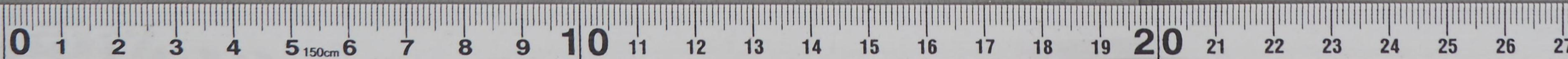

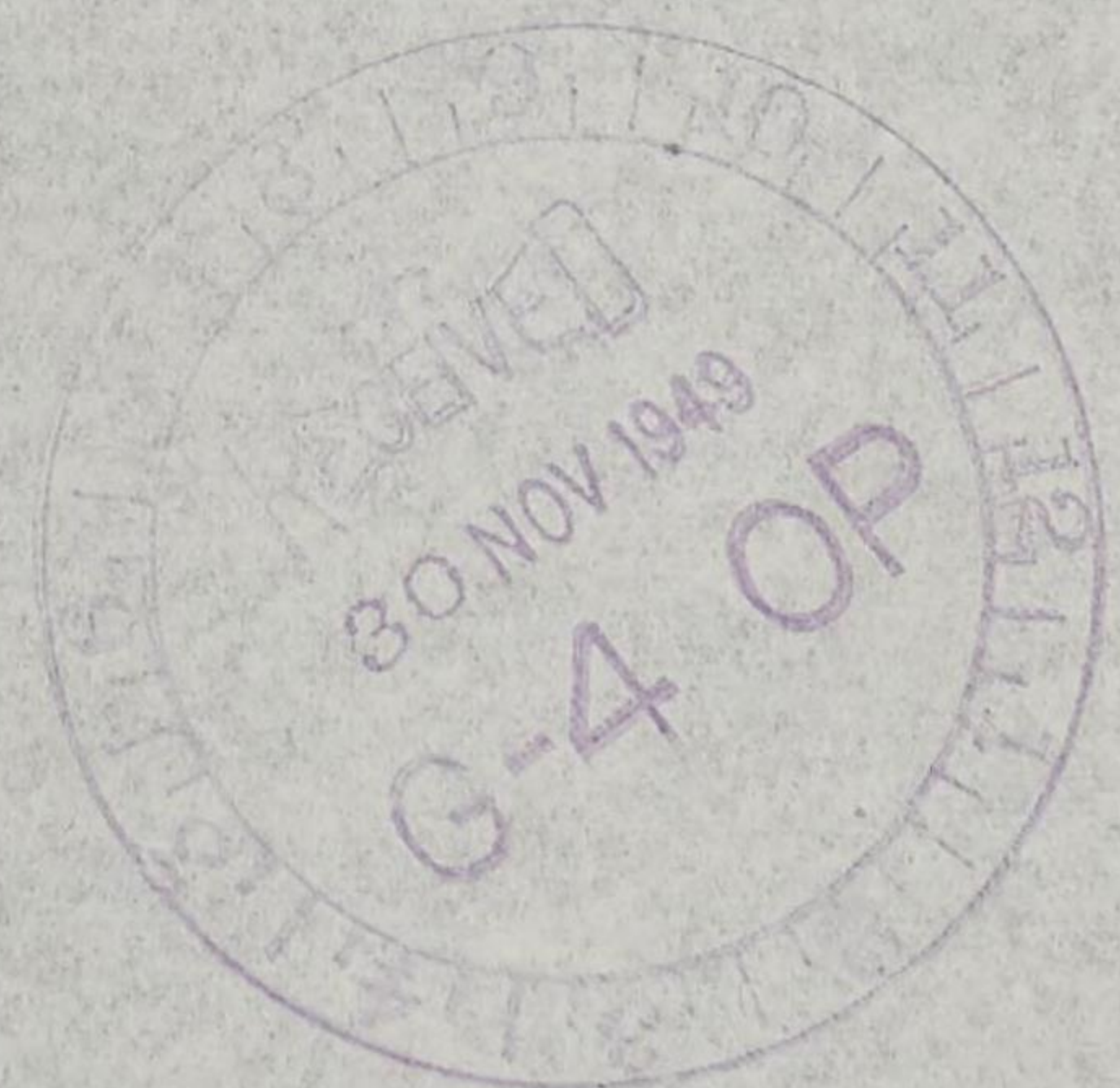

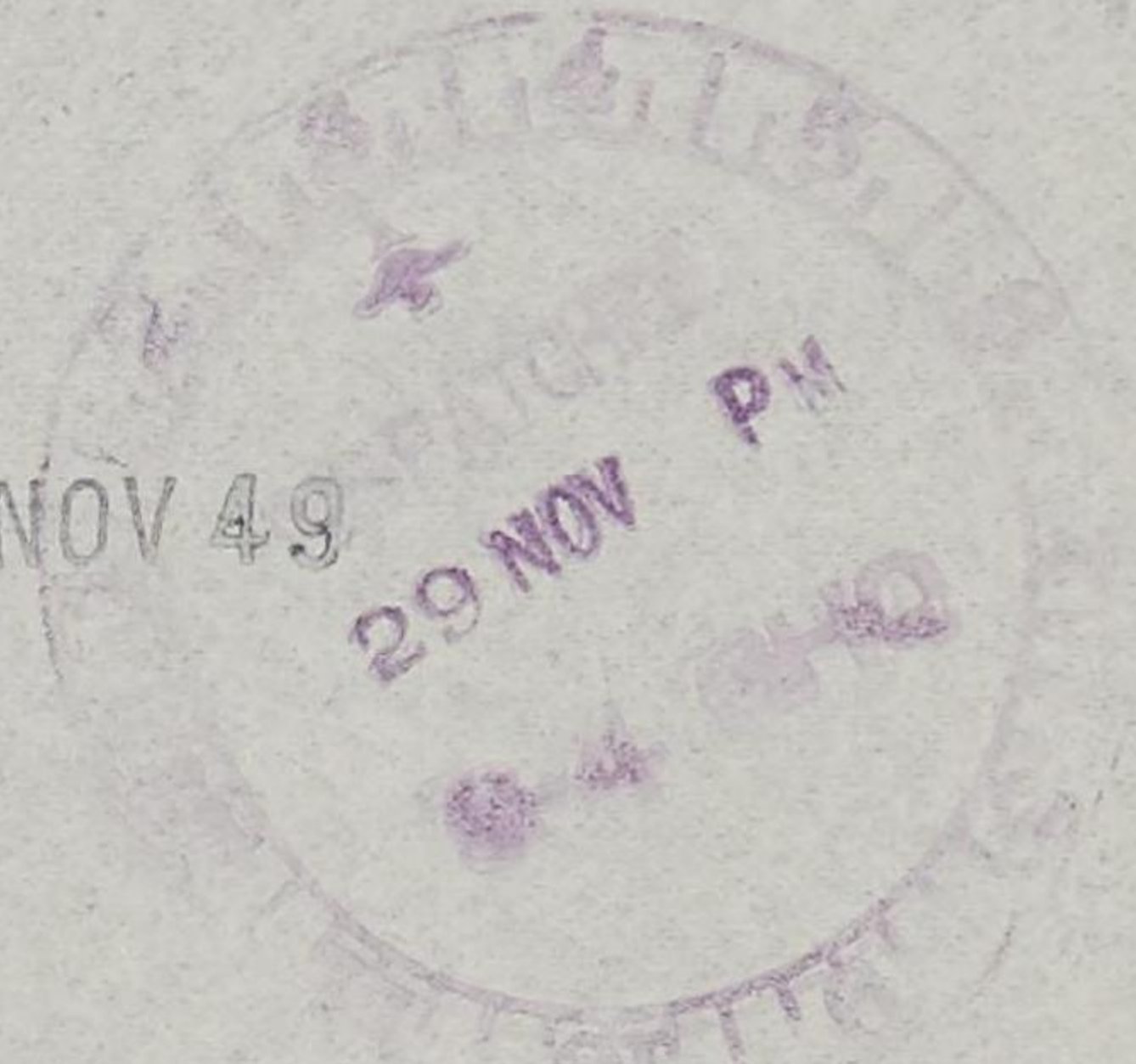

1. Biological items contained on the attached list may be requested from Eighth Army at semi-monthly periods or less frequently, as required. No restriction is placed on the quantities that may be requisitioned at any one time but in case quantities greatly in excess of the amounts listed are needed, Eighth Army will be informed sufficiently in advance of the required date in order that proper amounts may be obtained from the zone of interior. In event your command requires annual vaccination or inoculation of all personnel at a specific time, it will be necessary to inform Eighth Army at least 90 days in advance of such period in order that stock levels may be increased to supply your demands.

2. Requisitions will ordinarily be submitted on the prescribed forms by letter mail direct to the Commanding Officer, 5th Medical Depot, APO 503. However, in event it is necessary to submit special requisitions for items required in emergency, radio or other means of communication may be utilized.

3. Due to the fact that items listed require refrigeration and deteriorate at a rapid rate when removed from cold storage, shipment will be made by air in all cases. The required air priority will be established by the requisitioning agency and will be noted on all requisitions submitted.

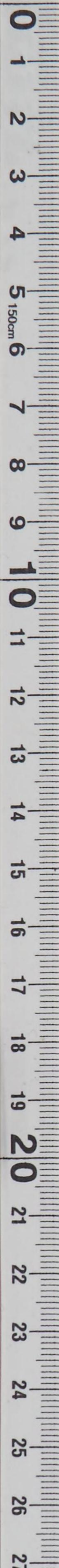

M/R: Previously, Rycom has ordered the listed biologicals direct from the ZI and has maintained 60-day stock levels on each item. Storage has been a problem in Rycom due to the frequent power failures resulting in loss of biologicals due to lack of refrigeration. In order to prevent such losses, it is deemed necessary to reduce the stock levels at Rycom to approximately 15 days and to permit requisitioning from 8th Army where fairly large stocks of these items are maintained at all times. Correspondence has been routed through 8th Army in this instance to inform them of the decision and the provisions for proper requisitioning.

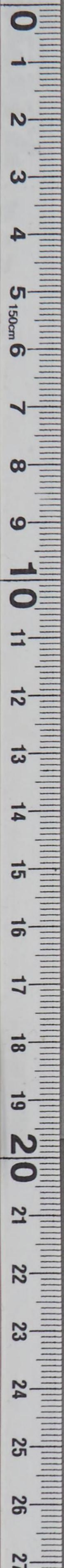

For CSUSA and CSPID. Re W-96747, 22 Nov 49. Reference Time story on Okinawa this headquarters does not contemplate any public comment. Answers to your four queries are in the order listed in cited radio.

1. a. Army, Navy and Air Force troop strength in Okinawa is approximately 18,000.

b. Discipline is not unsatisfactory. The discipline of combat troops is excellent. Morale has been lower than desirable, but for reasons enumerated herein, and is now satisfactory. In considering this problem it must be understood that troops on Okinawa have lived for over four years under conditions which existed at the termination of the campaign there in 1945 and with most improvements being furnished by the resourcefulness and ingenuity of the personnel serving on Okinawa. The existing conditions are known to the several senior Army officials and other distinguished persons recently visiting that command. GHQ has always given and will continue to give maximum assistance possible to RYCOM in its many and varied problems. The unique conditions which exert an adverse influence on discipline and morale are:

(1) Complete absence of normal urban recreational facilities.

(2) Substandard living conditions due to lack of necessary permanent construction and damage of recurrent typhoons.

(3) Paucity of military recreational facilities other than motion pictures.

(4) Long separation from families due to lack of sufficient quarters for married personnel.

(5) Wide dispersion of facilities which will be corrected upon completion of permanent construction program now being implemented

(6) Lack of a uniform spread of qualified leaders.

c. With reference to the characterization "natives who live in hopeless poverty", it is emphasized that at the beginning of the occupation in Okinawa all housing and public buildings had been almost completely destroyed. No land was being cultivated thus making it necessary to furnish 95% of the food requirements for the Okinawans the first year. This condition has improved to the extent that all Okinawans with few exceptions are now living in shelter comparable except for durability to that occupied prior to the war, this in addition to the more than one hundred thousand Okinawans repatriated in 1946. Now 70% of the arable land is under cultivation with the result that only approximately 35% of the required basic ration must be furnished by the occupation.

2. The answer to para 2 is contained in CINCFE rad C-52635, 21 September 1949.

3. During 1948 and until March 1949 RYCOM had a comparatively low VD rate, consistently lower than the overall FEC rate. The rate began a sharp increase in April 1949 exceeding the overall FEC rate. Although the RYCOM VD rate continues to be higher than that for FEC, as a whole, the Sept and Oct 49 rates show a cumulative decrease of more than 100/1000 per annum. The Oct VD Incidence data have been forwarded the DA. Indications are that the Nov rate continues on a downward trend. Several important factors contributing to the high VD rate in RYCOM: There is no ban on fraternization in the Ryukyus Command. A decided upswing in the VD rate resulted when colored troops were transferred to Okinawa from Guam. (VD rates for colored troops averages more than double the white rate which include both PS and white US troops during 48 and 49). AF rate averaged about 5 points lower than Army for the same period. Surprise command-wide physical inspections resulted in the discovery of numbers of previously unreported cases. No opportunity exists for personnel to obtain treatment by civilian sources as they are not available in Okinawa; consequently all VD cases become a matter of record.

4. The figures quoted in DA radio, paragraph 4, are at a wide variance with the actual and factual statistics which show that during this period five alleged murders, four alleged rapes, three alleged robberies and seventeen alleged assaults were reported by the PM, RYCOM; one alleged murder, four alleged rapes, four alleged robberies and six alleged assaults were reported by the Air PM, in Okinawa. This makes a total of six alleged murders, eight alleged rapes, seven alleged robberies and twenty-three alleged assaults for both the Army and Air Forces during this period.

It is significant to note that during this period, April to September 1949, inclusive:

- a. The Okinawa police reported only three murders and eight rapes.
- b. Soldier guards killed fourteen Okinawans attempting to escape when discovered stealing US supplies.

c. Due to road conditions, the accident rate in Okinawa was higher than ordinary and an intensive drive for correction was made with subsequent high numbers of arrests for traffic accidents and fatalities.

Fatalities other than murder were included in a memorandum which was published by RYCOM on 17 Oct 49.

During this period, 13 whites (12 Army, 1 Air Force) were arrested, suspected of murder; 11 whites (Army) were arrested, suspected of rape; 2 whites (Air Force) were arrested, suspected of robbery; 19 whites (17 Army, 2 Air Force) and 1 Negro (Army) were arrested, suspected of assault.

Some of these crimes originally reported as murder were later changed to manslaughter, suicide, justifiable homicide, or accidental death. Allegations of rape includes incidents involving surprised acts of fornication as well as complaints made by prostitutes in instances of non-payment implying that such non-payment justifies a charge of rape. Many allegations of robbery developed as larceny or only an incident of lost or mislaid property.

Reference the trial of alleged offenders, the Staff JA, RYCOM on TDY Okinawa, is an experienced member of the JA Section furnished by this General Headquarters. He states that military justice has been properly and adequately administered by Headquarters, RYCOM during period 1 July to the present. This statement verified and fully adopted by this General Headquarters.

During the period April - September, 18 Army and 10 Air Force trials by general court were held on Okinawa. Included among the Army cases were the following (offenses not necessarily committed within the period April - September)

Murder - convictions: one; acquittals; one (involving 4 accused)

Manslaughter - convictions; two; acquittals; two.

Robbery - convictions; two; acquittals; none.

Aggravated Assault - convictions; four; acquittals; one.

Rape - No trials reported during this period, however, since September one white soldier has been tried and convicted of rape for offense committed during period in question.

It should be noted that above figures do not include trials by special court, normally the proper forum for assault and battery.

Not readily available are comparable Air Force figures and complete Army breakdown by Filipino, Negro, and white.

5. This headquarters has made repeated requests for funds for construction of essential facilities in RYCOM. The following references obtain: AFPAC

Such funds have not been forthcoming because of the previous uncertain status of the Ryukyus Island and the inability of the authorities in Washington to provide for the need indicated by this Headquarters. Recent appropriations will materially benefit present conditions in RYCOM.

6. The DA was informed by a series of radios and by personal representation of the A C/S G-1 of this command that the personnel conditions in Okinawa were not good. (Ref rads Z-40786, 19 Feb 49; CX 69202, 12 Apr 49; C-51543, 27 Jul 49; WCL 48240, 3 Mar 49; W-92123, 3 Jul 49). This exchange of info has continued for ten or more months. It referred to the poor quality of replacements, a serious shortage of non-commissioned officers, and the failure of DA to provide career officers in proportion to those in other commands. The necessity for strong leadership in Okinawa has been constantly emphasized. GHQ, recognizing the seriousness of the lack of qualified personnel, has, thru diversion and reassignment from other FEC areas, raised the quality of Army personnel assigned to RYCOM. However, the limited possibilities of these actions are such that desired results cannot be effected locally. Any substantial improvement will require positive action on the part of the DA to furnish qualified personnel in sufficient numbers to garrison this command properly. Insufficient numbers of qualified officer and enlisted personnel in areas where living conditions are primitive in character, where highest type of leadership is required, provide the basic factors which are conducive of low morale and poor discipline.

GENERAL

1. No plan of operations to accomplish a mission, however good, will succeed unless administration has been emphasized from the start. *Supply discipline goes hand in hand with military discipline.*
2. Equipment and supplies are limited and their availability to this command is even more limited. Funds are not unlimited and the maintenance and reprocessing of supplies and equipment from Island depots is costly.
3. In any operation, transportation, whether by sea, rail, motor vehicle, or air, will *never* be adequate to meet all our requirements.
4. The training of the individual in supply discipline is as important as any other form of training. Your training program will set aside regular periods for this. Prepare what you have to say, your demonstrations, your practical work, as you would for any other training. The support of the men must be won. Ingenuity will be required. Emphasize protecting property in guard duty. Remind each man that he is a taxpayer, quoting prices.
5. The hoarding of supplies and equipment by individuals or organizations results in increasing the supply pipeline and will result in shortages of supplies when most needed.

DO'S AND DONT'S

1. Do not request Army supplies that your unit does not need.
2. Turn in to depots Army property on hand that your unit does not require.
3. Do not permit waste of materials authorized for your unit.
4. Check personally to assure yourself that equipment under your supervision is being given periodic preventive maintenance as prescribed by appropriate Technical Manuals.
5. Take disciplinary action on abuses in supply discipline that you observe in your unit and report abuses outside of your unit to the proper authorities.
6. Train your men so that they know how to care for as well as use all equipment in your unit.
7. Teach your men to realize that damage to equipment caused by abuse on their part will be charged against their pay.
8. Study your list of authorized allowances until you know them as well as you should know your bank balances. (You are subject to disciplinary measures in the event of an over-draft.)

CONCLUSIONS

1. It is not sufficient to have a good "G-4", "S-4" or Supply Sergeant—every man must be something of an "S-4" or Supply Sergeant himself.

1. The following information is submitted reference D/A message W 96304, 9 November 49:

a. Reference paragraph 1. The question has come up on several occasions as to the source of military and civilian spaces that will be required to augment the Okinawa District Engineers staff as well as the FEC Engineers staff. As of now no definite information is available as to the number or qualifications required. This information will not be available until the plans setting up the type organization to be used are completed. It is quite probable that we will have to exceed our present civilian ceilings. It may be necessary to obtain Mr. Vorhees assistance in giving us authority to hire qualified civilian personnel using some of the funds from the military construction appropriation.

b. Reference paragraph 2. G-4 did not include any remark on air transportation to Okinawa on Mr. Martino's memorandum to General Hickey. We have scheduled at the present time a plane daily with the exception of Sunday. In addition, there are frequent flights by GHQ staff planes. This has always been adequate, especially so in view of the limited number of staff visits we have been permitting. G-4 was aware that MATs planned on replacing presently unsuited equipment by December, and if the need should arise, we can schedule additional flights. For the time being no additional flights are required.

c. Reference paragraph 4. G-4 believes this matter was a misunderstanding by Mr. Martino. The question of a possible delay being caused by Bureau of the Budget review was discussed thoroughly by General Hickey, General Christiansen, General Eberle and Mr. Martino. The consensus of opinion was that no appreciable delay would occur. This conclusion was furnished to the Chief of Staff by C/N from G-4 on 28 October 49.

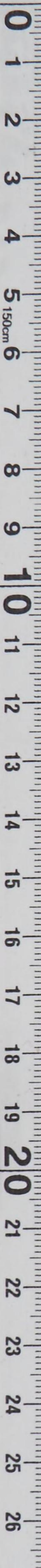
