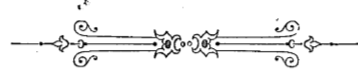

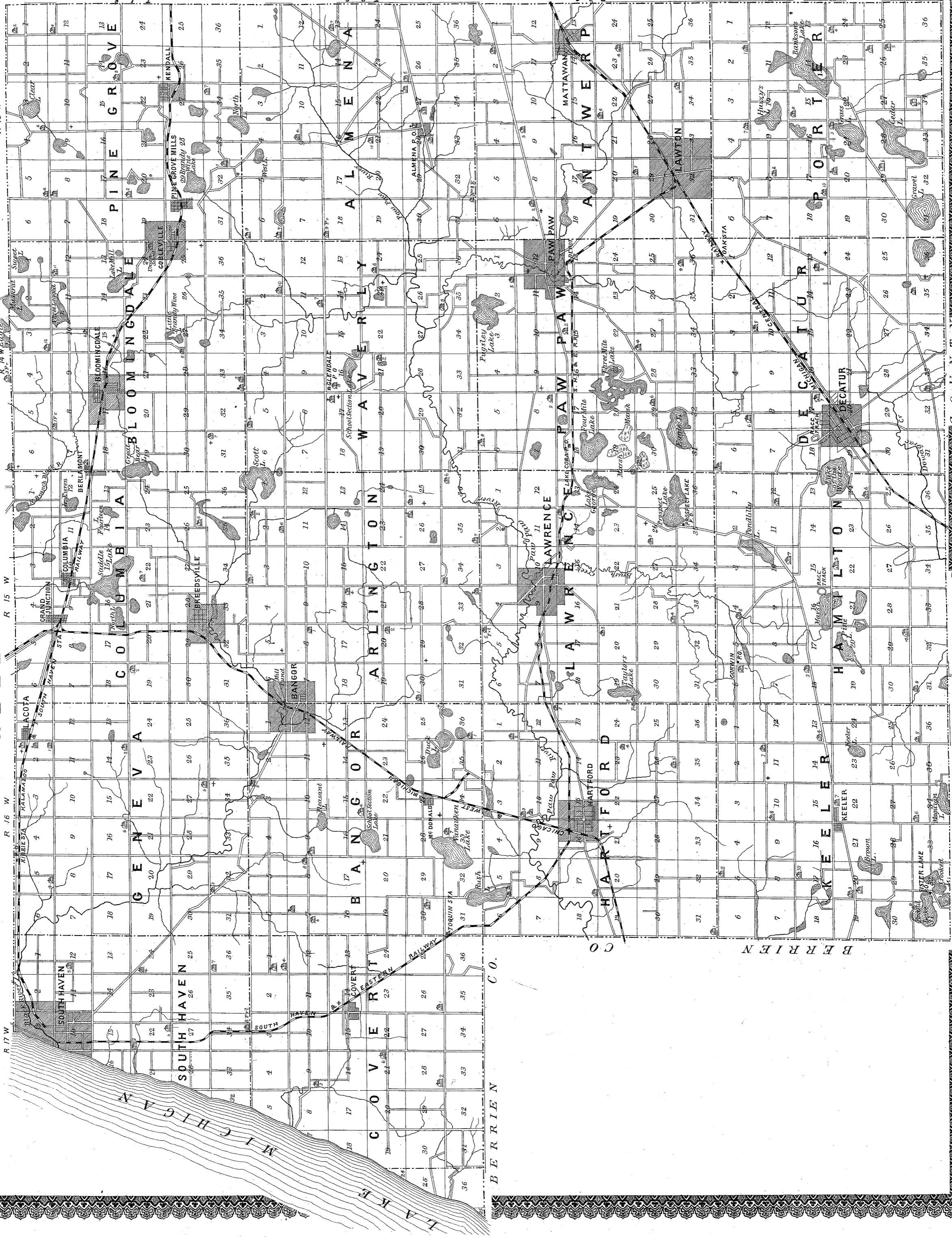

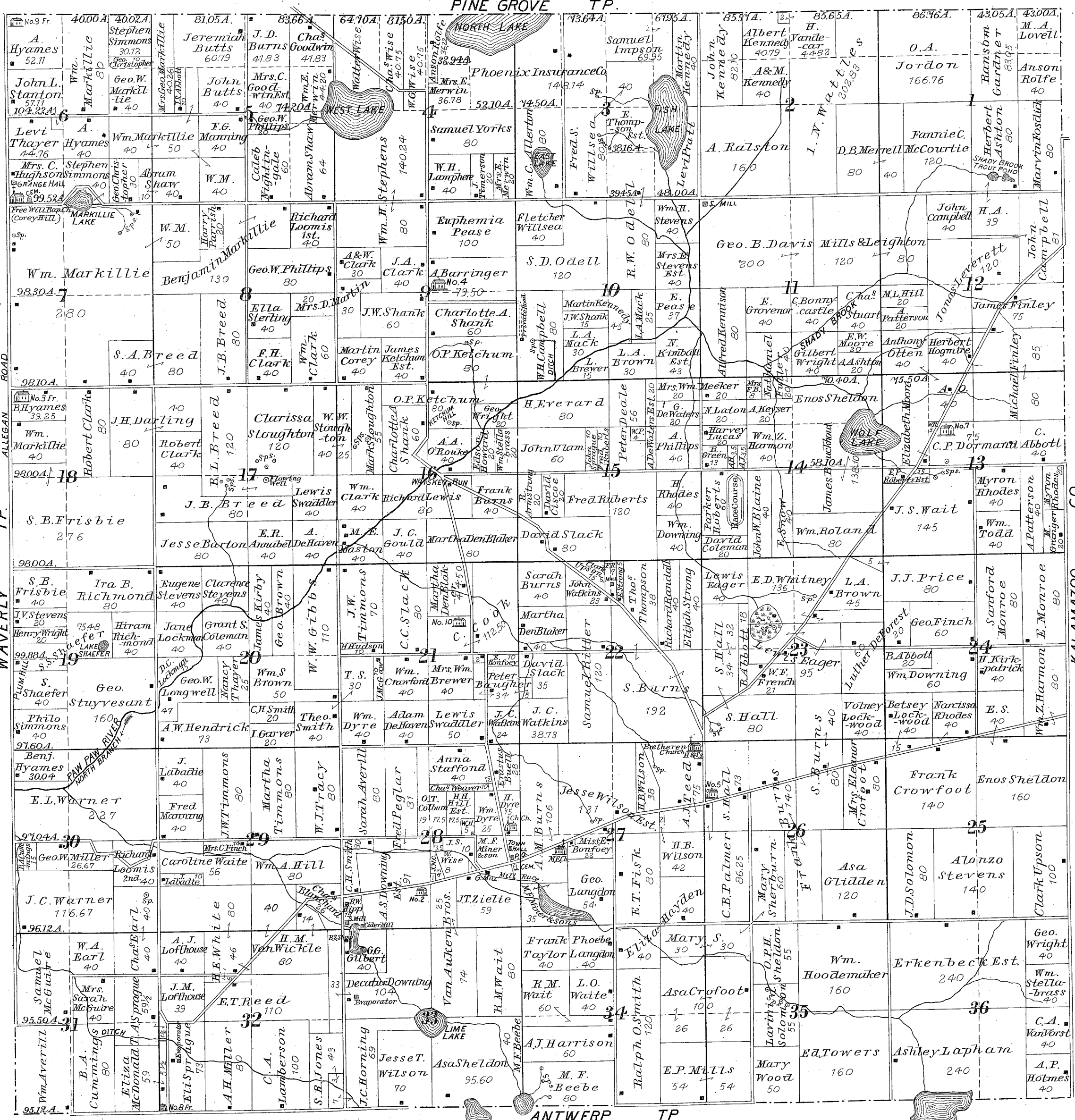


MAP OF ALMENA

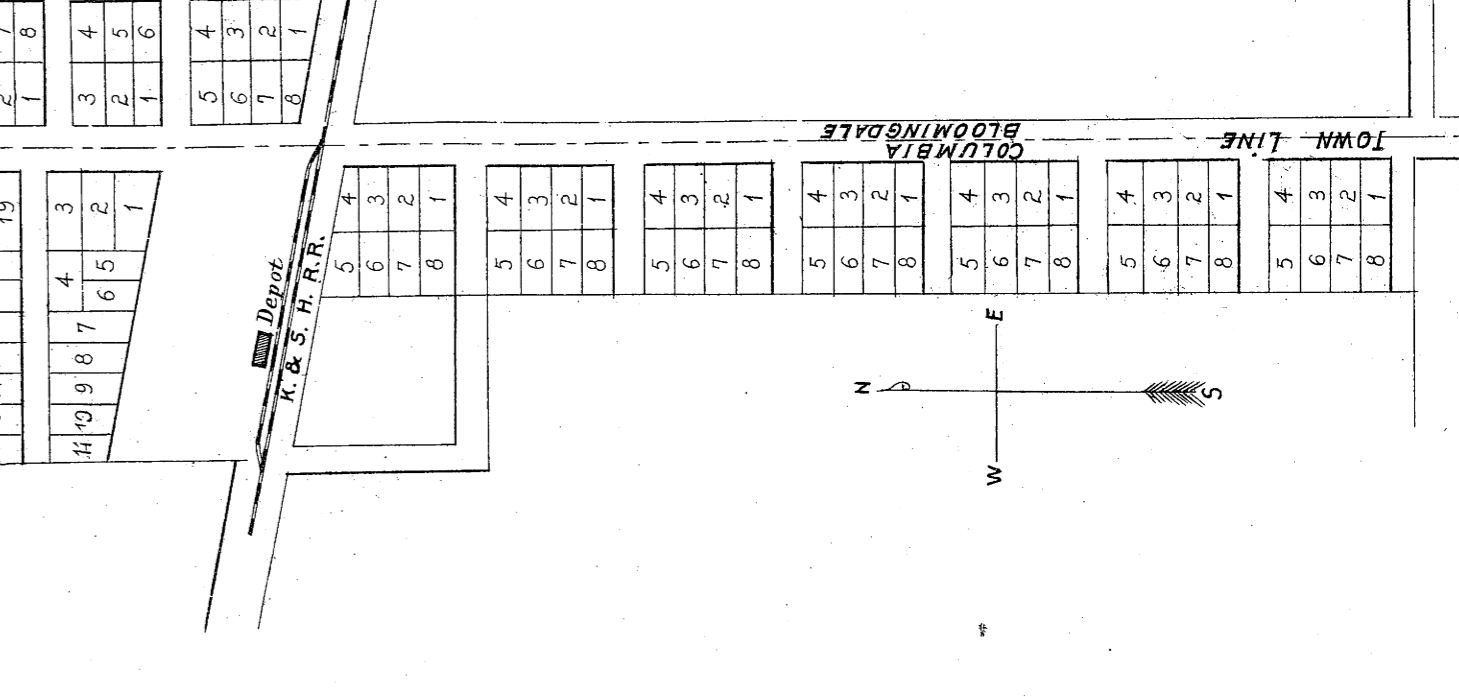
MAP OF BANGOR

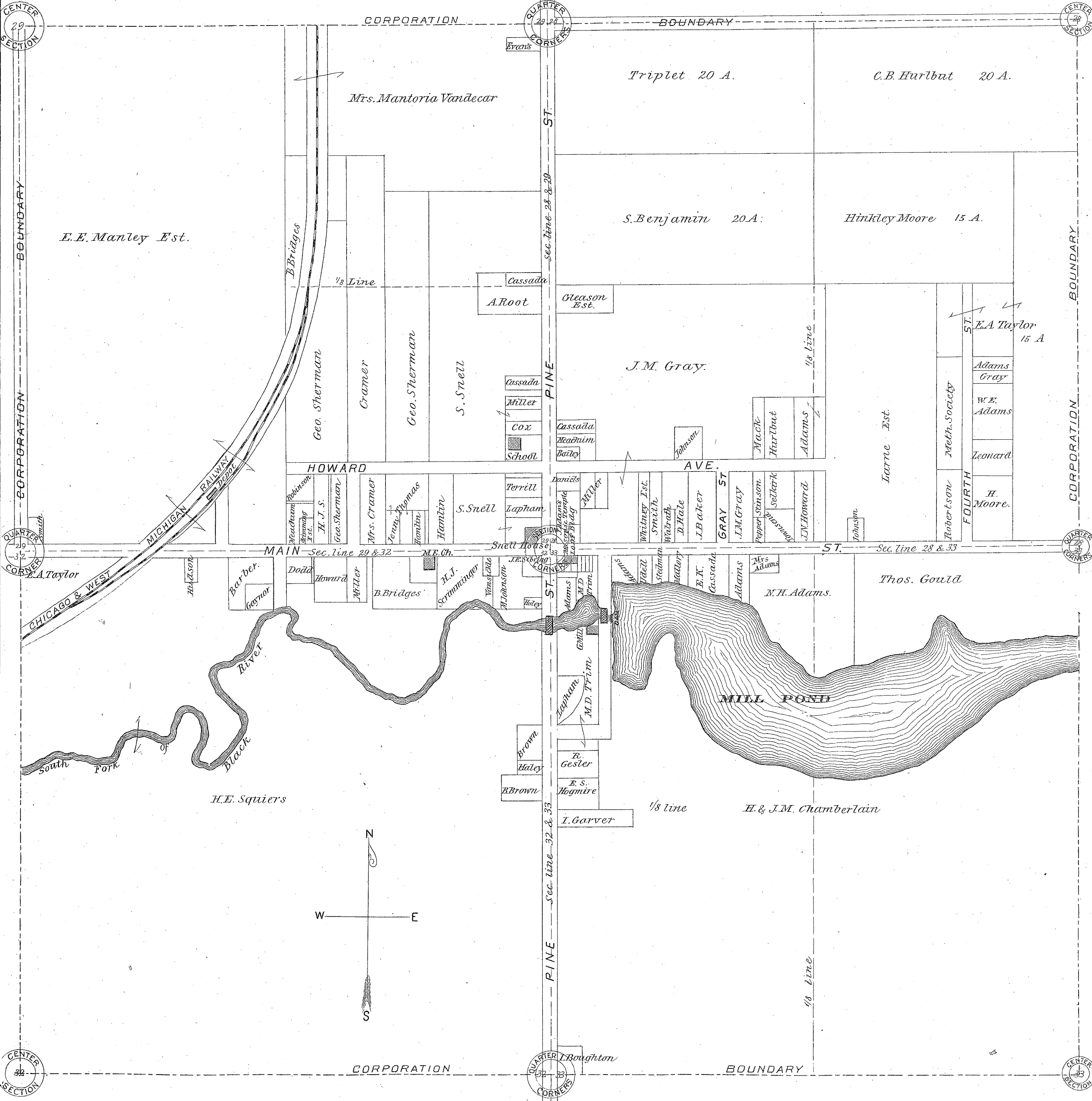


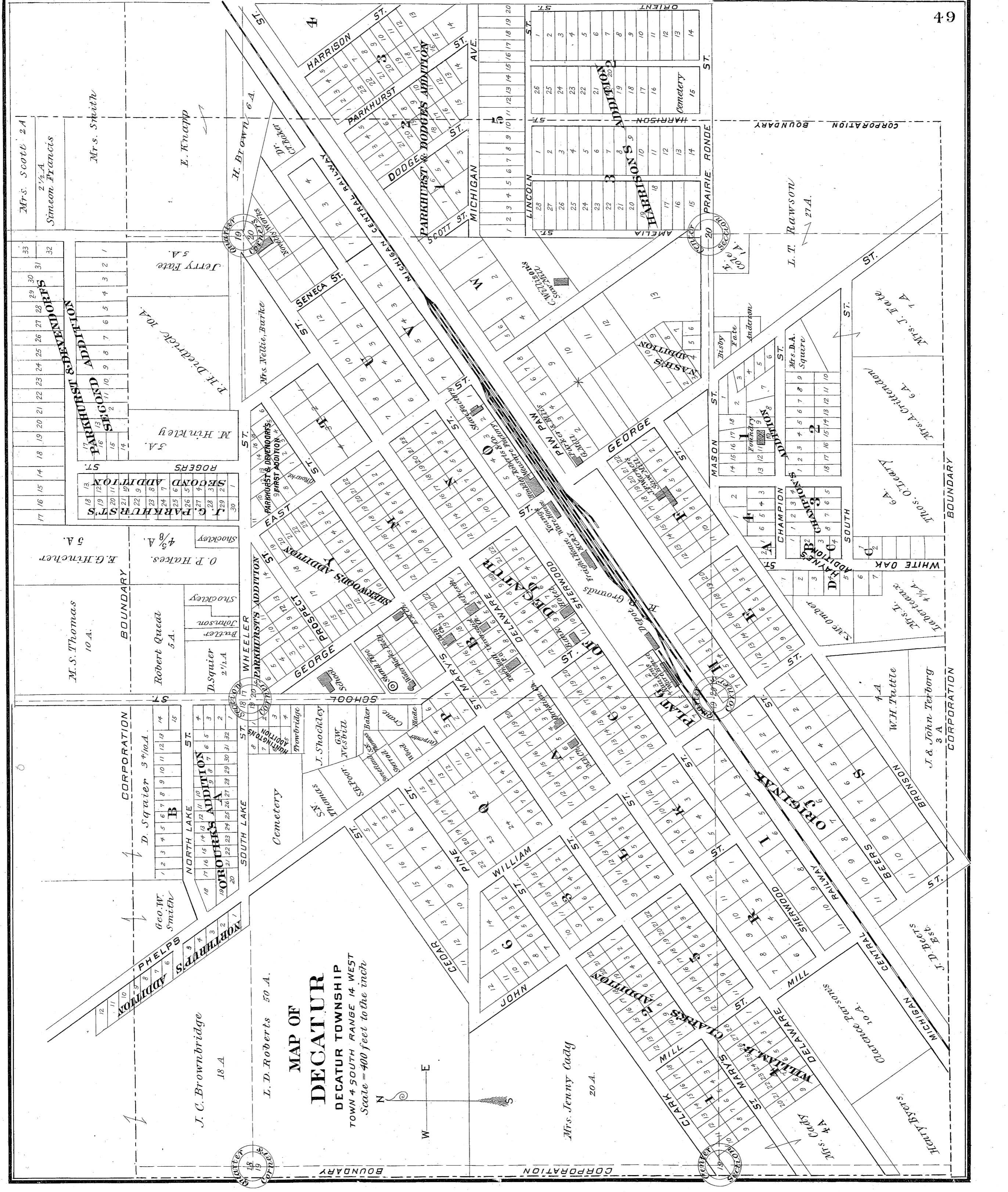
Map of BERLIAMONT

BREEDSVILLE

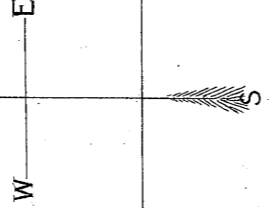
