

Replace **YOURID** with the Piwik ID for your country. Get the ID for your country at http://commons.wikimedia.org/wiki/Commons:Wiki_Loves_Monuments_2012/FAQ#Can_I_track_the_visits_of_my_country_website.3F

Put this code in every page of your website, just before the closing `</body>` tag.


For Wordpress, edit the **footer.php** via the wp-admin backend:

- Click Appearance → Editor

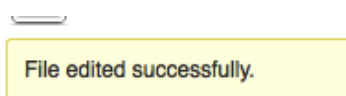
