# Spring Musical

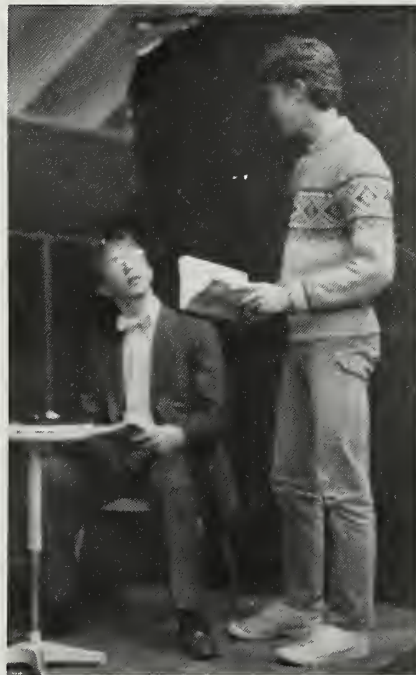

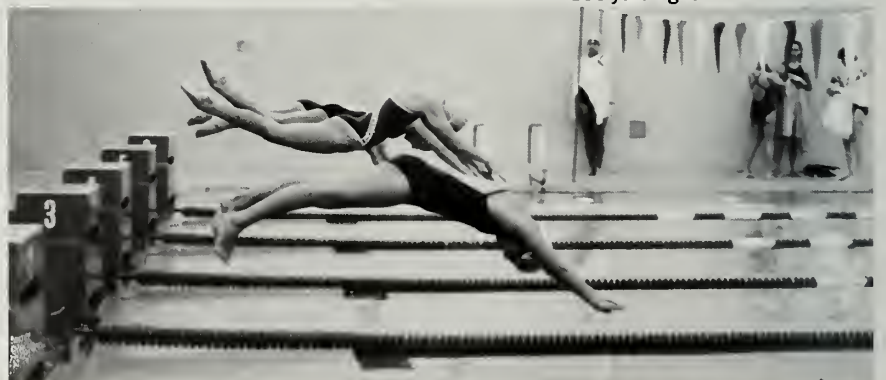
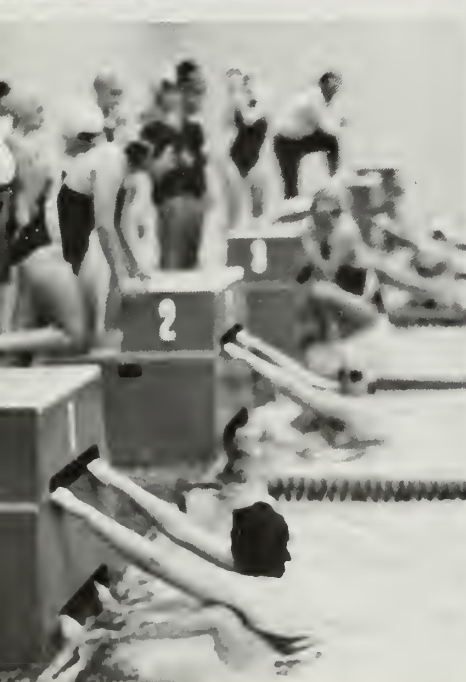
# Swimming

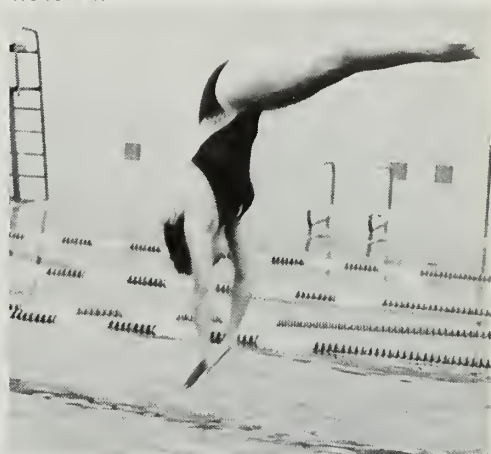

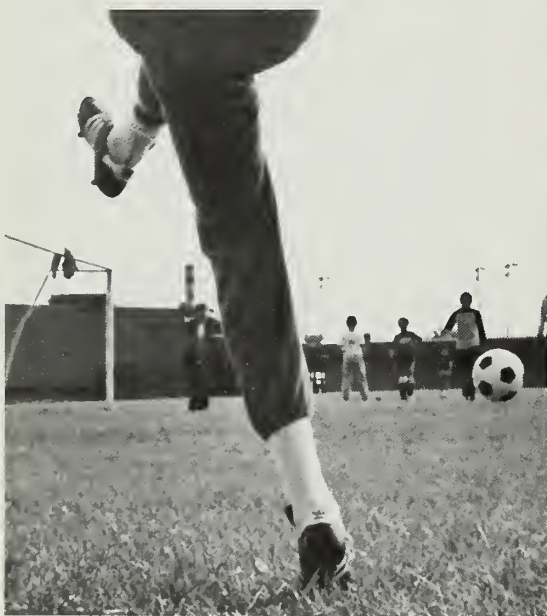
# Soccer

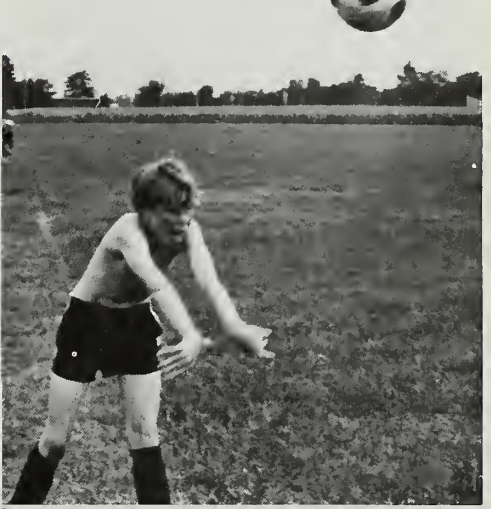

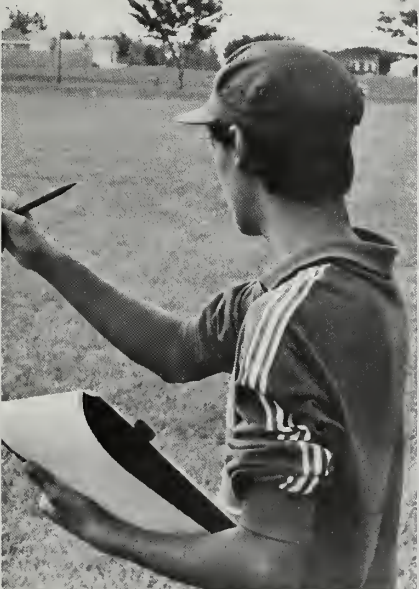

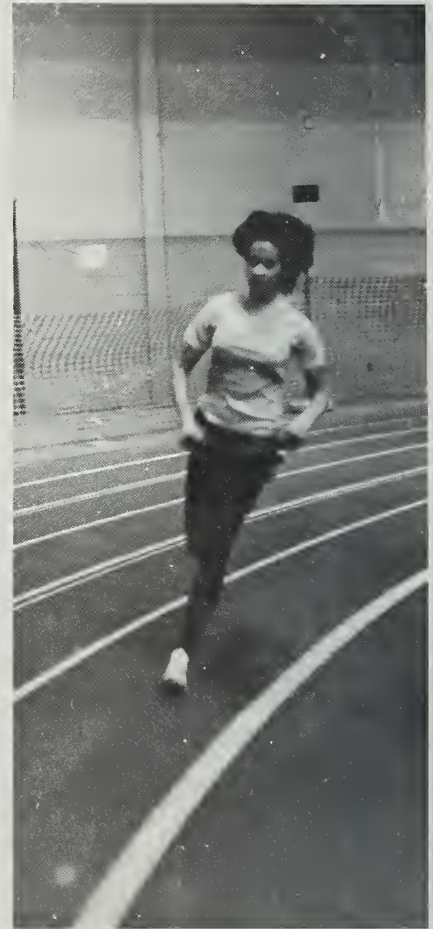


# Track and Field

# Sub Basketball

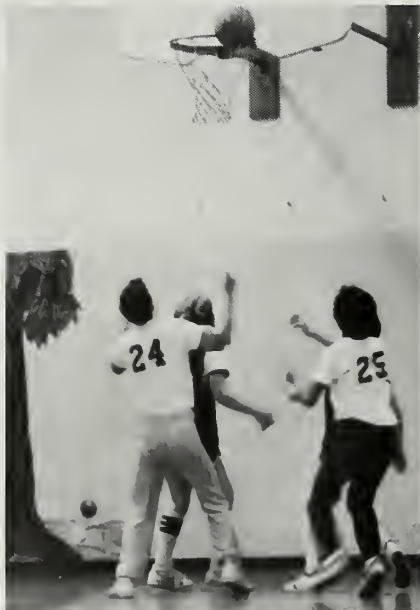

# Gargoyle

Gargoyle's top-notch staff supplied Uni with controversial editorials, informative (though often daring) exposes, and witty cartoons. Headed by William "stop the press" Gillespie, these high school professionals even scooped A.P. and U.P.I. on seven separate occasions.
