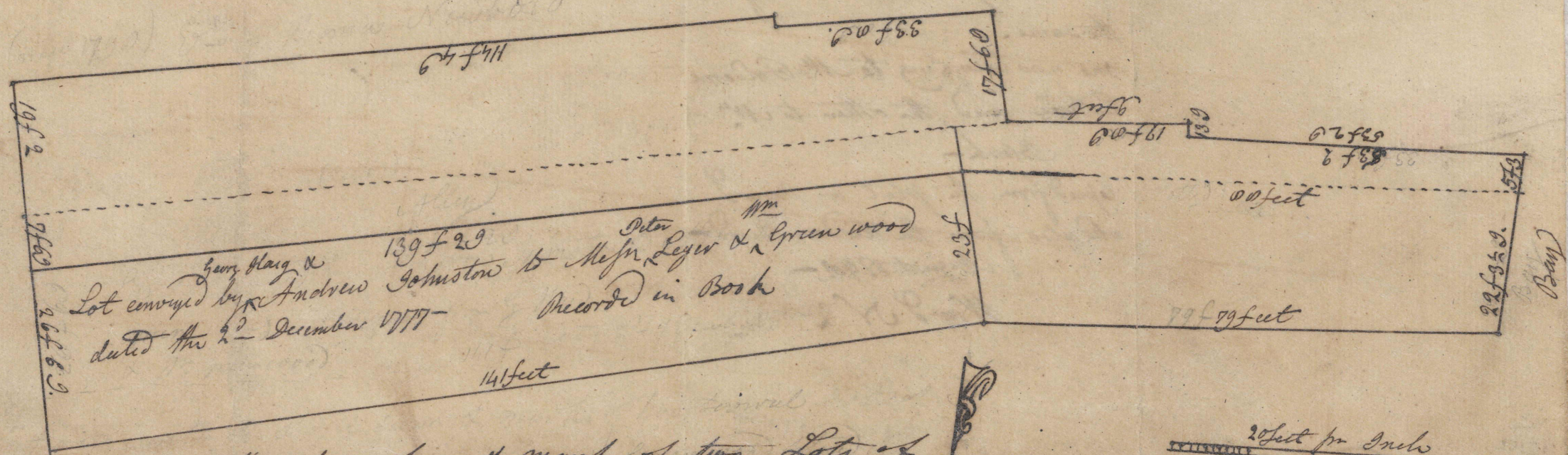


Bridons Alley



The above plan represents the shape form & marks of two Lots of Land adjoining each other belonging to Messrs Leger and Greenwood situated in Charleston, bounded on the Bay of Charleston Mt on Bridons alley and all other sides by the Lines of the above plat shaded yellow - The dotted line show the situation of an alley made for the convenience of the back Stairs &c as part of the Lots delineated & conveyed by Charles Elliott Esqr to the said Leger & Greenwood

Surveyed the 8 February 1774 by Wm Downes

Release from Charles Elliott & went to Leger & Greenwood dated the 16<sup>th</sup> February 1774 for a Lot of Land lying on the Bay containing from Mt on the E side fronting on the Bay 22 feet &c In with the right of a passage way

of 5739 wide running from E to W on the N side, with the absolute right of extending the buildings hereafter to the extent  
 on the said Lot or piece of land over the above the said passage way, in the same way & manner as the present  
 Buildings now are 00 feet then runs from E to W on the West 23 feet on the West side 23 feet, then  
 runs from W to E. south side 79 feet. be the same manner left. Bounded E on the Bay S on land late George  
 Scaman. W on Robert McKeown & N on William Elliott —

Also the Lot lying E side of Bradens alley containing from N to S fronting on said alley W side 26 feet 09 including  
 the alley <sup>running</sup> E & W of 7769 in width then runs from W to E on the N side 140 feet, then runs N to S on the E side  
 including the alley 25 feet, then runs from E to W on the S side 139 feet or there abouts. Bounding West on Bradens alley  
 N on land of Mr. Joor E on Mr. Elliott S on Robt. Makecum — Recorded in Book S N 6 page 269 —
