seek, may thirst for, may love, may serve and please Thee fully and for ever.

Fifth Day.

O LORD JESU CHRIST, shew forth Thy virtue and power in me, a most miserable sinner; shew that Thy goodness is greater than my wickedness; grant that I, who have been hitherto turned from Thee, and cold towards Thee, may now be wholly converted to Thee, and being set on fire by the slame of Thy love, may be transformed into Thee. My God, my Creator, how long I do not know Thee? how long dost Thou lie hid, and I do not seek Thee? yea Thou art my only salvation, and do I not seek Thee? Therefore most loving, most faithful lover, Who when

I existed not didst love me, and that I might exist hast made me, grant that I may long after Thee, thirst for Thee, seek Thee, run after Thee, and for love of Thee loathe all things which are out of Thee.

Sixth Day.

F O most gracious Lord Jesu Christ, grant that I may wholly love Thee most servently. O most faithful Lord Jesu Christ, grant that I may seel with how great a love Thou hast loved, and dost still love us! O sweetest Lord Jesu Christ, how willingly would I love Thee! and since Thou hast granted that I might thus will, grant, therefore, that I may love Thee with my whole heart, for without Thee I can do nothing. Sweet Jesus, pardon my vileness and my boldness, bestow upon me what I seek, and give me what I ask; make me to be afire with the most pure and ardent love of Thee, to be drawn to and lost in Thee, and to forget all things which are out of Thee. O Thou Lover of my heart, grant that it may die for love of Thee.

Seventh Day.

O most lovely Jesus, grant me a most faithful, most strong, most chaste and pure love for Thee, which may feel Thee incessantly, may praise Thee, may thank Thee, may obey Thee, may thirst most ardently for Thy honour, and bestow itself wholly upon Thee. O Jesus, crucified for

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me, transform me, I beseech Thee, into Thyself, and cause me to be crucified in Thee with the nails of love so that I may never be parted from Thee. Grant that I may please Thee wholly, always, and most perfectly. O most lovely Jesus, O most faithful lover, O most devoted lover, would that I might attain to be wholly fatiated with the love of Thee! O when shall I fee Thee face to face? O would that I might attain to be lost in Thy love! Would that I might attain to be afire in Thee by the flame of Thy love, to be united to Thee, and to be confumed in Thee! O Jesu most to be longed after, grant me to long after Thee, so that I may not be able to live without Thee, but be sick of love for Thee. My foul hungereth and thirsteth after Thee, my foul liveth and subsisteth in Thee alone, my foul resteth in Thee alone. O holy Jesus. fill me full of Thy love and most perfect humility, May I ever fo burn for love of Thee with most perfect charity, as at the same time I cease not to regard my own vileness. I am a finner, Thou art my Goo, Thou art all to me, into Thy hands I commend my spirit and all that I am.
