





#### TODAY'S GAME

Back before the current college set wore its first safety pins, back before the market crash and the WPA and nuclear fission, Vanderbilt last defeated Tulane in a football game. That was in 1928 and the score was 13-6. Since then the Commodores from Tennessee have tried seven times to do it again with the sole consolation of a 6-6 tie in 1932.

They will try once more this afternoon, on Tulane's Homecoming Day, and it is quite possible that they finally will succeed. Like Green Wave engagements for the past four weeks, this one is a toss-up to be taken by the team that is better prepared.

Although still bedeviled by injuries, the Greenies could not completely blame ill fortune for their 27-6 loss to Kentucky last week. The simple fact was that the hill men beat them to the draw, shredding dreams of extending victories over Auburn and Mississippi State into a season-ending winning streak. Today Coach Raymond (Bear) Wolf's sharpies will have to be considerably faster on the uptake.

For Vandy has been appearing more formidable by the Saturday. Two weeks ago Coach Bill Edwards' boys gave Washington and Lee a fearsome 67-7 shellacking. Last time out they downed Miami, 9-0. Before that they had picked up considerable prestige with a 20-13 triumph over Florida and ties with Ole Miss (21-21) and Northwestern (20-20). Losses have been to Georgia (19-7), Virginia (27-0) and Georgia Tech (30-0).

The visitors are men who can be scored upon, but they are also people who can cause excitement themselves. That is true principally because of their 18-year-old flaming youth, Quarterback Bill Krietemeyer. It is said that he will be greater than the graduated Bill Wade. Tulane will ponder that problem today, already having


