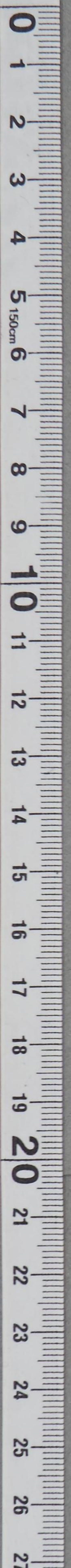

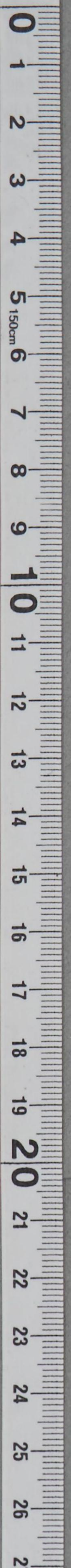

() For CSGSP/D6. In compliance with provisions of DA ltr, file AGAM-PM 319.1 (20 Oct 48) CSGSP/D6, subject, "Depot Space and Operating Report," dtd 27 Oct 48, the following comments and recommendations are submitted:

a. Currently all open and covered storage in the Far East Command is being used to maximum capacity and temporary storage expedients are necessary. This condition has resulted from roll-up of comds within FEC, conclusion of surplus property disposal program, and a change in policy contained in "Troop Program, Part III, Supply Supplement," Change I, dtd 29 Sep 48.

b. As cargo is recd by other comds, from comds being rolled-up and classified, it often causes a shifting from covered to open storage and vice versa, therefore, the storage and operating procedures for each comd differ in many respects.

c. The FEC is presently engaged in a program of considerable magnitude designed to repair all unserviceable, but economically repairable property. This operation is in furtherance of DA directive contained in DA publication refd in par a above.

d. There is a critical shortage of trained personnel in this comd and a high percentage of indigenous labor is employed in depots and storage areas. Occupation personnel on duty in depots, warehouses, and storage areas must by necessity of their small number be utilized in a supervisory capacity. The increase in the number of personnel and cost of making the subj report is not justified for this comd due to its limited value under present operating conditions.

2. In view of the foregoing it is recommended that until such time as supplies have been properly stored, inventoried, accounted for, and normal depot levels attained, installations in the FEC not be required to submit subj report. Upon completion of the program outlined in par 1c above, which is estimated to be 1952, the rendition of this report will be feasible.

Operating Reports," dtd 27 Oct 48, the following commands and recommendations
are submitted:

a. Currently all open and covered storage in the Far East Command
is being used to maximum capacity and temporary storage expedients are neces-
sary. This condition has resulted from roll-up of comba within the, conclusion
of a major property disposal program, and a change in policy contained in
"Trop Program, Part III, Supply Equipment," Change I, dtd 22 Sep 48.

b. As cargo is read by other comba, from comba being rolled-up
and classified, it often causes a shifting from covered to open storage and
vice versa, therefore, the storage and operating procedures for each comba
differ in many respects.

c. The FEC is presently engaged in a program of considerable
magnitude designed to repair all unserviceable, but economically repairable
property. This operation is in furtherance of DA directive contained in DA
publication cited in par a above.

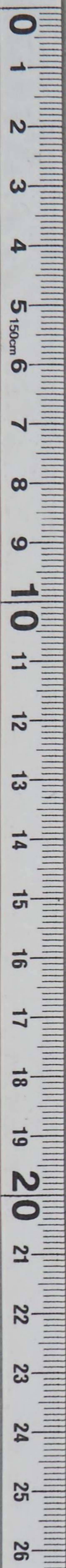
d. There is a critical shortage of trained personnel in this comd
and a high percentage of indigenous labor is employed in depot and storage
areas. Occupation personnel on duty in depots, warehouses, and storage areas
must by necessity of their small number be utilized in a supervisory capacity.

not justified for this comd due to its limited value under present operating

MEMO FOR RECORD:

1. DA ltr, file AGAM-PM 319.1 (20 Oct 48) CSGSP/D6, subj "Depot Space and Operating Report" 27 Oct 48, addressed to CINCFE and other overseas theatres, states that the DA considers it advisable to obtain uniform info regarding depot storage operations on a world-wide basis. To assure uniform rpts for the ZI and overseas, DA contemplates that Memo 700-10-6 and DA AGO Form 808 will be used as the reporting instructions and forms. Reports from overseas comds will be submitted quarterly rather than monthly as required from ZI installations. Along with reld DA ltr, copies of Memo 700-10-6 and AGO Form 808 were furnished CINCFE. DA ltr directed that CINCFE furnish comments and recommendations pertaining to reld proposed rpt to the Dir of Logistics on or before 31 Jan 49.

2. Rpt proposed by DA (DA AGO Form 808) requires info from each depot indicating the amt of covered, open, and ammo storage space contained therein, together with that amt of this space occupied at the time of the rpt. Under the headings of covered, open, and ammo storage space, the rpt calls for a breakdown of 22 items such as amt of total gross storage space; gross storage space allocated to DA agencies; bin storage space; aisles space; receiving and shipping areas; actual vacant and potential vacant space; and other items reflecting the amts of surplus, household, salvage, serviceable, unclassified, and non-issuable properties which make up the occupied space of each storage area. In addition to the above, numerous other minor entries and analyses are required by the rpt. DA Memo 700-10-6, 10 Sep 48, provides instructions to be followed in the preparation of the rpt.

3. In order to obtain the reactions and comments from the field, CINCFE ltr AG 400.2 (27 Oct 48)GD, SUBJ "Depot Space and Operating Report" 16 Nov 48, was dispatched on 16 Nov 48 to maj operating comds. Their comments and recommendations, required by CINCFE not later than 31 Dec, are as follows:

a. MARBO states that submission of reld rpt for the tech sv depots in MARBO is not recommended for the following reasons:

- (1) All tech sv supply depots in MARBO consist of interim-type warehouses.
- (2) Huge quantities of redistribution cargo have been recd by tech sv depots during the past year resulting in the accumulation of large quantities of supplies and equip in outside storage which have not been completely segregated or inventoried.
- (3) Lack of properly trained personnel hampers the accomplishment of (2) above, and necessitates the directing of all efforts to the proper accounting of such supplies, which, MARBO states, is the primary interest of their comd. Until such time as all ~~MARBO~~ MARBO supplies have been properly inventoried, stored, accounted for, and stocks reduced to normal depot levels, submission of rpt is not recommended.

b. PHILCOM recommends that Depot Space and Operating Rpt, if required from their comd, include only the Permanent Base Storage Space.

c. EIGHTH ARMY comments that compilation of this rpt would be a difficult task and of doubtful value to the DA and 8th A because of the following:

- (1) Storage facilities in Japan are of a temporary nature and are not consistent with the standard installations in the ZI. Storage operations within 8th A must be modified to conform to avail storage facilities.
- (2) Due to the critical shortage of trained personnel in 8th A, the compiling of the rpt would be a difficult task. Personnel in the tech sv depots, where the rpt would be made up, are practically all of indigenous source, and not easily trained for this type of work.
- (3) Info concerning depot operations required by 8th A Hq for operational and planning purposes is currently obtained thru informal rpts and surveys.

d. RYCOM concurs with proposed Depot Space and Operating Report.

e. USAFIK states that the proposed Depot Space and Operating Rpt is considered of limited value in overseas installations for the following reasons:

- (1) Overseas depots are a development of expediences to meet reqmts as well as possible by utilization of avail facilities. For this reason statistics presented would not necessarily reflect space reqmts consistent with good depot operating procedure.
- (2) USAFIK recommends the deletion of items 5,6,7,8,9,10,19,20, and 22 from rpts from other than ZI installations. (These entries have to do with space used not for storage, but for such installations as cafeterias, bin storage, aisles, packing and crating rooms, etc.)

3. Discussion: It is believed the intent of the proposed rpt on Depot Space and Operations is to furnish the DA with a clear, accurate rpt of the amt, nature, and utilization of depot space on a world-wide basis. The benefit to be derived from its submission by installations within the FEC is doubtful for several reasons. First of all, much of the storage maintained in this comd is of an improvised nature, erected and utilized as the demand arises. This is particularly true during the present period of shifting of cargoes from one comd to another, with the idea of retaining all possible property in the FEC. Much of this storage space is extremely temporary and only set up because of the urgent necessity for cover. Therefore, each successive rpt might portray a completely different picture of utilized storage space from that shown by its predecessor. Operating procedures in the various types of improvised storage spaces would of necessity be different, since they would have to be modified to meet existing conditions.

Secondly, due to a critical shortage of trained personnel in this comd, the compiling of this rpt would be a long and ~~difficult~~ difficult task further encumbered by the large percentage of indigenous personnel employed in the various depots and storage areas. It is not considered that the expenditure of time and labor utilized in preparing this rpt would be practicable in view of the limited value gained therefrom.

(1) Storage facilities in Japan are of a temporary nature and are not consistent with the standard installations in the U.S. Storage operations within the U.S. must be modified to conform to available facilities.

(2) Due to the critical shortage of trained personnel in 8th AF, the compiling of the report would be a difficult task. Personnel in the depot as depots, where the report would be made up, are practically all of indigenous source, and not easily trained for this type of work.

(3) Info concerning depot operations required by 8th AF for operational and planning purposes is currently obtained thru informal reports and surveys.

d. RYCOM concurs with proposed Depot Space and Operating Report.

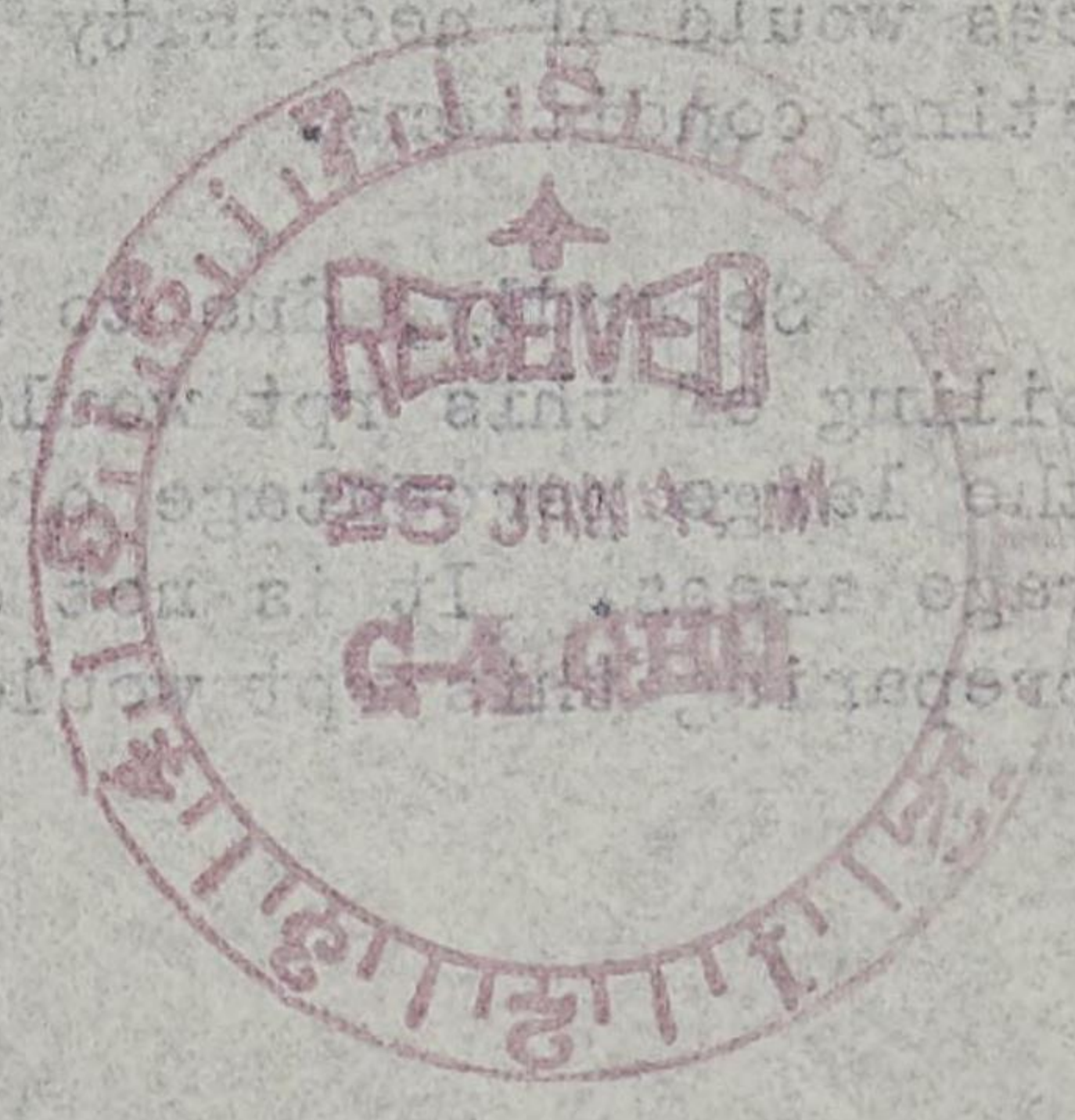
e. USAFIA states that the proposed Depot Space and Operating Report is considered of limited value in overseas installations for the following reasons:

(1) Overseas depots are a development of expediency to meet reports as well as possible by utilization of available facilities. For this reason statistics presented would not necessarily reflect space requirements consistent with good depot operating procedures.

(2) USAFIA recommends the deletion of items 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, and 13 from report from other than 21 installations. These entries have to do with space used not for storage, but for such installations as cafeterias, bin storage, aisles, packing and crating rooms, etc.

3. Discussion: It is believed the intent of the proposed report on Depot Space and Operations is to furnish the DA with a clear, accurate report of the actual, current, and utilization of depot space on a world-wide basis. The benefits to be derived from the submission by installations within the U.S. are doubtful for several reasons. First of all, much of the storage maintained in this country is of an improvised nature, erected and utilized as the demand arises. This is particularly true during the present period of shifting of cargoes from one command to another, with the idea of retaining all possible property in the U.S. Much of this storage space is extremely temporary and only set up because of the urgent necessity for cover. Therefore, each successive report might portray a completely different picture of utilized storage space from that shown by the predecessor. Operating procedures in the various types of improvised storage areas would of necessity be different, since they would have to be modified to meet existing conditions.

Secondly, a critical shortage of trained personnel in this command, the compiling of such a report would be a long and difficult task further compounded by the large number of indigenous personnel employed in the various depots and storage areas. It is not considered that the expenditure of time and labor utilized in preparing such a report would be practicable in view of the limited value gained therefrom.

Also, it should be pointed out, all personnel who can be made avail for duty in depots and storage areas in this comd are utilized in returning unserviceable, but economically repairable property, to a serviceable condition. This operation is in furtherance of DA directive contained in Change No. I to Part III of Supply Supplement, Troop Program, USA and USAF, dtd 1 Aug 48.

The final consideration deals with the shipping distances involved in supplying the FEC, in that due to the length of shipping distances, the storage avail in this comd would be of little value considered on a world-wide basis.

4. Conclusions:

- a. The rpt could be prepared by installations in the FEC but would be a difficult task in view of the lack of trained personnel or even untrained personnel.
- b. Due to the shipping distances involved in supplying the FEC, the storage avail in this comd would be of little value considered on a world-wide basis.
- c. Furthermore, the rpt would be of limited value to the DA in view of the great percentage of interim-type and makeshift storage facilities utilized in the FEC.
- d. The expenditure of time and labor is not considered advisable in view of the critical shortage of trained personnel. Occupation personnel which can be spared for duty in depots, warehouses, and ~~other~~ storage areas must by necessity of their small number be utilized in a supervisory capacity. Also, in furtherance of DA directive contained in Change I to Part III of Supply Supplement, Troop Program, which states that all unserviceable but economically repairable property will be returned to a serviceable condition, the utilization of all available personnel in this operating is essential.

5. Decision: To point out to the DA the circumstances described in par 4 above, and recommend that installations of the FEC not be required to submit subject rpt until such time as supplies have been properly stored, inventoried, accounted for, and reduced, by attrition, to normal depot levels. It is further decided to advise DA that this period of adjustment of stocks will continue until approx 1952. It is also considered appropriate to advise the DA that at such time as the above operations have been completed, the rendition of this rpt will be feasible.

6. This proposed ltr was fwded to the C/S by C/N and approved as drafted. Due to the shortage of time remaining by which date the rpt is required in the DA, it is considered advisable to send this msg by rad rather than by ltr. This decision is accomplished by dispatch of this radio.

- 7. No further G-4 action required.

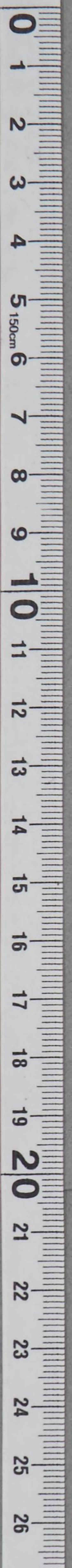

Also, it should be pointed out, all personnel who can be made available for duty in depots and storage areas in this country are utilized in returning merchandise, but economically repairable property, to a serviceable condition. This operation is in furtherance of DA directive contained in Change No. 1 to Part III of Supply Supplement, Troop Program, USA and USA, dated 1 Aug 48.

The final consideration dealt with the shipping distances involved in applying the FPC, in that due to the length of shipping distances, the storage available in this country would be of little value considered on a world-wide basis.

4. Conclusions:

a. The rot could be processed by installations in the FPC but would be a difficult task in view of the lack of trained personnel or even untrained personnel.

b. Due to the shipping distances involved in applying the FPC, the storage available in this country would be of little value considered on a world-wide basis.

c. Furthermore, the rot would be of limited value to the DA in view of the great percentage of intermediate and terminal storage facilities utilized in the FPC.

d. The expenditure of time and labor is not considered available in view of the critical shortage of trained personnel. Operation personnel which can be spared for duty in depots, warehouses, and other storage areas must by necessity of their small number be utilized in supervisory capacity. Also, in furtherance of DA directive contained in Change 1 to Part III of Supply Supplement, Troop Program, which states that all economically repairable property will be returned to a serviceable condition, the utilization of all available personnel in this operating is essential.

5. Decision: To point out to the DA the circumstances described in part 4 above, and recommend that installations of the FPC not be required to admit subject rot until such time as supplies have been properly stored, inventoried, accounted for, and reduced by rotation, to normal depot levels. It is further decided to advise DA that this period of adjustment of stocks will continue until approx 1952. It is also considered appropriate to advise the DA that at such time as the above operations have been completed, the rotation of this rot will be feasible.

6. The rot was labeled to the C-2 by D-1 and approved as drafted. The to the rot is required in the DA, it is considered possible to send this rot by rail rather than by air. This decision is accompanied by disposal of this rot.

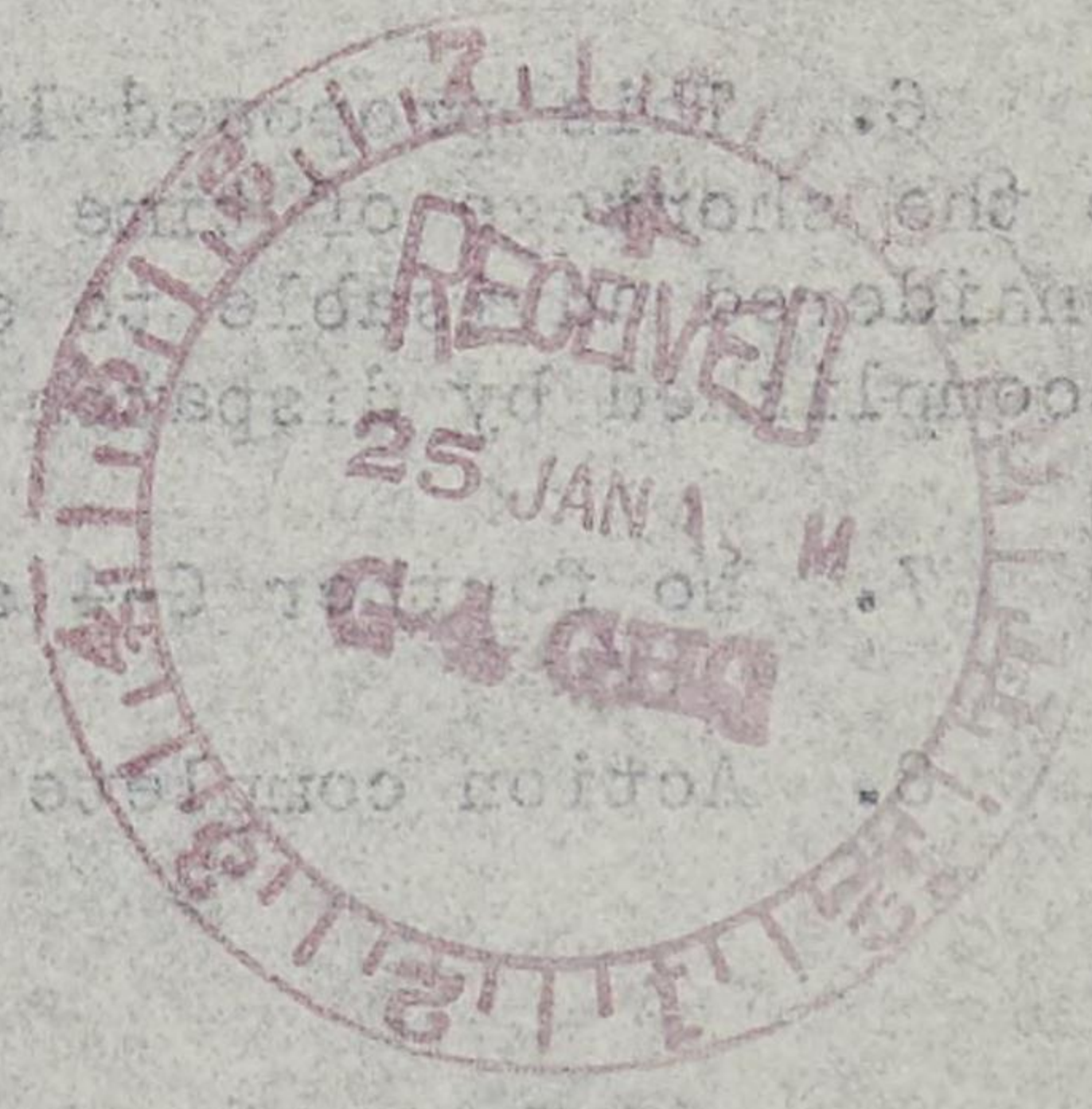

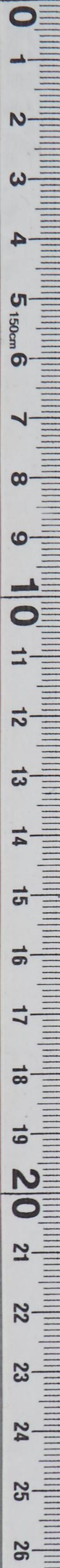

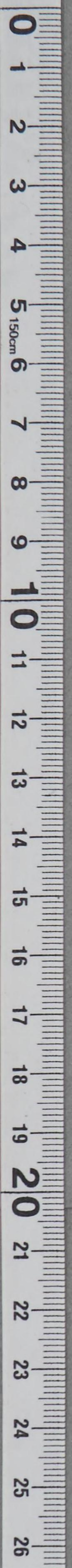

2. The submission of the quarterly Depot Space and Operating Report, Reports Control Symbol CSGSP-61 (R2), for the technical service depots in the Marianas-Bonins Command is not recommended.

3. In this connection, the following general conditions exist which are considered to limit the value of such a report:

- a. All of the technical service supply depots in the Marianas-Bonins Command consist of interim-type warehouses.

1. In accordance with instructions contained in basic communication the following comments are submitted:

a. It is recognized that data furnished by subject report, concerning depot storage operations in oversea commands may be of some value to the Department of the Army, but it appears doubtful that this data could be used to any material advantage by this command.

b. Storage facilities in Japan are of a temporary nature and are not consistent with the standard installations in the Zone of Interior. Storage operations in this command must be modified to conform to available storage facilities, and because of this it seems doubtful that information furnished would be of much value to the Department of the Army as a part of the overall Army storage plan.

c. Due to critical shortage of trained personnel in this command, the compiling of this report would be a difficult task. Personnel in the Technical Service Depots, where this report would be made, are practically all indigenous personnel, and not easily trained for a job of this type.

d. Information concerning depot operations required by this headquarters for operational and planning purposes is currently being obtained through informal reports and surveys.

2. In summarizing, the following is submitted:

a. It is recognized that subject report would be of some value to the Department of the Army.

b. The report could be compiled by this command, but it would be a difficult task, due to the shortage of trained personnel.

c. The report would be of only limited value to this command.

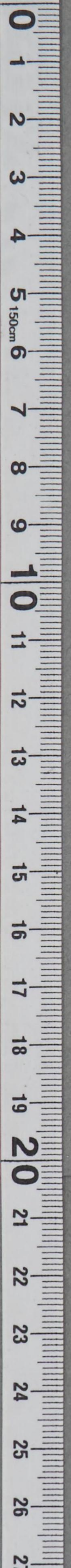

1. In accordance with instructions contained in basic communication the following comments are submitted:

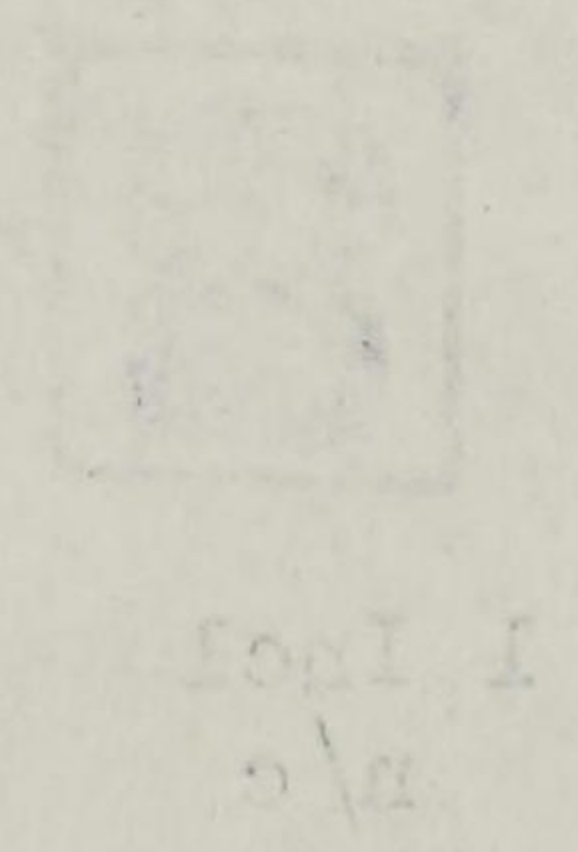
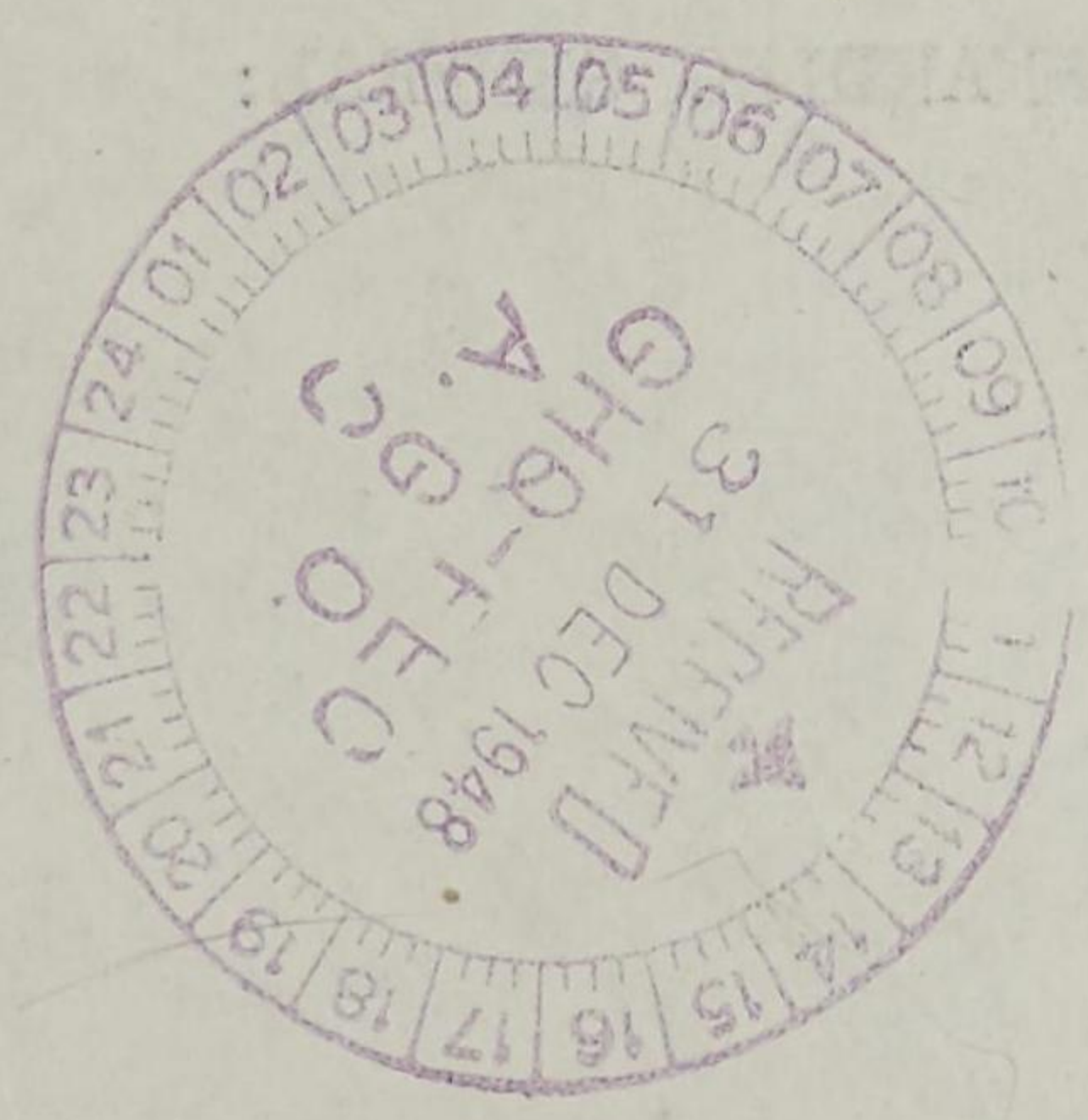
2. It is recognized that data furnished by subject report, containing data of storage operations in overseas commands may be of some value to the Department of the Army, but it appears doubtful that this data could be used to any material advantage by this command.

3. Storage facilities in Japan are of a temporary nature and are not consistent with the standard installations in the Zone of Interest. Storage operations in this command may be modified to conform to available storage facilities and because of this it seems doubtful that information furnished would be of much value to the Department of the Army as a part of the overall Army storage plan.

4. Due to critical shortage of trained personnel in this command, the compiling of this report would be a difficult task. Personnel in the Technical Service Group, whom this report would be made, are practically all indigenous personnel, and not easily trained for a job of this type.

5. Information concerning [illegible] operations required by this headquarters for operational and planning purposes is currently being obtained through internal reports and surveys.

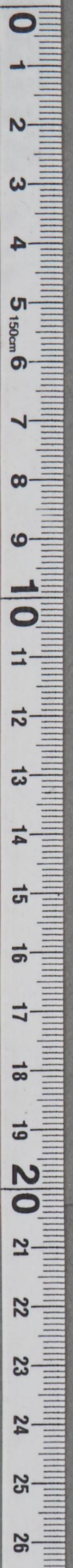
2. The submission of the quarterly Depot Space and Operating Report, Reports Control Symbol CSGSP-61 (R2), for the technical service depots in the Marianas-Bonins Command is not recommended.

3. In this connection, the following general conditions exist which are considered to limit the value of such a report:

a. All of the technical service supply depots in the Marianas-Bonins Command consist of interim-type warehouses.

b. Huge quantities of re-distribution cargo which have been received by the technical service depots during the past year has resulted in the accumulation of large quantities of supplies and equipment in outside storage which have not been completely segregated or inventoried.

c. Lack of properly trained personnel hampers the accomplishment of b above, and necessitates the directing of all efforts to properly accounting for such supplies, which is the primary interest of this command.

a. Report will be submitted quarterly instead of monthly; e.g., a report covering January, February, and March operations would show space entries as of 31 March and the tonnage data pertaining to receipts, shipments, rewarehousing, and backlog processed as a total for the 3 months.

b. The other forms mentioned in the memorandum (DA AGO Forms 566 and 567) will be prepared by Director, Logistics, General Staff, United States Army, Supply Group, directly from the reports submitted by the oversea commands.

3. Comments and recommendations pertaining to this procedure will be forwarded to the Director, Logistics, General Staff, United States Army, Attention: Supply Group, to reach that office on or before 31 January 1949.

MONTHLY DEPOT SPACE AND OPERATING REPORT
(REPORTS CONTROL SYMBOL CSGSP-61 (R2))

1. General. This memorandum governs the preparation of the Monthly Depot Space and Operating Report (DA AGO Form 808) (Revised), Reports Control Symbol CSGSP-61 (R2), 1 September 1948. Compliance with this memorandum is mandatory with the filing of the report for the month of September 1948. Prior approval of the Director, Logistics, General Staff, United States Army, is required for all deviations from this procedure.

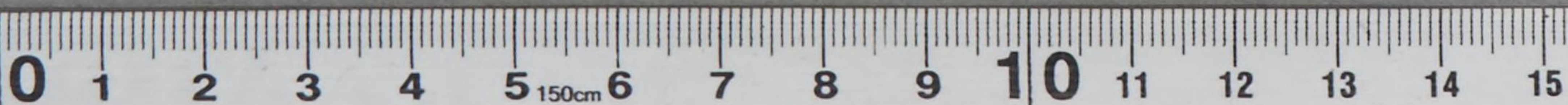
2. Purpose. This report provides uniform data on space and operating conditions at general depots, administrative and technical service depots, and ports of embarkation in the zone of the interior.

3. Preparation and distribution of reports. a. The Monthly Depot Space and Operating Report (DA AGO Form 808) will be prepared each month as of the last day of the month by each adjutant general and technical service section of a general depot; each headquarters section of a general depot; each adjutant general depot; each technical service depot, subinstallation, and port of embarkation. Dispersed storage locations, not designated as subinstallations, will be reported separately and also included in a consolidated report for the installation. Example: Stockton, Stockton Field, and Tracy areas will be reported separately and also consolidated under Stockton General Depot. Each reporting installation which handles both ammunition and general supplies will, in addition, submit a supplementary report on this form, showing all space occupied by ammunition and pyrotechnics (all columns of items 11 and 20), tonnage handled (all columns of item 26), and unidentified or unclassified property (lines A and B of item 27).

b. The adjutant general and technical service supply officers will submit the monthly depot space and operating report to the commanding officer of the general depot (two copies) and to the head of the respective technical service or to The Adjutant General (original and two copies). The commanding officer of each general depot will prepare a consolidated report embodying the operation of the entire depot which will be submitted to The Quartermaster General (original and two copies) together with one copy of each of the supporting section reports.

c. The commanding officer of each technical service branch depot, subinstallation and port of embarkation will submit the monthly depot space and operating report (original and two copies) to the head of the appropriate technical service, or in the case of the adjutant general depots, to The Adjutant General.

*This memorandum supersedes Memorandum 700-10-6, 4 August 1947



4. Action by the heads of technical services and The Adjutant General. The heads of technical services and The Adjutant General will check the reports for accuracy and compliance with instructions for their completion and will prepare the following:

- a. A consolidated report on DA AGO Form 808 for technical service sections mentioned in paragraph 3b and all installations referred to in paragraph 3c.
- b. A consolidated report for the installations mentioned in paragraph 3c.
- c. A consolidated report for the supplementary ammunition reports referred to in paragraph 3a.
- d. The tabular pages (DA AGO Forms 566 and 567) for the Progress Report, Section 4-E, Depot Operations, according to instructions contained in paragraph 9.

These consolidated reports and tabular pages (originals and one copy of each) together with the original and one copy of the monthly depot space and operating report from each reporting station will be submitted to the Director, Logistics, General Staff, United States Army, Attention: Supply Group, to reach that office on or before 1600 hours on the 14th day of the month following the report period with the exception of ordnance and Quartermaster reports. The Chief of Ordnance and The Quartermaster General will submit their reports and tabular pages to reach the Director, Logistics, General Staff, United States Army, Attention: Supply Group, on or before 1200 hours on the 15th of the month following the report period. Individual reports for sections of general depots (referred to in par. 3b) will be transmitted by the head of the respective technical service or The Adjutant General. The Quartermaster General in addition to preparing the consolidated reports and tabular pages for quartermaster operations, will prepare the consolidated reports and tabular pages for general depots and for the headquarters sections of the general depots. The Chief of Transportation in addition to preparing the consolidated reports and tabular pages for transportation depot operations, will prepare the consolidated reports and tabular pages for the ports of embarkation.

5. Classification. Monthly depot space and operating reports and tabular pages, when accomplished, will be classified RESTRICTED.

6. Distribution of forms. a. Initial distribution of an estimated 30-day supply of DA AGO Form 808 will be made by The Adjutant General during September. Resupply will be obtained by the reporting installation through normal publications supply channels.

b. Supply of DA AGO Forms 566 and 567, used in the preparation of the tabular pages of the Progress Report, Section 4-E, will be obtained by the heads of technical services and The Adjutant General from The Pentagon Adjutant General Depot.

7. Definitions. For the purpose of compiling this report, the following definitions will be used:

- a. Dispersed storage areas are those portions of a depot or sub-installation that are geographically located away from the main establishment.

b. Subinstallations are those establishments so designated by Department of the Army regulations. (Previously designated as sub-depots.)

c. Storage space is any area constructed or acquired for the storage and issue of supplies and material, or which is in use for that purpose at date of report.

d. Storage building is any building constructed or acquired for the storage of supplies, even though some part or all of it has been diverted to and is used for offices, depot utility storage, repair shops, etc. Buildings constructed or acquired for office buildings, repair shops, depot utility storage buildings, except when they are used in whole or in part for the storage of supplies are not considered storage buildings. The actual area used for such purpose within a building is considered storage space.

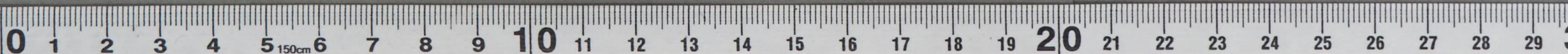
e. Warehouse is a storage building constructed with roof and side walls. It may be one story or more, built at ground level, or elevated to car or truck height. Presence or absence of outside loading platforms has no bearing on the classification.

f. Shed is a storage building without side walls and normally without end walls. Sheds ordinarily, though not necessarily, are built at ground level rather than car or truck level. A building originally constructed as a shed and subsequently closed with side and end walls becomes a warehouse upon completion of alterations and will be reported as such.

g. Open storage is ground area used for storage of supplies and material. It may be specially prepared area, an unimproved area, or an open area in use for storage in lieu of regular storage area. Open storage is reported under two headings: hardstanding and unimproved area. Parking space for employee use, maneuvering space between warehouses, lumber yards for depot use, and other depot utility storage areas, even though having a prepared surface, will not be reported as open storage area unless occupied by supply mission stock, salvage, or surpluses. Cases of doubt should be referred through channels to the Director, Logistics, General Staff, United States Army, Attention: Supply Group, for determination. Once the classification has been established, it will not be changed without prior concurrence of the Supply Group unless through new construction or treatment, the area has actually been physically changed. Such changes should be explained under remarks.

h. Hardstanding is area which has a paved, well-drained surface (asphalt, concrete, and well-prepared, water-bound macadam are examples) or area which has been prepared with topping of some suitable material, or which, because of the nature of the ground (gravel or shale) and special preparation (rolling, draining, grading) gives a surface which permits vehicular traffic under ordinary circumstances, and which lends itself to the storage of supplies on dunnage without danger of sinking of stacks. The fact that during certain seasons, due to weather conditions, operations may be limited does not change the category for reporting purposes.

i. Unimproved open is other open area which can be used for the storage of supplies, but which has not been specially prepared for the storage of supplies.



j. Toxic yard is any open storage area prepared for the storage of toxic materials. It will be included in the hardstanding figures.

k. Igloos and magazines are storage structures above and below ground, constructed for the storage of ammunition and explosives. These structures will be reported as igloos and magazines whether or not ammunition and explosives are actually stored in them. Under no circumstances will igloos and magazines be reported as warehouse space. Conversely, warehouses containing ammunition will not be reported as igloos and magazines. Occupancy of igloos and magazines will be computed to include that area utilized as access aisle space contiguous to materials stored. The balance unoccupied will be reported as vacant.

1. Open ammunition space is ground area prepared or improvised for storage of ammunition in open areas to supplement igloo and magazine space. It consists of prepared or improvised surfaces with or without roofing, barricaded sides, etc. The gross area of this space includes only the actual open storage space (pads) prepared or improvised for ammunition storage. It does not include surrounding area restricted for storage because of safety-distance factors.

m. Allocated space is that space which Logistics Division, General Staff, United States Army, designates for use by an agency. The assignment of buildings or areas within the allocation is the responsibility of the heads of technical services or The Adjutant General.

n. Aisles are those areas which are used for main passageways, cross aisles, and other access and fire aisles.

o. Receiving and shipping areas are operational areas, other than aisle space which are necessary in moving supplies in and out of the depot. Storage space used for the temporary storage of supplies awaiting shipping instructions will not be included as shipping area.

p. Bin storage is area occupied by bins of a permanent or semi-permanent nature. It is area usually set aside for storage of parts and small items. Box pallets and pallet racks are not bins and the area occupied by box pallets is not bin area.

q. Net usable general storage space is that portion of total gross storage space on which supplies can actually be stored. However, it does not include bin storage space, aisles, receiving and shipping area, and overhead space such as offices, cafeterias, etc.

r. Surplus property for this report is property which has been determined surplus by an authorized agency of the Department of the Army, which has been declared as surplus which is still physically located at the reporting installation. Space occupied by sample items displayed for customer inspection will not be included.

s. Gross space. All items designated as "gross" will be computed as follows: by using inside dimensions of buildings, by using overall measurements of the open hardstanding storage area with no deductions for trackage and permanent roads, by using only the actual open storage space (pads) for open ammunition space. All space entries will be made in thousands of square feet adjusted to the nearest thousand; e.g., seven hundred fifty-three thousand, five hundred (753,500) will be written 754.

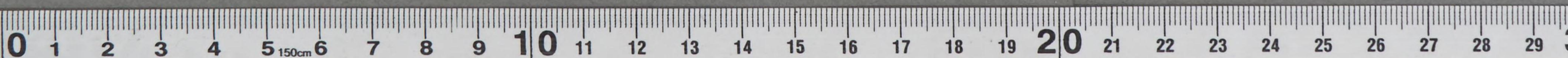
t. Tonnage will be reported to the nearest ton (one short ton equals 2000 lbs.). Tonnage is to be reported when received, when shipped, and moved within the depot (intra-depot movements). Do not include any freight which is received in the depot and reconsigned without loading or unloading. Freight movements that are merely entered on depot records for accountability purposes and are not handled by the depot will not be included.

8. Instructions for preparation of the Monthly Depot Space and Operating Report (DA AGO Form 808), a. Item 1, total gross storage space. Enter the total of items 2 and 3. Sections of general depots and technical services reporting space allocated to them in a branch depot administered by another service will leave this line blank. The total gross storage space at a general depot is reported only on the consolidated report submitted by the depot commander. Likewise, the total gross storage space at a branch depot or port, if jointly occupied, is reported only on the report of the depot commander. The sum of the entries for item 1 will equal the entry for item 23D. If space at a general depot is allocated to the depot headquarters (as distinguished from space allocated to the technical service sections at the depot) a separate report will be prepared by the headquarters section showing all items except 1, 2, and 23.

b. Item 2, Gross storage space allocated to agencies other than Department of the Army agencies. Enter the total gross storage space of buildings and open space allocated to all agencies which are not Department of the Army agencies. Unimproved space (column 5) will include the total space occupied and vacant which is allocated to other than Army agencies. All space reported on this line will be analyzed on the reverse side of the form in the space provided. The analysis will include a breakdown by type of space showing the amount of space which is allocated to and operated by or for the various enumerated agencies. The total line of the analysis should equal the entries for item 2.

c. Item 3, gross storage space allocated to Department of the Army agencies. Enter the total gross storage space of buildings and open space allocated to Army agencies. Unimproved space (column 5) will include the total space occupied and vacant which is allocated to Army agencies. The space reported on this line (including space of the reporting agency) will be analyzed on the reverse side of the report in the space provided. The analysis will include a breakdown by type of space showing the amount of space which is allocated to, operated by, and operated for the various enumerated services or agencies having personnel or supplies in the depot. The total line of the analysis should equal the entries for item 3. (This item and the analysis are the first entries made by the sections of general depots and technical services reporting space allocated to them in a branch depot administered by another service.)

d. Item 4, gross storage space operated by reporting agency. Each reporting agency will enter the gross storage space which is being operated. Included in this figure will be space allocated to agencies other than Department of the Army (item 2) and space allocated to

other Department of the Army agencies (item 3) which is operated by the reporting agency. (Space operated by other Army agencies is not reported.) Entries for the consolidated report prepared by general depots will be the total of headquarters and section reports.

e. Item 5, nonstorage space. Enter that part of item 4 taken up by nonstorage space in accordance with the following classifications:

All space reported on this line will be analyzed on the reverse side of the report in the space provided. The analysis will include the breakdown between structural (permanent) and other and structural (temporary) space as to type of space. Do not enter aisles or receiving and shipping areas for this item. Sections at general depots will not report service areas such as LCL (less than carload) rooms, assembly areas, etc., which are shared in common with other tenant services. Such areas, when located in storage buildings, will be reported on the report by the depot commander, and explained in a footnote. The total of the entries of the analysis will equal the entries for item 5.

f. Item 6, space available for storage. Subtract entries for item 5 from entries for item 4 and enter the results in item 6 in the appropriate columns.

g. Item 7, bin storage space. Enter that portion of item 6 which is used for bin storage in warehouses. This will be the total bin area, including aisles. Do not include any unit assembly, packing, or crating rooms. These should be entered in item 5.

h. Item 8, aisles. Enter that portion of item 6 which is taken up by aisles (other than aisles in bin area). Include fire aisles when there are any. This space figure will be arrived at by actual measurement, not by estimation.

i. Item 9, receiving and shipping areas. Enter that portion of item 6 which is taken up by receiving and shipping areas. This space figure will be arrived at by actual measurement, not by estimation.

j. Item 10, net usable general storage space. Enter the amount of space on which supplies can actually be stored. Obtain by subtracting the sum of items 7, 8, and 9 from the entries for item 6.

k. Item 11, occupied. Subtract the entries for item 12 (total vacant) from the entries for item 10 and enter the results in the appropriate columns.

l. Item 12, total vacant. Enter the sum of the entries for items 13 and 14 in the appropriate columns.

m. Item 13, actual vacant. Enter that portion of item 10 not occupied by supplies in storage. Short space in front of a stack which can be used only to store supplies identical with those in the stack and space to which access is blocked by supplies will not be included in actual vacant space.

n. Item 14, potential vacant. Enter that portion of item 10 (not including item 13) which would be made vacant if the stock on hand were stacked to its maximum height as limited by floor load, ceiling height, strength of package and commodity characteristics. Advisability or practicability of rewarehousing at time of report will not be considered in arriving at this figure. Enter also short spaces in front of stacks which cannot be used for storage of supplies other than identical sizes, lots, etc., and space to which access is blocked by supplies. Included in potential vacant will be unoccupied storage areas undergoing repair or alteration and not immediately available for use as well as hardstanding space not usable because of weather conditions due to heavy rainfall or heavy snowfall which would make access to and movement in the space difficult or impossible. If this situation exists with regard to any hardstanding space which is not occupied by supplies, it is to be reported as potential vacant during the period in which the area cannot be operated. When the area again becomes available for use due to melting of snow, subsidence of flood waters, or improvement in any conditions which have adversely affected the space, the hardstanding is reported in the normal fashion. Brief explanation will be made in a footnote.

o. Item 15, amount of item 1 which is leased. Enter in the appropriate columns the amount of item 1, total gross storage space, which is leased by the Federal Government. Leased storage space which is being inactivated will be reported in items 1 through 15 until such time as the leased space has actually been declared surplus to the Corps of Engineers. Changes in this entry will be explained on reverse of Form 808. The explanation will include information as to lease number or numbers and gross square feet involved in each lease. Technical service sections of general depots and technical services reporting allocated space in a branch depot administered by another service will leave this line blank.

p. Item 16, amount of item 11 occupied by surplus property. Enter that portion of item 11 occupied by supplies declared surplus to a disposal agency. Do not include surplus supplies of nominal value which were declared to the depot salvage officer for local disposal.

q. Item 17, amount of item 11 occupied by household goods. Enter that portion of item 11 occupied by household goods and personal equipment.

r. Item 18, amount of item 11 occupied by salvage property. Enter that portion of item 11 occupied by property that has been abandoned, discarded, condemned, or captured for scrapping, reclaiming, or other disposition.



s. Item 19, amount of item 11 occupied by strategic and critical materials. Enter that portion of item 11 occupied by strategic and critical materials being stored for account of Treasury Department, Bureau of Federal Supply.

t. Item 20, amount of item 11 occupied by unidentified or unclassified property. Enter that portion of item 11 occupied by unidentified, unsorted, or unclassified property. For the purpose of this report, property will be considered as unidentified or unclassified until such time as it is ready for issue as serviceable without repairs or unserviceable but repairable, or is classified as salvage or surplus.

u. Item 21, amount of item 11 occupied by unserviceable but repairable property. Enter that portion of item 11 occupied by property that has been classified as unserviceable but repairable.

v. Item 22, amount of item 11 occupied by other nonissuable goods. Enter that portion of item 11 occupied by goods of a nature unsuitable for military issue other than the space occupied by materials listed above in items 17 through 21. Explain in footnote on reverse.

w. Item 23, total space. Total space is the sum of lines A, B, C, and D. Sections of general depots (including the headquarters sections) and technical services reporting space allocated to them in a branch depot administered by another service will leave these entries blank. The total space at a general depot is reported only on the consolidated report submitted by the depot commander. Likewise, the total space at a branch depot if jointly occupied, is reported only on the report of the depot commander. If a depot has a dispersed area located elsewhere than at a class II installation, these items will include the space at the dispersed location.

- (1) Line A, gross manufacturing space. Enter the total gross space of buildings and open space allocated for manufacturing purposes.
- (2) Line B, gross administration space. Enter the total gross space of buildings allocated for administrative purposes.
- (3) Line C, gross maintenance space. Enter the total gross space of buildings and open space allocated for maintenance purposes including space used for in-storage-maintenance.
- (4) Line D, gross storage space. Enter the total gross space of buildings and open space allocated for storage purposes. Igloo and magazine space will be included in columns 2 and 3 (covered) and open ammunition in columns 4 and 5 (open).

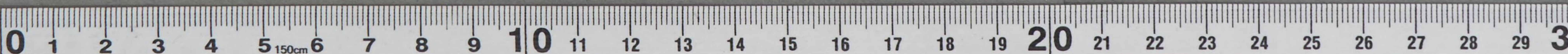
x. Item 24, total tonnage received. Total tonnage received at the depot or port of embarkation is the sum of Lines A, B, C, D, E, F, G, H, and I.

- (1) Line A, from procurement. That portion of tonnage received from manufacturers, Government arsenals, loading plants, and other suppliers of goods to the Army. Exclude line H tonnage.
- (2) Line B, zone of interior returns. That portion of tonnage which was returned from the zone of interior. Exclude line H tonnage.

- (3) Line C, oversea returns. That portion of tonnage which was returned from oversea commands. Exclude line H tonnage.
- (4) Line D, from depots. That portion of tonnage which was received from other sections of general depots and branch depots. Exclude line H tonnage.
- (5) Line E, S, and C materials. That portion of tonnage received for account of Treasury Department, Bureau of Federal Supply, consisting of strategic and critical materials.
- (6) Line F, foreign aid. That portion of tonnage which was received (primarily at ports of embarkation) for shipment overseas under the Foreign Aid Programs: e.g., GARIOA which includes SIM (surplus materials), SX (trust fund program), and SRE (reeducation and orientation materials); SEC (Economic Cooperation Administration); IRO (International Refugee Organization); Greek and Turkish aid; Western Hemisphere program; China program; etc.
- (7) Line G, household goods and personal effects. That portion of tonnage which was received (primarily at ports of embarkation) of household goods and personal effects for shipment to Army personnel (civilian and military).
- (8) Line H, operating supplies. All tonnage of coal, oil, packing and crating materials (including lumber), building materials, commissary and sales stores, etc., required for administrative activities.
- (9) Line I, other. Any tonnage received which is not included in lines A, B, C, D, E, F, G, or H. Receipts of non-Army and nonmission supplies will be included in this entry. Significant tonnages will be explained in "Remarks."

y. Item 25, total tonnage shipped. Total tonnage shipped out of the depot or port of embarkation is the sum of lines A, B, C, D, E, F, G, H, and I.

- (1) Line A, to ports of embarkation. That portion of tonnage (excluding line G) shipped to eastern, gulf, and western ports of embarkation and aerial ports of embarkation for trans-shipment overseas. Shipments of Army supplies to oversea ports of debarkation by the ports of embarkation will be included in this entry.
- (2) Line B, to installations. That portion of tonnage shipped to Army class I and class II installations (including ports of embarkation) and Air Force installations for their use and consumption. Do not include tonnage shipped to depots (reported in line C below), tonnage shipped to manufacturing facilities, or tonnage shipped to stations for storage on depot accountability.
- (3) Line C, to depots. That portion of tonnage (excluding line B) which was shipped to other branch depots or supply sections of general depots for depot stock.



- (4) Line D, surplus shipped. That portion of tonnage shipped which consists of surplus property shipped out of the depot or port of embarkation during the report period.
- (5) Line E, salvage shipped. That portion of tonnage shipped which consists of salvage items shipped out of the depot or port of embarkation.
- (6) Line F, S, and C materials. Include that portion of tonnage shipped which consists of Treasury Department, Bureau of Federal Supply, strategic and critical materials shipped out of the depot during the report period.
- (7) Line G, foreign aid. That portion of tonnage which consists of goods for the Foreign Aid Programs: e.g., GARIOA which includes SIM (surplus materials), SX (trust fund program), and SRE (reeducation and orientation materials); SEC (Economic Cooperation Administration); IRO (International Refugee Organization); Greek and Turkish aid; Western Hemisphere aid; China program; etc.
- (8) Line H, household goods and personal effects. That portion of tonnage which consists of household goods and personal effects shipped out of the depot or port of embarkation.
- (9) Line I, other. Any tonnage shipped which is not included in lines A, B, C, D, E, F, G, and H above. Significant tonnages will be explained under "Remarks."
- z. Item 26, total tonnage handled. Enter the total tonnage received and shipped (item 24 plus item 25) in column 3. The total rewarehousing tonnage will be entered in column 4. Any tonnage that is moved within the depot; e.g., tonnage moved from open space to covered space, tonnage moved within covered or open space, tonnage moved from a dispersed storage area to the main depot or port of embarkation, restacking of supplies, etc., comprises rewarehousing tonnage. Enter the sum of columns 3 and 4 in column 2.
- aa. Item 27, unidentified or unclassified property (backlog).
- (1) Line A, unidentified or unclassified property. Enter in column 2 the tonnage involved for the amount of unidentified or unclassified property reported for item 20. For the entry in column 3, determine the number of man-days it would take to clear up this backlog, under normal operations of the depot or port. Man-days will be computed to the nearest whole number.
- (2) Line B, backlog processed during month. Enter the tonnage of unidentified or unclassified property processed during the report period.
- ab. Item 28, surplus property status.
- (1) Line A, total in depot. Enter the tonnage involved for surplus property reported for item 16.
- (2) Line B, surplus awaiting shipment. Enter that portion of the total tonnage of surplus property for which complete shipping instructions have been received but which had not been shipped out of the depot as of the last day of the month.

9. Instructions for preparation of the tabular pages. a. All data will be taken or derived from the Monthly Depot Space and Operating Reports (DA AGO Form 808) received by the head of the technical service and The Adjutant General from the installations under his command.

b. Full use will be made of the "Remarks" column of the report to supplement or clarify conditions reflected therein which will assist all concerned to interpret same properly. Special features in the month's operation requiring additional explanation will be forwarded in letter of transmittal.

c. The heads of technical services and The Adjutant General are responsible for the accuracy and appearance of these pages.

d. Preparation of the tabular pages will include typing the final copy for photographic reproduction. Typing will be clear, clean, and sharp and figures will be in exact alignment and centered within the cells. Paste-over corrections will be made carefully and the pages will not contain smudges.

e. In transmittal of these tabular pages, care will be exercised to prevent creasing; sheets should be rolled and not folded.

f. Data contained on the tabular pages will be presented by depot for the three most recent months (in reverse chronological order). The name of the preparing agency will appear in item 1, column 1 of the report, i.e., "Chemical Corps," "Corps of Engineers," etc. Succeeding columns of item 1 will be left blank. The heading "Grand Total" will appear as the next listing. The depots will be listed alphabetically within two groups. The first group will be headed "Branch Depots" and will include branch depots, subinstallations, and dispersed areas. The second group will be headed "Sections of General Depots" and will list the sections and dispersed areas of general depots. A subtotal for each group will be shown as well as a grand total for the preparing agency. Each depot or subinstallation having a dispersed location will be shown with a depot or subinstallation total and an entry for each location; the entries will add to the depot or subinstallation total. The name and location of the depot or subinstallation will be indented two spaces under the total listing and the name and location of the dispersed location will be indented four spaces under the total listing, i.e.

Names and locations of subinstallations will be indented two spaces and will be entered on the tabular pages following the parent depot.

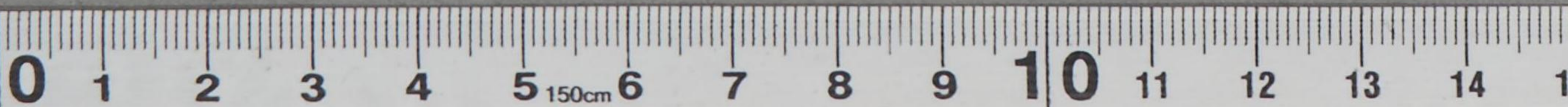

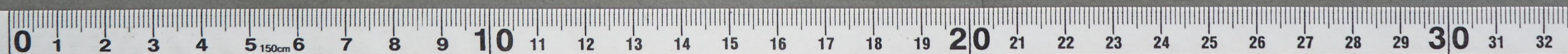
