At present 1,700 tons of coal per month is being produced from the pit and it is included in the total coal production of Tagawa Coal Mine of our company.

Our contract had been made as a temporary measure in the war time and it is now entirely clear that we have to liquidate the subordinate relation with him.

The Job Stabilization Law which was enforced on December 1, 1947 prohibits such a contract by the Art. 44. We, therefore, can not continue the contract with him and must find a way to solve the matter.

Mr. Kakudo wishes he will operate the pit in his own name and account, and we also consider it is a big burden for us to be a risky nominal owner under the present coal price policy.

We urgently wish to dispose the aforementioned mine claim and equipment as we believe it is good for both parties.

1. Following, is a resume of application for opening of a new coal mine and subsequent action taken by all concerned:

a. On 17 December 1945, Mr. MASUO ISHIDA, (Now deceased) No. 111 Hiracho, Sasebo, City, Nagasaki Ken, made application to the Military Government Section of the 2nd Marine Division, to open a new coal mine in Sasebo. Mining area applied for was approximately 1,300,000 tsubo, with expected monthly production of 1,000 tons. Land at that time was considered a part of the Sasebo Naval Arsenal. Application carried a favorable indorsement by the Sasebo Liaison Office.

b. On 20 December 1945, Maj. AMEDEO REA, of the 2nd Marine Division Military Government Section, forwarded a memorandum to the Director of the Sasebo Liaison Office stating: "You are authorized to grant permission to establish the coal mine in your Ltr. No. 104, dtd 17 December 1945. (Letter being application and indorsement noted in a above). In addition, the memorandum stated: "Due to the shortage of coal in Japan, you should take any steps necessary to increase coal production".

c. Upon receipt of the above documents, Mr. ISHIDA filed application with the Kyushu Region Commerce and Industry Bureau, Fukuoka, requesting formal permission to open the mine. Application was addressed to Mr. JIRO HOSHIZIMA, of the Bureau.

BASIC: Ltr, Hqs Nagasaki Mil Govt Team, APO 929, File 463.3, dtd 8 May 1948, subject: "Application for Mining Permit"

The Bureau refused to accept the application, stating that the reason for the refusal was based on item 6 of Article 1, of the "Important Mineral Increase Production Law", which stated; acceptance of application of this nature was prohibited for one year from 1 August 1945. This reply was dated 7 February 1946.

d. In compliance with the above, on 1 August 1946, a second application was submitted to the Commerce and Industry Bureau. This second application was refused due to the period of non-acceptance of applications of this nature being extended for nine additional days. Date of this reply was 2 August 1946.

e. In compliance with the above, on 10 August 1946 a third application was submitted. However, in this application the amount of land applied for was reduced to 342,537 tsubo. In reply to this application, Mr. ISHIDA was told that registered books, documents etc., were destroyed by fire, and it would take some time to handle the application.

f. Mr. ISHIDA is also in receipt of a letter from the Kyushu Region Commerce and Industry Bureau, dated 1 August 1946, and stating the following (Japanese translations):

- (1) "As the prohibition period for the mining is up on 9 August, applications with certificate of time dated after 0001, 10 August, will be accepted."
- (2) "Though there is a letter from the Chief of the Sasebo Liaison Office, permits will be granted to applicants on a priority basis of time received. In your case, no priority will be given in granting a permit."
- (3) "If the applications were of the same dates and time, priority will be given to the application dated of trial mining. (Mr. ISHIDA started trial mining in May 1946)"

g. Up to the present time, verbal negotiations continued with the various people and Bureaus concerned. However in March of 1948, Mr. MASUO ISHIDA died, and his brother and uncle continued negotiations. In March of 1948 the applying parties visited the Kyushu Regional Office of the Commerce and Industry Bureau and discovered the followings:

- (1) Permit number 812, dated 23 February 1947, and covering part of the area Mr. ISHIDA had applied for, was issued to Mr. SUSUMU KAWACHI, of No. 1-36, Fukaemen, Shikamachi, Sasebo.
- (2) Permit number 812, dated in October 1947, and covering part of the area Mr. ISHIDA had applied for, was issued to the Nippon Tanko Kabushiki Kaisha, Fukuoka City.
- (3) The Nakasato Mining Company, Ainoura, Sasebo City, has made application for mining rights in the same area, and it is suspected, will receive priority over the ISHIDA application.
- (4) The applicant was informed by the Commerce and Industry Bureau, that because the two remaining tracts of land is less than 50,000 taubo, there will be difficulty in granting any additional mining permits in this area.

2. Not having access to all the particulars of this case, this headquarters has made no effort to determine the right of the applicant to a mining permit. However, from the information secured and included in the foregoing, it appears that the application has not received the attention rightly due it. Also, it is indicated that other applications are receiving favorable approval, and were filed subsequent, to the filing date of Mr. ISHIDA'S application.

3. It is recommended that this case be investigated at Regional level, to determine the true status of the applicant.

1. This headquarters has interrogated the official of the Kyushu Commerce and Industry Bureau who handled Mr. Ishida's various applications and conferences. The official in question insists that he repeatedly told Mr. Ishida that he should write an application for actual mining rather than trial mining as the regulations give priority to applications for actual mining. Rights were granted to applicants desiring to engage in actual rather than trial mining. The official insists the letter translated in paragraph 1f (3) of basic letter cannot be correct insofar as it indicates priority would be based on date of application for TRIAL mining.

2. Since it appears that the entire issue between Mr. Ishida and the Kyushu Region Commerce and Industry (Japanese) section depends upon whether or not Mr. Ishida was misled into believing an application for trial mining would have equal priority with an application of an actual mining, a copy of the letter and a precise translation is necessary. Request same be forwarded together with comments of Ishida's representatives on explanation given by Japanese official.

SUBJECT: Increased Allocations Essential to Expedite
Coal Transportation on Kyushu

TO : Commanding General, I Corps, APO 301
(Attn: Military Government Section)

1. In connection with the activities of coal production and transportation coordination it has come to the attention of this headquarters that coal production and transportation on Kyushu can be materially expedited by an additional allocation of repair materials to the locomotive and coal car repair shops located on Kyushu.

2. The Wakamatsu repair shop, which is the sole coal car (15 tons only) repair shop on Kyushu, has a potential monthly output of from 325 to 350 cars per month. However, because of the shortage of repair materials only about 225 to 250 cars per month are being repaired. With this repair shop operating at peak production, an increase in repaired rolling stock of approximately 100 cars with a total capacity of 1500 tons can be returned to coal transportation monthly. This would greatly alleviate the present critical shortage of coal cars.

3. Following is an itemized list of the monthly requirements of the Wakamatsu repair shop to maintain peak production. The critically short items are marked with an asterisk (*):

Iron plate	40 tons
*Black paint	375 kg
*White paint	15 kg
Oxygen	500 bottles (4800 lt)
Carbide	250 cans (22½ kg)
Electricity	30,000 kw hrs
Timber	56 cu metres
*Tempering (boiling) oil	400 litres
*Paint dryer	36 litres
Coal	150 tons

4. This repair shop receives its repair materials as reallocated by the JGR in Tokyo, who receives the complete allocation of such materials for all JGR repair shops in Japan. In the past this repair shop has shown commendable production (about 75% of potential peak) with only about 60% of the materials actually needed to reach peak production. This has been accomplished through improvising and strict waste-prevention methods. The figures in paragraph 3 were closely checked by this office and are as nearly correct a forecast as can be arrived at.

Ltr, Kyushu Mil Govt Region, APO 929, subj: "Increased Allocations Essential to Expedite Coal Transportation on Kyushu", dated 26 April 48, cont'd.

5. In addition, the locomotive repair shops on Kyushu have increased the number of locomotives available to such an extent that there is a shortage of coal for operating these locomotives amounting to about 7000 tons per month.

6. The locomotive repair shops on Kyushu are receiving about 90% of all materials needed for maximum output except steel, only 78% of which is supplied.

7. It is strongly recommended that the increased allocations indicated in paragraphs 3 and 5 above be granted as urgently necessary to relieve transportation problems in Kyushu.

1. Reference is made to letter, your headquarters, file AG 453 (3 Feb 48)CTS-R, dated 3 February 1948, subject; "Emergency Program for Repair of Freight Cars."
2. In view of the fact that the Wakamatsu Repair Shop is the only coal car repair shop in Kyushu and an increase in repaired rolling stock would relieve the present shortage of coal transportation facilities in the Kyushu Region, it is recommended that the Japanese Government be instructed to allocate the critically short items listed in paragraph of the basic communication to subject plant.

1. Shortage of steel and other repair materials is general throughout Japan, and as a result, the majority of rolling stock workshops are not able at present to utilize their full capacity.

2. Inclosure 1 attached shows the overall rolling stock repair plan of the Japanese Government Railways for the Fiscal Year 1948-49, and the materials allocated to complete the program. Also shown are repair schedules and material allocations for Moji Division.

3. Inclosure 2 attached shows the repair plan for Wakayama workshop and a comparison of the material requirements recommended in basic communication, with actual allocation made by Japanese Government Railways' Material Bureau.

4. The allocations of materials are based on a projected production program and will necessarily fluctuate according to the fulfillment of the production schedule. Production of critical materials has thus far failed to develop as planned (see Inclosure 3 attached). No increase in actual delivery of materials can be made to the Moji Division at this time without seriously affecting repair programs established in other divisions.

5. Quotas of locomotives and cars to individual shops for repair were based on estimated capacities at the time the plans were formulated. These quotas will be adjusted as more materials become available and plant capacities develop.

6. There is at present a coal stockpile of 12,807 tons in engine sheds in the Moji Division, which is considered adequate to meet operating needs.

1. There are two labor unions in subject mine. The First Union is long established and is connected with Zen Sekitan. The Second Union was formed on 8 January 1948 and is an independent union. The First Union claims a membership of 1,000 of the 2,000 employees at the mine.

2. According to reports reaching this headquarters, the strike developed as follows:

On 18 January, SAKAMOTO, Hayata, arrived at Takashima from the Tokyo headquarters of Zen Sekitan. On 28 January, at 1100, the First Union presented demands to the Company. At 1300, 28 January, the union went on strike. The strike still continues.

3. The union has made the following demands:

- 1) That the Company dissolve the Second Union;
- 2) That the Company remove from office the present chief of its Labor Relations Section;
- 3) ^{previous} Violation of contract by the Company.

4. In regard to these demands, it seems to be beyond the authority of any company to dissolve a union. The third demand is not clearly understood. It appears to be possibly a repetition of the first demand.

5. Before the strike, the Takashima Mine was producing about 800 tons of coal per day. Due to this strike, production

has fallen to about 400 tons per day. In repeated conferences with union officials, this headquarters has pointed out the extreme need at present of sustained production.

6. A visit was paid to this mine in December, 1947, by the Butler Coal Production Team. It appears to be that the Second Union was formed as a result of this visit. The Company and the members of the Second Union were willing to act on the suggestions of Mr. Butler on the matter of increased production and longer working hours. According to reports, the members of the First Union were not. It is reported that, before they struck, they were working eight hours per day while the members of the Second Union were working nine hours per day.

7. It is reported, further, that the First Union received a telegram from Mr. Paul D. Jackson, Labor Relations Office, ESS/CHQ/SCAP, on 30 January, urging them to stop the strike and return to work while negotiations continued. Reports indicate that the First Union rejected this plea and sent such a reply to Mr. Jackson.

8. On 31 January, representatives from this Team went to First Union headquarters at Takashima to investigate reports that the mine might be flooded because of lack of experienced personnel to man the pumps and power station. The First Union at that time promised to furnish 35 skilled men for that purpose. It is understood that 25 of them are now on duty and that no danger of flooding exists. Close surveillance will be kept on that phase of the strike.

9. Neither side in this dispute has appealed to the Ken Labor Relations Committee for conciliation. Both sides seemed determined not to give in.

10. It is the conclusion of this headquarters that:

- a) Insufficient time was given to the Company to consider the demands;
- b) That it is extremely doubtful that a general meeting of all the First Union members had any chance to take a fair strike vote;
- c) It was unnecessary to call a strike in order to settle this dispute;
- d) In reference to the union's disregard of pleas to return to work it seems to be indifferent to

1. In compliance with telephone instructions from office of Lt. Col. Nelson, Military Government Section, I Corps, inclosures 1 to 5 are forwarded.
2. Inclosures 1 to 5 are individual reports from Fukuoka, Saga and Nagasaki Military Government Teams on coal shipments to Korea during June, July and August. Inclosure 4 shows general shipping schedules (quotas and actual shipments) from all ports Kyushu during June, July and August. Inclosure 5 shows shipping plan for September.
3. Reports from teams indicate that failure to meet shipping schedules are due to following reasons:
 - a. Failure of ships to arrive on schedule
 - b. Delays due to ships being in need of repair
 - c. Delays in loading due to bad weather
 - d. Cargo assigned ship is greater than actual capacity
 - e. Occasional failure of Japanese to comply with loading plan indicated in paragraph 4 below.
4. Japanese are required by Military Government Teams to keep one shipload of coal always ready at loading dock for loading on vessels arrival and to load on 24 hour basis including Sundays.
5. Military Government Teams, Kyushu, have been given renewed instructions to maintain strict surveillance of coal shipments to Korea and to report any delays in meeting schedules and reasons therefore.
