2. The Japanese Government is directed to prepare the SS "Hsin Yangtze" for trial runs and a marine survey to be conducted by Allied surveyors on or about 9 December 1947, at Maizuru, Honshu, Japan.

3. Upon the satisfactory completion of the trial runs and marine survey, the vessel is to be sailed to Shanghai, China, for delivery in restitution to the British Government.

4. It will be the responsibility of the Japanese Government to fully water, fuel, and provision the vessel from Japanese sources prior to its final departure from Japanese waters.

5. The inclosed receipt forms, an original and five copies, are to be delivered to the captain of the SS "Hsin Yangtze," who has been designated the authorized representative of the Japanese Government to execute the receipt forms in its behalf. All copies of the receipt forms are to be signed by the authorized representatives of the British Government and the Japanese Government, and are to be distributed as follows:

a. Original and one copy to be returned to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, by the Japanese Government:

b. Two copies to be retained by the British Government;

c. Two copies to be retained by the Japanese Government.

- b. Letter, this headquarters, file AG 475 (Engr)(LD-35), subject: "Revised Estimated Requirements for Engineer Construction Materials and Supplies for Japanese Fiscal Year Ending 31 March 1947", dated 20 September 1946.
- c. Letter, this headquarters, file AG 475 (Engr)(LD-45), subject: "Specifications for Low Pressure Heating Boilers Produced for Troop and Dependent Housing", dated 19 December 1946.
- d. Letter, this Headquarters, file AG 475 (Engr)(LD-57), subject: "Additional Estimated Requirements for Engineer Construction Materials and Supplies Required for Dependent Housing Construction", dated 30 April 1947.
- e. Procurement Demands numbers JPNZ 1254, 1279, 1280, 1281, 1776, 1786, 1806, 2268, 3445, 3446, 3447, 3448, 3449 and 5142.

2. Because of the critical coal supply situation, it is desired that all coal fired steam generating units of capacities in excess of 1735 lbs steam per hour, furnished in accordance with references cited above, be equipped with automatic firing stokers, where possible.

3. Reference paragraphs 1b and 1b above, steam generating units are listed as "Boiler Plants", and as such will include all equipment and materials to produce completely operable units. In a majority of orders placed by the Japanese Governments to date for the steam generating equipment listed in references 1a, 1b, and 1c above, there has been no apparent consideration given to the procurement of auxiliary equipment required for the operation of the completed units. The list

below is prepared as a guide for the procurement of auxiliary equipment required for steam generator operation. It is applicable to steam generation boilers listed on procurement demands as well as boiler plants listed on engineer requirement as "Complete With All Accessories". It is realized that a large variation in such equipment occurs depending on the size and type of unit being utilized. Any deviation from the following list will be approved only by the Engineer, this headquarters:

- a. Feed water pumps.
 - b. Feed water regulators.
 - c. Feed water treatment.
 - d. Feed water economizers.
 - e. Combustion control equipment.
 - f. Forced and induced draft fans.
 - g. Air preheaters.
 - h. Coal handling equipment.
 - i. Stockers.
 - j. Ash removal equipment.
 - k. Desecration heaters.
 - l. Soot blowers.
 - m. Pulverizers.
 - n. Piping (re-fabricated for 2" IPS and larger), including valves, traps, expansion joints, strainers, etc.
 - o. Fire Brick (including special shapes) and mortar.
 - p. Water level indicators and high and low water level alarms.
4. Because of the special nature of steam boiler construction and erection, it is desired that all steam generating units of capacities

in excess of 6,900 lbs steam per hour be erected, tested hydraulically and operationally where possible in accordance with reference cited in paragraph 1c above, and in accordance with Japanese Engineer Standards where applicable, by the boiler manufacturer prior to being made available for Occupational Forces utilization.

5. It is directed that the Japanese Government take the following action.

a. Designate a single agency as responsible for furnishing boilers and required accessory equipment as listed in paragraph 3, above.

b. Procure and install where possible, stokers as described in paragraph 2, above.

c. Erect and test where possible, all steam generating units as described in paragraph 4, above.

6. Should the Japanese Government be unable to comply with any phase of the provisions of paragraphs 4a and 4b above, it is directed that a report showing the reasons for non-compliance be furnished the Engineer, this headquarters, prior to 31 July 1947.

7. This letter supplements, but does not make void, previous instructions and directives issued by OCE, GNC, FEC.


