You Get Value in Cadwell & Jones' Selected Tulips in Mixtures and Named Varieties

OF all the Spring flowers, Tulips are the most popular. The bulbs require no attention whatever after they are planted, and the blooms are unequalled for richness of color and magnificence by other plants in their class. Whether they are placed in formal beds or used here and there in the shrub border, Tulips are certain to produce an excellent display in the early Spring months when flowers are so scarce. If a number of different varieties are planted, the blooming season can be extended over a period of three to four weeks. Plant the bulbs 5 to 6 inches apart and cover them with 3 to 4 inches of soil. For house culture, 4 to 6 bulbs can be placed in a 6 inch pot. Keep them in a cool, dark place until the roots are well established, then bring them into the light. Letters A, B, C and D indicate the relative blooming periods; A is followed by B, etc. Height is given in inches to aid in arranging flower beds.

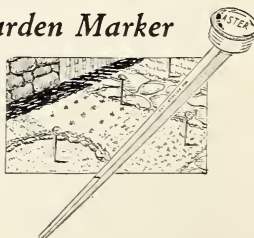

Hyacinths

THE outdoor cultivation of Hyacinths is quite similar to that of Tulips, except that the bulbs should be set further apart—about 8 to 10 inches. For house culture, pot the bulbs any time from September to December, using a light, rich soil and bone fertilizer. Place the pots outdoors and cover them with 4 to 6 inches of leaves. After ten to twelve weeks they may be brought indoors a few at a time.

If Hyacinths are grown in glasses the bases of the bulbs should barely touch the water. The glasses should be set in a cool, dark place until they are full of roots.

Plant the bulbs from 4 to 6 inches apart, depending upon the variety and cover them to one and one half times their depth. Bonemeal makes an ideal fertilizer; fresh stable manure should never be used.

To prepare a good lawn you must have seed of the proper kind and use plenty of it; you cannot produce a fine and beautiful lawn with ordinary hay seed. Next in importance is the proper preparation of the soil. Spade or plow it deeply, fertilize freely, and make it fine, free from clods and perfectly level, avoiding uneven places.

When to Sow. During the cool temperatures of early Fall when the soil is warm, and usually moist, seed can germinate quickly and make deep roots, which are far less likely to be killed by Winter frosts than the shallower roots of Spring sown grass being killed by the extreme heat of Summer. Weeds which are dormant in every soil, spring up quickly, but the majority of them being annuals only, will be killed by the first severe frosts. We advise all who contemplate making a new lawn, or renewing the old, to do the work this Fall, as the grass will become well established before freezing weather, ready to start a luxuriant growth with the return of Spring. One quart of our mixture will sow a space 16 feet square or 256 square feet, 5 bushels to the acre.

Shady Nook Lawn Grass Seed

It is quite difficult to obtain a satisfactory growth of grass under trees and in shady places, and we recommend the use of this special mixture. In extremely shady spots or under trees, a liberal application of lime is recommended in the Fall.
